In response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, enclosed is a processed copy of Bates Stamped documents, FBI(18-cv-154)-1536 through FBI(18-cv-154)-2035. The enclosed documents represent the fifth interim release of information responsive to your request.

The FBI conducted email searches for any email communication between Peter Strzok and Lisa Page. This search located both official government records and non-record personal communications between these two individuals.

The FBI reviewed 500 pages of these emails. While conducting this review, the FBI individually analyzed the emails to determine whether they pertained to official government business constituting records under the FOIA or whether they consisted of purely personal communications between the two individuals. As a result of the FBI's review, it determined 211 pages were non-record, personal communications not subject to the FOIA; and 289 pages consisted of responsive FBI records.

As previously indicated, document(s) were located which originated with, or contained information concerning another agency (ies). We are consulting with the other agency (ies) and are awaiting their response. Our office has processed all other information currently in our possession. The FBI will correspond with you regarding those documents when the consultation is completed.

To minimize costs to both you and the FBI, duplicate copies of the same document were not processed.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

Just so YOU know, "Opinion work product," which includes such items as attorney's legal strategy his intended lines of proof, his evaluation of strength and weaknesses of his case, and inferences he draws from interviews of witnesses, and is normally accorded absolute protection from discovery. "Fact work product" on the other hand, consists of items prepared in anticipation of litigation and is discoverable if the moving party makes a showing of substantial need and undue hardship.

And I'm sorry, it is not obvious to me that the sort is opinion work product. It should have been conducted by State department records managers, and you wouldn't even be in this position to be talking about privilege. And to be clear, some opinion work product materials "do not warrant heightened protection because, despite revelations they contain as to attorney's thought processes, lawyer has no justifiable expectation that mental impressions revealed by materials will remain private."

Second judge opens door to depositions in Clinton email case

A second federal judge is opening the door to allowing current and former federal officials to answer questions under oath as part of the legal battle over Hillary Clinton's private email server.

Citing "evidence of government wrong-doing and bad faith," Judge Royce Lamberth of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia ordered that conservative watchdog group Judicial Watch could begin a limited version of the evidence-gathering process known as discovery.

The Obama administration has offered "constantly shifting admissions" about the state of Clinton's server, Lamberth added in his Tuesday order, raising questions about the extent of her use of the server and the government's role in setting it up.

The ruling represents growing frustration with the State Department's response to federal records laws, following a similar order from another federal judge earlier this year.

The decision is likely to only further inflame scrutiny of Clinton's bespoke email arrangement, which has dogged her presidential campaign. A pending court battle about the State Department's compliance with federal records laws is likely to stretch well into the general election.

Tuesday's case centered on talking points prepared in the aftermath of the 2012 terrorist attacks on the U.S. diplomatic facility in Benghazi, Libya, but has become entangled in broader questions surrounding Clinton's private server.

Tom Fitton, Judicial Watch's president, said that the "remarkable decision" on Tuesday "may help the

American people find out why our efforts to get Benghazi answers was thwarted by Clinton's email games."

In the first case, which also involves Judicial Watch, Judge Emmet Sullivan questioned whether top State Department figures had intentionally tried to skirt the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) by allowing Clinton to exclusively use her private email server throughout her time as secretary of State.

This month, Judicial Watch submitted a list of eight current and former State Department officials that it hoped would testify about their roles in facilitating Clinton's use of the unorthodox email system. The judge in that case has until April 15 to decide whether to proceed.

Because the process is already moving forward in the case before Sullivan, Lamberth's order on Tuesday is likely to have a limited practical effect.

Lamberth told Judicial Watch that it had until 10 days after Sullivan outlines the path forward in his case to decide whether it has additional lines of inquiry it would like to pursue in the other court battle.

Lamberth was appointed to his district court seat by President Reagan.

In addition to the FOIA lawsuits, the FBI and a pair of inspectors general are investigating whether Clinton or her top aides mishandled classified information through use of the private server.

1. Suspect in custody after reported shooting at White House [Guardian]

- A suspect has been arrested after he approached a White House security checkpoint with a firearm on Friday afternoon.
- The man was shot by secret service and transported to George Washington University hospital in critical condition.
- The secret service put the White House on lockdown immediately after the incident but that was later lifted.

2. Secret Service Shoots Man Near White House [New York Times]

- WASHINGTON A man who approached the White House on Friday brandishing a gun was shot and wounded by a Secret Service agent, the agency's spokesman said. The man, whose identity was not released, was taken into custody and treated at a nearby hospital.
- President Obama was away at the time, playing golf at Andrews Air Force Base in Maryland. He was told about the shooting, a White House official said.
- The episode began shortly after 3 p.m. Friday, when the man walked toward a security checkpoint on E Street, southwest of the White House.
- 3. US releases Guantánamo prisoner after 14 years and no conviction[Guardian]

U.S. targets spying threat on campus with proposed research clampdown [Reuter's]

- Leading U.S. universities are pushing back against a proposed State Department rule that would bar foreign students from more research projects and classes involving information seen as vital to national security.
- The proposal by the administration of President Barack Obama reflects growing worries in Washington over a rise in intellectual property theft from foreign adversaries such as China

Hacking terrorist's iPhone was easy compared to next FBI hurdle [Chicago Tribune]

- The next frontier in the battle between the FBI and technology companies over encrypted communications will be more legally complicated — and messy — than trying to get into the iPhone of a dead terrorist.
- Messaging tools like Facebook's WhatsApp and Internet services that automatically encrypt the content of texts, phone calls and other data while they're being sent are increasingly. becoming a problem for national security and criminal investigations, according to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- "We're kind of all waiting for the next big test case," said Andrew Crocker, a staff attorney with the Electronic Frontier Foundation in San Francisco, which is suing the Justice Department over whether the government has ever used secret court orders to force technology companies to decrypt the private communications of their customers.

U.S. moves to unseal Islamic State defector's case [Reuter's]

- U.S. prosecutors on Friday sought to unseal the to-date secret criminal case of an Islamic State defector after NBC News broadcast an interview with the New York man in which he spoke out against the militant Islamist group.
- Unsealing the case could allow the U.S. Justice Department to make public details of why the man turned against Islamic State at a time when the government is trying to combat the group's online propaganda.
- Prosecutors said in June 2014, Mo traveled from Brooklyn to Syria, where he enlisted with Islamic State. Once there, they said, he received military training and served as a sentry at one of its headquarters and in various administrative positions.

EgyptAir flight MS804 sent smoke alarm messages before crash – reports [Guardian]

- The missing EgyptAir flight MS804 transmitted messages about a smoke detector and other alerts in the minutes before it went down in the Mediterranean Sea, according to reports.
- Flight data published online suggests there were smoke alerts aboard MS804 minutes before it crashed.
- Smoke was detected in a toilet and the aircraft's electronics, according to data from the Aircraft Communications Addressing and Reporting System (Acars).

Data Points to Rapid Loss of Control Aboard EgyptAir Jet (New York Times)

3. Search for black box intensifies after EgyptAir debris found [USA Today]

- Search crews found human remains and debris Friday from the ill-fated EgyptAir jet that crashed into the Mediterranean Sea, but investigators were still looking for the critical black box data recorders and any evidence that might determine whether terrorists brought down the plane with 66 people aboard.
- Authorities expanded the search area about 180 miles from the Egyptian coast city of Alexandria in the hopes of finding the main sections of the aircraft and the data recorders.

4. Can Egypt's tourism recover from latest blow? [BBC]

- Tourism has long been a mainstay of the country's economy, which is the second largest in the Arab world after Saudi Arabia.
- But in the light of recent attacks on Western tourists, and with large areas of neighbouring.
 Libya controlled by so-called Islamic State (IS), foreign holidaymakers are reluctant to set foot there.

Second Nigerian girl to flee Boko Haram 'is not from Chibok' [Guardian]

- A second Nigerian girl who escaped from Boko Haram militants and was kidnapped from her village is not one of the 218 secondary school students missing from the 2014 mass abduction.
- An army spokesman said on Thursday that <u>Serah Luka</u> was the second of the Chibok girls, who were snatched from their secondary school by masked Boko Haram fighters two years ago, to be "rescued" by Nigerian forces in the past three days.

6. Police: Doctor Hacked to Death, Friend Wounded in Bangladesh (New York Times)

- DHAKA, Bangladesh A doctor was hacked to death and his friend critically wounded by men wielding machetes in western Bangladesh, police said, in the latest attack on the country's atheist bloggers, minorities and others who promote liberal views.
- The Islamic State group claimed responsibility. Its news agency Amaq said Friday that Sanaur Rahman, a homeopath doctor, was attacked because he promoted Christianity.

7. Paris Bombing Suspect Refuses to Cooperate With Investigation [New York Times]

- PARIS Salah Abdeslam, thought to be the only direct participant in the November terrorist attacks in Paris to have survived, refused to answer questions on Friday at a hearing with a French investigative judge in Paris, the prosecutor's office and his lawyer said.
- Although the hearing was just the first in what is expected to be a long inquiry, Mr. Abdeslam's silence highlighted the obstacles facing investigators as they seek information from him about the attacks, which killed 130 people.
- Mr. Berton said, however, that his client was disturbed by video surveillance in his prison cell. Mr. Abdeslam is being held in isolation at the Fleury-Mérogis Prison, about 20 miles south of Paris, and is barred from contact with other inmates.

8. Security Tightened in Paris for French Open [New York Times]

- The new level of scrutiny at Roland Garros Stadium is both evident and understandable as France, still in a state of emergency, prepares for a grand two months of sport that also present a major security headache.
- The European soccer championship, from June 10 to July 10, will be the much bigger challenge, with its full stadiums and fan zones nationwide. But the French Open — nestled among the foliage and red clay on the fringes of the city's 16th Arrondissement — could also be a target.
- The tournament begins Sunday....

9. U.S military officials tout a win against ISIS [CNN]

- U.S. Military officials Friday pointed to a key victory over ISIS in Iraq but acknowledged the bigger battles against the terror group are still to come.
- Iraqi forces have declared the key town of Rutbah "secure" from ISIS, a conclusion that the United States agrees with, according to spokesman Col. Steve Warren of the U.S.-led coalition.
- The small southwestern town in Anbar province has important strategic value because it sits on the main road connecting Iraq to Jordan. Before the war, it was estimated that \$1 billion in commerce flowed on that road annually.

10. Hezbollah vows stronger presence in Syria after commander's death [Reuter's]

- Lebanese Shi'ite group Hezbollah on Friday vowed to strengthen its presence in wartorn Syria and send more leaders to the conflict, a week after its top military commander there was killed.
- The death of Mustafa Badreddine, who Hezbollah said was killed near Damascus by shellfire from Sunni Islamist rebels, was one of the biggest blows yet to the Iranian-backed group's leadership.

11. Kosovo group jailed for 42 years for aiding Islamic State [Reuter's]

- A Kosovo court sentenced seven men to a total of 42 years in jail for recruiting on behalf of Islamic State or fighting for the group in Syria, a judge said on Friday.
- The main defendant, Imam Zekeria Qazimi, was jailed for 10 years for recruiting young Kosovars to go and fight in Syria. In a 2013 YouTube video Qazimi said: "The blood of infidels is the best drink for us," the judgment said.
- Five others were found guilty of "fighting with the terrorist organization called ISIS after traveling from Pristina to Turkey and later to Syria," the judge said.

12. Belgian prison chaos prompts fears of national malaise [BBC]

- Some of Belgium's top judges and lawyers gathered outside Brussels' Palais de Justice on Friday to protest against what they say is the government's long-term failure to fund a creaking justice system.
- "Security is terrible, conditions are mediaeval," says one former inmate at Forest prison, one
 of Belgium's most notorious institutions not far from the centre of Brussels.
- A Beigian convert to Islam named Abourayan, he spent several weeks in the jail in 2014 and 2015, while on trial on charges relating to terrorism.

13. Wave of Terror Hits African Nations Facing Unrest [Chicago Tribune]

- If the sudden disappearance of an EgyptAir flight turns out to be the work of terrorists, it will be the fourth such attack in the past year on air travelers in North African countries battling militant Islamic groups.
- Even as airports in Europe and North America have strengthened security, experts say that gaps in screening of employees and passengers in the Middle East and Africa are being exploited in a way that security officials say should alarm all nations that fly to those areas.
- "It calls into question the airports in that region," said John Halinski, the former deputy administrator of the U.S. Transportation Security Administration. "It's something that needs to be looked at not just in those countries, but in any country that flies into that country."

14. Iraq crisis: Green Zone protests end in violence [BBC]

- Tear gas and live bullets were fired to drive back the mainly Shia Muslim crowds, as they
 protested against corruption and security failures.
- Officials imposed a curfew in the Iraqi capital, which has now been lifted.

1. IS urges terror attacks on American soil during Ramadan [The Times of Israel]

- The Islamic State group appeared to try to keep morale high among its supporters in a new audio message released on Saturday, which also called for attacks on the US during the holy month of Ramadan.
- The audio recording reportedly featuring IS spokesman Abu Mohammed al-Adnani was posted online late Saturday evening after much fanfare by IS supporters on Twitter.
- Adnani also called for attacks on the US and Europe during the holy month of Ramadan, which starts in early June this year, an appeal he made at the same time last year when urging supporters to seek "martyrdom."

2. 'Now everything is broken:' Terror dragnet sweeps up Somali American's sons [Stars and Stripes]

- In the largest case of its kind on U.S. soil, the FBI swept up 10 young men from the Twin Cities' tight-knit Somali American community and accused them of conspiring to join the Islamic State, or ISIS, and commit murder on its behalf. One man made it to Syria and has been charged in absentia. Six took plea deals and are awaiting sentencing. Three pleaded not guilty.
- The trial of Mohamed Farah and the two others who pleaded not guilty Guled Ali
 Omar, 21, and Abdirahman Yasin Daud, 22 opened last week and is expected to last a month.
- Over the past two years, the U.S. government has charged more than 80 people in connection with ISIS, the terrorist group that surged to global prominence in 2014. More than 30 have been convicted; the rest are on trial or awaiting their day in court.
- The prosecutions are stirring anxiety among American Muslims, who fear their communities are being targeted for federal entrapment. After ISIS-inspired attacks in Paris, Brussels and San Bernardino, California, terrorism has become a major issue in the U.S. presidential campaign. From Los Angeles to Alexandria, Virginia, American Muslims complain of increasing harassment - and of intensifying scrutiny from law enforcement.

3. Aviation security, presidential election featured on Sunday talk shows [USA Today]

- Aviation safety and terrorism will share the spotlight with the 2016 presidential election on the five major Sunday talk shows this week.
- Members of Congress with responsibility for homeland security, foreign affairs and intelligence appear on four shows, as well as Secretary of Homeland Security Jeh Johnson, who will be on Fox News Sunday

4. House ties Pakistani aid to freedom for hero doctor who helped get Bin Laden [Fox News]

- The House of Representatives passed a defense budget that would make \$450 million in aid to Pakistan contingent on the nation doing more to stop a militant terror network and calls for the freeing of an imprisoned doctor who helped the CIA find Usama bin Laden.
- The \$602 billion National Defense Authorization Act passed by the House late
 Wednesday calls on the Muslim-majority nation to crack down on the infamous Haqqani
 Network or lose aid. It also included a "sense of Congress" that Dr. Shakil Afridi is an
 International hero and calls for his immediate release from prison

FBI (18-cv-154)-1763

 Pakistan sentenced Afridi in 2012 to 33 years in jail on charges of belonging to a militant group, which he denies. That sentence was overturned and Afridi is now awaiting trial on another charge.

OCONUS

1. Taliban leader Mullah Mansour killed by U.S. drone strike near Pakistan [New York Daily News]

- The leader of the Taliban was killed Saturday in an American drone strike near the Afghanistan-Pakistan border, U.S. officials said, an account later confirmed by a senior Taliban commander.
- Mullah Mansour was taken out while riding in a vehicle with another Taliban fighter south of the Pakistan town of Ahmad Wal, officials said.
- He was "actively involved" in plotting terror attacks across Afghanistan. He has been "an obstacle to peace and reconciliation between the government of Afghanistan and the Taliban."

2. Just one in seven Brit ISIS fighters are jailed after returning to UK [UK- The Sun]

- Just 54 of 350 back in the UK have faced court, official figures show. Only 35 have been prosecuted, while a further 13 cases involving 30 defendants is being processed, the Home Office said.
- Experts say the figures will raise questions over domestic security. In the latest breach, Gianluca Tomaselli, 27, was found to be working as a London hospital car park attendant after training to be a jihadi.
- A source said one problem facing the security services was finding evidence from a warzone for use in trials against British fighters.

3. EgyptAir Upgraded Security After Past Threats [The International Business Times]

- The Airbus plane that carried the passengers of EgyptAir Flight 804 was victim to
 previous terror threats. Graffiti that read, "We will bring this plane down," was scrawled
 in Arabic on the underside of the plane two years prior to the crash, the New York Times
 reported.
- Seventeen years ago, EgyptAir Flight 990 crashed en route to Los Angeles from Cairo. It
 is still unknown if the crash was due to mechanical failure or an act of terror, USA Today
 reported.
- EgyptAir has tried to improve security on its planes by assigning two officers to each flight. These officers assist the flight crew in any passenger emergencies and also monitor the deplaning and boarding processes, including the luggage transfer.

4. Internal blast 'tore right side' of EgyptAir jet [The New Indian Express]

- Data from the final moments before EgyptAir flight MS804 crashed into the Mediterranean suggest an "internal explosion" tore through the right side of the aircraft, a pilot said last night.
- Investigators trying to determine whether the A320 was brought down by terrorism or a technical fault are poring over a series of warnings indicating smoke filled the cabin shortly before it disappeared from radar.

5. Iraqi army says preparing to retake IS-held Falluja, tells residents to leave [Reuters]

- Iraq's army said on Sunday it was preparing to retake the Islamic State stronghold of Falluja and asked residents to get ready to leave, state TV reported.
- Families who could not leave should raise white flags to mark their location in the city
 just west of Baghdad, the army's media unit added, according to the TV channel.

- Former president Asif Ali Zardari has told the United States that Pakistan was committed to fight terrorism as he voiced concern over the deterioration of Islamabad-Washington relations.

 People's Party (PPP), said, referring to mass-casualty attacks by the Taliban and AlQaeda, most recently in Lahore, in a letter published in The New York Times on Saturday.

7. Can France Protect Tourists and Sports Fans This Summer? [The Daily Beast]

- From the Euro 16 soccer championships to the Tour de France, the country will be a target-rich environment for terror.
- The 51 Euro 2016 soccer matches will be held in 10 cities across France—from Paris and Lens in the north to Nice and Marsellle in the south—beginning June 10 and ending July 10.

8. Malaysia's police nab 14 in anti-terror crackdown [The News International]

- Malaysian authorities detained 14 people believed to have links to the Islamic State (IS)
 in a series of raids across several states earlier this week.
- Deputy inspector-general of police Noor Rashid Ibrahim said in a statement that eight
 of the suspects are believed to have transferred money to the IS in Syria and the Abu
 Sayyaf militant group in the southern Philippines.
- All eight are also believed to have ties with Malaysian IS recruiter Muhammad Wanndy Mohamed Jedi, who police had earlier identified as having recruited several Malaysians to launch an attack in the southeast Asian nation.

9. Soko Haram ready to discuss surrender and release of Chibok girls [Nigeria - The Nation]

- Terror sect Boko Haram seems to willing to broker a deal with the federal government to release the remaining kidnapped Chibok school girls in return for escaping prosecution.
- "We want to surrender because things are getting worse," said Amir Muhammad
 Abdullahi, who is reportedly Boko Haram's second in command. He said no side was

- Mourad Laachraoui, who will compete at Rio 2016, has said he was "scared and saddened" by his brother's actions and added that "you don't choose your family." Just two months ago his brother, Najim, blew himself up in an attack that killed 32 people.
- In a press conference shortly after the Brussels bombings, he said: "When we were younger we were close, but as I became more passionate about sport we grew apart."

13. Hezbollah to bolster military presence in Syria [World Bulletin]

- A Hezbollah chief Hassan Nasrallah on Friday said his Lebanese Shiite movement would boost its support for Syria's regime after one of its top commanders was killed there last
- According to Hezbollah expert Waddah Charara, the Shiite militant group has sent. between 5,000 and 6,000 combatants to Syria since 2013. Between 1,000 and 2,000 Hezbollah fighters have been killed in fighting there, other experts say.

14. Lebanon arrests 3 'terror' suspects [The Daily Star]


- Lebanese General Security said it arrested a Syrian national, identified by the initials Aa.M., as part of a special operation. He confessed to providing logistical assistance to militants and smuggling them into Syria so they could join the ranks of militant groups fighting government forces, the statement added. The suspect said he was working under a Syrian militant commander identified as M. M.
- Meanwhile, the Lebanese Army also arrested two men in Beirut's southern suburbs suspected of being affiliated to militant groups.

15. Iraq asks Jordan to extradite Saddam's eldest daughter, Ba'athi veterans [Ahlul Bayt News Agency]

- Iraq has demanded Jordan extradite the daughter of former Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein as well as a number of his loyalists residing in the kingdom.
- Raghad Hussein, Saddam's eldest daughter, has been living in Amman as a "guest of the royal family" since leaving Iraq in 2003, when US and British forces invaded Iraq and ousted Saddam. The Jordanian royal family has already rejected the Iraqi government's demand to extradite the 47-year-old Raghad.
- Raghad, who is also known as Little Saddam for her similarities to her father, has openly pledged her support for the Takfiri Daesh terror group.

16. European Central Bank pressures BOV to close down suspicious Libyan accounts [Malta Independent]

- The European Central Bank is applying considerable pressure on Bank of Valletta (BOV). to close down bank accounts opened by Libyan nationals since at least 2013 and which have been flagged as not having been subjected to legally-required due diligence procedures.
- Bank of Valletta is resisting the demand, and has instead agreed to close down trusts set up in recent years by Libyan nationals. Such trusts have also raised the concern of Malta's anti-money laundering and anti-terrorism funding authorities in that they lacked due diligence procedures when they were set up.

Is Hillary Clinton Telling the Truth About Emails?

By Lauren Carroll and Jon Greenberg

Saturday's news that Hillary Clinton spent more than three hours speaking with the FBI bled into the Sunday news shows, with Clinton again saying she did not send or receive material marked classified through the private email server she used while secretary of state.

"Let me just repeat what I have repeated for many months now," Clinton told NBC's Chuck Todd in a phone interview following her interview with investigators. "I never received nor sent any material that was marked classified."

The line has been part of Clinton's defense since at least last August. Back then, PolitiFact hesitated to rate Clinton's claim because of the fluidity of events and the ongoing investigation.

Eleven months later, we wanted to take a fresh look.

Classified after the fact

The public became aware that Clinton used a private email server in March 2015. Eventually, Clinton turned over about 30,000 work-related emails to the State Department for public release.

The State Department redacted about 2,000 of those emails before releasing them, saying they contain classified information — including some that have been withheld entirely because they contain "top secret" information.

Clinton's statement focuses on a much narrower and potentially misleading point — that Clinton sent or received material she knew was classified because it was marked.

None of the emails the State Department redacted, or any other emails made public, contained classification markings at the time they were sent, government officials said.

The possibility remains, however, that that she sent or received classified information that was inappropriately left unlabeled — or that Clinton, as head of the department, failed to recognize and deal with information that should have been classified.

Further, because Clinton used a private server, we only have Clinton's word that she turned over all relevant email. It's possible there are emails with classified information on them that she deleted or did not turn over.

Danielle Brian, executive director of the Project on Government Oversight, said Clinton is carefully picking her words.

"On the one hand, I believe that sentence is likely accurate," said Danielle Brian, executive director of the Project on Government Oversight, told PolitiFact. "But I also believe that it is so carefully crafted as

Obtained via FOIA by Judicial Watch, Inc. to avoid a more important question, which is whether there was information in her email that should have been marked classified."

The plot only gets more complicated.

While we know officials retroactively classified portions of emails on Clinton's private server, we do not yet know if any of those emails contained classified information when they first landed in Clinton's server. It's possible that emails that were not marked classified contained classified information.

There's also some disagreement between the State Department and the intelligence community over what was or should have been treated as classified. Government agencies regularly disagree over what should be classified or not, and transparency advocates say the government regularly overclassifies.

Clinton's specific phrasing — that she never sent or received material "marked classified" — is likely a critical point for investigators, as it's relevant to the question of Clinton's intent and whether she knowingly mishandled material.

In that sense, Steven Aftergood, director of the Project on Government Secrecy at the Federation of American Scientists, said Clinton's claim might not be misleading.

But it's also true, Aftergood said, "that statement alone does not answer all possible questions about the matter."

Overall, Clinton is focusing on a technical aspect of the government chain of classification, that information contained within her private email server wasn't "marked" classified. There is no evidence Clinton knowingly sent or received classified information.

But the government classification system is complicated, and Clinton fails to acknowledge that classified information could have moved through her email server without a proper label. Part of the problem is Clinton's private server itself, because only she and her team know what was in the emails she deleted.

We rate the claim Half True.

Clinton, the Russian 'reset'

On Meet the Press, Sen. Tom Cotton, R-Ark., was asked to explain foreign policy positions that appear more in line with Clinton than Republican presumptive nominee Donald Trump.

"I can assure you that I'm not very close to Hillary Clinton. I think she's disqualified herself from commander in chief by her cavalier attitude towards our nation's secrecy laws," Cotton said. "And she has been responsible for many of the worst decisions of the Obama administration.

"She was literally present when we pressed the reset button with Russia just a few months after Russia had invaded Georgia."

Cotton's talk about Russia is an imperfect but not inaccurate retelling of history. That claim rates Mostly True.

Russia long has had a military presence in the semi-autonomous Georgian regions of South Ossetia

and Abkhazia, two areas that enjoyed substantial autonomy from Georgia.

In 1991, Georgian forces occupied the South Ossetian capital, but resistance by Russian-backed fighters led to a stalemate. In 1992, all parties agreed to a ceasefire, which included a Russian-led peacekeeping force. There was a similar pattern of hostilities in Abkhazia that resulted in a similar solution. The presence of peacekeepers and international monitors worked for about a decade.

Calm unravelled in 2004 with the election of a more nationalist leader in Georgia. There was aggression on both sides. Violence grew and on Aug. 7, 2008, after Russian-backed rebels in South Ossetia shelled ethnically Georgian villages, the Georgian government sent in its army to take control of the region. Russia responded militarily, successfully pushing back Georgian troops from both South Ossetia and Abkhazia.

Clashes continued for a week, drawing in portions of Georgia beyond the two breakaway regions, until France helped broker a peace deal. Open conflict ended Aug. 12, 2008. Russia then recognized South Ossetia and Abkhazia as sovereign nations, though most other countries have not taken that step.

Jump forward to March 2009 to pick up the other point in Cotton's statement.

Newly elected President Barack Obama had campaigned that he would put relations with Russia on a less confrontational footing. Most of his focus was on scaling back the nuclear arsenals of both nations.

As part of that initiative, on March 6, 2009, in Geneva, Switzerland, then-Secretary of State Clinton gave her Russian counterpart Sergei Lavrov a red button. The button was supposed to have word "reset" written on it in Russian. But the Americans got it wrong — the word translated to "overcharged."

So Cotton has the basics of the story largely correct though he's cutting off the edges of the story. Russian troops did participate in military activities on Georgian soil, but troops were already in place as part of a brokered settlement. The Russians didn't necessarily initiate hostilities.

And while Cotton said the Americans hit the "reset" button "a few months" after the Russian invasion, the reality is it took place almost six months after the week-long conflict had ended.

Susan Allen, director of the Center for Peacemaking Process at George Mason University, calls Russia's action an invasion because in early August 2008, no one considered South Ossetia to be an independent country.

But Allen told us that beyond that legal definition, the details muddy the picture. Georgia made the first large military move. On top of that, Russian soldiers were already on the ground in South Ossetia.

"Russia had had a longstanding role as part of a peacekeeping force separating the Georgians and South Ossetians," Allen said. "Yes, Russia invaded Georgia, and, yes, there is a lot more to the story."



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Did Clinton delete any emails while facing a subpoena?

No. As noted, the emails that Clinton chose not to keep were personal emails—they were not federal records or even work-related—and therefore were not subject to any preservation obligation under the Federal Records Act or any request. Nor would they have been subject to the subpoena—which did not exist at the time—that was issued by the Benghazi Select Committee some three months later.
