A spokesman for Arizona U.S. Attorney Dennis Burke said Wednesday that none of the complaints raised by ATF agents Wednesday "have ever been raised in the past with this office."

Robert Sherwood said some of the agent's statements contradict statistics and facts about the office's successful prosecution of gun cases. He said the office is prosecuting more and more cases.

"Indeed, ATF is on record as commending this office for the outstanding work on gun-related prosecutions and the office has won national awards within the last year," Sherwood said. "We stand by our record of gun-related prosecutions."

Burke would not respond directly to questions raised about his office's involvement in Operation Fast and Furious or to claims that his office purposely allowed guns to "walk" into the hands of Mexican cartel members.

A fact sheet from the Arizona U.S. Attorney's office shows that prosecution of gun-related cases rose 8 percent from 2009 to 2010 with 185 cases. The office so far in 2011 has prosecuted 113 cases.
