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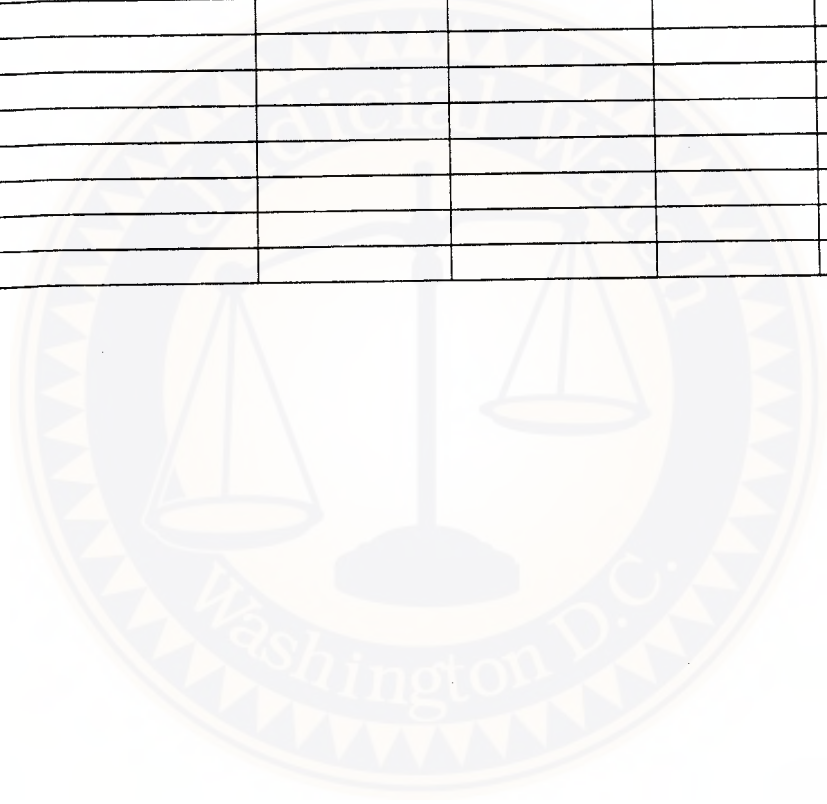

I. (U) COMMANDER'S OWN SITUATION / DISPOSITION / STATUS OF FORCES.

- The EJAT completed the major muscle movements of the ESAT to the EJAT transition today 21AUG08. Our current contract at the Sheraton Hotel now expires on 12 SEP 08; and our team is aggressively researching alternate locations for the future EJAT EECF, personnel life support, and housing. The Sheraton Lodging capabilities and limitations.
 - Sheraton Lodging will expire 12 Sept 08
 - Current headcount is 103
 - Configuration to change to 36 singles and 74 Doubles.
 - Max Occupancy this configuration is 184
- The atmospherics between Georgia and Russia remain static with no major shifts. The EJAT continues to increase situational awareness through LTC ██████ (CAO) direct coordination with the Cabinet of Ministry, Ministry of Health (MoH) and Ministry of Finance (MoF). LTC ██████ is embedded with these agencies and is taking part in the ~~(b)(6)~~ Cabinet of Ministry War Room to increase the EJAT situational awareness.
- Brigadier General Miller met with the Senators Lieberman and Graham along with the Georgian President and members of his cabinet. The party reviewed the chronology of the conflict highlighting that aggression was a forgone conclusion; only the timing was a surprise. Throughout the discussion both U.S. Senators were effusive in their support of the President, his team, the citizens of Georgia, and the need to maintain unwavering support of Democracy.
- The group spoke of funding initiatives to restore infrastructure, energy storage capability, and accelerated plans to implement hydro-electric power plan, road construction, high voltage power lines connecting to Turkey, and improvements in air traffic control. The Senators suggested a one billion dollar support package and the Georgian President suggested a matching contribution from the European Union. The Georgian President also requested a second funding initiative to rebuild defense forces. He specifically requested air defense and anti-tank capabilities. Both Senators Graham and Lieberman supported this request and asked BG Miller to ensure that the EJAT assessment provide insight into requirements prior to Defense Authorization activities in the coming weeks.

UNCLASSIFIED

- The EJAT SPO continues to refine our visibility and tracking of STRAT Air. EJAT continues to provide the Ministry of Finance (MoF) visibility of arriving strategic and intra-theater flights ISO humanitarian assistance to no less than 2 hours notification time.
- The EJAT, J3 Operations is awaiting the EJAT Commanders final review of the JMD and redeployment plan for the excess GSSOP personnel within the next **48 hours**.
- Upon approval of both plans, the EJAT will transmit the final approved DRAFT of the JMD to MAJ [REDACTED] 21 TSC (PLEX) for final vetting thru 21st TSC and EUCOM. NLT **23AUG08**.
- BG Miller now has the approval authority to execute assessment missions outside of Tbilisi. All movements outside of Tbilisi will be strictly vetted through our Force Protection OIC and J-2 prior to execution.

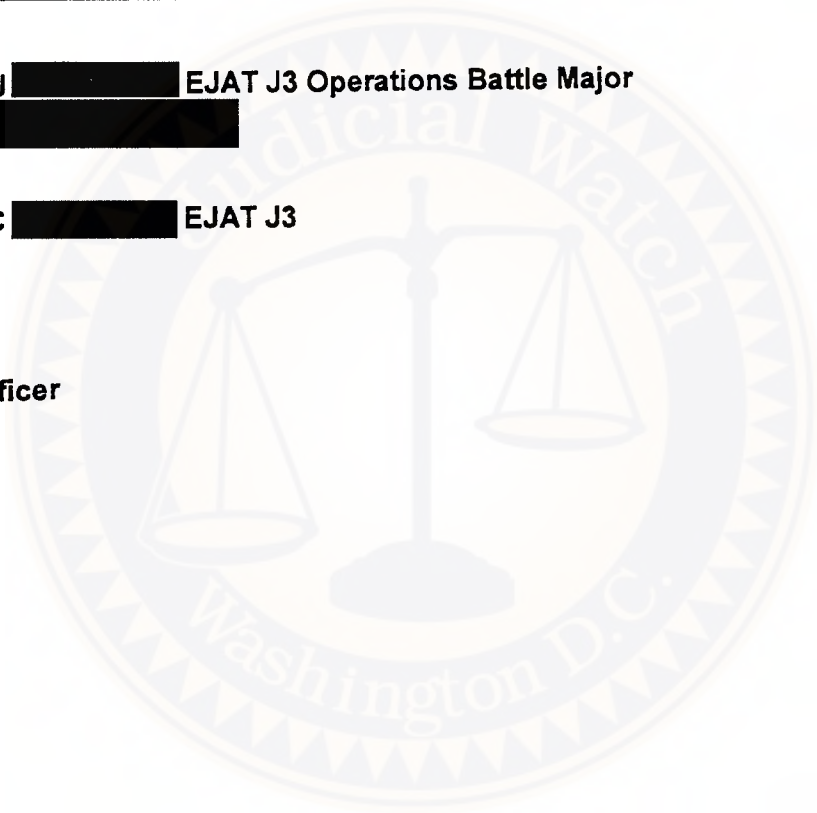

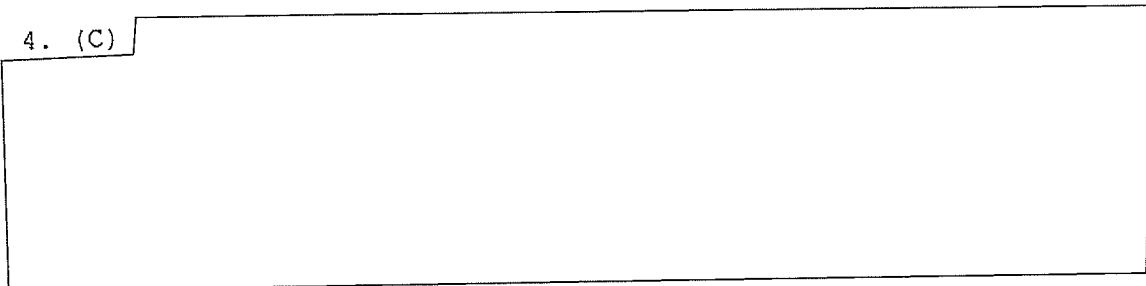

1. (U) The Minister of Defense, Irakli Okaruashvili has been in his post since December 2004. He previously served as the Minister of the Interior, and has a reputation for being hawkish on the possible use of force to attempt to bring South Ossetia and Abkhazia back to full Georgian control.

2. (C) During the fighting in South Ossetia in July and August 2004 he personally directed the employment of the Ministry of Interior Troops via cell phone. During the recent joint MOIA/MOD operation to eliminate a rebel militia group and bring the upper Kodori Gorge fully under Georgian control, Minister Okruashvili personally led the first 300-person MOD task force into the Gorge. Even as some Georgian officials in Tbilisi attempted to minimize the MOD role in the Gorge operation, Okruashvili gave interviews while in the Gorge, wearing a camouflage U.S. Marine Corps uniform with full field gear. He is a hands-on Minister of Defense who spends most of his time away from Tbilisi, checking on troops and visiting and critiquing their training.

3. (U) The Chief of Defense is Colonel Levan Nikoleishvili. He was appointed to the post in February 2005. With the same senior leadership in place for almost 2 years, there is some degree of continuity in policies and trends in the Georgian military. Colonel Nikoleishvili loyally executes the policies of the Minister of Defense, operating more autonomously than most U.S. officials realize, but strictly within the "Commander's Intent" as he understands it. While the Minister of Defense is respected but feared, the CHOD is personally disliked by most senior officers in the Georgian military, who have seen that anyone who challenges him or is seen as a future threat is removed or dismissed.

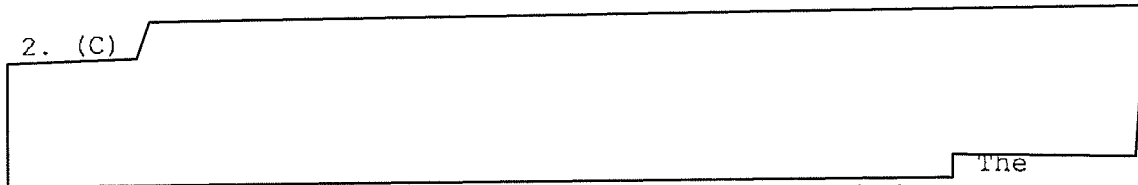

5. (C) There is little argument that the Minister of Defense has created a legitimate Armed Forces, where only disorder and corruption existed before. The change has truly been remarkable, as troops have received equipment they can be proud of and the quality of life of soldiers has seen remarkable improvement. In less than two years, the force has gone from twenty percent to eighty percent professional. Dilapidated equipment has been hauled away and either destroyed or repaired. Dozens of new barracks and dining facilities have been constructed. 6 U.S. Senators visiting the new 3,300 person military base in Senaki just three days ago were amazed with the facilities there, which include a large gymnasium and Olympic-sized swimming pool.

Current Trends and a Look Toward the Future

1. (C) The Georgian operation in the Kodori Gorge seems to have had a profound effect on the mood of the senior military leadership and of the possibility of military operations in Ossetia this fall. The Minister of Defense and CHOD returned from the Gorge operations overjoyed with the result of the operation and with the performance of the Armed Forces. The Minister and CHOD have been far more relaxed and personable since the operation, sharing war stories and tales of fishing and hunting in the local Kodori Gorge rivers. The operation is being billed as a step in the ultimate restoration of Georgian territorial integrity, even though the area had fallen under militia, not Abkhazian separatist, control. The public accepts this argument and President Saakashvili's National Movement has seen a recent bounce in popularity. The net effect is that the President and Minister of Defense feel less pressure to take further military action and seem willing to accept the Kodori operation as this year's "victory".

3. (C) While a new round of diplomatic maneuvering, including more moves to demand the departure of Russian peacekeepers from Ossetia and Abkhazia, seems likely, Minister Okruashvili will use the additional time available to further strengthen the Georgian Armed Forces.

**Sustainment and Stability Operations Program (SSOP) and Global
War on Terrorism Support**

1. (U) The SSOP II Program began on 7 July 2006. The training will complete U.S.-Georgian joint efforts to train and equip Three Professional Brigade Combat Teams (the United States did not participate in training of organic artillery and armor units). This program gives Georgia a deep pool of trained infantry battalions to continue their commitment of two battalions (858 personnel) in Iraq. The Terms of Reference that describes the SSOP II agreement obligates Georgia to support five additional Iraq rotations. Politically, however, the Georgian government has expressed the determination to stay in Iraq as long as the United States is there.
2. (U) The U.S. training team from the United States Army Europe's Hohenfels training center is very strong and experienced. The 31st battalion is in training now and completes training on 29 September 2006. This unit will deploy to Iraq on 5 November 2006.
3. (U) As Georgia is responsible for the vast majority of the equipping of Third Brigade and other SSOP II units, the number of logistical problems effecting the program is actually lower than one year ago, during the first SSOP. The Georgian side has successfully professionalized Third Brigade and brought SSOP II units to full strength. Within the last week, Georgia received a large shipment of TA-50 in order to fully equip all SSOP II units with personal equipment that is of the same standard as equipment previously provided by the United States.

4. (U) While Georgia has generally been compliant with SSOP II requirements, a few issues have surfaced. One, the Georgian MOD initially balked at providing blank ammunition to support the program as required. In recent weeks, the MOD has come through with 100,000 rounds to support SSOP II training. Second, the 31st Battalion and 2nd Brigade Recon Company absented themselves from SSOP II training during the Kodori Gorge operation with little to no advance warning or coordination with U.S. officials. Lost training time has since been made up.

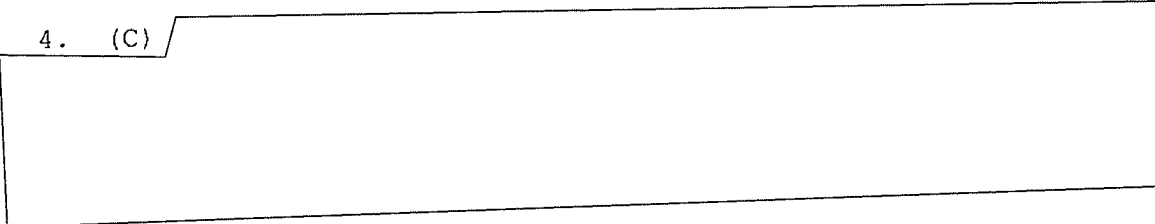
1. (C) Georgian military officials seem increasingly interested in contributing forces to Afghanistan. Actually, the Georgian Chief of Defense made such an offer earlier in 2006 and has yet to receive a clear U.S. response. While Georgia desires to claim the political benefit of participating in a NATO operation, Georgian military officials are far more comfortable with their forces under U.S. command.

3. (C) The Georgian Special Forces teams are the best trained units in the Georgian Armed Forces and are already fairly well equipped by regional standards. A highly successful JCET in October 2005 laid the foundation for a large JCET in May-June 2006, in which three U.S. Special Forces teams trained a Georgian Special Forces battalion. The commanders of the JCET mission were highly complementary of the level of training of their Georgian counterparts. Although not fully interoperable with U.S. SOF, and having some equipment deficiencies, these teams could definitely make a contribution in OEF.

I. (U) COMMANDER'S OWN SITUATION / DISPOSITION / STATUS OF FORCES.

- The EJAT completed the major muscle movements of the ESAT to the EJAT transition today 21AUG08. Our current contract at the Sheraton Hotel now expires on 12 SEP 08; and our team is aggressively researching alternate locations for the future EJAT EECF, personnel life support, and housing. The Sheraton Lodging capabilities and limitations.
 - Sheraton Lodging will expire 12 Sept 08
 - Current headcount is 103
 - Configuration to change to 36 singles and 74 Doubles.
 - Max Occupancy this configuration is 184
- The atmospherics between Georgia and Russia remain static with no major shifts. The EJAT continues to increase situational awareness through LTC ██████ (CAO) direct coordination with the Cabinet of Ministry, Ministry of Health (MoH) and Ministry of Finance (MoF). LTC ██████ is embedded with these agencies and is taking part in the ~~(b)(6)~~ Cabinet of Ministry War Room to increase the EJAT situational awareness.
- Brigadier General Miller met with the Senators Lieberman and Graham along with the Georgian President and members of his cabinet. The party reviewed the chronology of the conflict highlighting that aggression was a forgone conclusion; only the timing was a surprise. Throughout the discussion both U.S. Senators were effusive in their support of the President, his team, the citizens of Georgia, and the need to maintain unwavering support of Democracy.
- The group spoke of funding initiatives to restore infrastructure, energy storage capability, and accelerated plans to implement hydro-electric power plan, road construction, high voltage power lines connecting to Turkey, and improvements in air traffic control. The Senators suggested a one billion dollar support package and the Georgian President suggested a matching contribution from the European Union. The Georgian President also requested a second funding initiative to rebuild defense forces. He specifically requested air defense and anti-tank capabilities. Both Senators Graham and Lieberman supported this request and asked BG Miller to ensure that the EJAT assessment provide insight into requirements prior to Defense Authorization activities in the coming weeks.

- The EJAT SPO continues to refine our visibility and tracking of STRAT Air. EJAT continues to provide the Ministry of Finance (MoF) visibility of arriving strategic and intra-theater flights ISO humanitarian assistance to no less than 2 hours notification time.
- The EJAT, J3 Operations is awaiting the EJAT Commanders final review of the JMD and redeployment plan for the excess GSSOP personnel within the next **48 hours**.
- Upon approval of both plans, the EJAT will transmit the final approved DRAFT of the JMD to MAJ [REDACTED] 21 TSC (PLEX) for final vetting thru 21st TSC and EUCOM. NLT **23AUG08**.
- BG Miller now has the approval authority to execute assessment missions outside of Tbilisi. All movements outside of Tbilisi will be strictly vetted through our Force Protection OIC and J-2 prior to execution.

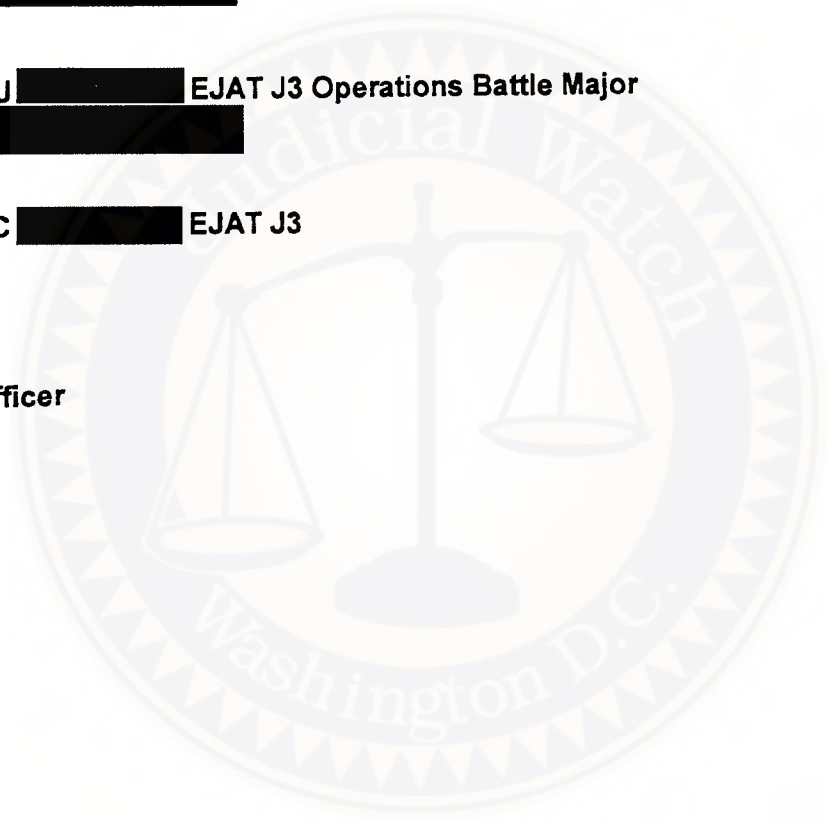

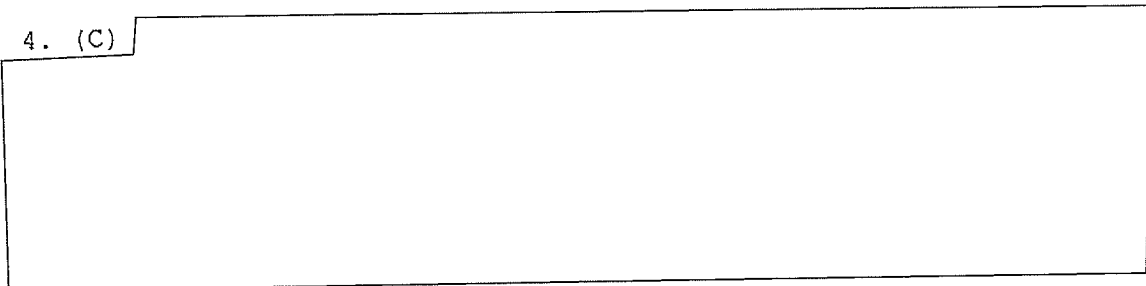

1. (U) The Minister of Defense, Irakli Okaruashvili has been in his post since December 2004. He previously served as the Minister of the Interior, and has a reputation for being hawkish on the possible use of force to attempt to bring South Ossetia and Abkhazia back to full Georgian control.

2. (C) During the fighting in South Ossetia in July and August 2004 he personally directed the employment of the Ministry of Interior Troops via cell phone. During the recent joint MOIA/MOD operation to eliminate a rebel militia group and bring the upper Kodori Gorge fully under Georgian control, Minister Okruashvili personally led the first 300-person MOD task force into the Gorge. Even as some Georgian officials in Tbilisi attempted to minimize the MOD role in the Gorge operation, Okruashvili gave interviews while in the Gorge, wearing a camouflage U.S. Marine Corps uniform with full field gear. He is a hands-on Minister of Defense who spends most of his time away from Tbilisi, checking on troops and visiting and critiquing their training.

3. (U) The Chief of Defense is Colonel Levan Nikoleishvili. He was appointed to the post in February 2005. With the same senior leadership in place for almost 2 years, there is some degree of continuity in policies and trends in the Georgian military. Colonel Nikoleishvili loyally executes the policies of the Minister of Defense, operating more autonomously than most U.S. officials realize, but strictly within the "Commander's Intent" as he understands it. While the Minister of Defense is respected but feared, the CHOD is personally disliked by most senior officers in the Georgian military, who have seen that anyone who challenges him or is seen as a future threat is removed or dismissed.

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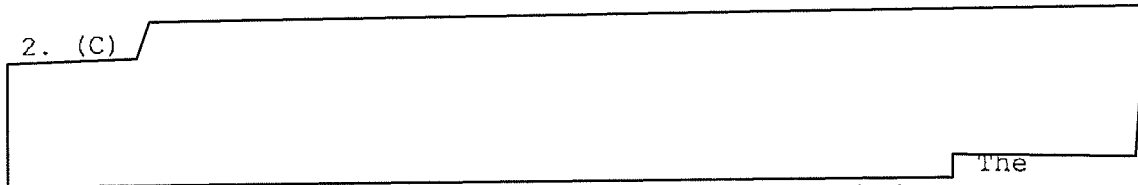

5. (C) There is little argument that the Minister of Defense has created a legitimate Armed Forces, where only disorder and corruption existed before. The change has truly been remarkable, as troops have received equipment they can be proud of and the quality of life of soldiers has seen remarkable improvement. In less than two years, the force has gone from twenty percent to eighty percent professional. Dilapidated equipment has been hauled away and either destroyed or repaired. Dozens of new barracks and dining facilities have been constructed. 6 U.S. Senators visiting the new 3,300 person military base in Senaki just three days ago were amazed with the facilities there, which include a large gymnasium and Olympic-sized swimming pool.

Current Trends and a Look Toward the Future

1. (C) The Georgian operation in the Kodori Gorge seems to have had a profound effect on the mood of the senior military leadership and of the possibility of military operations in Ossetia this fall. The Minister of Defense and CHOD returned from the Gorge operations overjoyed with the result of the operation and with the performance of the Armed Forces. The Minister and CHOD have been far more relaxed and personable since the operation, sharing war stories and tales of fishing and hunting in the local Kodori Gorge rivers. The operation is being billed as a step in the ultimate restoration of Georgian territorial integrity, even though the area had fallen under militia, not Abkhazian separatist, control. The public accepts this argument and President Saakashvili's National Movement has seen a recent bounce in popularity. The net effect is that the President and Minister of Defense feel less pressure to take further military action and seem willing to accept the Kodori operation as this year's "victory".

The recent visits of Senators Lugar and McCain, and their very strong pro-Georgian statements, may have buoyed President

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Saakashvili's hopes that pressure can be brought on Russia that would give the diplomatic efforts a ray of hope.

3. (C) While a new round of diplomatic maneuvering, including more moves to demand the departure of Russian peacekeepers from Ossetia and Abkhazia, seems likely, Minister Okruashvili will use the additional time available to further strengthen the Georgian Armed Forces.

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**Sustainment and Stability Operations Program (SSOP) and Global
War on Terrorism Support**

1. (U) The SSOP II Program began on 7 July 2006. The training will complete U.S.-Georgian joint efforts to train and equip Three Professional Brigade Combat Teams (the United States did not participate in training of organic artillery and armor units). This program gives Georgia a deep pool of trained infantry battalions to continue their commitment of two battalions (858 personnel) in Iraq. The Terms of Reference that describes the SSOP II agreement obligates Georgia to support five additional Iraq rotations. Politically, however, the Georgian government has expressed the determination to stay in Iraq as long as the United States is there.

2. (U) The U.S. training team from the United States Army Europe's Hohenfels training center is very strong and experienced. The 31st battalion is in training now and completes training on 29 September 2006. This unit will deploy to Iraq on 5 November 2006.

3. (U) As Georgia is responsible for the vast majority of the equipping of Third Brigade and other SSOP II units, the number of logistical problems effecting the program is actually lower than one year ago, during the first SSOP. The Georgian side has successfully professionalized Third Brigade and brought SSOP II units to full strength. Within the last week, Georgia received a large shipment of TA-50 in order to fully equip all SSOP II units with personal equipment that is of the same standard as equipment previously provided by the United States.

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4. (U) While Georgia has generally been compliant with SSOP II requirements, a few issues have surfaced. One, the Georgian MOD initially balked at providing blank ammunition to support the program as required. In recent weeks, the MOD has come through with 100,000 rounds to support SSOP II training. Second, the 31st Battalion and 2nd Brigade Recon Company absented themselves from SSOP II training during the Kodori Gorge operation with little to no advance warning or coordination with U.S. officials. Lost training time has since been made up.

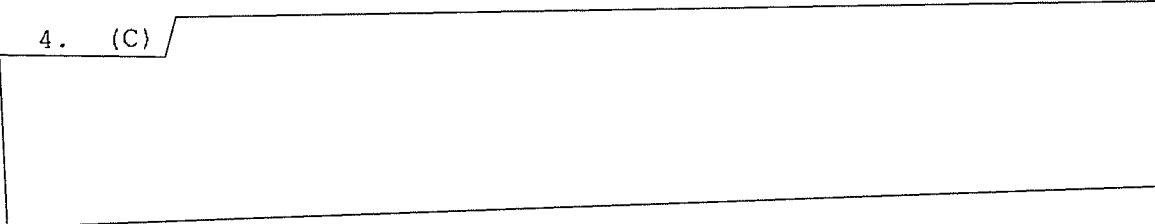
1. (C) Georgian military officials seem increasingly interested in contributing forces to Afghanistan. Actually, the Georgian Chief of Defense made such an offer earlier in 2006 and has yet to receive a clear U.S. response. While Georgia desires to claim the political benefit of participating in a NATO operation, Georgian military officials are far more comfortable with their forces under U.S. command.

3. (C) The Georgian Special Forces teams are the best trained units in the Georgian Armed Forces and are already fairly well equipped by regional standards. A highly successful JCET in October 2005 laid the foundation for a large JCET in May-June 2006, in which three U.S. Special Forces teams trained a Georgian Special Forces battalion. The commanders of the JCET mission were highly complementary of the level of training of their Georgian counterparts. Although not fully interoperable with U.S. SOF, and having some equipment deficiencies, these teams could definitely make a contribution in OEF.
