In the EOD report there is mention of the Boston Globe - Sacchetti (the Globe reporter) – story that she is writing about Haitian TPS. Sacchetti's piece is focused on the local Boston area Haitian population and their experiences with TPS since the earthquake. She has interviewed the Boston DD, Denis Riordan and to bring you up to date further, during the Boston DD's conversation yesterday with Sacchetti, she specifically asked if any Haitian deferred action requests had been submitted to the Boston district. Denis did confirm that 'fewer than 30' had been received and are under review. He further explained that requests are submitted locally and reviewed locally and the DD forwards a recommendation to the RD for decision. She also understands that deferred action is handled on a case by case basis and we can not comment on specific cases.

She is now asking how many Haitians have requested deferred action nationally and how many overall deferred action (DA) requests does USCIS receive nationally each year (looking for the past few years).

Bill and I spoke with Debbie Rogers, Molly Groom and Julia Harrison about DA statistics and her request. They inform us that we do not track DA request numbers nationally and we do not categorize DA requests as to whether they are Haitian or not. However, as Denis indicated during his interview, regional field offices know the number of requests they are currently receiving and reviewing.

In order to respond to her request, we would like to get back to Sacchetti today (she's on deadline) to let her know that we do not track or categorize the number of DA requests received by USICS. However, we can survey our regional field offices and get her an estimated number some time next week. The numbers from the internal survey would not be able to be used within her time frame of today's deadline, but would allow us to respond to her request and be as transparent as possible.

Denise and Roxie: I met with Linda Swacina and her team yesterday and asked them to reach out to the CBOs to find out if they were holding deferred action requests for B-2 visitors from Haiti. It turns out that the two organizations have hundreds of requests on hold. They were holding the requests in anticipation of public guidance.

MIA has several stake holder events planned over the next few days and anticipate getting a lot of questions on this topic.

I have advised Linda to inform the CBOs that MIA will accept the requests now. It is not

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surprising that they have hundreds of cases since we know there were at least 1300 B-2s issued. The sooner we get the requests and the better.

I asked Ellen to prepare internal talkers and FAQs for MIA to use at tomorrow's community events. The draft FAQs are attached. We will write "internal use only" clearly on the final document.

As the SOP is on hold, it is critical that I provide MIA with some guidance before the meeting tomorrow.

Once we begin receiving the requests for deferred action we plan to take a task force approach in addressing this workload. We will be reaching out for legal and policy support.

Can you take a look at these internal talkers and FAQs and provide your comments by 4pm? I am sorry for the short turn around. We had hoped to have the SOP and talking points out last week which would have addressed a # of these issues.

Thanks for your attention. I am happy to arrange a con-call if it helps.

I wanted to alert you to the attached letter to S1 from the Embassy of Honduras requesting that we extend the TPS re-registration period which expires on July 6th. The request was made yesterday. The Embassy cited the bad economy as the reason to extend the re-registration period. We have discussed this with DHS Policy and they agree that we should not honor the request. As mentioned above the registration period is set to expire on Tuesday, so we would not have sufficient time even if we were inclined to extend the registration period. Additionally, we rarely extend TPS registration periods. Most recently it was done for Haiti of course, but prior to that it was done once for El Salvador a few years ago. El Salvador made the request well before the registration period began, the economy had just started to tank and they had over 260,000 folks to register. Honduras on the other had, has only 70,000 people to register and did not make the request until 5 days before the registration period is set to expire. We are drafting a courtesy letter for S1s signature to the Honduran Ambassador explaining that we will be unable to grant the request.

Exec Sec notes that USCIS will be contacted for input.

Here the June 28th DHS statement:

DHS Statement

The Administration strongly supports the enactment of comprehensive immigration reform, and the Department is committed to working with Congress to pass bipartisan reform that combines effective enforcement with improvements to our existing immigration systems while realistically addressing those who are already here.

While we continue to work with Congress to enact reform, we are focused on smart, effective immigration enforcement that focuses first on criminal aliens who pose a threat to our communities. DHS has the authority to grant a deferral of removal action based on the merits of cases while considering humanitarian circumstances and other factors in the interest of the Department's overall law enforcement mission.

However, this discretionary authority is implemented on a case-by-case basis and DHS does not grant deferred action without a review of relevant facts. To be clear, DHS will not grant deferred action to the nation's entire illegal immigrant population.

Comprehensive legislation, coupled with a safe and secure border, provides the best solution to our nation's immigration challenges, and we believe the recently unveiled Senate proposal for comprehensive immigration reform is a step in the right direction.

Often when we get an application where our checks turn up reported suspicions, or sometimes an investigation, but no definitive judicial or other conclusion. Since we have to make a decision on the EAD within 90 days and have to issue unless we're prepared to deny the underlying status application, we issue the EAD unless there is a clear basis we can use to deny the underlying status application, and then continue to work the issue in the context of the status application.





The federal government on Monday announced a decision to extend by six months the deadline for undocumented Haitian nationals in the United States to apply for Temporary Protected Status, giving them until January of 2011 to ask for the benefit.

Alejandro Mayorkas, head of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services made the TPS announcement Monday at the USCIS Miami field office during a news conference. TPS is now available for undocumented Haitians who were in the United States when the Jan. 12 earthquake struck Haiti.

But in an interview before the news conference, Mayorkas told El Nuevo Herald that the administration is considering the possibility of allowing Haitians who arrived in the United States after the Jan. 12 earthquake to also apply for TPS.

Mayorkas said this could be accomplished by moving forward the date of TPS registration. Right now that registration date is Jan. 21.

Mayorkas also said that his office is examining -- along with the State Department -whether to expedite visas for Haitians whose petitions for relatives in Haiti have been approved.

Mayorkas did not announce any special benefit for Haitians who have tourist visas and arrived in the United States after the earthquake. But he encouraged them to apply for socalled deferred action which would grant them a work permit or a simple extension of their visitor visa, which would not authorize them to work.





- 1. Parole in Place: under what circumstances is it appropriate to use this authority? Some examples:
- military dependents who enter the US without inspection (EWI) and therefore cannot adjust.
- --Haitians who are in the US, have an approved immediate relative petitions and a visa available but can't adjust because they entered without inspection.
- Deferred Action When should USCIS exercise this authority?
- --anytime a request is made?
- --Is it ever appropriate to refer a case to ICE?
- --serious long term medical cases
- --Military dependents

These issues are before them everyday so they are very interested in your thoughts and philosophical views. Historically we have taken a very, very conservative approach to deferred action and parole and have granted it in only the most extraordinary cases. We have moved away from this approach in some recent decisions so the field leadership is definitely looking for some high level direction.

Let me know if you want to meet before the meeting to discuss these issues.

Also, if you want to ask the DDs to collaborate on an issues paper I will make sure that happens quickly. I am already working on these issues with the RDs who, in turn, reach out to the DDs but further field engagement is always helpful.

The Department of Homeland Security is committed to assisting those individuals who are unable to return to Haiti due to the January 12 earthquake. In the immediate aftermath of the disaster, approximately 1,300 Haitians, including some who were escorting children or medical evacuees, received B2 visas (tourist-travel visa) to allow them to enter the United States. We are continuing to provide all appropriate humanitarian protections to these individuals who find themselves here in the United States in this extraordinary situation and are approaching each case consistent with the humanitarian response taken since the earthquake.

Background

Persons in the United States on B2 visas have the option of returning home, applying for an extension of their visa to continue to stay in the United States, or requesting Deferred Action, which will allow them to stay on the country and work while they are here.

Dear President Obama:

We understand that there's a push for your Administration to develop a plan to unilaterally extend either deferred action or parole to millions of illegal aliens in the United States. We understand that the Administration may include aliens who have willfully overstayed their visas or filed for benefits knowing that they will not be eligible for a status for years to come. We understand that deferred action and parole are discretionary actions reserved for individual cases that present unusual, emergent or humanitarian circumstances. Deferred action and parole were not intended to be used to confer a status or offer protection to large groups of illegal aliens, even if the agency claims that they look at each case on a "case-by-case" basis.

While we agree our immigration laws need to be fixed, we are deeply concerned about the potential expansion of deferred action or parole for a large illegal alien population. While deferred action and parole are Executive Branch authorities, they should not be used to circumvent Congress' constitutional authority to legislate immigration policy, particularly as it relates to the illegal population in the United States.

The Administration would be wise to abandon any plans for deferred action or parole for the illegal population. Such a move would further erode the American public's confidence in the federal government and its commitment to securing the borders and enforcing the laws already on the books.

We would appreciate receiving a commitment that the Administration has no plans to use either authority to change the current position of a large group of illegal aliens already in the United States, and ask that you respond to us about this matter as soon as possible.

We got word at about 10 p.m. DHS ain't the easiest agency with which to connect even during daylight much less 10 p.m. Handle it from here as a brief if you like.

Mr. Chandler's statement does not address the assertions by (b)(6) as well as the (b)(6) that the Haitian Prime Minister personally gave the go-ahead to exempt these 12 BRESMA children from the regulation that was put in place after the earthquake. They said the US government insisted the Prime Minister must not have understood what he had agreed to and they then produced an assurance from his aides that he, indeed, intended to permit the children to enter the U.S.

As to fears of trafficking, every one of these children has a family in Colorado, approved by Adoption Alliance, waiting for him or her. Additionally, every one of the children was voluntarily released for adoption by the guardians who brought them to BRESMA and every one of them was at the orphanage prior to the earthquake. BRESMA did not accept any more children after the quake; these 12 simply did not have a pending adoption.

I have no opinion one way or the other about whether these children should be admitted, but I don't see how this statement addresses the reality of this specific situation.





The individuals from the orphanage have not been given any indication from the Embassy Staff with respect to their request to bring the children to the U.S.A. The Embassy staff reviewed the documents for each child yesterday afternoon. We understand that over the last few days one of the children they expected to bring to the U.S. has died and another is now in the hospital. It is apparent that under these circumstances the medical condition of some or all of the children is deteriorating. Moreover now that the rains have started it is likely that those who are well may succumb to illness rapidly. As such we are asking for expedited review of the status of these children given that the Adoption Alliance has arranged for screened American families to adopt these children upon their arrival in the United States.

The Governor is asking that DOS provide him with a written response on the status of the petition to permit these children to leave which if it is negative specifically states the reasons that the request is being denied. We make this request to both clarify the open issues as well as to ensure that if more child deaths were to occur and inquirees were made to determine why they could not leave to come to safety in the U.S., we could be confident and explicit about what the challenges were that we could not overcome.



As I try to explain to Ambassador Joseph, the only way I can help in this situation is through a petition sent by the embassy. 





 Preventing the Trafficking of Haitian Children in and Outside of the Intercountry Adoption Process

OBJECTIVE:

For Secretaries Napolitano and Clinton to discuss how DHS and DOS can engage all
international partners (foreign missions, NGOs, etc.) in vigilantly preventing the trafficking of
Haitian children in and outside of the intercountry adoption process, particularly in light of the
January 12th Haiti earthquake disaster.

TALKING / DISCUSSION POINTS:



BACKGROUND:

- 1. Orphans and Humanitarian Parole
- As of January 22nd, USCIS in PaP has processed more than 370 orphan cases under the humanitarian parole policy announced by Secretary Napolitano on January 18th.
- There are two categories of orphans eligible for humanitarian parole under this new DHS policy (as announced in the DHS January 18th press release on the USCIS website). (See Attachment.)

- DHS has been encouraging U.S. citizens with pending adoption cases in Haiti to send detailed information about their cases to <u>HaitianAdoptions@dhs.gov</u> for additional assistance.
- USCIS assesses information provided to this email address to determine if the children fall into either Category 1 or Category 2, and works closely with USCIS staff in PaP to ensure that children given parole are within either Category.
- On January 20th, USCIS Acting Deputy Director Lauren Kielsmeier represented DHS in a press conference with Secretary of State Clinton announcing a DOS-led task force for Haitian adoptions in process. Sharon Parrott, Counselor for Human Services Policy from the Department of Health and Human Services was also present. Each of the three agencies gave brief statements following Secretary Clinton's announcement.
- Per Deputy Secretary Lute's January 22nd request, USCIS Director Mayorkas called DOS Assistant Secretary Eric Schwartz (AS/Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration) that same day and apprised him of Secretary Napolitano's intent to call Secretary Clinton on Sunday, January 24 as a follow up to Secretary Napolitano's communication with Bill Swing of IMO on the subject of potential trafficking in the wake of the Haitian earthquake. AS Schwartz informed Mayorkas of his view that it was not advisable to have the IMO assume any leadership role in addressing vulnerable children in the international arena by virtue of UNICEF's existing responsibility in that space.
- The White House has established an Interagency Policy Committee (IPC) to focus on Haitian orphans. Lori Scialabba, USCIS Associate Director for Refugee, Asylum and International Operations is the DHS representative.

Two Categories of Orphans Eligible for Humanitarian Parole

Category 1

Children who have been legally confirmed as orphans eligible for intercountry adoption by the Government of Haiti, were in the process of being adopted by Americans prior to Jan. 12, 2010 and meet the below criteria.

Required Criteria

- Evidence of availability for adoption, which MUST include at least one of the following:
 - o Full and final Haitian adoption decree
 - o Government of Haiti Custody grant to prospective adoptive parents for emigration and adoption
 - Secondary evidence in lieu of the above.
- Evidence of suitability for adoption, which MUST include at least one of the following:
 - Notice of Approval of Form I-600A, Application for Advance Processing of an Orphan Petition
 - o Current FBI Fingerprints and background security check clearances
 - o Physical custody in Haiti plus a security background check

Category 2

Children who have been identified by an adoption service provider or facilitator as eligible for intercountry adoption, were matched to prospective American adoptive parents prior to Jan. 12, 2010 and meet the below criteria.

Required Criteria

- Significant evidence of a relationship between the prospective adoptive parents and the child AND of the parents' intention to complete the adoption, which could include the following:
 - o Proof of travel by the prospective adoptive parents to Haiti to visit the child
 - o Photos of the child and prospective adoptive parents together
 - o An Adoption Service Provider "Acceptance of Referral" letter signed by the prospective adoptive parents
 - Documentary evidence that the prospective adoptive parents initiated the adoption process prior to Jan. 12, 2010 with intent to adopt the child (filed Form I-600A, Application for Advance Processing of an Orphan Petition, and/or Form I-600, Petition to Classify an Orphan as an Immediate Relative, completed a home study, located an ASP to work with in Haiti, etc.)
- Evidence of the child's availability for adoption, which could the following:
 - o IBESR (Haitian Adoption Authority) approval
 - o Documentation of legal relinquishment or award of custody to the Haitian orphanage
 - o Secondary evidence in lieu of the above
- Evidence of suitability for adoption, which MUST include at least one of the following:
 - Notice of Approval of Form I-600A, Application for Advance Processing of an Orphan Petition; OR
 - o Current FBI Fingerprints and background security check clearances

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



The Administration strongly supports the enactment of comprehensive immigration reform, and the Department is committed to working with Congress to pass bipartisan reform that combines effective enforcement with improvements to our existing immigration systems while realistically addressing those who are already here.

While we continue to work with Congress to enact reform, we are focused on smart, effective immigration enforcement that focuses first on criminal aliens who pose a threat to our communities. DHS has the authority to grant a deferral of removal action based on the merits of cases while considering humanitarian circumstances and other factors in the interest of the Department's overall law enforcement mission. However, this discretionary authority is implemented on a case-by-case basis and DHS does not grant deferred action without a review of relevant facts. To be clear, DHS will not grant deferred action to the nation's entire illegal immigrant population.

Comprehensive legislation, coupled with a safe and secure border, provides the best solution to our nation's immigration challenges, and we believe the recently unveiled Senate proposal for comprehensive immigration reform is a step in the right direction.

The Department of <u>Homeland Security</u> on Friday denied any plans to grant blanket amnesty to the "entire illegal immigrant population," following claims from senators and others that the Obama administration has been holding behind-the-scenes talks to craft a gameplan for mass legalization.

The concern is that DHS, in a bid to bypass Congress, would extend what is known as deferred action or parole — actions usually taken on a case-by-case basis — to millions of illegal immigrants at once.

The department statement, however, did not address the possibility of giving a selective reprieve to the segment of the population holding expired visas -- as opposed to those who crossed illegally. This is something that a former Bush administration official told FoxNews.com could be an option for the administration.

But the statement, while affirming its authority to grant the reprieves "on the merits of cases," said that authority is applied on a "case-by-case" basis and would not be drastically expanded.

Implementation of TVPRA 2008 Section 203(c) requires DHS to permit A-3 and G-5 visa holders who have filed civil actions against their employers to remain and work legally in the United States during the pendency of their suit. See Attachment A.

Applicable laws and regulations:

William Wilberforce Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2008 (TVPRA 2008), Pub. L. 110-457, 122 Stat. 5044 (2008), section 203(c). 8 CFR 274a.12.

DHS is required to permit the A-3 or G-5 nonimmigrant to remain legally in the United States for time sufficient to fully and effectively participate in all legal proceedings related to any civil actions filed against their former employers for labor or contract violations. TVPRA 2008 section 203(c)(1)(A). In addition, DHS is required to provide work authorization to such a nonimmigrant for the time period during which the nonimmigrant is permitted to remain legally in the United States due to a pending civil action. TVPRA 2008 section 203(c)(2).

Budget implications are expected to be negligible. The affected population is projected to be no more than 10-20 individuals per year. In 10 years of implementing T nonimmigrant status for victims of human trafficking, the Vermont Service Center has a record of only a handful of individuals who originally entered the United States as an A-3 or G-5 visa holder.

The working group identified the following three options:

Option 1: Deferred Action1

USCIS would add this population to the existing list of groups eligible on a case-by-case basis for deferred action. A grant of deferred action allows an A-3 or G-5 nonimmigrant to legally remain in the United States while pursuing a civil action against their employer. Through the filing of a Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization, USCIS would provide an Employment Authorization Document (EAD). The purpose behind TVPRA 2008 Section 203(c) is to allow those who have become victims of human trafficking or related labor offenses by their employers the opportunity to pursue civil actions against their employer. It is also to hold abusive employers accountable for their actions. Therefore, there is a humanitarian and public interest need justifying the use of deferred action.

Option 2: Continued Presence (CP)2

¹ Granting deferred action is an exercise of prosecutorial discretion. Deferred action can be granted for someone who is unlawfully present in the United States when USCIS has decided against placing an individual in removal proceedings for humanitarian or public interest reasons.

ICE grants CP, so this would not be a matter for USCIS. This option may not be feasible because CP is tailored for those victims of human trafficking who are potential witnesses in an investigation related to human trafficking offenses. Those with A-3 and G-5 status who have filed civil actions may not meet the federal definition of a trafficking victim necessary to receive CP, or the lawsuit may be for other labor violations not categorized as human trafficking-related offenses.

Option 3: Parole³

The working group had initially considered Parole-in-Place. However, this is not feasible because it applies only to individuals who had not previously been admitted to the United States. By virtue of having entered on A-3 or G-5 visas, this population would be ineligible for Parole-in-Place. See Attachment B for a recent paper that analyzes Parolein-Place and Deferred Action as options for relief for military spouses.

Recommended course and form of action:

Option 1: Deferred action- This falls under the circumstances in which USCIS is authorized to issue deferred action and also fulfills the Congressional mandate in TVPRA 2008 without the need for USCIS to create a new process.

Proposed process:


- EAD CODE: Because 8 CFR 274a.12 provides all EAD eligibility codes, creating a new EAD code specific to these A-3 and G-5 visa holders would require a regulatory change. Therefore, the working group recommends using the existing 8 CFR 274a.12(c)(14) EAD code reserved for those granted deferred action.
- BENEFIT APPLICATION: A-3 or G-5 visa holder would submit the following:
 - 1. A cover letter
 - 2. Form I-765, requesting an EAD under (c)(14)
 - 3. Proof of legal entry into the United States in A-3 or G-5 nonimmigrant status
 - 4. Proof of having filed a civil complaint (e.g., the date/time-stamped civil complaint)
- WHERE TO FILE: Direct file at the VSC.
- USCIS PROCESS: VSC would adjudicate the Form I-765. If adjudicated favorably, USCIS would issue deferred action and a one-year work permit.
- FEE: The Form I-765 fee would be waivable.
 - While Section 203(c) of the TVPRA is silent on fees, 201(d)(3) of the TVPRA permits USCIS to waive any fees associated with an application for the underlying status or adjustment of status for VAWA, T and U nonimmigrants. While the A-3 or G-5 category is not listed, it is in USCIS's discretion to waive the fee. The working group recommends that USCIS waive the fee because the

² Continued Presence (CP) is a temporary immigration status authorized under TVPA section (107)(c)(7) for individuals identified by law enforcement as victims of human trafficking. CP allows victims to remain in the United States temporarily during the investigation into the human trafficking-related crimes committed against

³ Parole under INA section 212(d)(5)(A) is a discretionary tool that may be exercised on a case-by-case basis. Parole is limited to aliens who are applying for admission to the United States and whose circumstances present urgent humanitarian reasons for the parole or if the parole would serve a significant public benefit. Granting parole to aliens in the United States who have not been admitted or paroled is commonly referred to as "Parole-in-Place."

Agency already does so for other victimized populations and because these individuals generally would not have the means to pay, as they are no longer working for their abusive employers. Finally, these individuals may likely file for T and U nonimmigrant status later on. Form I-765 is fee waivable, so it does not require a regulation update.

RENEWALS: The applicant would submit sufficient evidence of the ongoing court
proceeding (e.g., copy of docket update). Alternatively, USCIS can check PACER,
although this would serve as a backend process, and the burden of proof should remain
on the applicant.



Proposed implementation process and schedule:

On June 2, 2010, the working group outlined these next steps. For the immediate update, USCIS will post a public notice on www.uscis.gov and distribute through regular OCOMM and OPE

channels. USCIS will also distribute the public notice to the Department of State Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons, which has inquired about the DHS implementation of this TVPRA provision and meets with a stakeholder working group on protection for A-3 and G-5 visa holders. For the long term, USCIS should add this to a list of updates for the Form I-765 Instructions.

- 1. POST PUBLIC NOTICE: See draft, Attachment D.
- 2. ISSUE FIELD GUIDANCE: SCOPS would have to draft guidance for the VSC.
- 3. CREATE TRACKING SYSTEM: TVPRA 2008 includes a requirement that DHS report to the Department of State the number of A-3 or G-5 visa holders who have filed for this benefit annually. Current systems do not allow for this level of granularity (e.g., which EAD recipients originated from A-3 or G-5 visas). The VSC has asserted that it can maintain its own method for tracking this small population of filers.
- 4. CHANGE FORM I-765 INSTRUCTIONS: The Form I-765 Instructions needs various updates aside from adding instructions on how A-3 or G-5 visa holders can request an EAD. The working group has recommended that USCIS submit all updates concurrently to OMB, once all updates are ready:
 - 1. A-3 and G-5 visa holders who have filed civil suits
 - 2. VAWA Dependents of A, E, G, H's
 - 3. U Bona Fide Determinations
 - 4. T and U Extensions of Status

Hi Ben,

Yes, please do discuss this in tomorrow's interagency communicators meeting.

We believe that the OpEd is timely now and will continue to be, because it addresses the question of why every vulnerable child can't be immediately spirited out of Haiti for placement with an American family. "Why can't they all come?" is a question that won't be going away any time soon and it is one that we attempted to answer in Michele's OpEd (while also pointing out our government's fine work on existing adoption cases).

As for placement, we recommend the widest distribution possible. Folks seeing TV images of Haitian children and reading papers of every size throughout the country would be interested. We don't believe we have to just aim for the biggies. But of course, placement will hinge on whose bylines ultimately appear on the piece.

If it's not signed at the cabinet member level, Michele would be a good candidate because of her appointment as leader of the whole-government task force and because she's already had a lot of visibility on the topic. But we're much less concerned about bylines than we are about getting the message out.

To this first point, this has been a concern to us, and we've made it clear that there is a process, in both Haiti and the US, that needs to happen in order to not unduly separate families and to protect potential trafficking victims. See some points below:

- Our humanitarian efforts in Haiti and on behalf of Haitians in the United States reflect the compassion of the American people. Our efforts also reflect our adherence to a system of laws that protects earthquake survivors during such a difficult time.
- We remain focused on family reunification and must be vigilant not to separate children from relatives in Haiti who are still alive but displaced, or to unknowingly assist criminals who traffic in children in such desperate times.
- USCIS and the Department of State are assisting individuals who present themselves at the American Embassy in Port-au-Prince to determine eligibility for evacuation and entry to the United States.
- We appreciate the urgency of the situation and need to process evacuees quickly. However, in order to
 ensure children are not separated from relatives in Haiti and to protect potential victims of trafficking, we
 strongly discourage the use of private aircraft to evacuate orphans.
- All flights must be appropriately coordinated with the US and Haitian governments to ensure proper clearances are granted before arrival to the United States.

• The State Department is heading up a joint task force with the Departments of Homeland Security and Health and Human Services to streamline this process and ensure that these families are united

- as quickly as possible while still ensuring that proper safeguards are in place to protect children in our care.
- An interagency working group has been established to focus on the humanitarian needs of highly vulnerable children. And the Administration is also working closely with the many Members of Congress who are understandably very concerned about this process.

State: Nanda – thank you for sending draft guidance around earlier. Once that is final today, please send around again so that we can deploy tomorrow first thing as inquiries will surely continue.

HHS and DHS: Jenny and Matt – you raised important questions on the call and your agencies have important roles to play w/ State.

We should circulate amongst ourselves here to start: State's talking points and a description from each agency as to your role in the process. We can begin to build a single document that contains the full scope of USG efforts — as we look to supporting our fellow OPE/IGA/Leg shops, we should keep a living guidance document w/ all the hard and nitty-gritty Q&A as well. I have to stay focused on compiling interagency actions across the range of activities, so may I nominate State to take the pen with robust input from HHS and DHS?

Sound like a plan? Very open to suggestions - I hope I capture the gist of what y'all suggested on the call.

This is what I sent to press yesterday about medevac flights . Sorry if you're getting this multiple times

"Since the earthquake, U.S. personnel have seen nearly 23,000 patients in Haiti. Additionally, we have worked to increase and strengthen domestic medical capacity by supporting a network of NGOs and local hospitals across the country. In limited instances where patients had medical needs that could not be met in Haiti, we have worked to transport them to hospitals in the United States for care. Given concerns about the strain on domestic health capacity, we worked to increase cooperation with our international partners, NGOs and states to expand access to additional facilities to care for Haitians who were gravely injured in the earthquake. Having received assurances that additional capacity exists both here and among our international partners, we determined that we can resume these critical flights. The flights are on track to resume in the next 12 hours. Patients are being identified for transfer, doctors are making sure that it is safe for them to fly, and we are preparing specific in-flight pediatric care aboard the aircraft where needed. Florida is identifying specific receiving facilities. The Government of Haiti has estimated that there are more than 200,000 injuries from the earthquake. We are working with the Haitian government and the international community to meet this urgent need and save lives."

More background on the international element: We have reached out to countries the Caribbean basin and a number of them are in the process of finalizing their ability to accept patients with urgent needs and/or to expand their care facilities in Haiti to accommodate such patients.



As discussed on this morning's call, this is the key message all of us should be driving today. Thanks again for the inputs – look forward to actions lists by 2 p.m. Our next call is at 7:30 p.m. (b) (6)

The United States continues to expand and secure our distribution network in Haiti to deliver more aid more quickly to the Haitian people.

C-17 air delivery of food and water will resume today -- 15,000 water bottles and 14,500 MREs/Humanitarian Rations are slated for delivery.

U.S. military aircraft, helicopters, and vessels are giving the highest priority to the shipment of water. Over the past several days, JTF-Haiti has distributed more than 400,000 meals/humanitarian rations and more than 600,000 bottles of water. The USS Carl Vinson is producing 100,000 gallons of potable water daily. Water tanks are being installed in each zone of the city and potable water is now available at 45 distribution points. The U.S. Coast Guard has distributed a total of 38.5 tons of water (62,880 bottles). And USAID/OFDA has delivered 9 water treatment units to provide 900,000 liters of safe drinking water for 90,000 people per day.

Yesterday, the hospital ship USNS Comfort started receiving injured patients from the local hospitals and international medical facilities. The Comfort has a crew of 850 ready to provide a host of medical services, and will eventually provide nearly 1,000 hospital beds, and 11 operating rooms.

The airport in Port au Prince is open around the clock. The U.S. Air Force continues to manage air operations with approval of the Haitian Government. And the State Department continues to coordinate closely with our international partners and NGOs to facilitate the smooth arrival of aid and personnel. This is a consultative process with the government of Haiti, involving dozens of international assistance flights, not solely U.S. military flights. Airport arrival slots continue to increase steadily, with 153 flights arriving yesterday, 1/20 (38 of those were official U.S. flights).

- For example, of the 330 arrivals between 1/16 and 18:
 - o 155 were civilian aircraft,
 - 91 from U.S. military and government aircraft,
 - 84 from international governments and militaries.
 - On 1/18, flights landed from: Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Cuba, France, Mexico, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Turkey, the United States, Ukraine, and from the United Nations and numerous international aid organizations such as the Red Cross, the Salvation Army, and the World Food Program.

The United States is a part of a continuing international **search and rescue** effort: six U.S. Urban Search & Rescue teams with more than 500 personnel are a part of an international effort involving 43 USAR teams from around the world with 1,700 rescue workers that are continuing to search for survivors — to date they have rescued 122 survivors.







(<u>http://www.boston.com/news/local/breaking_news/2010/01/immigrants_in_f.html</u>) She spoke earlier today with Vice Minister Miguel Angel Ibarra from Guatemala, where some of those arrested are from, who spoke very harshly about the Administration's enforcement priorities and his perception that nothing has changed. He said (parapharased):

• It seems to me to persecution of immigrants is similar to Hitler's persecution of the Jews during WWII. They can't get a license, authorities pull them out of their homes, and there was the humiliation under Sherriff Joe Arpaio – who even though has no federal authority – is similar to other ICE and law enforcement tactics throughout the country. We're not seeing any change under the Obama Administration, they are acting the same as the Bush Administration. I had thought the deportations would stop, but they have stayed the same or increased.

She wants comment from DHS on this matter as those arrested were evidently not criminals and the action seems contrary to what the Secretary has said on the topic.

Background

The ICE detention reform initiative rests on three pillars: 1) short-term improvements that will provide immediate responses to failures in the existing detention system; 2) long-term improvements and redesign of the detention system to pave the way toward twenty-first century immigration detention services; and 3) medical care reform founded on the belief that detainees deserve access to high-quality and timely care while in ICE's custody. These initiatives are described in more detail below.

Pillar 1: Short-term Improvements

In an effort to move from a penal-oriented to a civil-oriented system, I established the Office of Detention Policy and Planning (ODPP), which oversees day-to-day detention reforms while designing a new detention system that aligns with our nation's values. Since the October release of Dr. Schriro's report, ODPP has made steady progress in implementing many of the recommendations in the report, and securing both internal and external support from the NGO community. Accomplishments and ongoing initiatives include:

- Implemented a new policy to release arriving asylum seekers from detention who have a credible fear of
 persecution or torture if they establish their identities, pose neither a flight risk nor a danger to the
 community, and have no additional factors that weigh against their release. The new guidelines also
 mandate that all such arriving aliens should automatically be considered for parole—a significant
 change from prior guidance;
- Reduced the number of facilities used from 341 to 270 and canceling contracts at 10 facilities because they received at least 2 deficient ratings;
- Finalizing the Performance Based National Detention Standards 2010, allowing ICE to significantly improve conditions of confinement for 55% of its population (housed in its largest 22 facilities) within the next 12 months:
- Met with vendors and staff at ICE's largest facilities to determine immediate no-cost improvements to conditions at facilities. More than 20 facilities have already expanded visitation, recreation, and legal access for detainees;
- Initiated pilot projects in Baltimore and Miami with EOIR to create an expedited non-detained docket to
 accelerate the processing of cases of aliens supervised through the alternative to detention (ATD)
 program;
- Transitioned the ATD program to a single provider, allowing for better performance and evaluation;
- Discontinued family detention at the T. Don Hutto Family Residential Facility in Texas, converted the facility to a female detention center, and saved millions in the process; and
- Secured dramatic cost savings and improved conditions for detainees by closing the Varick Street facility in New York and the Aquadilla facility in Puerto Rico.

Pillar 2: Long-term Redesign

To design a new civil detention system, ICE is considering what civil detention centers will look like to accommodate our unique population and reflect that removal is the sole purpose of immigration detention. Our goals include avoiding costly transfers and placing facilities near the site of apprehensions, legal service

providers, hospitals and medical providers, immigration courts, and transportation hubs. In the coming weeks, we will complete the significant first step—forecasting our apprehensions and identifying where facilities are best positioned. Other accomplishments and ongoing initiatives include:

- Instituting a new policy on detainee transfers, which will require ICE officers, prior to transferring a
 detainee from a facility, to examine considerations related to counsel, the status of proceedings,
 hardships posed by separations from family, and other relevant factors to ensure fair and humane
 immigration and removal proceedings;
- Issuing two new RFPs for civil detention facilities in the Northeast and Southwest;
- Drafting a new set of civil detention standards to govern civil detention facilities;
- Developing a risk assessment and classification tool to identify aliens suitable for ATD and to inform housing placements based on risk;
- Launching a detainee on-line locator system for attorneys, family members, and others;
- Strengthening procedures for annual inspections and detainee grievance procedures;
- Developing a long-term acquisitions plan based on supply and demand of detention beds and optimize the location of facilities to decrease transfers away from relatives and counsel; and
- Establishing an on-site monitoring program so federal employees are present to monitor conditions where ICE houses the majority of detainees.

Pillar 3: Medical Care Reform

To support our commitment to the health and safety of detainees, I established an independent Office of Detention Oversight to monitor detention facilities and promote uniform conditions to meet our detention standards. In addition, I am working closely with the Office of Health Affairs to identify systemic ways to reform and improve medical and mental health care at the wide range of facilities ICE uses. Accomplishments and ongoing initiatives include:

- Issued new protocols about reporting detainee deaths and notifying the press, Congress, and our stakeholders to increase transparency and accountability;
- Assigning clinical directors to provide ongoing case management of complex medical cases and expeditiously review denials of requests for medical services;
- Revamping the Treatment Authorization Request process to avoid delay in medical care;
- Developing a medical classification system to support immigration detainees with unique medical or mental health needs;
- Rolling-out a new medical services plan that will identify covered treatments, replacing the current plan that lists excluded procedures and considers the length of time before a detainees removal; and
- Working with medical doctors detailed from the Bureau of Prisons and OHA to conduct a systematic assessment of the delivery of medical services.

Update on Phoenix Cross Check planning:

OPERATION CROSS CHECK ARIZONA:

- Operation Cross Check Arizona planning is making progress. FOD Phoenix is preparing to send in the first batch of 20 targets to be vetted by HQ/NFOP and FOSC by COB today (July 19, 2010). A total of 100 targets or more are expected for this operation. FOD Phoenix is currently working with Maricopa County, Probation and Parole Office and is currently vetting approximately 50 additional possible targets to be included for the purpose of this operation. The FOSC is also continuing to assist with the additional generation of leads to add to information already sent to FOD Phoenix. All potential targets will be vetted by both the NFOP and FOSC and will adhere to standard National Operation Cross Check parameters that have been employed for the other regional CC Ops in FY10.
- Other component/agency participation for this operation includes HSI-Special Agents and unspecified number of United States Marshal Service's personnel.
- FOTs from El Paso, San Bernardino (LOS), and San Diego are expected to come in week of July 26 for Operation Cross Check Arizona preparation and will stay through the execution of the enforcement activity. HQ Funding Strings for Fed Traveler have been issued to these respective offices and funding has been set aside in the NFOP budget to fund this and any other expense related to Operation Cross Check Arizona.

In FY 2010 we put out the new Parole Policy which sends all CF aliens for a parole determination, assuming our parole numbers for FY 09 hold true for FY 10, we were averaging a parole grant rate of 55%. Thus of the roughly 1000 seeking CF with USCIS, about 550 would be granted parole. For our demographic we would focus on the remaining 450 who didn't get parole, but may otherwise be released from detention if a Community-Based ATD program/pilot existed. 





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









Timeframe for Nationwide Expansion of the ATD Program
