Summary: Arizona Trailer Manufacturing, Inc., a company based in Buckeye, Ariz., and its president and owner, Richard Taylor, also of Buckeye, were sentenced on Wednesday to two years of probation and to collectively pay a \$30,000 fine for engaging in a pattern and practice of knowingly employing illegal aliens.

Quote: "This is a unique case because both the owner and the company itself were sentenced and fined for knowingly employing illegal aliens," said U.S. Attorney Dennis K. Burke. "When employers find out that their employees are unauthorized to work in this country, they can't continue employing them. This was an ongoing pattern that we have put to an end."
