Dear Chairperson Mulder:

Thank you for allowing me to write to you today in asking for your support with our continued health, air quality and air safety issues involving the new runway 9L/27R.

Since November 20th we the many residents that have been impacted have had to face the following issues surrounding this new runway:

- A substantial increase of air traffic over Park Ridge all at the direction of the FAA.
- Noise levels of 65 DB or greater, day and night.
- Night time noise well after 10pm from the aircraft such as on Feb 7, Th 2009.
- Low frequency rumbling and shaking of the houses due to jet engine backwash.
- Air pollution from the jet fuel and exhaust.
- Potential for falling blue ice (airplane waste material).
- Greater risk of airplane accidents, many planes coming in over schools.
- The potential of 90% of all bird strikes taking place under the 2500 feet - our space cap over Park Ridge.
- Disruption of a quiet and peaceful community – now our health and safety in jeopardy.

Additionally, I feel like many others here in Park Ridge that our air space has been violated (**vertical violation**) and most don't care about what happens to us residents.

Furthermore, I feel that we have no leadership here to properly represent us. Most recently the request by U.S. **Senator Dick Durbin's** office NOT to be notified about the monthly ONCC meetings, his absence and lack of support is all quite deafening (MIA) from the February 2009 meeting.

We have also notified the Honorable Secretary of Transportation Mr. Ray La Hood in asking for his involvement with the FAA's standard operational procedures in "**over use**" of this new runway 9L/27R. I understand the most recent statistics given out at the February 2009 meeting but the bottom line is – we have been inundated and continue to follow that same route of "**let's dump the planes on 9L/27R**" **all day and after 10 pm.**

We respectfully ask that you continue to press the FAA and those making the day to day decisions at O'Hare field flight operations in adhering to the "**two set of rules**" that appear to be working when **they decide** which runway to use and what time to use it.

Finally, I personally feel that the city of Chicago and Mayor Daly may have their own agenda here when it comes down to the OMP – its' called the **2016 International Olympics. Why else would a city with such an aggressive agenda remove the dead from a cemetery and walk away laughing at the families knowing that they (the city of Chicago) can do what ever it wants, where ever it wants and with whom it wants.**

The continue build out and take over of area land in and around the airport at O'Hare continue to be a menace to our society in where we have all been to believe that all men and free and the freedom to live in peace which is NOT the case when your air space like ours has been invaded.

The Illinois delegation – some have come forward but it also appears to be too little and too late for helping the residents of Park Ridge.

Mayor Daley appears to unofficially violate our freedoms by annexation via the air space above us and continues to refuse to listen to the good people of Park Ridge.

We can only hope that a change in leadership here in Park Ridge will be the spark to restart the engine of support from the people and for the people.

We – those of us who are impacted do care about our families, our health, our children's futures and we respect those in the official capacity that control these flight operations in making the right decisions when is come to our "public safety ".

Lastly, I spoke at the December 2008 meeting and my statement of 300 – 400 planes per runway per day is and continues to be far too many. Our Alderman Don Bach officially requested that a per "**cap**" be placed on the number of planes being allowed to use our air space as well as the total "**number of planes per day**" to 150.

Nothing has been addressed here to these aforementioned issues that continue to plague our community that is without leadership.

Madame Chair and members of the commission, we'd now like to provide some details on the political and economic climate and structure for Chicago's bid.

We have forged partnerships with governmental partners that stretch across the country.

Chicago, the region and the country possess the economic strength and vitality to deliver a spectacular Games in 2016.

The city has a strong tradition of public-private partnerships that have delivered on bold visions to enrich the city.

You will hear today from some of the governmental leaders who have voiced their support for Chicago's bid and for its plan to promote Olympic and Paralympic sport across the country.

I'd like to introduce them now.

Mayor Mufi Hanneman, from the City of Honolulu, is a partner with Mayor Daley in the U.S. Conference of Mayors and is co-chair of a task force that was formed to promote urban youth sport throughout the country.

Governor Jim Doyle, from the State of Wisconsin, has committed his state to host cycling competitions.

Governor Pat Quinn from the State of Illinois, has been a valued partner to the bid.

Valerie Jarrett, a senior adviser to President Barack Obama, is a former board member for Chicago 2016 and a longtime Chicagoan.

And please welcome the honorable Mayor Richard M. Daley, a leader who embodies the spirit of partnership and collaboration.

Thank you, Lori.

Madame Chair and members of the Commission, over the past several years, I have visited Beijing, Athens, Barcelona and London.

I've seen the impact the Games can have on a city—and the impact a city can have on the Olympic and Paralympic Movement.

During the Olympic Games, the athletes celebrate the best of the human spirit and our shared commitment to accomplishment, friendship and unity.

Political, religious and other differences are put aside so that athletes, regardless of who they are or where they're from, can achieve their potential in competition.

Today, we are more committed than ever to bringing the world to Chicago and back to the United States

Allow me to talk about one of Chicago's great strengths: our economy.

Chicago has one of the most diverse—and therefore resilient—metropolitan economies in the United States.

Our gross domestic product is comparable to many major countries. Chicago's GDP would make it the 18th largest country.

The city has maintained a bond rating of double A, which reflects the stability of our economy and effectiveness of our fiscal policies.

And Chicago has also accumulated deep cash reserves.

Over the past decade, the Chicago area has received more than \$40 billion in foreign investment, and more than 1,500 foreign-based companies have operations here.

While these are challenging economic times, the City of Chicago is a strong pillar of the economic foundation of our country.

My administration has joined with private businesses, civic leaders and labor unions in partnerships to improve Chicago.

- Together, we have promoted accessibility and the environment, which has enabled us to be at the forefront of innovation in both areas.
- We raised more than \$250 million in private funding to create Millennium Park.

- We have raised more than \$70 million from our civic, business and foundation communities to create new schools through our Renaissance 2010 program.
- Leaders of Chicago's business community helped Chicago 2016 raise \$14 million in just one night last July.
- And we have entered into long-term collective bargaining relationships with our leading unions—a tremendous asset of our City.

If so honored, we will meet the challenge and deliver a spectacular Games in 2016.

I have been joined by the people of Chicago in this bid. Their support has been overwhelming.

Throughout our city's history we have been successful because of the dynamic spirit and generosity of our residents and the willingness of everyone to work together for the greater good. I know our residents will welcome the world with open arms in 2016.

The popular support for our bid is reflected in the leadership of the city's government.

Our city council has approved all laws and agreements related to the Games, including the city's Olympic Commitments Agreement and the Governmental Cooperation Agreement, which we will discuss in our next presentation.

The City Council has confirmed the city's \$500 million shortfall guarantee.

And today, I pledge to you that should Chicago be awarded the honor of hosting the 2016 Games, the city stands ready to sign the Host City Contract.

Rest assured: Chicago will live up to its commitments to the IOC and the Olympic Movement.

During my two decades as mayor, I have always placed a priority on working together with my colleagues in local, state and national government.

In 1997, I founded the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus, an organization of 273 mayors representing cities and towns in the Chicago region. The mayors of the caucus have enthusiastically supported Chicago's bid.

Allow me to turn to yet another partnership. In January 2009, the U.S. Conference of Mayors, an organization of 1,100 mayors nationwide, formed a Task Force focused on promoting urban youth sport throughout our country. My co-chair on the Task Force, Mayor Mufi Hanneman of Honolulu, is with us today.

- First, the U.S. Conference of Mayors supports Chicago’s bid, and our Task Force will work diligently with Chicago 2016 to inspire young people to participate in sport through the Olympic Movement.
- Second, Chicago’s bid is every American city’s bid. And you have our commitment that we will play our part in building bridges of friendship to the world.

After the Games the Village will become the cornerstone of a vibrant new neighborhood in the city's near South Side. Chicago 2016 worked closely with our 63-member Outreach Advisory Council to incorporate the input of community members into our planning. The result is a 2,500 unit mixed-income, mixed-use residential development that will result in several important benefits for the city and its residents.

Revitalize the Community—The Olympic Village will continue to revitalize a neighborhood that was in decline as recently as the last decade. During the period from 1990 to 2000, population in the proposed Village location decreased 14% and the number of vacant units increased by 17%. Yet, the area has natural assets, including proximity to the city center and a prime lakefront location. During the Games, the Village will attract businesses and retail establishments to the area, facilitating the post-Games transformation into a vibrant community. Our Village development plan does not displace any residents. On the contrary, a significant portion of residential units will be set aside as affordable and accessible housing.

Physical Improvements—In addition to the economic benefits, residents of the near South Side will benefit from a number of physical improvements to the area, such as the lakefront promenade, which will provide permanent access to the lakefront, sculptural landmarks, and a new, more connected street grid.

Extend the Near South Side Revitalization—Recent years have seen the development of a residential corridor extending south along the city's lakefront from downtown Chicago. Demand for the area is high, as can be seen in two local neighborhoods: Central Station and the South Loop. The former is a 13-hectare residential community that has spurred the construction of 7,500 housing units since 1990. Adjacent to Central Station, the South Loop neighborhood has produced an additional 8,000 residential units over the past decade. The Olympic Village development will continue this trend of revitalization. The Olympic Village and venues to the north, combined with Washington Park and Jackson Park venues to the south, will define a region of Olympic energy that we believe will provide very positive benefits and linkages for the entire South Side.

An Achievable Plan

City Support

The City of Chicago fully supports Chicago 2016's vision for the Olympic Village, and plans to develop the site regardless of the outcome of our bid. The city has already:

- Secured the use of the proposed 52-hectare site
- Rezoned the parcel for Olympic-specific permanent uses
- Drafted proposed modifications to the building code to facilitate Olympic-period construction

The city plans to begin predevelopment of the site this summer, in the form of demolition and remediation, which it hopes to complete in 2010. After predevelopment activities are complete, the city will solicit private development teams throughout the world through a comprehensive Request for Proposal process whether or not Chicago is selected as Host City. Last year, in the preliminary phases of our bid development and Village planning, 12 development teams submitted expressions of interest and qualifications, alongside their strong financial partners.

After a development team has been selected, CHICOG and the city will maintain delivery control through a written agreement approved by City Council. This agreement will cover planning, design and financial requirements, and will establish milestone goals to guarantee timely completion of the Village.

Financing

Despite the current economic climate, Chicago 2016's public-private partnership ensures that our Village plan is financially feasible. There are two components to our financing model: public improvements and permanent housing.


Public Improvements—We estimate an array of public improvements—including building demolition, environmental remediation, and infrastructure construction—at \$150 million dollars. These public improvements would be paid for by two sources: 1) a \$32.5 million charitable donation from the previous site owner that would cover estimated environmental remediation and building demolition costs and, 2) projected future property taxes from the Village, which would cover the \$114 million in infrastructure costs.

Permanent Housing—Estimated at just under \$1 billion (in 2008 dollars), construction of the mixed-used housing component will be funded through debt and equity sources. We anticipate that 60 percent or \$600 million will be generated through debt financing, including both traditional bank financing institutions and an institutional debt pool. Forty percent or \$400 million will be generated through equity financing, including the private development team and an institutional investor pool. We have commitments for portions of both the debt and equity pools from large institutional lenders and

pensions funds. We have also worked closely with commercial and investment banks and other financing sources to identify alternative funding sources, including state and federal funding related to affordable, accessible and senior housing. Based on these commitments and investigations, we are confident that our Village development will be very attractive to investors.

Further, our preliminary demographic analyses show strong growth in demand after 2016 in several major housing types, including condominiums, apartments, affordable and senior housing. We also have a number of local universities who have expressed interest in leasing blocks or apartments for both their students and faculty. This early demonstration of demand further creates confidence in the feasibility of the Village project and its future viability as a new community.

Dear Ms. El Moutawakel and Mr. Felli,

Thank you for the opportunity to host the IOC Evaluation Commission in Chicago. I believe the enthusiasm for the Olympic and Paralympic Games was evident throughout the city.

As you know, the Chicago City Council has approved a \$500 million operating guarantee to support the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games. In regard to the redevelopment of the Olympic Village site, the city has committed to purchase the Michael Reese property for \$86 million, and has pledged all tax increment financing (TIF) revenues generated by the Village to support the its redevelopment. These revenues are estimated to be \$250 million in 2008 dollars.

Should Chicago be selected as the host city for the 2016 Olympic and Paralympic Games, I am prepared to introduce legislation to the Chicago City Council to provide additional guarantees to ensure the completion of the Olympic Village. I will also work closely with the Illinois Delegation, led by U.S. Senator Richard Durbin, to pursue federal funding to support the redevelopment of the Michael Reese property.

Thank you for your consideration of this commitment. We look forward to our continued relationship with the International Olympic Committee.



As you are aware, the IOC Evaluation Commission (EC) will visit Chicago April 2 – 8 to tour proposed venue sites, hear presentations on the 17 themes that are outlined in the bid book, pressure test our assumptions and assertions through Q&A sessions, and experience the city first hand on behalf of the broader voting membership of the IOC. They will also be evaluating the team that Chicago has brought together to bid for the Games, including the experts, supporters and government officials that make up the Chicago 2016 network.

You have been asked to participate in this visit on behalf of Chicago 2016 due to your unique qualifications and relationship with the city and the bid. In order to assist in your preparation for the EC visit, we have designed a thoughtful and comprehensive schedule of rehearsal and coaching sessions, background materials and support resources. This message lays out an overview of the preparation process that you will participate in over the four weeks. In addition to the Chicago 2016 staff members that you have worked with previously (**and who remain your primary contact and source of subject matter related information**), we have assigned individuals responsible for providing assistance on travel & accommodations, scheduling of preparation sessions, general background information on the city and the bid, presentation/venue tour sessions, etc.

Later this week, we will send you each a packet of information on the EC visit including:

- EC visit primer, including background on Commission members
- Schedule of visit activities and locations
- Participant lists for theme presentations
- Additional information relevant to your subject matter area

Your role – You will participate in one or more of the following roles:

- **Presenter** – Presenters will use scripted dialogue and supporting graphic materials to provide details on our bid plan to the EC. Review sessions for presenters are beginning next week, and we ask that you participate by phone or in person (if already in Chicago) if possible. Mock EC presentation sessions will take place later this month (see attached schedule) in the Chicago 2016 offices, and will further refine the scripted dialogue and flesh out likely questions generated by the material. Again, we invite you to participate in the first Mock EC presentation if possible, the second session (March 20-

21) is mandatory for presenters. Dress rehearsals (April 1-3) will be held on site at the Fairmont Hotel and are mandatory for all presenters.

- **Panelist** – Panelists will serve as subject matter experts, providing strength to our bid offering through their participation and support. Panelists do not present, but are part of the overall theme team in the room during the presentation. You may have a question directed to you – all questions will be directed by the Chicago 2016 theme moderator – and will need to be prepared to address any relevant questions from the EC panel. Review sessions for panelists are beginning next week, and we ask that you participate by phone or in person (if already in Chicago) if possible. Mock EC sessions will take place later this month in the Chicago 2016 offices (see attached schedule), and will further refine the scripted dialogue and flesh out likely questions generated by the material. Again, we invite you to participate in the first Mock EC presentation if possible, the second session (March 20-21) is mandatory for panelists. Dress rehearsals (April 1-3) will be held on site at the Fairmont Hotel and are mandatory for all panelists.
- **Guest** – Guests are invited to participate in one of several activities designed to provide the EC with a sense of the type of people that make up the broader Chicago 2016 team. Guests will engage in a range of activities, including attendance at meals, sporting events, press briefings, venue tour site activities and more. Preparation for the guests will be activity specific, and we will contact guests individually to provide additional details on the specific dates, times, activities and preparation required.

It is likely and understood that all questions posed by the EC members may not be answered during that day's session. So immediately after the presentation and into the evening, you may be asked to be part of the team that will do additional research and develop materials that can be delivered the next morning to the Commission coordinator. The core team for this process is already hard at work developing the information and tools necessary to make this process as expedient as possible, but please plan for this contingency when arranging your schedule.

Your preparation – In order to prepare, there are several things you should do. First is to familiarize yourself with the Chicago 2016 bid. As stated above, materials will be sent to you this week to assist in your preparation. An electronic version of the bid file and additional materials are also available at: <http://www.chicago2016.org/our-plan/bid-book/bid-book.aspx>. Candidature files from the other bid cities are also available (Tokyo: <http://www.tokyo2016.or.jp/en/plan/>; Madrid: <http://www.madrid2016.es/en/nuestracandidatura/dossierm16/Paginas/default.aspx>; Rio: http://www.rio2016.org.br/sumarioexecutivo/default_en.asp) Second is to better understand how Chicago is viewed by the IOC, through evaluations done thus far, and through review of the other materials that we will send to you.

Finally, there are the rehearsals mentioned above, most of which you will call in to. The first call in you are expected to participate in to listen to the script reads will commence next week, so disregard any reference to this week on the schedule (internal 2016 teams only). The purpose will be to listen and comment on key messages that should complement (not duplicate) what is in the bid book. Your experience/expertise is counted on to generate feedback and ensure accuracy, understanding what constitutes the best value proposition for the EC and for the key stakeholders each theme is addressing. We are also looking for likely questions that the EC will pose, based upon what you have reviewed and hear.

Your arrangements – We have reserved rooms for Mock EC session 2 (March 20-21) and the actual visit (April 2-8) for those of you traveling from outside Chicago. To minimize your time commitment, we have attempted to schedule you in Chicago for as little time as possible, depending upon your role and responsibilities. Travel arrangements will be made through Chicago 2016 for those of you not traveling through the USOC system.

Dear Chairperson Mulder:

Thank you for allowing me to write to you today in asking for your support with our continued health, air quality and air safety issues involving the new runway 9L/27R.

Since November 20th we the many residents that have been impacted have had to face the following issues surrounding this new runway:

- A substantial increase of air traffic over Park Ridge all at the direction of the FAA.
- Noise levels of 65 DB or greater, day and night.
- Night time noise well after 10pm from the aircraft such as on Feb 7, Th 2009.
- Low frequency rumbling and shaking of the houses due to jet engine backwash.
- Air pollution from the jet fuel and exhaust.
- Potential for falling blue ice (airplane waste material).
- Greater risk of airplane accidents, many planes coming in over schools.
- The potential of 90% of all bird strikes taking place under the 2500 feet - our space cap over Park Ridge.
- Disruption of a quiet and peaceful community – now our health and safety in jeopardy.

Additionally, I feel like many others her in Park Ridge that our air space has been violated (**vertical violation**) and most don't care about what happens to us residents.

Furthermore, I feel that we have no leadership here to properly represent us. Most recently the request by **U.S. Senator Dick Durbin's** office NOT to be notified about the monthly ONCC meetings, his absence and lack of support is all quite deafening (MIA) from the February 2009 meeting.

We have also notified the Honorable Secretary of Transportation Mr. Ray La Hood in asking for his involvement with the FAA's standard operational procedures in "**over use**" of this new runway 9L/27R. I understand the most recent statistics given out at the February 2009 meeting but the bottom line is – we have been inundated and continue to follow that same route of "**let's dump the planes on 9L/27R**" **all day and after 10 pm.**

We respectfully ask that you continue to press the FAA and those making the day to day decisions at O'Hare field flight operations in adhering to the "**two set of rules**" that appear to be working when **they decide** which runway to use and what time to use it.

Finally, I personally feel that the city of Chicago and Mayor Daley may have their own agenda here when it comes down to the OMP – its' called the **2016 International Olympics. Why else would a city with such an aggressive agenda remove the dead from a cemetery and walk away laughing at the families knowing that they (the city of Chicago) can do what ever it wants, where ever it wants and with whom it wants.**
