Hi Matt

Could you give me an update about the computer link situation we discussed on Tuesday. As we understand it, all documents produced to the Committee have been made available to certain ATF employees via a shortcut installed on their computer desktop.

Can you tell us whether this access included (assuming you shut this down like you said you would immediately on Tuesday evening) access to documents produced *in camera* as well?

We have rec'd the McMahon transcript. He testified as follows:

Q So how much of your time has been spent in terms of assisting with responding to the various inquiries and the public controversy about this case?

A Not much. They have pulled all my emails. They asked me to go through other documents. And I did that. And then I haven't been doing much more. I have been purposely just trying to stay away from it. It can get pretty depressing.

Q What other documents have you gone through other than your emails?

A A couple of the things that have been produced. They put a link on our computer, some kind of drive that I can click on and read things that have been produced. So I do that every once in a while, but not normally.

Q And so what is the purpose of that, to your knowledge?

A Just to refresh my recollection about what is out there, you know.

Q So you have a link on your computer so that you know what we have been provided by Justice?

A Yes. There is a link in our computer for Gunrunner, Fast and Furious produced to Congress, and there is updates every once in a while of those documents that are being produced.

Q And those aren't just documents that you are on, those are documents that other people are on?

A Sure. Yeah.

Q And are you encouraged to look at that? Or it is there for your perusal if you want to?

A It is there for my perusal if I want to, and every once in a while I have some time I just read it what type of documents that are showing up. Most of it I have already seen before.

Q So you think you've read them all?

A I know I haven't read everything, no, but --

Q Are there versions that you have on that available to you at length? Are they redacted?

A I believe they are. I believe they are. Yes.

Q So it is just literally a copy of what we got?

A Yes.
