The Committee on Oversight and Government Reform hereby requests your testimony at a hearing on Wednesday, June 15, 2011, at 10:00 a.m. in room 2154 Rayburn House Office Building.

The hearing will examine Operation Fast and Furious, conducted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF). In particular, the hearing will focus on ATF's reckless methods, which allowed straw purchasers to buy semi-automatic assault weapons and transfer the guns to Mexican drug cartels, resulting in the death of hundreds of Mexican citizens and an American Border Patrol Agent. The hearing will also address the tragic event of December 14, 2010, that resulted from this program. You should be prepared to provide a five-minute opening statement and answer questions posed by Members. In particular, you should also be prepared to explain publicly the reasons the Department of Justice has not produced any non-public documents pursuant to the Committee's valid and lawfully issued subpoena.
