RE: Colorado DHS Compliance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 ("NVRA")

Dear Ms. Beye:

Thank you for taking the time to send a representative in your stead to the August 5, 2009 NVRA meeting with the Secretary of State's office. We are writing to discuss NVRA noncompliance at agency offices and what remedial measures you plan to implement in your role as the ultimate authority and administrator of DHS in Colorado. We participated in two separate meetings with the Secretary of State's office and county agency directors, both of which were very positive and productive. It is clear that the Secretary of State is providing both support and direction to the county agency directors on what is required for compliance with the law. It is also clear that the agency directors are interested in doing what needs to be done to ensure compliance at their offices. Of course, you are the ultimate authority on agency procedures, with the county directors as agents of the state department. Colo. Rev. Stat. §§ 26-1-108; 26-1-118. Given that you are responsible for the administration of DHS, we would like to know what steps you are taking to ensure NVRA compliance at the agency offices. As we told Ms. McDonough and the county directors at the meeting, data collected by both Project Vote and the Secretary of State suggests that some offices are still operating out of compliance with federal law, despite more than a year of continued discussions on this issue and two letters communicating our intent to initiate litigation if DHS fails to comply.¹

In particular, we are concerned that the DHS offices in Denver County are operating out of compliance. The County's own voter registration reports are enough to suggest noncompliance. Besides the fact that Denver has reported numbers that seem quite low for such a populous county, the numbers of voter registration opportunities that are accounted for vary widely by reporting period. For example, the County reported the total number of people offered voter registration during the first two weeks of June 2009 was 506, while the number of offers during the second half of that same month was 1,023. Unless Denver County regularly serves twice as many people during the second half of the month as it does during the first half, these numbers suggest a reporting and possibly compliance problem. In light of this report, the current NVRA procedures at the Denver offices warrant immediate attention by your office.

As we discussed at the August 5 meeting, Project Vote conducted a survey of both Denver DHS clients and office staff members during March 2009. At that time, we surveyed a total of 19 clients at the three Denver DHS offices. Despite the fact that all clients surveyed had completed NVRA covered transactions, none of those clients reported having been offered voter registration. In addition, office staff were unclear of their responsibilities under the law. An employee at the Tremont office told our surveyor that she had to mail the voter registration application herself, and that the registration applications were not included in the benefits applications. An employee at the Peoria Street office also stated that the voter registration application was not normally given out in the benefits package.

On June 9, 2009, we gave you notice of these problems in a "re-notice" letter that was sent to the Secretary of State and copied to you. (See enclosed.) When we returned to the Denver offices during the first week of August 2009, we found almost no change. Voter registration applications were not distributed with the benefit applications, as required by law. Staff at the Colorado Works program desks were completely unaware of their NVRA responsibilities. When asked where one could register to vote, a Colorado Works staff person in the Peoria Street office responded, "You can go to the motor vehicle department." When asked that same question, a Colorado Works staff person at the Federal Boulevard office responded, "I don't know."

Colorado's NVRA compliance problems do not lie with Denver County alone. Rather, DHS offices across the state report incredibly low numbers of voter registration applications. Some offices do not report at all. It is difficult to discern whether Colorado DHS clients are receiving the services they are owed by law if reporting is inconsistent or nonexistent. Moreover, it is impossible to identify procedural or training issues such as those discovered by our in-person survey if agency offices are not reporting the relative success of their voter registration services. Until agency offices adopt accurate and consistent reporting procedures, we are left to assume counties that collect very small numbers of voter registration applications – or none at all – are operating out of compliance with the law.

We have been working with both Wayne Munster and Christi Heppard of the Secretary of State's office for the past year in an attempt to rectify these compliance problems. As we are sure you would agree, the Secretary of State's office has shown a great deal of leadership by providing technical support, including a ready-made and easy to use online reporting tool for county offices to use in tracking their NVRA compliance. In fact, Secretary Buescher himself attended our meeting with both Denver and El Paso Counties, making it clear that he expects statewide compliance with the federal mandate. Patricia Wilson Pheanious, Director of the Denver County DHS office was present at that meeting as well, and she indicated her support of voter registration at the agency and her intent to work to move Denver County toward compliance.

While the support of the Secretary of State and individual county directors is certainly a necessary

component, the responsibility for rectifying the above listed NVRA violations, among others, ultimately falls to you. We have offered our services and technical support to the Secretary of State Buescher, Ms. Wilson Pheanious, and the rest of the county agency directors. We offer the same to you, and would be happy to provide you with additional information on how to accomplish this goal. We would like to set up a conference call to discuss this further. Please let us know what time would be convenient for you. Colorado has the potential to be a nationwide leader in agency voter registration. We remain hopeful that the state will achieve its potential in that regard. Nevertheless, Project Vote is committed to pursuing full compliance with the NVRA and will initiate litigation against DHS if it appears that the above violations are not corrected despite our repeated efforts.

Thank you for coming to our meeting to discuss ways to increase the efficiency of voter registration at CU-Boulder. The location is the Regent Administrative Center at CU-Boulder, Room 252. Attendees – (I apologize but I did not get the names of everyone) – Danny Katz from CoPIRG, Britt Havey from UCSU (student government), Boulder County Clerk and Recorder Hillary Hall, Christi Heppard and others from the Secretary of State's office, Yolanda Sheffield and Teresa James from Project Vote, and a representative from the Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs office.

Here is the proposed agenda:

- I. Introductions. We will have representatives from CU-Boulder's Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs Office, the CU student government, Boulder Clerk's Office, the Secretary of State and the non-profit world – CoPIRG and Project Vote.
- II. Lay out the Goal – To explore ways that students at CU-Boulder could more efficiently and effectively be registered to vote. With the state of Colorado's new, online voter registration option, there might be places where CU already collects or could collect the necessary information to update/register students to vote. There would be a number of benefits including potentially a reduction of errors, less paperwork/administrative costs for the county, and greater numbers of students registered and able to vote. CU-Boulder could create a model that could be used across the state.
- III. Ground rules – Before we explore our options, the Secretary of State and Boulder Clerk should review with us the current requirements to register to vote.
- IV. Options on the table – Project Vote has explored many options that universities and public assistance agencies could pursue and can lay these out to start our brainstorm
- V. Brainstorm other options – CU already interacts with students when they select classes, pay tuition or register for housing. Could voter registration be added to any of these transactions or any others?
- VI. Identify obstacles to the options we lay out and brainstorm and ways they could be addressed so we can see how many practical options might exist
- VII. Follow up plan – some of the options might need to be explored outside of this meeting to determine if they can work. So we can adjourn and have each agency/organization look into the options a bit more and vet them.
- VIII. In a few weeks – Come back together and make a decision about which options, if any, are worth exploring and talk about setting up a pilot project.

Attached there are some background materials by Project Vote and CoPIRG. They are not specifically for this meeting – they are broader in context – but hopefully provide some useful ideas for our discussion tomorrow.

Paperless Voter Registration in Colorado: *Expanding the Electorate Among Young, Low-Income, and Disabled Populations*



Paperless registration is the seamless integration of voter registration into existing agency transactions with the public such that completed voter registration applications can be transferred electronically to election officials. Paperless registration systems for colleges and public assistance agencies will provide convenient registration opportunities for groups traditionally underrepresented in the electorate. In addition, electronic voter registration can reduce costs associated with paper applications, help agencies to comply with the National Voter Registration Act more easily and consistently, and make Colorado a national leader in voter registration modernization.

Paperless Registration Will Allow Colorado to Reach Under-Registered Populations

Colorado's youth, low-income, and disabled populations are significantly underrepresented in the electorate. As of November, 2008, approximately 72 percent of Colorado's adult citizens were registered, which is close to both the national average (71 percent) and the median for all states (73 percent).¹ However:

- Only 58 percent of Colorado citizens between the ages of 18 to 29 were registered to vote as of November 2008. This is 14 points lower than the population of all adult citizens in Colorado.
- Only 68 percent of eligible Coloradans from households with incomes below \$25,000 a year were registered to vote in 2008. This is 14 points lower than those from households with incomes of \$60,000 or more, who were registered at a rate of 82 percent.
- Only 65 percent of disabled citizens between the ages of 18 and 64 were registered in 2008.

States implementing paperless registration at departments of motor vehicles have experienced dramatic increases in the number of clients accepting the offer to register, compared to when "motor voter" services were paper-based.² Integrating paperless registration into universities and public assistance agencies, therefore, would likely result in many citizens taking advantage of a seamless registration process. For instance, in 2006, Colorado had 308,000 students enrolled in courses at post-secondary institutions, and 223,000 applications for the Food Stamp Program alone.³ By integrating paperless registration into existing data collection systems at these sites, tens of thousands of Coloradans from under-registered groups could easily, efficiently, and inexpensively register to vote or update their registration records while transacting business they would have done anyway.

Paperless Registration Will Save Money and Reduce Errors

Significant cost savings have been realized with paperless voter registration. A survey conducted by U.S. PIRG Education Fund found that, in 100 counties surveyed, over 33 million dollars were spent on registration implementation and error-correction issues in 2008, including: administering

provisional balloting; part-time and overtime pay for data-entry personnel; correcting errors on registration forms; mailing acknowledgment cards; and other associated and jurisdiction-specific costs.⁴ (Certain other costs such as system-design costs, and outreach to citizens for registration, were not included.)

A streamlined system that allows for the electronic transmission of voter registration applications to election officials could reduce both clerical costs and costs associated with errors. For example:

- Maricopa County, Arizona reports that processing paperless voter registrations costs 3 cents per application compared to 83 cents for paper applications. Indeed, the county reports 2008 cost savings in data entry alone that equaled the cost of eight full-time employees.⁵
- Delaware's electronic registration system has saved the state over \$200,000 a year from its election budget and has eliminated 5 positions.⁶ The state's planned move to a fully paperless registration system will save an additional \$100,000 over four years.⁷

Moreover, an electronic voter registration system at public assistance and disability agencies would reduce costs associated with NVRA-related paperwork and reduce the likelihood that rights conferred by the NVRA are violated by these agencies.

Addressing Privacy Concerns Related to Paperless Registration

Colorado can comply with state and federal privacy laws while transferring information collected by public assistance agencies and universities to state and/or county election officials. See attached document "Security and Privacy: Linking College and University Databases to Colorado's Online Voter Registration Portal."

Planning and Implementation: Issues to Be Addressed

While automatic registration presents the opportunity for cost savings for governments and improved access for citizens, there are several issues that will need to be explored prior to developing a plan, including:

- What current transactions with the public allow for integration of voter registration?
- What current laws, technologies, and office procedures may present barriers to implementation of electronic transmission of voter registration applications?
- What legal issues, privacy or otherwise, must be considered when proposing new methods of registration with e-transmission?
- What are the short term costs of implementation (keeping in mind that there may be savings over time)?
- Will interfaces between different institutions be able to inform the user if a signature is already on file for purposes of registration?
- If a signature is currently not on file, how will the process capture signatures or deal with the lack of signatures?

Security and Privacy: Linking College and University Databases to Colorado's Online Voter Registration Portal

Summary:

As we pursue modernizing our voter registration system, we must do so in a way that maintains the current levels of database protection at both the federal and at a state level.

When transferring information that is currently collected by universities and colleges, we must update the public state voter rolls without exposing information that is currently kept private under either state or federal law, as well as build off the experiences of the administrators on the ground in CO when determining security safeguards.

General Transparency Recommendations to Assist in Privacy and Security:

- Publish on the main election board website a complete notice of policies and practices describing the collection, maintenance, use, and disclosure of voter registration data procured from college and university databases. The notice should include contact information for the office or the officials responsible for the voter registration data.
- Publish a readable summary and an online summary at origin database site (i.e. the college websites)
- Provide a copy of the complete notice to any person who requests it from the state election office
- Place a date and version number on notices as they are published.
- Develop and publish detailed requirements for the clearance of employees authorized to view, search, enter, edit, and delete information in the online voter registration database
- Develop secure audit logs that are impervious to manual modifications
- Allow individuals access to their online voter registration file once information has been submitted from another source. (i.e. college database)

Legislative Background:

Federal and State information on databases is protected by the Privacy Act (and corresponding amendments) of 1974. Most federal and state databases have additional rules and operation regulations that have been put in place by agencies. For example homeless shelter and food stamp records are regulated by the Housing and Urban Development agencies' guidelines for the HMIS (Homeless Management Information System). Some agencies have information available for sale and public consumption and some do not. For instance the postal service database already sells the information that is entered into change of address forms to their Locatable Address Conversion System to paying customers.

College and university databases which could be drawn from will fall under the protection of both the Privacy Act and the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act.

FERPA was passed in 1974 with the express purpose of protecting the privacy of any student's information that attends a school financed by the U.S. Department of Education.

The act guarantees that students have access to their records and have an opportunity to have some records amended. Schools are not allowed to give out any information about student's addresses, ages or anything deemed personal to any third party without students giving their legal consent. Turning over information to a voting agency would be in direct violation of this act. However, several mechanisms for exceptions have been made.

1) By getting prior written consent from the student, information can be passed to a state voter registration portal. If a student gives written consent, the school can forward information anywhere. Written consent could be gained from students on their application or at any sort of orientation or registration for new students.

2) There were five exemptions to the "prior written consent" rule that were originally built in to the law and more exemptions have been added since. For instance, state officials, companies dealing with financial aid, other colleges and universities, or military requests through the Solomon Amendment, can see the information upon request without any consent from students because it is written into FERPA.

Databases:

Following a U.S. PIRG research survey performed in January of 2009; it became clear that as long as an institution uses a recognizable database they would be able to transfer all the necessary information (current address, name, age, citizenship) to an online portal.

The majority of the 72 schools of differing sizes and regions surveyed use corporate databases to collect information on their new registering students. 40% use Banner, 30% use Jenzabar, 10% use Oracle PeopleSoft, and 6.6% used Datatel; the last 13.4% was made up of an assortment of single uses.

All of these databases collect the information needed to determine whether a student should be included on voter rolls. For example, the Sungard SCT Banner database includes, but is not limited to, address, identification and personal information including birth date and citizenship.

Sungard states they "provide solutions, strategic consulting and technology movement to...more than 1,600 institutions. That fact guarantees that 1,600 schools are ready to pass on their information immediately. Banner also claims that "data changes are available immediately."

Jenzabar claims that they service "700 campuses worldwide, including private liberal arts, medical, law, state and community colleges." The diversity of Jenzabar demonstrates how many different types of institutions would be immediately ready to share information with an online portal.

As requested, attached are the data from our SCORE voter registration program, which shows the number of registrations "coded" as being from an NVRA agency and completed by county clerks. We have not yet had a chance to do any in-depth review of our spreadsheet or side-by-side comparisons, but with your imminent departure I wanted to make sure you had the file. We may find that we need to modify the SCORE extract if the script wasn't set up correctly, although my very preliminary review looks good.

Our NVRA team plans to compare your spreadsheet with our SCORE data, keeping in mind we will likely find fluctuations, as discussed earlier in this email exchange. If you or someone at Project Vote plans and has time to do the same, we would be happy to schedule a call and chat about what we find. After a quick skim of the information, I was pleased to see that registrations have significantly increased over the past 18 months and appear to now be maintaining a fairly consistent level. These tools will help us to quickly detect, and mitigate where necessary, if a county experiences a decrease in their registrations.

Hi, Christi.

Hope you are well. Two questions for you:

1. I saw in the latest email from Angela a reference to the upcoming 2009 "coordinated" elections in CO. What are these? Local government elections? (I tried "googling" the phrase but didn't learn much.)

Response: "Coordinated" elections (see C.R.S. 1-1-104 (6.5)) are odd year elections. In Colorado, there may or may not be a statewide question on the ballot - there is not one for this year. Non-partisan offices like school district director and some municipal candidates will be on ballots. There may also be local ballot questions. Let me know if you need more specifics.

2. More importantly: Some college student groups in CO are considering working with their administrators to see how the online voter registration (OLVR) system could be built into some systems that interface with students regularly. In other words, just as we want the final phase of the human services application interface to have the a seamless inclusion of online voter registration, so they hope that housing or financial aid or course registration systems on campuses could include a voter registration confirmation system. If school administrators are interested in exploring this idea, are you all willing to meet with them to see what could be developed? They wanted us to ask, and I figured you would at least be willing to meet about it, so let me know.

Response: Certainly we would be willing to meet with school administrators and other interested parties to discuss OLVR. Accomplishing this goal might be as easy as putting a link to our online voter registration system on the school's interface.

We've been talking to a national group that organizes students (the Public Interest Research Group or US PIRG) about this campus idea. At some point we want to share with you the flowchart we've been working on for how voter registration might best be seamlessly integrated into human services websites or campus websites. I think that would help to make sure that we are all on the same page (or getting closer to it) for how thoroughly integrated we would see the OLVR system working with the benefits or students web interfaces. Hope that all makes sense.

I'm sorry, Teresa. Timing couldn't be worse right now. I'm out for the rest of the week.

I've attached our internal policy and a flowchart our staff use that should give you an idea of the process we use.

I know you've seen a dramatic increase in our numbers, and while that does reflect an increased effort on our part to register people, I don't think the declination numbers being submitted are very accurate. We tend to get a lot of complaints from clients who are being asked multiple times if they would like to register (with a separate declination form being completed each time). There is not a very good central mechanism in place to keep track, so staff are asking people over and over. (Which is good from a compliance standpoint, but not a very good reflection of how many people are actually declining the opportunity to register.) We have been asking the state for the last few years to simply add a screen to CBMS which could ensure compliance by making a mandatory "have you asked" box and allowing for a set of electronic declination boxes which could be reported to SOS on a monthly basis. We believe this would be an easy solution and would lead to better data. It would also provide an internal control -- the number of applications forwarded to the Clerk should match the number reflected in CBMS of those who requested to complete an application. And, it would dramatically cut down on the amount of paper moving around -- which is another one of our biggest issues.

Background

Congress enacted the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) in order to increase participation in federal elections by reducing barriers to voter registration and by requiring states to play a more active role in registering citizens. Section 7 of the NVRA, as well as Colorado Revised Statutes 1-2-505, require the Denver Department of Human Services (Department) to offer applicants / clients voter registration opportunities with each application, redetermination, or change of address.

Policy

1. The Department, and those working on behalf of the Department, will provide the following services to Food Assistance Program, Medicaid, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), and Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP) applicants and clients who are eligible to vote:
 - Provide the individual with an approved voter registration application;
 - Assist the individual in completing the application, unless the individual refuses such assistance;
 - Provide the individual with a declination form containing the specific question, "If you are not registered to vote where you live now, would you like to apply to register to vote here today?" along with a check-off box indicating the individual's choice; and

- Accept completed voter registration application forms and transmit them promptly to the Denver County Clerk and Recorder's Office.
- These services will be provided at all Department locations.
2. Department staff will be encouraged to provide the services above to all adult applicants of other programs as well, to ensure all those wishing to register to vote are provided an opportunity.
 3. Department staff will not:
 - Seek to influence an applicant's political preference or party registration;
 - Display any political preference or party allegiance;
 - Make any statement to an applicant or take any action, the purpose or effect of which is to discourage the applicant from registering to vote; and/or
 - Make any statement to an applicant or take any action, the purpose or effect of which is to lead the applicant to believe that a decision to register or not to register has any bearing on the availability of services or benefits.
 4. The Department will ensure the confidentiality of individuals registering or declining to register to vote. Applications completed at the Department will not be used for any purpose other than voter registration.

Procedures

1. All application packets or recertification / redetermination packets mailed directly by the Department will contain the attached Agency-Based Voter Registration Application.
 - The attached instructional Voter Registration Application Letter will be included in all mailings that contain the Agency-Based Voter Registration Application.
2. Department staff, and those working on behalf of the Department, at all locations will have access to and distribute the attached Agency-Based Voter Registration Application to all U.S. citizens over 18 years of age (or who will be 18 on or before the next election) who come into the Department to apply for Food Assistance Program, Medicaid, TANF, or CCCAP benefits, as well as to those seeking recertification or redetermination of benefits, as well as to those requesting a change of address for current benefits.

Department staff at all locations are encouraged to also distribute the Application to all U.S. citizens over 18 years of age (or who will be 18 on or before the next election) who come into the Department to apply for other programs as well. (Note: Those individuals who have been convicted of a criminal offense are not eligible to vote until they have served their sentence, including parole.)

- Office of Economic Development, Division of Workforce Development (DWD) workers will offer clients who are changing an address the opportunity to register to vote. These procedures will be followed by both Department and DWD staff.
3. Those who do not wish to complete the Voter Registration Application will be requested to fill out the first page of the Application or the attached separate Declination-Only Form instead. After the individual has provided his/her name, date, and signature, the staff member will initial the top of the page and write the date and time received.
 - Staff are encouraged to use the Declination-Only Form whenever possible to save paper.
 - If the individual refuses to fill out and/or sign the declination form, the staff member assisting him/her will write REFUSAL on a Declination-Only Form, mark the "I do not want to apply to register to vote today" box, initial the top of the page and write the date and time received.
 4. Staff will verbally offer assistance to those who decide to register to vote. Staff will provide the same degree of assistance with regard to the completion of the Registration Application as is provided with regard to the completion of benefit applications, unless the applicant refuses such assistance. Department staff will review the provided Voter Registration Application to ensure it has been completed in its entirety.
 5. Those applicants or clients who complete the Voter Registration Application will also be requested to fill out the first page of the Application, marking the first box noting that they do wish to apply, and signing.
 6. Those individuals who complete the Registration Application in person at the Department will be provided with the bottom portion / voter's receipt of the form. Staff may complete the voter's receipt on behalf of the individual.

7. Department staff who interview applicants / clients over the phone, or receive a change of address request from a client over the phone, will offer the applicant or client the opportunity to register to vote. If the applicant / client would like to register, the staff member will mail a registration application along with a return envelope to the applicant / client. If the applicant / client chooses not to register, the staff member will complete a Declination-Only Form in the same way as if the client refused to fill out the declination.
8. Upon being provided a completed registration application or declination form, Department staff will immediately put the date and time received on the top of the page and initial.
9. Staff will note in CBMS Case Comments that the individual has been offered the opportunity to register and that documentation has been completed and forwarded. Department staff will also note in CBMS Case Comments if an individual was not offered the opportunity to register and why (not U.S. citizen, not 18 years of age, on parole).
10. Staff will forward all completed forms to their supervisors (or other designated individual) at the conclusion of each work day. Supervisors will forward completed declination forms and completed registration applications to an authorized Family and Adult Division staff member on a weekly basis. Note: Supervisors may need to provide completed forms more frequently as a deadline for registering approaches.
11. The Family and Adult Division staff member authorized to collect completed applications will forward all completed registration applications to the Denver County Clerk and Recorder's Office no later than ten (10) days after the date the Department received the completed registration application from an individual. If a registration application is received within five (5) days before the last day for registration to vote in an election, the application will be forwarded to the Denver County Clerk and Recorder's Office not later than five (5) days after the date the Department received the completed registration application from an individual.
12. The authorized Family and Adult Division staff member will provide the Compliance Office with a weekly update reflecting how many completed applications and how many declination forms were received each week.

13. Declination forms will be forwarded to and maintained by the Department's Compliance Office. Declination forms and registration applications will not be subject to subpoena and will be kept confidential. Forms will be retained for two years by the Department's Compliance Office, after which time the forms will be destroyed.
14. The Compliance Office will provide the following information to the Colorado Secretary of State's Office twice a month, on the 5th and the 20th:
 - Reporting period;
 - County name;
 - Agency name and address;
 - Name of the agency director and name of the person submitting the information;
 - Number of those choosing to register to vote;
 - Number of those who changed their voter registration address;
 - Number of those declining to vote;
 - Number of those who are already registered to vote;
 - Number of those refusing to fill out the declination form; and
 - Number of completed applications forwarded to the Denver Clerk and Recorder.
15. The attached general (not Agency-Based) Voter Registration Application will be available in public areas of all Department locations. The Department will not track the number of general Applications provided. However, if a completed Application is turned in to a Department staff member, the Department will forward that Application to the Clerk and Recorder through the same process outlined above.
16. An authorized Family and Adult Division staff member will order new Agency-Based Voter Registration Applications and general Voter Registration Applications as needed from the Secretary of State's Office, and will ensure that all Department staff have access to Agency-Based Voter Registration Applications and Declination-Only Forms.

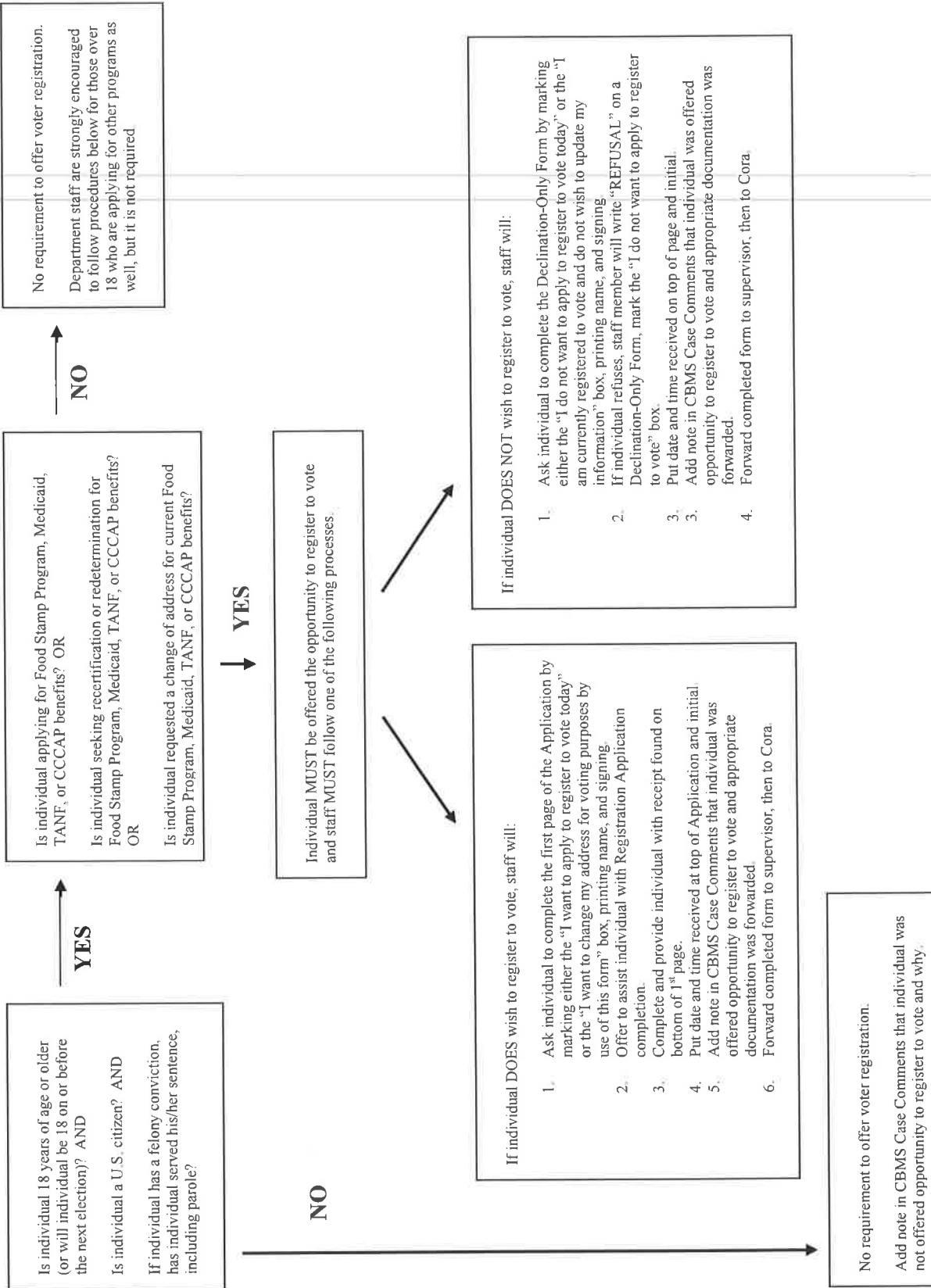

El Paso County, Colo. Exemplifies Voter Reg. Turnaround for Low Income Citizens

Fifteen years following the passage of National Voter Registration Act, few states are abiding by the law to make voter registration more accessible to all citizens, particularly those who apply for public assistance. But one Colorado county is proving that this does not have to be the case, no matter how "busy" or "underfunded" a program may be because expanding access to the democratic process is as simple as it is priceless.

Since its inception in 1995, compliance with a key provision of the NVRA that requires public assistance agencies to offer voter registration services to its clients has declined by 79 percent. Earlier this summer, Project Vote was working with Colorado officials to bring the state into compliance when it noticed the densely populated El Paso County was seriously out of step with the NVRA.

After being notified of their noncompliance in all four public assistance sites, which provide TANF, Food Stamps, Medicaid, and other benefits, Acting Director of El Paso County Department of Human Services Rick Bengtsson and the Colorado Benefits Management System collaborated to integrate voter registration with

regular services. Since April, the number of clients offered voter registration services has increased sevenfold. How did they make such a quick turnaround? By simply making it part of the every day workload and holding offices accountable, said Bengtsson.

“The first thing we did was make sure we had sufficient [voter registration] forms in stock,” Bengtsson said. Then, they made sure every site attached voter registration applications to every public assistance form and implemented a staff training on NVRA and how to apply it to public assistance services.

Finally, to keep all sites accountable for providing voter registration services, Bengtsson appointed the Dept. of Human Services’ quality assurance specialist to monitor voter registration at all public assistance sites in addition to the public assistance data she was already collecting.

“She now is collecting, reviewing, and tabulating the [voter registration] numbers, so she can report back to each of our managers to ensure that the appropriate steps are being taken, forms are being properly filled out...and being forwarded to the clerk and recorder,” he said. “I think the big point is having one person who is not only accountable for collecting the forms, but knowing that we’re in compliance. It helps to have a compliance specialist, someone who is really analyzing and ensuring that we’re following the law.”

Bengtsson says another important component in keeping this opportunity available for low income citizens is “helping staff understand the importance” of providing voter registration at public assistance agencies. “It’s the law – it’s an opportunity for our citizens to participate in our political process.”

“I know it’s an additional workload issue,” he said. “If it becomes part of the daily process, it really isn’t that difficult to get this done.”

Having only learned of the NVRA’s mandates earlier this summer, El Paso County Commissioner Sallie Clark demonstrated the need to be aware of the law and following it, above all else. While expressing concerns about the increasingly high number of public assistance clients and the declining resources impeding their ability to facilitate voter registration properly, Clark recognizes the importance of voter registration access, particularly for the people that they serve.

“I think that our workers really understand the reasons behind the law and the reasoning is to ensure that citizens who are sometimes disenfranchised have easy access to their fundamental privileges of voting.” Clark said.

However, “a majority of our clients don’t have adequate transportation and aren’t in jobs that allow flexibility to go to the clerk and recorder’s office during the day, so there is sometimes more concern about their basic needs than the register to vote,” she said. “But I do think that offering the service in the agency - and they do visit us on a fairly regular basis - ensures that they are given the information they need to make the decision about whether they should register to vote or not.”

Both Clark and Bengtsson agree that working with other state leaders to efficiently make voter registration part of the state’s services is key to successfully helping citizens in need not only get public assistance, but also a chance to participate in the democratic process. Bengtsson says that the state is working towards creating online assistance payments applications which would also link to online voter registration opportunities. Clark cautions against the viability of this option.

“The only problem is that some people that are on public assistance don’t have access to computers, so while they can go to the library, they can just as easily go down to the offices of human services,” she said. “I think it’s about accessibility to registering to vote...It’s something we would like to see people do – take an active role in the people that they elect.”

Dear Secretary Buescher:

On May 14, 2008, Project Vote and Demos sent a letter to Karen L. Beye, Secretary of the Colorado Department of Human Services ("CDHS"), and then-Secretary of State Mike Coffman officially notifying them of the state's violation of Section 7 of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 ("NVRA"). The nature of the violations was illustrated in those letters, copies of which are attached.

Under the NVRA, with 90 days notice, an aggrieved person may bring litigation against any noncompliant parties. *See* 42 U.S.C. § 1973gg-9(b)(2). That notice period elapsed on August 12, 2008. As you are aware, we have been in communication with CDHS and with your staff on this issue since December 2007. While we recognize your staff for its recent efforts to bring state public assistance agencies into compliance with Section 7 of the NVRA, it is unfortunate that the response from CDHS has been so inadequate to date. Our detailed analysis of CDHS offices across the state confirms the continued failure of CDHS to meet its responsibilities under the NVRA.

In March 2009, Project Vote conducted surveys of random CDHS offices across the state to evaluate compliance of Section 7 of the NVRA. CDHS remains out of compliance with the law. None of the clients we surveyed in Denver and El Paso Counties were offered a voter registration application. The staff at a Denver County office reported that voter registration applications are automatically provided to clients, but this doesn't seem to be the case. In Jefferson and Larimer Counties, there were sporadic offering of voter registration. In Larimer County, those people who were there to apply for benefits for the first time were offered voter registration, while those who were there to recertify or renew their benefits or to change their address were not offered a voter registration application. In Jefferson County, the only clients who received a voter registration application were those who met with a caseworker during their visit to the office.

CDHS has had a year and a half to comply with the NVRA. We are left with no choice but to prepare for litigation. We hope that before litigation begins, you will contact us and initiate a series of aggressive procedures to bring CDHS into compliance. We are happy to share

information on procedures that have proved successful in bringing other states into compliance. To the extent we can provide any additional assistance that might turn the tide at CDHS, we are willing to meet with you to accomplish that goal.

Our office is in receipt of your letter dated June 9, 2009, wherein you have expressed your intent to prepare for litigation in Colorado under Section 7 of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 ("NVRA"). As we stated in our response to your letter in August of 2008, our office is committed to Colorado's renewed compliance effort, and we have continued to work closely with your organization in furtherance of that commitment.

Over the past year, the Secretary of State's office has worked closely with the Colorado Department of Human Services ("CDHS") and local public assistance agencies to improve compliance and improve statistical reporting throughout the state. Our office has implemented an aggressive educational outreach program that includes the development of a PowerPoint training presentation for use by the local agencies, as well as onsite training at regional locations. Our team is scheduled to conduct onsite training for a minimum of 100 public assistance agency staff later this summer and anticipates more such training sessions to be scheduled in the coming months.

The use of an online survey tool to collect agency statistical reports has allowed us to identify and address potential areas of concern, resulting in a significant increase in agency voter registration in 2008. Our office has, and will continue, working closely with Project Vote in order to increase local agency compliance. We have shared the results of the survey data with Project Vote and attended several conference call and in-person meetings over the past several months in an effort to facilitate communication with CDHS and local agencies.

We have three meetings scheduled this week to continue discussing how to bring local public assistance agencies into full compliance. On August 4, 2009, a meeting is scheduled with our office, WIC, and Project Vote. In the morning of August 4, 2009, we are scheduled to meet jointly with

As we have discussed on several occasions, Colorado will begin including a voter registration application with the centrally-mailed applications for renewal of services sent to the state's DHS clients, thereby relieving local offices from sending a separate mailing. You may also be aware that Colorado has contracted with a professional usability firm to completely redesign our standard voter registration application; I believe we have solicited your comments on the proposed design. We will apply that design to the agency registration form next year after design is finalized. In the meantime, we are proposing to utilize Colorado's current agency form for the centralized mailings. We have shortened this form from two pages to one page, with agency-related information on the back, in order to lessen the impact on mailing and printing costs. As such, please review the attached agency voter registration application we propose to use for central mailings on an interim basis. We welcome your comments and suggestions, particularly on the second page where various information, including mandatory language required by the NVRA, is included.

As a side note, we will be switching the color of the application from yellow to green because CDHS already utilizes yellow colored paper for another document contained in the renewal application. Our county clerks have been made aware of the color change to ensure proper handling and coding.

Because we would like to begin including the agency voter application with the renewal packets as soon as possible, please provide your comments and suggestions to us no later than Tuesday, October 20, 2009.

Finally, please note that I have included Judd Choate, Colorado's new Elections Director, on this email. While Wayne and I will remain your points of contact for NVRA matters, Judd will oversee our efforts. Should you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact us.

Also, if you decide not to use this application to register to vote, that decision will remain confidential. It will not affect the service you receive from the agency or office.
- Colorado law requires identification at the polls and for first time voters who vote by Mail-In Ballot. Types of approved ID may be found on the Secretary of State's website at <http://www.sos.state.co.us>. You may also speak to a Secretary of State Election Division representative at (303) 894-2200 or you may contact your County Clerk and Recorder's office for information.
- You should receive an official information card from your County Clerk and Recorder approximately 20 days from receipt of your registration form at your clerk and recorder's office. The information card will confirm your registration form has been received and processed by the County Election Department. If you do not receive the information card, please call your County Clerk and Recorder for verification that your application was received.
- If you require additional voter registration application forms for yourself or your household, please contact the State agency or public office representative.
- Hearing impaired persons may call the state TDD number at (303) 869-4867.

TO REGISTER TO VOTE

You must:

- Be a U.S. Citizen.
- Register to vote no later than 29 days before the election.
- Be 18 years old on or before the date of the election in which you want to vote.

- Complete the fields marked "Required" on the application, including your complete address with apartment or unit number.



PERMANENT MAIL-IN BALLOT INFORMATION

After the County Clerk & Recorder receives your completed application or letter to receive a Permanent Mail-In Ballot, your name will be placed on a list to receive a Mail-In Ballot for each applicable election. Your name will remain on this list until you request that your name be removed, your Mail-In Ballot is returned as "Undeliverable," or your voter registration record is marked "Inactive."

ELECTION OFFENSES

Colorado law provides penalties for submitting a false voter registration application and for submitting false information as to the voter's qualifications or place of present residence, as well as other election related offenses. See C.R.S. 1-2-228, 1-13-104, 1-13-106 and 1-13-201 et seq. The penalties provided are set forth in the Colorado Criminal Code, C.R.S. 18-1-101 et seq.

Christi:

Upon reflecting on our conversation this morning, I wanted to add a few thoughts on the concept of paperless registration by way of redirecting the client away from the CDHS website to the SOS online voter registration page. We have a few initial concerns that could potentially be overcome by someone with technological skills that I lack.

First and foremost, we are concerned that a client who is directed away from the CDHS application for benefits to an entirely different website will immediately decide against registering to vote, as it appears that the process of registering to vote is not part of the application for benefits. There could be two reasons for this. First, the client may be unsure whether or not she will be able to resume her application for benefits where she left off if she starts filling out forms on an entirely different website, and her main priority is to complete the benefits application. That client would likely click back to the benefits application for fear of "losing her work" or not being able to complete the main part of her application. Second, even a client who does not fear taking the detour to a different website may well be dissuaded from doing a transaction with the SOS when her purpose is to do a transaction with CDHS. In other words, sending an online client to the SOS website if she wants to register to vote would be the practical equivalent of telling an in-person client who appeared at the CDHS office to walk across the street to the SOS office to fill out the voter registration form. A wholly separate website makes it clear that voter registration is available in Colorado through the SOS, but not as an integral part of the application for benefits process at CDHS.

Of course, the NVRA requires that the voter registration application be distributed as part of the CDHS transaction, and that the agency offer the client equal assistance with filling out the form. We suggest that the SOS simply create an agency based online voter registration form on its website that looks and feels like a seamless part of the CDHS process. The website/form would be accessed by PEAK if the client indicates online that she wants to update her voter registration information or apply to register to vote for the first time. It would be most helpful if PEAK could somehow send already collected information to the SOS website and pre-populate that online form. I know commercial businesses do this, but I am ill-equipped to discuss the logistics for how this could be done. I am sure your technical people would have input on this. The declination/preference form could also be distributed electronically and client responses could be automatically sent to your office and maintained by the SOS. This would completely eliminate any survey monkey reporting by CDHS staff.

I am going to forward you the email I sent to Dara Hessee a few minutes ago, detailing my thoughts on how this might be done most efficiently considering the system(s) that you have right now. My email includes an example of an electronic declination/preference form that was designed by the North Carolina State Board of Elections. The client fills out the form electronically at the agency and the forms are automatically transmitted to the BOE. North Carolina submitted this form to DOJ for approval as part of their pre-clearance requirements under the Voting Rights Act. DOJ approved the form for use.

Thank you again for taking the time to speak to me today. I hope we can keep in contact about this very exciting possibility, as it seems changes must be made quickly if they will be implemented in PEAK.

Wayne and Christi:

We am writing to let you know about some exciting developments in agency voter registration. Secretaries of States across the nation are taking the lead in voter registration by designating additional voter registration agencies under the NVRA. We know how hard you are working to make sure Colorado is at the top of the pack – we are writing to request that Secretary of State Buescher be the next to designate additional voter registration agencies.

As you know, the NVRA authorizes the chief election official in each state to designate voter registration agencies. Executive Order 12926, signed by President Clinton in 1994, requires federal agencies to cooperate with such designation by state officials. In particular, we would ask that Secretary of State Buescher designate the following federal agencies to be voter registration agencies in Colorado: the Social Security Administration in its administration of Supplemental Security Income and Social Security Disability Insurance; the Indian Health Service of Department of Health and Human Services; the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services in its conduct of naturalization ceremonies; and the medical and homeless facilities, and military pay/personnel offices of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

These agencies serve increasing numbers of underrepresented citizens in Colorado and across the United States. We have attached a fact sheet to this email as a guide to the impact designation of the above listed agencies could have on the American electorate. California, Vermont, and North Carolina have already made such designations. We have

attached designation letters from those Secretaries of State for your review, as well as a sample letter template.

Please let us know whether you need us to submit an additional letter of request for designation, or if this email request is sufficient. We are happy to send you whatever might be necessary.

Doug,

I understand the juggling thing – I have 3 major projects going at the same time so it all starts to run together.

The short answer is, no, county clerks will not initially be able to track the centrally-mailed forms separately from in-person registrations completed at an agency office. Although we would like to do this in the future, it would require a fairly substantial (and therefore expensive) modification to our statewide voter registration system to add an additional tracking code. Hopefully, we can add the code at some point in the future.

However, keep in mind that we will be able to get the number of centrally-mailed applications versus applications that are offered in person. I am anxious to see how much, if any, this additional mailing will further increase our voter registrations from agencies, although it will take a few months to identify and feel comfortable with the trends. Also, I think we can do some extrapolating of data to get what you are looking for by comparing the number of applications that local agency offices send to counties against the total number of applications received by counties.

Finally, just let me know if you guys do discuss this and have recommended modifications for the proposed application – we welcome your thoughts. If I don't hear from you in the next few days, we'll go ahead and put our printing order in so we can get the process moving. This is a major accomplishment for us and I'm excited to put it into action.

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As we have discussed on several occasions, Colorado will begin including a voter registration application with the centrally-mailed applications for renewal of services sent to the state's DHS clients, thereby relieving local offices from sending a separate mailing. You may also be aware that Colorado has contracted with a professional usability firm to completely redesign our standard voter registration application; I believe we have solicited your comments on the proposed design. We will apply that design to the agency registration form next year after design is finalized. In the meantime, we are proposing to utilize Colorado's current agency form for the centralized mailings. We have shortened this form from two pages to one page, with agency-related information on the back, in order to lessen the impact on mailing and printing costs. As such, please review the attached agency voter registration application we propose to use for central mailings on an interim basis. We welcome your comments and suggestions, particularly on the second page where various information, including mandatory language required by the NVRA, is included.

As a side note, we will be switching the color of the application from yellow to green because CDHS already utilizes yellow colored paper for another document contained in the renewal application. Our county clerks have been made aware of the color change to ensure proper handling and coding.

Christi and Andrea,

Thank you for sending the revised Colorado voter registration application to us for comments. Project Vote team members have reviewed it and have the following comments.

There are several very effective sections. The voting by mail/permanent voting by mail section is clear and very readable, and the information sections on eligibility, Voter ID and felony convictions are comprehensive.

We recommend some improvements, such as changing "I would like to be an election judge or poll worker " to " I would like information on being an election judge or poll worker," because many people who would otherwise be interested may be reluctant to say yes because they do not know what the work entails or even that they would be compensated for their time.

The two boxes after the question about the last four digits of the SNN may give the appearance that the first 5 numbers of the SSN must be also be provided. We'd recommend having only one box for the last four digits of the SSN. This section is otherwise excellent in the way that it breaks down the question into three parts.

For the option choice for people who don't have an SSN or DL, we'd recommend adding an explanation in parentheses such as "you will be assigned a unique voter registration number."

We recommend putting the self-affirmation section and information under the signature line in the same size font as the rest of the form. Additionally, we recommend changing this sentence after t

"A violation of the self-affirmation, of which you are about to make, is a criminal act under the laws of this state and you will be subject to the penalties provided by law,"

to

"Violating the terms of the self-affirmation is a criminal act under the laws of this state and punishable as provided by law. "

Different members of our team had different reactions to the general readability. For some the type was very small, for me, the regular type was too light. It would be a good idea to test the readability of the form in various web browsers and screen sizes. Your vendor is probably doing this already.

Here are our comments:

1. The Identification section asks for the last 4 digits of the social security number, but the box for the applicant to fill out has spaces for the entire SSN. This may be confusing to some voters. We suggest you ask for the last 4 digits and leave 4 blank spaces for the applicant to fill in (with an obvious instruction that the 4 spaces are for the last 4 of the SSN – we understand the original thinking behind including all 9 spaces is probably that people would most easily recognize that space as requiring SSN information.
2. Will there be a cover sheet that includes instruction on what the form is and where to send it? (“If you are not registered to vote or are not registered to vote where you live now, you can register by filling out the attached application and mailing to: _____. You can also return the completed form to any CDHS office where staff are available to assist you in filling out the form.”) We understand that the mailing address is on the back of the current form, but it is quite buried in a lot of text. Many applicants may be too overwhelmed by the amount of text on this form to read through it carefully to try and locate the instructions for where to send it. If you choose not to include a separate page with the basic instructions on where to mail, we would encourage you to move the mailing information to the top of the form in bold print or with some other way to make it stand out from the rest of the text. (It took us a while to find the mailing information, and we are quite accustomed to reading VR applications.) Is there a self-mailer envelope? Are clients encouraged to return the form in the packet they use to mail their recertification materials? This may simplify the mailing process for the client.
3. While we understand your intent to use the new, designed form to replace this form in the future, we would urge you to adopt the self-affirmation language in the new form immediately. The current agency form has a disclaimer under the “READ, SIGN AND DATE” line that includes an affirmation that “You intend to claim the present address as your sole legal place of residence, and in so doing, abandon claim to any other legal residence....” It then goes on to talk about taxes and concludes with the warning that if the self-affirmation is not true, you could be prosecuted. This paragraph is confusing and feels threatening as a result. (Do I have another “legal residence?” What would I be abandoning? How does this affect my tax return?) We noticed that the new, designed form does not include the wording of this particular paragraph – instead, the new form includes a fairly innocuous affirmation of claiming no other place as a legal resident. We think the new form is a great design and the wording of the disclaimer should do nothing to deter anyone from registering. We would urge you to use the self affirmation language from the new form in the current agency form in this mailing.
