MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

I. INTRODUCTION

Mr. Rosebrock has been charged with taking photographs on Memorial Day, May 30, 2016, within the Veterans Administration Facility located at 11301 Wilshire Boulevard in Los Angeles, California ("VA Facility") in violation of 38 C.F.R. § 1.218(a)(10), and on the same day "displaying placards or posting materials" by affixing two small (4" x 6") American Flags to the exterior fence of the VA Facility without authorization in violation of 38 C.F.R. § 1.218(a)(9). See Exhibit A (United States District Court Violation Notice, Number 4920201 and Number 4920202); see also Government Trial Memorandum ("Gov Trial Memo"), filed November 30, 2016 at 2. Mr. Rosebrock has been further charged with recording video on June 12, 2016, with a Sony camcorder within the VA Facility in violation of 38 C.F.R. § 1.218(a)(10). See Exhibit B (United States District Court Violation Notice Number 6593951); Government Trial Memo at 3.

For additional background, the Court is referred to Mr. Rosebrock's separately filed motions (1) to suppress statements, (2) to dismiss photography / recording charges, and (3) to dismiss Memorial Day 2016 American Flag charge.

II. ARGUMENT

A. Selective Prosecution

A claim of selective prosecution is based on the premise, rooted in the concept of equal protection, that a decision to prosecute "may not be based on an unjustifiable standard such as race, religion, or other arbitrary classification." *United States v. Armstrong*, 517 U.S. 456, 464 (1996). Selective prosecution "is not a defense on the merits to the criminal charge itself, but an independent assertion that the prosecutor has brought the charge for reasons forbidden by the Constitution." *Id.* at 463. To demonstrate selective prosecution, "the claimant must demonstrate that the federal prosecutorial policy 'had a discriminatory effect and that it was motivated by a discriminatory purpose." *Id.* at 465 (citation omitted). To meet these requirements, the defendant must show that he was singled out for prosecution while other violators similary situated were not prosecuted, and the decision to prosecute was based on an arbitrary classification such as race, religion, or the exercise of constitutional rights. *Id.* at 465-466; *see also United States v. Arenas-Ortiz*, 339 F.3d 1066 (9th Cir. 2003).

Here, the first requirement is met. When conservative activist Ted Hayes was accused of hanging a large American Flag on the fence of the VA Facility on June 12, 2016, Mr. Hayes, a regular participant at Mr. Rosebrock's Sunday rallies, was detained and handcuffed, but not cited. Mr. Rosebrock was detained, cuffed, and cited, however, puportedly for unauthorized photography. The second requirement is also satisfied. Mr. Rosebrock is being punished, first for exercising his First Amendment right to lead the Sunday rallies and show support for veterans and protest what he believes is the VA's failure to make full use of the VA Facility and land to benefit and care for veterans, particularly homeless veterans, and second in retaliation for suing the VA in 2010.

B. Vindictive Prosecution

The due process clause protects criminal defendants from prosecutions that are based on vindictive motives – e.g., to punish the defendant for exercising a legal right. See Blackledge v. Perry, 417 U.S. 21 (1974). A presumption of vindictiveness may arise. For example, if more serious charges are filed following a successful appeal by a defendant, the presumption will apply. Id. To establish a presumption of vindictiveness, a defendant need not show the prosecutor acted in bad faith or maliciously sought the indictment. See United States v. Jenkins, 504 F.3d 694, 699-700 (9th Cir. 2007). Rather, the defendant must demonstrate only a "reasonable likelihood" that the government would not have brought the charges had he not elected to exercise a protected right. Id at 700. "The mere appearance of prosecutorial vindictiveness suffices to place the burden on the government because the doctrine of vindictive prosecution 'seeks[s] to reduce or eliminate apprehension on the part of an accused" that she may be punished for exercising her rights." Id. "[T]he 'prophylactic' doctrine is designed, in part, 'to prevent chilling the exercise of [legal] rights by other defendants who must make their choices under similar circumstances in the future." Id.

Mr. Rosebrock had been demonstrating at the VA Facility for over 8 years without incident. Since October 25, 2015, he has received at least 14 citations. Nothing was said to Mr. Rosebrock about photography or video recording until after 10 "flag" citations were dismissed. Mr. Rosebrock was instrumental in exposing nine land deals made by the VA on the land in question resulting in a federal judgment declaring them unlawful. He challenged former VA Secretary McDonald's failure to end veteran homelessness by January 31, 2015 as promised in a settlement of the lawsuit over the land deals.

There is more. The VA police officer who cited Mr. Rosebrock on Memorial Day, 2016 was well aware of Mr. Rosebrock's protected, expressive activity, as he referenced this activity in his "Statement of Probable Cause." These circumstances raise at the very least a "realistic or reasonable likelihood" that the government's decision to prosecute the instant charges was motived by retaliation. *See Jenkins*, 504 F.3d at 700.

III. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the Court should dismiss all charges against Mr. Rosebrock.
