## EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information ( A ) could be reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, ( B ) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, ( C ) could be reasonably expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, ( D ) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, ( E ) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or ( F ) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;

- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

VISIT OF PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON AND MRS. JOHN F. KENNEDY AND FAMILY TO NEWPORT NEWS, VA., 5/27/67

On 5/27/67 the aircraft carrier "John F. Kennedy" will be launched at Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Co., Newport News, Va. According to press sources, the President, Mrs. JOHN F. KENNEDY and her two children, and Senators ROBERT KENNEDY and EDWARD KENNEDY are to attend.

*Senator*  
Commander GEORGE HUMPHRIES, NISO, Norfolk, advised this date that on 5/18/67 Undersecretary of the Navy ROBERT H. BALDWIN will arrive at Patrick Henry Airport, Newport News, from Washington, D.C. Mr. BALDWIN, along with Rear Admiral REYNOLD HOGLE, Commandant, 5th Naval District, will survey the Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Co. area for helicopter landing facilities in connection with the arrival of the President and Mrs. KENNEDY. He further indicated that the Navy is setting up a point of contact for the arrival of the President. He indicated that he has not received any information concerning the arrival of the President and Mrs. KENNEDY from Mr. [redacted] Secret Service, Norfolk.

No request for assistance from Secret Service has been received as of this date. Above is for information, and Bureau will be kept advised.

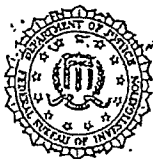

On July 10, 1969, Senator KENNEDY had received a letter which was addressed to Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, 1400 Pennsylvania Avenue, Senate Building, Washington, D. C., and which bore a return address of [REDACTED] Building 110, M. C. R. D., San Diego, California 92140. The letter was postmarked July 8, 1969 at San Diego, California and read as follows:

" 7 July 69

"Dear Punk (OBSCENE OBSCENE)

We thought we'd write this letter to let you know you're a dead (OBSCENE OBSCENE). We've been offered \$20,000 apiece to bump your nasty (OBSCENE) off. We have accepted. When we get through with you, you're gonna look like you were in the St. Valentine's Day Massacre.

Your wife Joan is a (OBSCENE) looking little (OBSCENE), I'd sure like to (OBSCENE) out that (OBSCENE) little (OBSCENE) of hers. I hear that she (OBSCENE) (OBSCENE) almost as much as you. Is that true? Is it true that your mother is as big

a faggot as your? Well Punk (OBSCENE) (OBSCENE) you may not know but we will take great pleasure in eliminating your (OBSCENE) from the political scene. I know how the others took care of your brothers. Did you ever read the Merchant of Venice from Shakespeare: I'm gonna take a "pound of flesh" from you to compensate for what the Marines have done to me. I'm gonna castrate your (OBSCENE) (OBSCENE). [redacted] provided a xerox copy of the letter and its envelope and stated that the Secret Service had been advised of the letter and the FBI in Washington, D. C. had also been advised. [redacted] verified that both subjects were stationed at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot and were currently confined to the brig on other charges. [redacted] also confirmed the serial numbers as given by [redacted] and [redacted] as being correct.

On July 24, 1969, the facts of this case were presented to Assistant U. S. Attorney HARRY R. MC CUE, San Diego, California, who declined prosecution of the case as being a matter more appropriately handled by military authorities.

On July 25, 1969, SA [redacted] was advised of Assistant U. S. Attorney MC CUE's opinion and stated that appropriate action would be taken by military authorities.

2. IN THE LIGHT OF SOUTH AFRICAN PRESS REPORTS THAT SENATOR KENNEDY IS PLANNING TO VISIT SOUTH AFRICA FROM JAN 4 - JAN 12, IT IS MY DUTY TO ALERT THE DEPARTMENT NOW TO A CRITICAL SECURITY PROBLEM. THE IMPLICATIONS OF AN ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT ON THE SENATOR WHILE IN THIS COUNTRY REQUIRE NO ELABORATION. YET, THE SENATOR'S TRAGIC FAMILY HISTORY, THE LIKELIHOOD THAT HIGH-PROFILED APPEARANCES BY THE SENATOR IN UNCONTROLLED SETTINGS WILL RAISE TEMPERATURES IN AN ALREADY TENSE SITUATION, THE EXISTENCE OF VIOLENT AND ARMED RADICAL GROUPS AT THE ENDS OF THE WHITE AND BLACK POLITICAL SPECTRUMS ALL MAKE IT MANDATORY TO START ORGANIZING SECURITY PRECAUTIONS NOW AND TO DISCUSS THEM WITH THE SENATOR. 1. AS A RESULT OF HER VISIT HERE SEPTEMBER 7 (REFTTEL), SENATOR KENNEDY'S FOREIGN POLICY ADVISOR SODERBERG INFORMS US THAT THE SENATOR WILL VISIT FRANKFURT AND BONN NOVEMBER 14-15. THE PLAN IS TO FLY INTO BONN (FROM WARSAW, APPARENTLY), ARRIVING APPROXIMATELY 1700 ON NOVEMBER 14, IN FRANKFURT, WHERE HE EXPECTS TO HAVE A DINNER WITH A SMALL GROUP OF CONTACTS AND MAKE A SPEECH THE FOLLOWING MORNING. HE WILL THEN MOTORCADE ONWARD TO BONN FOR MEETINGS THERE. DEPARTURE FROM BONN/KOLN AIRPORT IS NOVEMBER 16 AT 0710, FROM THERE ONWARD TO PRAGUE VIA FRANKFURT.
2. WE HAVE BLOCKED OUT HOTEL ROOMS IN BOTH BONN AND FRANKFURT PER SODERBERGS REQUIREMENTS AS EXPRESSED IN A RECENT TELCON. BEFORE PROCEEDING FORMALLY TO REQUEST MEETINGS WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND TO SET UP OTHER EVENTS, HOWEVER, PERHAPS THE DEPARTMENT (H) COULD SEEK TO CONFIRM THE SENATOR'S PLANS AND ANNOUNCE THE VISIT.

1. SUBJECT, EMBASSY REPRESENTATION CASE RESID Leningrad, appeared at consular office on May 17 and told Consoff she was planning public protest re her inability obtain Soviet exit permission for travel to US. She produced copy of letter she sending to United Nations, International Red Cross and Party Secretary Brezhnev. Letter states she and 12 year old daughter unable obtain exit permission reunite with husband (now in Israel) and planning three-day hunger strike in connection with International Children's Day June 1. She also planning to provide copy of letter and details her situation to American Press Corps Moscow. Consoff outlined likely adverse reaction by Soviet authorities to this step, but she plans proceed regardless.

2. Consoff also gave Epelman sealed hand-written note to her left by Senator Kennedy during recent visit. Note thanked her for letters and expressed Senator's wish to see her soon in US.

3. Epelman plans contact Moscow Consoff Steiner in near future for additional discussion her situation.

known to have communist sympathies. While in Mexico City, Kennedy asked the Ambassador  
to invite left-wingers to the Embassy where he could interview them; however, the

ment official in Lima, Peru, confidentially advised that Kennedy had made a similar

In August, 1961, a confidential source advised that Edward Kennedy had  
recently dined with Dr. Lauchlin Bernard Currie, former White House Aide to President  
Roosevelt. Currie's name had been mentioned in Washington investigations of Soviet spy  
rings. It was also noted that Dr. Currie had recently been invited to the U. S. Embassy  
at Bogata, Columbia, where Currie presently resides.

In October, 1961, a confidential source on Portuguese matters advised that  
Edward Kennedy was planning to enter politics and had retained one [redacted]  
an attorney in Boston, to be his advisor on how to obtain Portuguese votes in Massachusetts.  
This source described [redacted] as being a rightist and an extremist on behalf of the

Legat, Rio de Janeiro, has furnished data from State Department files, Sao Paulo, Brazil, indicating that in August, 1961, Edward and Robert Kennedy, now U.S. Senator and Attorney General, respectively, were interested in subject's obtaining an immigrant visa to U.S. Subject is former Hungarian actress of unsavory reputation who has now obtained the immigrant visa. Attorney General (AG) being advised.

Subject, Hungarian-born, aged 48, is former well-known actress in Hungary. Numerous allegations have been received in the past indicating subject to have been a communist collaborator, lesbian, and prostitute. She has reportedly admitted being the fiancée of the head of Hungarian intelligence (Nazi) during World War II and was allegedly a close friend of Hungarian intelligence head (communist) after World War II. Subject "escaped" from Hungary in 1951 under unusual circumstances and in the company of an individual who subsequently admitted he was a Hungarian intelligence informant. Subject has resided in recent years in Brazil where she has operated a hat-designing business. Bureau investigation of subject in connection with a brief visit subject made to the United States in 1958 neither confirmed nor refuted the variety of allegations which have been made against the subject. In connection with her visa applications subject has consistently denied having communist associations at any time or any connection with Hungarian intelligence services. Similarly, she denied having any lesbian tendencies.

Issuance of an immigrant visa to subject 12/28/62 which permits subject permanent residence in U.S. prompted review of subject's visa file at U.S. Consulate, Sao Paulo, Brazil, by Legat, Rio. Review indicated that with exception of temporary permit issued to subject to visit U.S. in 1958, subject has been consistently refused an immigrant visa because of the voluminous subversive and derogatory data on file concerning her. However, in August, 1961, Consulate officials were contacted by Bela Kornitzer, one of several individuals who accompanied Edward M. Kennedy, the President's brother on a Latin American tour in mid-1961. Kornitzer, indicating he was

acting in Mr. Kennedy's interest, expressed considerable displeasure at the failure of the Consulate to issue an immigrant visa to the subject. He reportedly indicated that both Edward and Robert Kennedy were "boiling mad" over the Karady situation. Kornitzer further tried to impress Consulate officials with his possession of a letter from the Assistant Attorney General, Internal Security Division, purportedly clearing Karady. Exhibition of this letter, however, indicated it merely listed the steps required prior to the issuance of a visa to subject.

Subsequent to Kornitzer's contacts with the Consulate, U.S. Minister Cochran was in touch with Edward Kennedy who very courteously expressed interest in the Karady case and when the classified and administrative aspects were pointed out by Minister Cochran to Mr. Kennedy he seemed to be completely satisfied.

From this point on several memoranda were exchanged between the Sao Paulo Consulate to State Department looking toward a ruling with respect to subject's eligibility for an immigrant visa. A decision was eventually reached in subject's favor.

Kornitzer, a minor official of the post World War II Hungarian Government, initially entered the U.S. in 1946 and remained here after a disagreement with the Hungarian Government. Since 1947 he has been in touch with the Bureau on numerous occasions making repeated efforts to arrange for an interview with the Director on one pretext or another with the objective of writing an article or biography of the Director. As an author and biographer, Kornitzer has been in contact with many leading political personalities in the U.S. and has authored several books including one on the Eisenhower brothers in 1955 and another on former Vice President Nixon in 1960. Kornitzer, while disclaiming to be a "name-dropper," frequently uses this technique. In 1947 a Bureau official described Kornitzer as a smooth-talking, fast-operating, tricky individual who would use a contact with the Director to his advantage in meeting other individuals.

Extensive investigation by the Bureau concerning Karady has previously been conducted. In the absence of any new allegations and further since the State Department saw fit to permit her entry into the U.S. as an immigrant with full knowledge of available derogatory data, investigation by the Bureau at this time is unnecessary, and inadvisable.

SUBJECT: SENATOR EDWARD M. KENNEDY (D-MASSACHUSETTS)  
REQUEST FOR ARTICLE

By letter dated 10-13-64, Senator Kennedy advised he is currently putting together a short book of recollections about his father, Joseph P. Kennedy. It is to be composed of personal essays written by those who are the senior Kennedy's closest friends, and the Director is requested to write an account of this nature. Mr. Hoover has indicated he would be agreeable to providing Senator Kennedy with such an article.

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Joseph P. Kennedy is on the Special Correspondents' List and is known to the Director on a first-name basis. On numerous occasions, he has expressed a great admiration for Mr. Hoover and the work of the FBI. He was a Special Service Contact of the Boston Office from 1943 until 1954, following which he was an SAC Contact of that Division.

The FBI has never conducted a complete investigation of Mr. Kennedy; however, a limited inquiry was made in May, 1951, at the request of the Department. This concerned an allegation that Mr. Kennedy, then owner of the Merchandise Mart in Chicago, had given \$100,000 for the removal of Government offices from that building. No specific facts were developed and the inquiry was closed on 6-7-51.

In 1953, the State Department advised that William Bullitt, former Ambassador to France, stated that while Mr. Kennedy was Ambassador to London he frequently called \_\_\_\_\_

(S) According to Mr. Bullitt, Mr. Kennedy sought council concerning important issues and always followed the latter's advice. Mr. Bullitt also alleged that large financial offers were made by Mr. Kennedy in an attempt to get \_\_\_\_\_ to accept employment with him. (S)

Edward M. Kennedy defeated Republican candidate George C. Lodge in an election held on 11-6-62. The 9-28-62, issue of "Time" magazine contained an article which reflected Senator Kennedy obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1956 from Harvard. After being turned down by the Harvard Law School, he entered the University of Virginia Law School, earning a Bachelor of Laws Degree in 1959. The 4-9-62 issue of "U. S. News and World Report" stated Mr. Kennedy announced he

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

March 12, 1969

Subject: Telephone Call Concerning Possible Problems with Launch of AS-504 and Predicted Death of Edward Kennedy.

1. On February 28, 1969, this office was contacted by Captain Mack of Pan American Airways (PAA) Security Police at Cape Kennedy Air Force Station (CKAFS) who stated that a PAA employee by the name of Homer Gayhartt had received the subject call and wished to inform the proper authorities. *Ha Ky*
2. The writer proceeded to PAA Security Police Headquarters at CKAFS and interviewed Mr. Gayhartt, supervisor of Launch Complexes 31 and 32, Pan American Airways, CKAFS.
3. Mr. Gayhartt stated that at about 1:30 a.m. the morning of the 28th his wife answered a telephone call from a Josephine Bagley who stated that her husband wanted to talk to Mr. Gayhartt. Mrs. Gayhartt called Mr. Gayhartt to the phone. When he answered the phone the party on the line identified himself as "Luke" from "Hazard" and made the following statement (in substance).

"The Lord told me something is wrong. I have talked to NASA in Washington all day. I don't trust ..... (gave names but Gayhartt could not recall them). Put on more guards. There is moisture in the ..... oil, (gave trade name, not recognizable to Gayhartt as anything used in space vehicles), in the engine where there is a "Y", and if it isn't changed, there will be a problem.

4. At this point "Luke" mentioned three mens' names and three womens' names, which Gayhartt could not recall, and the names Von Braun and Haney which he did recognize as being NASA officials. The names were spoken rapidly and nothing was said concerning them. "Luke" then said,

"The Lord told me there was bakelite stripped off, and the missile would putt, putt, putt, and boom! It would get no higher than tree top level. The Lord told me that Edward Kennedy will die in May at ..... (location was named but Gayhartt did not recall it). I don't know what you can do about it but please try."

5. Gayhartt stated that "Luke" talked excitedly and irrationally at first, but after making the above statements started to talk about family matters and calmed down and became more rational. Also, that Hazard is probably Hazard, Kentucky where Gayhartt originally came from and upon recollection

that Josephine Bagley is his cousin and that she and her sister married twin brothers named Mark and Luke, but he could not recall Lukes last name and could not recall ever having met him.

6. On March 3, 1969, Gayhartt contacted the writer and stated that he had called his father, now residing in Naples, Florida, concerning the call from "Luke". His father said that "Luke" had called him the same night and he had furnished "Luke" Gayhartt's phone number to get rid of him. He identified "Luke" as Luke Walters and described him as a "religious fanatic," married to his niece Josephine and residing in or near Hazard, Kentucky.

7. The writer subsequently contacted a Captain George Smith of the Hazard Police Department, Hazard, Kentucky. Captain Smith said he was well acquainted with Luke Walters and that Walters was in the coal business about five miles from Hazard; was a respected member of the community, law abiding, always cooperative with the police department, and had in the past been a deputy. Captain Smith further stated that Walters was interested in religious work, and owned a church which was built for his father who is a preacher. The denomination is "Church of Christ". Captain Smith stated that there have been labor problems in that area involving the coal mines, and it was felt locally that they were Communist inspired.

8. The writer made inquiries to persons knowledgeable of the Saturn V systems concerning the information about the engine oil, etc., and could find no indication that Walter's information was pertinent.

Easter, Staff Official, National Aeronautical and Space Authority, 400 Maryland Avenue, S.W., made available to an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation a typed and reproduced leaflet bearing the name of Eldridge E. Morton, 1101 Harvard Road, S.E., Washington, D.C. Mr. Easter stated he wished to bring this leaflet to the attention of authorities due to implied threats against the life of Senator Ted Kennedy.

Mr. Easter added italics on this leaflet enclosed this section:

"Spurn the damned Kennedys! They are in my pocket where Jesus put them. Ted will join his brothers before the Words of God (Rev. 13:5) is mocked--or the United States will pass from Earth!"

The above information was furnished to Special Agent [redacted] United States Secret Service; Detective [redacted] Metropolitan Police Department; and Officer [redacted] United States Capitol Police.
