Valerie –

We have been in touch with Etihad Airways, the official airline of the UAE, who are beginning non-stop service to Chicago on September 2nd and they are willing to provide us with some good visibility at their inaugural flight event on September 2nd. They are willing to have us hang up banners or signage at O'hare when they expect the 1st plane to arrive in Chicago. They have also offered to have a Chicago 2016 dignitary (i.e. PGR, Lori Healey, or other senior Bid person) participate in a ribbon cutting ceremony following the arrival.

Etihad is fully supportive of our Bid and have even offered to have the CEO draft a letter to the IOC member in UAE. Lori Healey was invited to deliver welcome remarks at a reception hosted by the Chicago Architecture Foundation welcoming them to Chicago (I attended in her place as she had to attend a Ward meeting) They have also been working with Chip and had purchased a table at the Sprint to the Finish event on Aug 12. (They had very positive feedback on that event btw)

The inaugural event will take place at O'Hare on Sept 2nd to mark the arrival of the 1st flight at 4:40pm. They will have media and some high level dignitaries present for a ribbon cutting around 5:30pm. The plane will then leave for the UAE around 7:45pm. Before proceeding with anything, I wanted to check with you on how best to proceed with this... Would whether or not this may pose a conflict with our partnership with United Airlines?

Any guidance you could provide would be greatly appreciated. I can swing by this afternoon if you'd like to discuss at all.

[IOC grip on cities grows tighter every time

From no-fly zones to free-speech areas, Olympic officials want to control what the world can see

When Juan Antonio Samaranch was president of the International Olympic Committee, he demanded that those in the "movement" refer to him as Your Excellency.

Let pretensions of grandeur aside, even under his watch the IOC never described itself as the "supreme authority" on all things Olympic, as it did under Jacques Rogge in Vancouver's host city agreement.

And while Rogge rejected the "His Excellency" honorific, he also spelled out in the host-city contract what creature comforts he requires come Games time.

To be precise, Rogge gets three multiple-screen video walls all hooked up to the international television signals of the games. One will be in his room at the Westin Bayshore Hotel and two others in the IOC offices at the hotel, which has been totally booked for the Olympic Family.

It's only a small example of the growing demands the IOC puts on host cities. One is for more money. For the 2002 Winter Games in Salt Lake City, the IOC took 40 per cent of the broadcast revenue. This time, it's more than half.

If Vancouver pulls off a miracle and has a surplus, the IOC will take 20 per cent, twice the cut it demanded from Salt Lake

city, which had a \$50-million surplus. The IOC's share of marketing royalties from mascots and logo-wear has also risen, to 7.5 per cent from five.

At the same time, it has off-loaded costs.

One big-ticket item is the tab for all medical costs and anti-doping measures. For 2010, that's an estimated \$13 million, a number that the B.C. auditor-general has repeatedly challenged as being too low. The auditor also challenged the \$185 million security budget. It's now set at \$1 billion. Unlike in 2002, host cities and organizing committees now pay all taxes, duties or indirect taxes "whether present or future" assessed to either the IOC or any third party owned or controlled by the IOC on revenue generated by the Games or to competitors as a reward for their performances.

Perhaps it's because the province is on the hook for any Olympic cost overruns that Premier Gordon Campbell's unpopular harmonized sales tax won't be put in place until after the Games.) But the biggest burden the IOC puts on cities is ever-increasing demands to protect sponsorship and marketing rights, demands that bump up against citizens' rights and freedoms.

Like Vancouver, Salt Lake City agreed that there would be no advertising or propaganda outside the venues within view of television cameras or spectators watching the events. But that was the end of it. No other Utahans and Americans faced widespread restrictions on protest signs, pamphlets, leaflets and posters.

Eight years later, Vancouver's contract widened the "clean zone" beyond venues to "major access points leading to Olympic venues" and the torch relay route. Those are the so-called halo areas in Vancouver's omnibus bylaw, a bylaw that the contract also required. That's another addition and so is the required no-fly zone.

The Vancouver contract says that "no propaganda or advertising is allowed in the airspace over the city and other cities and venues hosting Olympic events during the period of the Games."

There was a no-fly zone over the Utah capital in 2002, but only because five months earlier, New York's twin towers had been toppled by a terrorist attack. It's also noteworthy that Salt Lake City's total security budget was \$310 million US. That's nearly double Vancouver's original security estimate, but only a third of the current budget.)

With the new, larger area for top-tier sponsors' exclusive advertising use, the IOC passed on all costs associated with preventing, policing and prosecuting ambush advertisers, propagandists and marketers infringing on Olympic trademarks, including mascots.

As detailed as the host city contracts are in some areas, there's no mention of "free-speech zones," "demonstration zones" or "protest zones," as they were called in Beijing.

Yet, the fenced enclosures for permit-paid protesters are Olympic hallmarks and remarkably similar from one city to the next.

All details of Vancouver's have yet to be released, but the zones are promised to be in high-profile locations. They were in Salt Lake City as well, albeit with a total capacity of 170 people. Unlike in Beijing, plenty of demonstrators used the Salt Lake City enclosures. Only a few were arrested including an anti-abortion activist who broke the protest-one rules and carried a placard that said "God Bless America."

Not that it headed off the feared riot. However, it wasn't incited by wild-eyed anti-anythings, but rather by a bunch of punks after a beer garden closed early.

So what's in London's contract for 2012? It's impossible to know because London's freedom of information act doesn't require its release. Excellent.

Chicago 2016 today issues the following statement:

There have been recent media reports concerning Michael Scott, co-chair of the Chicago 2016 Outreach Advisory Council, and his efforts on behalf of a group of religious leaders interested in developing affordable housing in the Douglas Park area.

Chicago 2016 officials, including its Chief Ethics and Governance Officer, met today with Mr. Scott to understand Mr. Scott's role. As a result of that meeting, Chicago 2016 has concluded that Mr. Scott had no conflict of interest between his volunteer role with Chicago 2016 and his efforts on behalf of the religious leaders seeking to improve the community surrounding Douglas Park. Mr. Scott has had no role in the determination of venue locations, and was not involved in the decision to utilize Douglas Park for certain venues.

Mr. Scott has been an invaluable member of the Chicago 2016 Committee. Working with community groups around the city he was instrumental in the development and conclusion of a Memorandum of Understanding, which among other things, commits Chicago 2016 to certain goals relating to procurement, employment, and transparency should Chicago be selected to host the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Ms. Healey,
At this past Monday's public forum held at the Center on Halsted, the Chicago 2016 delegation offered a 31-page booklet ("An unforgettable celebration of sport, culture and friendship") for distribution touting what they promote as beneficial aspects that the Summer Games will bring to the City of Chicago.

Once again, this new Chicago 2016 publication omits any reference to Chicago's GLBT population, community, or activities.

While reviewing the contents of the book, I've located multiple references to 1994 and 1999 FIFA World Cup (soccer) events, the 2007 AIBA World Boxing Championships, the annual Chicago Marathon, multiple professional sporting events, and yet not one reference to the Gay Games VII held in Chicago in July, 2006.

The publication also boasts references to our "dynamic mixture of cultures" and our "city's festive atmosphere" in listing some of our most notable events such as the World Music Festival, Chicago Summerdance, Bud Billiken Parade, Celtic Fest, Grant Park Music Festival, and yet not one reference to any of Chicago's GLBT events such as Pride Festival and Parade, Chicago's Gay and Lesbian Hall of Fame, and other events.

Will Chicago 2016 organizers continue to keep our proud and vibrant GLBT community in the 'closet' and unmentioned along with Chicago's other unmentionables?





The Event:



S. Batbold (CV attached), Foreign Minister of Mongolia (as well as head of the country's Olympic body), will be arriving in Chicago on Thursday, June 11th at 6:35 PM and will stay through Sunday, June 14th. Although the nature of the Foreign Minister's visit is private (he is attending one of his son's graduation from university), Minister Batbold had requested a meeting with Mayor Daley for the morning of June 12th.

The Mongolian Embassy in Washington requested a meeting with Mayor Daley through standard channels (specifically through Eileen Hubbell), but the Embassy has requested that I make you, in your capacity at Chicago 2016, aware of his visit as as one of Minister Batbold's reasons to see Mayor Daley is to discuss Chicago's Olympic bid.

"Our city flag has four stars. One for each event that shaped this city; the establishment of Fort Dearborn, the Great Fire of 1871, the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893 and the Century of Progress Exposition of 1933.

The 2016 Summer Olympics would most certainly rank on the same level of those historical defining events rendering the city its fifth star.

What all these events have in common is that they called on our collective resolve as a city to reach beyond the common and achieve the extraordinary.

Chicago has never backed away from a challenge that would improve the city. In fact, it is one of Chicago's most fundamental characteristics; its passion to welcome the world to come and see what these Midwestern minds and hands are capable of.

Is progress perfect? No, of course not. Perfection is not the goal, but rather civic improvement and inspiration. Taking yet another step towards developing the *idea of Chicago*.

Sadly the built legacy of 1893 and 1933's accomplishments may not be immediately apparent, until one looks a bit deeper.

Then we see Northerly Island, Jackson Park, the University of Chicago and a host of rich architectural institutions that serve the citizens of Chicago every day – the Art Institute and the Museum of Science and Industry to name just a few.

The legacy of 2016 in Chicago will not only be the facilities that we construct, furthering the lessons of competitive sport, the character building legacy of sportsmanship that will shape our young citizen's lives for decades to come, but the journey itself. It is a reward that every Chicagoan will witness every day forward as the cheers of the world celebrating the drama of mankind's most gifted and committed athletes redefining the limits of human achievement echo on the streets of one of mankind's greatest accomplishments; Chicago - a city on the shores of a vast inland sea, at the gateway to a continent's rich fertile plains in which dwell citizens of remarkable character, artistic accomplishment and commercial innovation.

2016 will enable chicago to realize the next inevitable level of it's vast potential."
