Situational Awareness

December 2, 2015, at 1220 hours (MST). CBPO's at the Port of Mariposa, Nogales, Arizona encountered a male subject identified as SCHIVONE, Gabriel Matthew inside the entrance of pedestrian area observing the facilities. CBPO's questioned Schivone on the purpose of his presence in the pedestrian area and stated he was "just looking around". SCHIVONE also stated he was with two females who were standing outside by the entry door. SCHIVONE was advised to depart the facilities.

The two females were identified as ABDELRAZAQ, Leila and MCAFEE Alamer, Leila. ABDELRAZAQ was looking at the direction of vehicle primary and drawing sketches on a book. CBPO's questioned ABDELRAZAQ why she was drawing sketches of the facilities and stated because she's never been to the border.

CBPO's requested their identification and to see ABDELRAZAQ sketch book. ABDELRAZAQ stated she would rather not show it due to personnel reasons but subsequently handed it over to CBPO's. The subjects were escorted to secondary.

Subjects stated their purpose of the being at the Port of Entry was to see the border.

During the inspection of the ABDELRAZAQ sketching book, CBPO's noticed the book contained writings in English and Arabic language. There were drawings of what appeared to be vehicle primary inspection area and an additional drawing of pedestrian turn stile gate depicting video surveillance cameras above the gate. The drawings were partial and incomplete. HSI and SCBPO interviews yield no derogatory information.

Subjects were identified as:

USC Leila Y.Y. ABDELRAZAQ DOB: 11/14/1992

USC Leslie MCAFEE Alamer DOB 12/27/1986

USC SCHIVONE, Gabriel Mathew DOB: 02/24/1984

All three subjects were released at 1540 hours (MST) without incident.

Due to the San Bernardino mass shooting in California and the incident at the Port of Nogales all personnel must be extra vigilant of their surroundings and when traveling to and from work specially when in uniform.
