But after the shooting of an ICE agent and the BP agent in Arizona, what is your view on that? I know that you solicited an IG study. Is this the correct use of Project Gunrunner? Of course itâ $\in$ <sup>TM</sup>s a great concern.</sup>

### **Attorney General Holder:**

The mission of ATF is to stop the flow of guns into Mexico and to people who shouldn't have guns here in the states. ATF has served greatly here and in Mexico.

It is true, there have been concerns. I take those allegations very seriously and that is why I asked the IG to report on it. Letting guns †walk' is not something that is acceptable. Guns are different than drugs or money when we are trying to follow their trail. That is not acceptable. We cannot have a situation where guns are allowed to walk. And I made that clear to attorneys and agents in charge of ATF.

Following the Government of Mexico's request for information about ATF's Operation "Fast and Furious" and the statement made by the U.S. Department of Justice, The Office of the Attorney General states:

As part of the intense exchange of information it conducts with the Department of Justice [the PGR] has had contacts regarding various specific cases, some of which are known to have links to this operation. As has already been mentioned, at no time [did the PGR] have information indicating that U.S. authorities have planted or have authorized the crossing of weapons into Mexican territory, which would not have been acceptable to Mexico under any circumstances.

[The PGR] Recognizes the commitment to bilateral cooperation shown by the Department of Justice and ATF itself to initiate investigations into this case and has offered the support that may be required in both processes in order to fully clarify the facts and if so required punish those responsible.

The Government of Mexico reiterates its commitment to strengthen cooperation with the United States to prevent and stop trafficking in weapons from the U.S. into Mexico.
