COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Plaintiff Judicial Watch, Inc. brings this action against Defendant District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department to compel compliance with the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act, D.C. Code § 2-531, et seq. ("FOIA"). As grounds therefor, Plaintiff alleges as follows:

JURISDICTION

1. The Court has jurisdiction over the persons and subject matter of this action based on D.C. Code § 11-921.

PARTIES

2. Plaintiff is a non-profit, educational foundation organized under the laws of the District of Columbia and having its principal place of business at 501 School Street, S.W., Suite 500, Washington, DC 20024.

3. Defendant District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department is a public body and part of the government of the District of Columbia. Defendant has its principal place of business at 300 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. Defendant has possession, custody, and control of certain public records to which Plaintiff seeks access.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 4. On August 10, 2006, Plaintiff sent a FOIA request to Defendant seeking access to the following public records:
 - 1. D.C. Police policy and procedures pertaining to illegal aliens and law enforcement activities with respect to a person's immigration status.
 - 2. The enforcement of any federal and/or local immigration laws in the District of Columbia.

A true and correct copy of Plaintiff's August 10, 2006 FOIA request is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

- 5. Defendant acknowledged receipt of Plaintiff's FOIA request twice, by letters dated August 22, 2006 and August 30, 2006. Since that time, however, and despite at least one inquiry by Plaintiff regarding the status of the request, Defendant has failed to produce responsive records or otherwise comply with Plaintiff's request. True and correct copies of Defendant's August 22, 2006 and August 30, 2006 acknowledgments of receipt of Plaintiff's FOIA request are attached hereto as Exhibit B and are incorporated by reference herein.
- 6. Because Defendant failed to comply with Plaintiff's FOIA request within the time limits required by D.C. Code § 2-532(c), Plaintiff is deemed to have exhausted its administrative remedies pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-532(e).

COUNT 1 (Violation of FOIA)

- 7. Plaintiff realleges paragraphs 1 through 6 as if fully stated herein.
- 8. Defendant has violated FOIA by failing to produce records responsive to Plaintiff's August 10, 2006 FOIA request.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that the Court: (1) declare Defendant's failure to comply with FOIA to be unlawful; (2) enjoin Defendant from continuing to withhold public records responsive to Plaintiff's August 10, 2006 FOIA request and otherwise order Defendant to produce the requested public records without further delay; (3) grant Plaintiff an award of attorney's fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred in this action pursuant to D.C. Code § 2-537(c); and (4) grant Plaintiff such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.


