The Committee on Oversight and Government Reform hereby requests your testimony at a hearing on Wednesday, June 15, 2011, at 10:00 a.m. in room 2154 Rayburn House Office Building in Washington, DC. Attached you will find a subpoena requiring your presence at the hearing.

The hearing will examine Operation Fast and Furious, conducted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF).
