Representatives from the Arab American Institute (AAI), the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee (ADC), and the Muslim Public Affairs Council (MPAC) stressed the importance of continued dialogue and additional efforts to promote partnerships between local communities and law enforcement.

As has been repeatedly demonstrated, profiling is ineffective, wastes precious law enforcement resources, and alienates American communities eager to assist in keeping our country safe and secure."

Mary Rose Oakar, President of the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee (ADC), said: "We urged the Attorney General to repeal the 2008 Department of Justice FBI Guidelines that were put into effect in the last month of the Bush Administration and asked him to assist in repealing the NSEERS program, which targets young men from Arab and Muslim countries."

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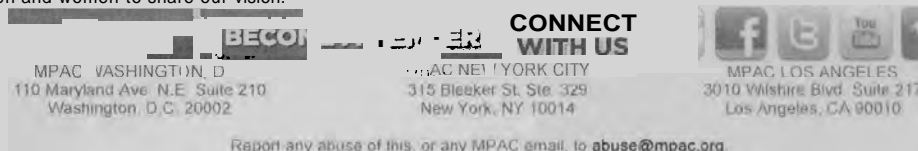

The groups are planning to make a joint public statement on Friday, but since the cabinet meeting is first thing in the morning, I thought I'd share with you the summary. You and the Secretary might find this of interest:

The commitments Secretary Napolitano made to these community leaders include:

- Community participation in an anti-violent extremism task force of the Homeland Security Advisory Council, which reports to the Secretary;
- Regular, quarterly meetings with the Secretary;
- A seminar on cultural competency for DHS leadership; and
- An honest and full discussion of legitimate grievances from members of these communities about DHS policies that are ineffective and have a deleterious, humiliating impact on Muslim, Arab, Sikh and South Asian American communities.

Community leaders believe that fulfilling these commitments would be a step forward in establishing meaningful, open and authentic dialogue between DHS and the Muslim, Arab, Sikh and South Asian American communities. In addition, these leaders have called for changes to DHS policies that are ineffective and discriminate based on race, ethnicity or religion.
