A Yes; I have a specific memory of marking out James Baker and Marlin Fitzwater, because there was a big joke that those were the only two names that I could remember. And I went through and did the same thing with the Bushes and the Quayles, and we then handed the list over to Tony and said okay, go through it, and if there are any more

names that you recognize that are Bush appointees, let's go ahead and mark through them and then, make another request of Secret Service to take these people off the lists. And then, after we do that, we will request another one later.

Q I'm sorry; I hate to keep interrupting David; I'm not trying to distract. But were there any other names you mentioned? The Bushes, the Quayles, Fitzwater and Baker; do you recall any other names that you personally marked off?

A Those are the only names I recall.

MR. HIRSHLAND: Okay; thanks.

MR. SCHANZER: Now, off of this second list, do you know if he ever used this second list, the one you just talked about, to continue Project Update during this period?

THE WITNESS: I believe that for a little while, he did. I don't think it was a very long time. I think it was shortly thereafter that we requested a new one after he had gone through it, because what we tried to do is have those staff members in the office--it was mainly Tony's responsibility, but anybody in that office really--if you recognize a name that should not be here, let's go ahead and strike it.
