It is highly unlikely that the PGR will conduct ballistic examinations to determine which firearms were used to shoot at the helicopter. The only other reported incident of similar nature occurred in Arteago, Michoacán, Mexico, on December 9, 2010, when SSP helicopters came under fire while deploying SSP

GOPES. As a result, 5 SSP personnel were killed. **ATF** that La Familia has contacted SSP and informed them that they will continue to attempt to shoot down their helicopters.

NOTE, Preliminary reports regarding this incident from PGR to this office were simply incorrect.

Mexican AG is aware that F&F firearms were recovered as a result of the May, 29, 2001 event. She was concerned but

not alarmed in any way.
