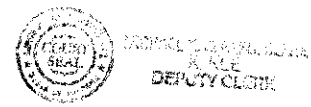

**APPLICATION FOR ORDER TO
SHOW CAUSE**

Pursuant to Rule 4(c) of the Rules of Procedure for Special Actions, plaintiff Judicial Watch, Inc. ("Judicial Watch") respectfully requests that the Court issue an order requiring Defendant City of Phoenix ("the City") to show cause why it should not be compelled to produce public records -- the activity logs of Mayor Phil Gordon's taxpayer-funded police detail -- requested by Judicial Watch pursuant to the Arizona Public Records Law, A.R.S § 39-121, *et seq.* Special action relief is appropriate because the issue to be decided by the Court is purely a question of law: Is the City's refusal to produce the requested public records lawful?

Judicial Watch's proposed Order to Show Cause submitted herewith requests that the Court direct the City to file its Answer by June 7, 2010. It is also requested that the Court set a briefing schedule for the parties to submit their respective arguments regarding the withholding of the requested public records. Given the limited nature of the issues

1 presented, Judicial Watch respectfully suggests that the City be ordered to submit its brief
2 on or before June 17, 2010. A hearing date should be set promptly thereafter, allowing
3 enough time for Judicial Watch to file a reply brief. This Application for Order to Show
4 Cause is supported by Judicial Watch's Complaint for Special Action and the
5 Memorandum of Points and Authorities below.

6 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

7 **I. LEGAL STANDARD FOR SPECIAL ACTIONS AND EXPEDITED
8 HEARING.**

9 A.R.S. § 39-121.02(a) sets forth the procedures for challenging the denial of a
10 request for public records: "Any person who has requested to examine or copy public
11 records pursuant to this article, and who has been denied access to or the right to copy
12 such records, may appeal the denial through a special action in the superior court,
13 pursuant to the rules of procedure for special actions against the officer or public body."

14 In addition, Rule 3(a) of the Rules of Procedure for Special Actions authorizes a
15 special action when "the defendant has failed ... to perform a duty required by law as to
16 which he has no discretion." A special action is necessary and appropriate here because
17 the City has denied Judicial Watch access to requested public records and, in so doing,
18 failed to perform a duty it is required by law to perform.

19 Under Rule 4(c), an order to show cause may be requested when a special action is
20 initiated. When an order to show cause is filed, Rule 4(c) requires the Court to "set a
21 speedy return date." Accordingly, because Judicial Watch is properly instituting a special
22 action to challenge the City's denial of access to requested public records and seeks an
23 order to show cause that requires the City to demonstrate why it should not be compelled
24 to make the requested public records available, expedited procedures are appropriate.

25 **II. FACTUAL BACKGROUND.**

26 On or about November 16, 2009, Judicial Watch requested that the Phoenix Police
27 Department provide access to the following public records pursuant to A.R.S § 39-121.01:

28 All activity logs for Mayor Phil Gordon's Security Detail. The time frame
for this request is December 30, 2007 to the present.

1 See Complaint at ¶ 5; Exhibit A (Letter to Police Chief Jack Harris dated December 11,
2 2009). Judicial Watch also requested, pursuant to A.R.S. § 39-121.01(D)(2), that, if any
3 responsive public record or portion thereof was withheld, sufficient identifying
4 information with respect to each withheld records or portion thereof to allow Judicial
5 Watch to assess the propriety of the withholding. Exhibit A. Finally, Judicial Watch also
6 requested that disclosable portions of any withheld records also be made available, to the
7 extent such portions were reasonably segregable from the withheld record. *Id.*

8 As the elected chief executive of the City of Phoenix, the Mayor's daily activities
9 and his use of his police detail are of substantial interest to residents and taxpayers of the
10 City of Phoenix. See Complaint at ¶ 6. On information and belief, the activity logs of the
11 Mayor's police detail identify the Mayor's daily activities by date, time, and location and
12 also may contain additional, descriptive information, such as meetings or appointments
13 the Mayor had, persons with whom the Mayor met, places to which the Mayor traveled,
14 and persons accompanied or traveled with the Mayor. *Id.* At least one reporter, Monica
15 Alonzo-Dunsmoor of The Arizona Republic, requested these same activity logs in July
16 2009, but the reporter's request was denied. *Id.*

17 The logs also are of substantial public interest because the Mayor's police detail is
18 made up of officers of the Phoenix Police Department and, on information and belief,
19 costs taxpayers an estimated one million dollars per year. Complaint at ¶ 10. Disclosure
20 of the logs will assist residents and taxpayers in the City of Phoenix in assessing whether
21 the Mayor's publicly funded police detail is an appropriate use of public resources. *Id.*
22 Indeed, disclosure of the logs is especially important in light of a proposal made by the
23 City of Phoenix in late January 2010 to lay off hundreds of Phoenix Police Department
24 police officers, including patrol officers, for budgetary reasons. *Id.*

25 In a letter dated January 4, 2010, the City denied Judicial Watch access to the
26 requested activity logs. Complaint at ¶ 13 and Exhibit B (Letter from City Attorney Gary
27 Verburg dated January 4, 2010). In its denial letter, the City made the broad, sweeping
28 assertion that disclosure of the logs, some of which are now more than two years old,

1 would “demonstrate a pattern which could easily be used by anyone to determine the time
2 and location of the Mayor.” Exhibit B. It also claimed that disclosure of the logs would
3 reveal “the location and time that [the Mayor] may be alone, without the protection of the
4 security detail,” that the logs “reflect private, confidential information relating to the
5 Mayor and his family members,” and that they also “contain[] information related to
6 private meetings held by the Mayor.” *Id.* It incongruously claimed that disclosing
7 information about the Mayor’s “private” meetings would undermine the deliberative
8 process of the Mayor’s office, albeit without making any attempt to demonstrate how any
9 such allegedly “private” meetings were related to any way to any governmental process or
10 how disclosure of the logs could even reveal the substance of any governmental
11 deliberations. *Id.*

12 Although the City’s stated concerns were directed at only a portion of the
13 information contained in the logs, it nonetheless withheld the logs in their entirety. It
14 made no effort whatsoever to disclose any reasonably segregable portions of the logs.
15 While the City offered to produce the Mayor’s public calendar, it made no effort to
16 explain the contradiction between its alleged security concerns about revealing the
17 Mayor’s whereabouts more than two years ago and the apparent lack of concern about the
18 Mayor announcing, in advance, on his public calendar, where he will be at a particular
19 time on a given date in the future. As of the date of this Special Action, the City has
20 continued to deny Judicial Watch access to the requested logs.

21 **III. THE COURT SHOULD REQUIRE THE CITY TO SHOW CAUSE WHY**
22 **THE ACTIVITY LOGS SHOULD NOT BE PRODUCED.**

23 “Public records and other matters in the custody of any officer shall be open to
24 inspection by any person at all times during office hours.” A.R.S. § 39-121. In light of
25 this clear, statutory language, it is well-established in Arizona law that public records are
26 presumed to be open to the public for inspection. *Lake v. City of Phoenix*, 222 Ariz. 547,
27 549, 218 P.3d 1004, 1006 (2009); *Griffis v. Pinal County*, 215 Ariz. 1, 4, 156 P.3d 418,
28 421 (2007); *Arizona Board of Regents v. Phoenix Newspapers, Inc.*, 167 Ariz. 254, 266,
806 P.2d 348, 360 (1991); *Carlson v. Pima County*, 141 Ariz. 487, 491, 687 P.2d 1242,

1 1246 (1984). “The Public Records Law exists to allow citizens “to be informed about
2 what their government is up to.” *Scottsdale Unified School District v. KPNX*, 191 Ariz.
3 297, 203-03, 955 P.2d 534, 539-40 (1998), quoting *U.S. Dep’t of Justice v. Reporters*
4 *Committee for Freedom of the Press*, 489 U.S. 749 (1989).

5 Nonetheless, the availability of records for public inspection is not without
6 qualification. *Carlson*, 141 Ariz. at 490, 687 P.2d at 1425. Access to a public record may
7 be denied if required by statute. *Id.* In addition, a public officer or custodian of a public
8 record may refuse inspection of a public record where “the unlimited right of inspection
9 might lead to substantial and irreparable private or public harm.” *Arizona Board of*
10 *Regents*, 167 Ariz. at 266, 806 P.2d at 360; *Carlson*, 141 Ariz. at 491, 687 P.2d at 1246.
11 Where “the countervailing interest of confidentiality, privacy or the best interests of the
12 state in carrying out its legitimate activities outweigh the general policy of public access,
13 [a] public officer may deny the inspection of the records.” *Id.* The burden falls squarely
14 on the public officer or custodian to overcome the presumption favoring disclosure. *Cox*
15 *Arizona Publications, Inc. v. Collins*, 175 Ariz. 11, 14, 852 P.2d 1194, 1198 (1993).
16 However, it is incumbent on the public officer or custodian to “specifically demonstrate
17 how production of the documents would violate rights of privacy or confidentiality, or
18 would be detrimental to the best interest of the state.” *Id.* (emphasis added).

19 The City does not claim that any statute requires it to withhold the logs.
20 Consequently, to overcome the presumption of disclosure, the City must “specifically
21 demonstrate” that allowing access to the logs will “violate rights of privacy or
22 confidentiality” or “be detrimental to the best interests of the state” to such an extent as to
23 outweigh the public’s substantial interest in disclosure of the logs.

24 To date, the City has failed to satisfy this substantial burden. Its reasons for
25 denying public access to the logs are generalized, conclusory, and incongruous, if not
26 contradictory. It has made no mention of, much less addressed, the obviously substantial
27 public interest in a complete, unfiltered account of how the Mayor spends his time --
28 which is what the logs would provide the public -- or how the taxpayer dollars that pay for

1 the Mayor's police detail are being expended. It clearly has not demonstrated that the
2 public interest in disclosure is outweighed by the generalized, conclusory, and
3 incongruous claims it asserts.

4 The City claims that disclosure of the logs -- some of which are more than two
5 years old -- could threaten the Mayor's security by revealing a "pattern of activity" that
6 could "be used by anyone to determine the time and location of the Mayor." Exhibit B.
7 The City fails to demonstrate that the Mayor's "pattern of activity" in January 2008 or
8 even in January 2009 is the same as it is today.¹ In addition, some "patterns of activity"
9 may be obvious even without disclosure of the logs. It is likely that the Mayor's police
10 detail picks him up at his residence in the morning and takes him either to his office at
11 City Hall or to his first scheduled event for the day. It also is likely that the police detail
12 returns the Mayor to his residence at the end of the working day or after his last scheduled
13 event. The Mayor's residence, at least until recently (and outside the time frame of
14 Judicial Watch's request), has been a matter of public record. Among other places, it
15 appears on the Statement of Organization he filed when he announced his candidacy for
16 reelection in 2006. Exhibit C. The address of the Mayor's Office at City Hall obviously
17 is a matter of public record. It thus is possible to surmise at least some "patterns of
18 activity" in the Mayor's likely movements irrespective of whether the logs are made
19 public.

20 Discovering the Mayor's current or upcoming activities -- as opposed to trying to
21 discern "patterns of activity" from past police detail logs -- is easily accomplished based
22 on the Mayor's own public pronouncements. The Mayor's Office announces at least
23 some of the Mayor's planned daily activities in advance by posting them on the City of
24 Phoenix's website. Complaint at ¶ 7. By way of example, on February 12, 2010, the
25 Mayor's Office's page on the City of Phoenix's website stated: "Today's Events: Friday,
26 February 12, 2010; In Office; Speaking before the Talent Dividend Luncheon; In Office."
27 *Id.* and Exhibit D. The Mayor also "tweets" real time reports about his current and

2 Complaint at ¶ 8 and Exhibit E. When compared to the Mayor's own disclosures about
3 his current and upcoming activities, the City's concern that disclosure of historical records
4 about the Mayor's past activities -- the police detail logs -- will enable someone to discern
5 "patterns of activity" that could undermine the Mayor's safety is insufficient to overcome
6 the public interest in gaining access to the records.

7 The public interest is substantial. Not only will the logs likely provide a complete,
8 unfiltered look in to most, if not all, of the Mayor's daily activities during the time period
9 in question, but also will demonstrate how the Mayor's million-dollar per year police
10 detail is being used. Complaint at ¶¶ 10 and 11. The logs also will help the public to
11 appreciate the size, scope, and duties of the detail and the activities of the officers
12 assigned to it, including whether the detail has been used for official purposes only or if it
13 also has been used for non-official or personal purposes as well. *Id.* at ¶ 11. Disclosure of
14 the logs thus will assist residents and taxpayers in the City of Phoenix in assessing
15 whether the Mayor's publicly funded police detail is an appropriate use of public
16 resources. *Id.* Making such an assessment is especially important in light of a proposal
17 made by the City of Phoenix in late January 2010 to lay off hundreds of Phoenix Police
18 Department police officers, including patrol officers, for budgetary reasons. *See*
19 Complaint at ¶ 12.

20 The City also asserts that disclosure of the activity logs will invade the privacy of
21 the Mayor or his family. Again, in order to rebut the presumption of disclosure of public
22 records, a "public official must demonstrate *specifically* how production of the records
23 would violate rights of privacy or confidentiality or would be detrimental to the best
24 interests of the state." *KPNX v. Superior Court*, 183 Ariz. 589, 592, 905 P.2d 598, 601
25 (App. 1995) (emphasis added). The City's blanket denial of access to the logs based on
26 the bald assertion that "information in the logs reflect private, confidential information
27 relating to the Mayor and his family members" fails to meet this standard. Significantly,
28 the City also failed to provide any information about specific log entries allegedly

1 containing private material or an index of these specific logs, as requested by Judicial
2 Watch and as required under A.R.S. § 39-121.01(D)(2). Exhibit A (“If any responsive
3 record or portion thereof is claimed to be exempt from production, please provide
4 sufficient identifying information with respect to each allegedly exempt record or portion
5 thereof to allow us to assess the propriety of the claimed exemption”). If the City had
6 provided such information or an index, it would likely have revealed that substantial
7 portions of the logs do not implicate any privacy concerns and otherwise could have been
8 released. At a minimum, it would have provided a starting point for reviewing and
9 segregating out any potentially private information. In either case, the City has failed to
10 support its privacy claim with the specificity required to overcome the presumption of
11 disclosure.

12 Finally, the City also makes the broadbrush claim that disclosure of the logs would
13 reveal information about the Mayor’s “private” meetings and thus undermine the
14 deliberative process of the Mayor’s Office. Not only does this sweeping claim fail to
15 demonstrate with any degree of specificity how production of the logs would violate any
16 rights of privacy or confidentiality or be detrimental to the best interests of the state
17 (*KPNX*, 183 Ariz. at 592, 905 P.2d at 601), but it is incongruous, if not inconsistent. If the
18 meetings were “private,” as the City claims, then they would not impact government
19 decision making in any way. The City makes no claim that these any of these unidentified
20 “private” meetings were official meetings or otherwise had any nexus to any
21 governmental activity at all. And again, the City failed to provide any information about
22 specific log entries or made any effort to segregate discloseable portions of the logs from
23 the portions about which it allegedly is concerned.

24 Moreover, the City fails to demonstrate how disclosure of the logs would reveal
25 any “deliberative” material at all. It does not claim, much less prove, that disclosure will
26 reveal any opinions, recommendations, or advice given to the Mayor by any of the
27 participants of these unidentified “private” meetings. Certainly, “the names of persons
28 with whom government officials have consulted are not protected from disclosure under a

1 deliberative process privilege.” *DR Partners v. Board of County Comm’ners*, 6 P.3d 465,
2 470 (Nev. 2002) (rejecting claim that disclosure of records of cell phone usage by county
3 officials would reveal government deliberations) *citing Van Bourg, Allen, Weinberg &*
4 *Roger v. NLRB*, 751 F.2d 982, 985 (9th Cir. 1985). In rejecting the government
5 defendant’s deliberative process claim in *DR Partners*, the Court also noted that the
6 requested telephone records contained “no information as to topics discussed or advice or
7 opinions exchanged between the parties to the telephone calls.” 6 P.3d at 471.


8 The requested records in this case are no different. The disclosure of the Mayor’s
9 police detail logs will not reveal any information about the subjects that may have been
10 discussed or any advice that may have been provided in “private” meetings the Mayor
11 may have attended. The deliberative process privilege simply does not apply to the
12 Mayor’s police detail logs. On the contrary, disclosure of the logs will provide significant
13 information to the public about both the Mayor’s activities and his taxpayer-funded police
14 detail.

15 **IV. CONCLUSION.**

16 For the foregoing reasons, the Court should issue an order directing the City to
17 show cause why it should not be compelled to produce the requested activity logs to
18 Judicial Watch.

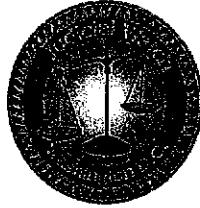

Pursuant to the provisions of the Arizona Public Records Law (APRL), A.R.S. 39-101 through 39-221, Judicial Watch, Inc. (Judicial Watch) requests from the Phoenix Police Department access to and a copy of any and all record(s) within ten (10) business days concerning or relating to the following:

1. All activity logs for Mayor Phil Gordon's Security Detail.

The time-frame for this request is December 30, 2007 to the present.

These records are considered public under A.R.S 41-1350. **For purpose of this request the term "record" shall mean:** (1) any written, printed, or typed material of any kind, including without limitation all correspondence, memoranda, notes, messages, letters, cards, telegrams, teletypes, facsimiles, papers, forms, records, telephone messages, diaries, schedules, calendars, chronological data, minutes, books, reports, charts, lists, ledgers, invoices, worksheets, receipts, returns, computer printouts, printed matter, prospectuses, statements, checks, statistics, surveys, affidavits, contracts, agreements, transcripts, magazine or newspaper articles, or press releases; (2) any electronically, magnetically, or mechanically stored material of any kind, including without limitation all electronic mail or e-mail, meaning any electronically transmitted text or graphic communication created upon and transmitted or received by any computer or other electronic device, and all materials stored on compact disk, computer disk, diskette, hard drive, server, or tape; (3) any audio, aural, visual, or video records, recordings, or representations of any kind, including without limitation all cassette tapes, compact disks, digital video disks, microfiche, microfilm, motion pictures, pictures, photographs, or videotapes; (4) any graphic

materials and data compilations from which information can be obtained; (5) any materials using other means of preserving thought or expression; and (6) any tangible things from which data or information can be obtained, processed, recorded, or transcribed. The term "record" also shall mean any drafts, alterations, amendments, changes, or modifications of or to any of the foregoing.

Please provide copies of the requested records to us at our Washington, D.C. office, located at 501 School Street, S.W., Suite 725, Washington, DC 20024, within ten (10) business days of your receipt of this request. If the requested records cannot be produced within ten (10) business days, please notify us in writing of the reason for the delay and the date by which the requested records will be available.

If any responsive record or portion thereof is claimed to be exempt from production, please provide sufficient identifying information with respect to each allegedly exempt record or portion thereof to allow us to assess the propriety of the claimed exemption. A.R.S. 39-121.01. Additionally, any reasonably segregable portion of a record otherwise exempt from disclosure is required to be made available after deletion of the portions that are exempted by law.

Finally, Judicial Watch requests a waiver of any direct costs of duplication or statutory fees pursuant to A.R.S. 39-121.03 as the request is for noncommercial purposes. Judicial Watch is a non-profit, tax-exempt 501(c)(3) educational organization dedicated to increasing public understanding of the operations of government as well as the importance of ethics and the rule of law. Judicial Watch regularly requests information from public agencies about their operations and activities and disseminates this information to the public in furtherance of its educational mission. However, if any fee is to be charged for copying the requested records, please notify us in advance if the expected cost is likely to exceed \$100.00.

Dear Mr. Althen:

This letter is in response to your public records request dated December 11, 2009. Attached please find an invoice in the amount of \$342.11. Please return a copy of the attached invoice along with your remittance to the attention of Marsha Spencer in the Phoenix City Attorney's Office, 200 W. Washington, Suite 1300, Phoenix, Arizona 85003-1611. Upon receipt of your payment, the Mayor's Public Calendar from December 2007 through June 2009 will be forwarded to your Washington D.C. office. If you want the Mayor's Public Calendar from August 2009 to present, we will need to request these records, which will take time to obtain, and there will be additional copying and postage fees for these records.

As you know, the public records law does not require the disclosure of records where the countervailing interests of confidentiality, privacy or the best interests of the government outweigh the duty to disclose. *Carlson v. Pima County*, 141 Ariz. 487 (1984). When the release of information will have a harmful effect on the duties of the officials in question, disclosure is not required. *Arizona Bd. of Regents v. Phoenix Newspapers, Inc.*, 167 Ariz. 254 (1991).

Due to these recognized interests, the City is not disclosing daily logs which list the drop-off and pick-up locations of the Mayor throughout the day. The Mayor's security detail is charged with the duty of protecting the Mayor. In the past, threats have been made against the Mayor's safety and the logs you are requesting demonstrate a pattern of activity which could easily be used by anyone to determine the time and location of the Mayor. It also discloses the location and time that he may be alone, without the protection of his security detail. This information, in the hands of inappropriate people, could be used to undermine the Mayor's safety, as well as undermine the efforts and duties of the security detail.

In addition, the information in the logs reflect private, confidential information relating to the Mayor and his family members. It also contains information related to private meetings held by the Mayor. The disclosure of this information not only violates the Mayor's right to privacy, but also undermines the

deliberative process of the Mayor's office. Such disclosure would inhibit access to the broad spectrum of persons and viewpoints which the Mayor seeks to govern effectively. Under these circumstances, the courts have reasoned that disclosure of this type of information reflects the elected official's deliberative process. Courts, uniformly, have held that disclosure of the deliberative process under these circumstances has been deemed contrary to the public interest, and therefore the documents are not subject to disclosure. See, *Times Mirror Co., v. Superior Court, State of California*, 53 Cal. 3d 1325, 813 P.2d 240, 283 Cal Rptr. 893, (Sup. Ct. 1991) and the cases cited therein.

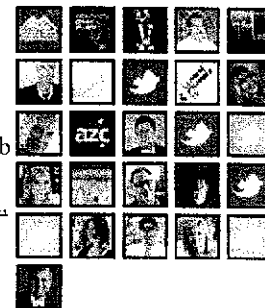
