As you know, and very much thanks to the help again of HRC, we hope to be able to move forward with the final phase of the political process in the Autumn.

As the CGI coincides with the UN meeting and also the G20, we should explore the idea of whether we could bring together and participation of both the British and Irish Prime Ministers under the auspices of the CGI. The theme

could be 'Implementing Peace'. The session would explore the steps for the peace and political process in NI and obviously a session could have wider application into say the Middle East peace and political process.

Nominations and other H issues

- Mike Polt said that the Department has now eclipsed the Bush Administration's record in terms of first session confirmation of State nominees with a total of 85 (vice 73 for Bush).
- Mike noted that there are a total of 33 Codels in motion now.
- Mike said that H is preparing for the 2010-Conference. Jack said in this context that he wants H to alert him and S early on to allow them to engage on matters they care about, even if some matters appear below the threshold for 7th floor involvement. This is a new era, he stressed, and he and the Secretary feel they can be most useful if they know about problems sooner rather than later, and they are prepared to engage whenever necessary. He asked H to put together a "cluster" of issues that S and he care most about and develop a strategy for engagement.
- Chris Hill will be back in Washington in mid-September to testify before Congress. Jack noted that he planned to be in Iraq the week before that to review various issues related to the hand-over of DoD responsibilities to State.

Honduras

- I raised a pending request from OAS for U.S. Milair support for the upcoming OAS Mission to Honduras. Sheba said she wanted to check with Jim (who is in Guadalajara with the President) whether he supported this. She subsequently reported that Jim thought this was a good way for us to gain a little ground by showing support for the mission, but he wanted to make sure we did not refer to this as the Insulza mission, but rather the "Espinosa/OAS Mission."

Public Affairs

- Robert said he anticipated some questions today about General Jones' weekend interviews where he said we would be willing to talk bilaterally to North Korea, but made it clear this should be in the context of the 6 Party Talks. Some in the press are seeking to make more of this than meets the eye.

1. Red Lentil Soup with Wild Mushrooms

Afghanistan

- Jack raised today's Washington Post article on Ambassador Eikenberry's request for a major increase in spending on development and civilian reconstruction in Afghanistan next year. PJ indicated he thought that the story had come out about as well as possible – Jack had been careful not to reject it out of hand, but make it clear we needed to evaluate the request carefully, a line that a Senate staffer quoted in the article echoed. The Post article, however, will prompt additional stories. The related article that DeYoung has been working on with reference to alleged State/DOD rivalry over civilian staffing is not dead, but PJ says he has arranged for Petraeus to speak to her.

Merida Initiative

- WHA is working on a revision of the 15 percent report, which Jim and Jack have not yet seen. Rich Verma said that Tim Rieser has indicated that Senator Leahy will not block the money in the end, but clearly this issue will have an impact on future appropriations. Jim asked Rich to tell Rieser that he is prepared to meet with him, along with Carlos Pascual and Valenzuela, to discuss the matter further and as a signal of our continued involvement and good faith. The message will be that we have heard their concerns, that we share them, and that we will stay on it. Jim noted that the tone of the report should be that this is a work in progress, and that both presidents at the recent summit meeting agreed to take steps to increase transparency.

Leahy Vetting

- Rich reported that Tim Rieser has asked for a status report on Leahy vetting with respect to Israel. The problem is that we have nothing to report beyond what has been in the press. [REDACTED]

Colombia

- WHA is working on revised guidance with respect to the proposed U.S.-Colombia Defense Cooperation Agreement. [REDACTED]

President Carter

- Pat reported President Carter is planning another trip into Gaza later this month and the Secret Service is requesting substantial DS support for this or hoping State will dissuade the former President from going. Pat

said he is going to raise this issue with Cheryl

Appropriations

- Pat noted that given the legislative calendar in September, it is likely we will not have an appropriations bill before the end of the fiscal year and will face the prospect of a Continuing Resolution. Jack said, in that case, we will have to appeal to OMB for "anomaly treatment" in order to give us what we need for operations in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Afghanistan/Pakistan Benchmarks

- Rich asked where we stood on the benchmarks. [REDACTED]

Somalia

- Jack said that the meeting yesterday with regard to the OFAC letter and humanitarian assistance to Somalia had failed to resolve USAID's concerns. In essence, the OFAC letter referred both to permitted and non-permitted actions, but also used the term "illegal" in describing any material assistance, even inadvertent, that goes to terrorist groups. AID will not move forward if that term is used. There will be another meeting today, and Jack said he is prepared to speak to Stuart Levey if necessary.

UBS

- Jim Thessin reported a deal in the UBS case that will likely be announced tomorrow. Both sides seem satisfied.

Preaching reform, Clinton wins African hearts

JOHANNESBURG — In Liberia, Hillary Clinton brought out the crowds despite torrential rain. In Congo, she came away deeply shaken from a meeting with rape victims. Kenya's prime minister said Africa didn't need lectures from the West about democracy, but Africa got one anyway.

At home, the U.S. secretary of state's visit may have been overshadowed by the aftermath of her husband's mission to North Korea to bring home two imprisoned U.S. journalists. But on her seven-nation Africa tour, ending Friday with a stopover in the West African island republic of Cape Verde, she made one splash after another.

Coupled with Barack Obama's visit last month, the two trips to Africa were the earliest into an administration by any secretary of state or president, underlining Washington's pledges to pay more attention to the continent.

In the U.S., the headline-making moment of the trip was her testy response to a question about Bill Clinton. But in Africa, it quickly became a footnote. What people wanted to hear was support for democracy, clean government and ending its many civil wars.

Clinton's ambitious itinerary resembled those of China's foreign minister, who makes extensive annual tours of his country's allies on the continent. But where China tends to sidestep the issues of corruption democracy, Clinton confronted them head-on.

Kenyan Prime Minister Raila Odinga, speaking hours before Clinton arrived, said Africa did not need to be lectured about democracy. After they met, she did just that. "The absence of strong and effective democratic institutions has permitted ongoing corruption, impunity, politically motivated violence and a lack of respect for a rule of law," Clinton said. "These conditions ... are continuing to hold Kenya back."

Odinga switched to a more conciliatory tone, saying African countries could learn from Clinton's example when she conceded defeat to Obama during the U.S. presidential primaries.

"That is a lesson Africa needs to learn seriously," he said. "In Africa, in many countries, elections are never won, they are only rigged. The losers never accept that they lost. If we do this, we will be able to develop democracy truly in the African continent."

In Angola, she told Foreign Minister Assuncao Afonso dos Anjos that his country needed to write a new constitution, prosecute human rights crimes and hold a proper presidential election.

"So, Mr. Minister, we have our work cut out for us," she said.

And in Nigeria, Africa's biggest oil producer, she said "the disconnect between Nigeria's wealth and its poverty is a failure of governance at the federal, state and local level."

To Africa's reformers, often an embattled minority, these were heartening words.

Emma Ezeazu, who campaigns for free and fair elections in his native Nigeria, said Clinton's visit showed that U.S. officials "are becoming more pro-active in their relationship with Nigeria, in particular on the subject of governance and democracy. They are paying more attention."

Tiseke Kasambala, a Johannesburg-based researcher for Human Rights Watch, commended her grasp of human rights abuses in Africa — not just the headline-makers, like Zimbabwe and Congo, but the lesser publicized offenders such as Angola.

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"That's why I'm here," Clinton replied. "I want you to be able to go home."

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The crowds in Nigeria and Angola were fewer, but community and religious leaders seemed excited just to be with Clinton and be heard by her.

Nancy Kachingwe, a Malawian with the development group ActionAid, applauded Clinton's "very strong emphasis around women's rights."

Some of former President George W. Bush's Africa initiatives, particularly on AIDS, have been widely praised in Africa. But there were also sharp differences over world trade, global warming, and over the Bush administration's anti-terrorism strategy.

Washington wants to buy Africa's oil and gain access to its markets, and fears instability in places like Somalia could fuel anti-U.S. terrorism. Clinton won points by stressing that as the U.S. pursues its interests, it sees the virtue of "working with and listening to our friends and allies, and creating not a multipolar world, but a multi-partner world."

Kachingwe said what matters now is the follow-up.

"There will be a positive impact" from Clinton's trip, she said. "But somewhere along the way, we do need to see ... what's going to come to keep the momentum going."

Clinton Ends Africa Tour, Vowing to Stay Involved

SANTA MARIA, Cape Verde - After a grueling seven-nation, 11-day trip, Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton wrapped up her Africa tour on Friday by reaffirming her promise to renovate American relations with the continent.

"I leave Africa after this remarkable trip even more committed," Mrs. Clinton said before leaving Cape Verde.

"I have seen the joy and energy Africans have, evidenced not just by the boogieing, but by the hard work and perseverance," she said, referring to a recent comment from her husband, former President Bill Clinton, that she knew how to "boogie" with African dancers.

"And we've seen the worst humanity can do to itself," she added, presumably referring to Congo, where Mrs. Clinton met victims of a brutal civil war that just does not seem to end.

Mrs. Clinton seemed satisfied that she had accomplished her mission: strengthening American relations with crucial allies on the continent, like Nigeria and South Africa, and sending a message of "tough love," as she called it, to nations like Kenya and Congo.

Over all, she said, the United States wants to work more closely with African nations as a partner, not simply as a patron or dispenser of aid. In exchange, she said, African leaders must deliver democracy and good government.

Mrs. Clinton vowed to stay on top of Africa, even after she gets back to Washington, closely monitoring the issues she addressed on her tour. She also pointed to Cape Verde, a set of palm-studded islands best known for their beaches and enormous tourist hotels, as an example of what good leadership can do.

"This is possible," she said. "You create not just economic growth but a sense of human dignity and possibility."

Kenya. South Africa. Angola. Congo. Nigeria. Liberia. And finally Cape Verde. Mrs. Clinton saw with her own eyes some

of Africa's most promising countries - and some of its most troubled ones. In Kenya, she pushed for the government to prosecute perpetrators of the postelection violence last year. In South Africa, the big issue was Zimbabwe and how the South African government should do more to help ease the crisis there.

In Angola, the theme was good governing practices and oil, a strategic concern of the United States given the many inroads China has made there and elsewhere in Africa in its hunger for natural resources. In Congo, Mrs. Clinton was passionate about the need to end the nation's rape epidemic.

"The secretary's visit to the heart of the world's deadliest war zone in eastern Congo was a potential game-changer for that conflict," said John Prendergast, a founder of the Washington-based Enough project. "Her commitment to addressing root causes such as the conflict minerals that power our electronics industry was a refreshing contrast to the usual disaster sympathy tourism of visiting dignitaries."

"Now," he added, "comes the hard part: making good on the promises and living up to the high expectations engendered by her visit."

In Nigeria, Mrs. Clinton pressed for electoral changes. In Liberia, she praised the country's president, Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, the only woman in Africa to be elected head of state.

The Liberian visit had a special warmth, almost like a meeting of long-lost cousins. Liberia was founded in the 19th century by freed American slaves, and the country's flag, the people's names and even the police uniforms with plastic-brimmed hats were all reminiscent of the American versions. Mrs. Clinton received possibly her most exuberant welcome there, and a Liberian man with a long wooden horn followed her around most of the visit, blowing out loud funny noises whenever she said something striking.

"I love that - the horn - I want to take that guy with me wherever I go," she said.

In Cape Verde, Mrs. Clinton seemed to have few bones to pick. For once, she said, she had a cheat sheet on a country that included a list of far more positives than negatives. The country has fewer than 500,000 people and has escaped the turmoil that has engulfed so much of Africa. The all-inclusive, poolside buffet resorts here feel like something found in Cancun or the Bahamas.

Mrs. Clinton called Cape Verde "a model of democracy and economic progress in Africa."

On Friday, just as she had at every stop, she started her speech by saying, "I bring you greetings from President Obama."

She called him a "son of Africa" and said that under the Obama administration, the United States was determined to help Africa reach its promise.

This is Lyn Lusi writing to you from HEAL Africa in Goma and your address comes from the business card you left me when you visited us. You may have heard that Secretary of State Mrs Clinton and Ambassador Ms Verveer came to HEAL Africa on Tuesday 11th August. The visit went very well, and the organisation was impeccable, so she could achieve her objectives. While in our Conference Centre, she announced a package of aid to Congo to fight Gender Based Violence.

First she congratulated HEAL Africa on the excellent work we are doing; then she announced a deal between the US and the Norwegian Government to build a state of the art fistula and teaching hospital in Goma.

She must have been aware of the shock and discouragement of all our staff. In effect she was saying:

"Your excellent work is not really excellent at all, and we will work with the Norwegians to replace you in North Kivu."

I seriously believe she was not properly briefed, because of some remarks she made as she was leaving.

This is now a request to you, and if possible, other members of the your organisation, if you would be so kind as to contact them. Nothing is set in stone, and politicians respond to pressure from their friends and constituencies. We believe that wise use of funds means building capacity among local organisations that have already proved that they can do the work, and sustain their efforts, rather than starting something new.

I am attaching below a letter like the one we have written to Mrs Clinton and a similar one to Ambassador Verveer. If you think it is appropriate, we are requesting you to write a similar letter to both of them. We are hoping that local Congolese organisations will not be excluded from these resources to build local capacity on the foundations of what is being done already.

Dear Mrs Clinton,

I/ We followed with interest reports of your visit to Goma on 11th August 2009, where you convened a meeting of Congolese actors in the fight against Gender Based Violence at HEAL Africa training center. The commitment of the people of the United States to working alongside Congolese associations for peace and human rights is heartening, after 16 years of endless war.

We congratulate you for this pioneering visit which gave a voice to Congolese community based organizations, who are often overpowered by international actors. We sincerely hope that the US government and USAID will take the next step in working alongside community based organizations in Eastern Congo.

After studying the announcement of the package of assistance that is being prepared to contribute to fighting Gender Based Violence in the east of Congo, we are mystified to hear that the United States and the Norwegian government have decided to build for North Kivu a centre of excellence for training doctors in fistula repair and care of mothers.

According to good development principles, outside assistance builds on what is already in place and functioning well, developing proven capacity and giving local actors the additional tools they need to do a better job.

As friends and supporters of HEAL Africa for many years, we know that this hospital has pioneered fistula repair in North Kivu and Maniema provinces since 2002, when no one else was interested in caring for women with fistula. They have four experienced surgeons trained in Addis Ababa fistula hospital, and have performed over 1600 fistula surgeries. HEAL Africa has a wide network of community based workers to identify and support patients coming and returning. HEAL Africa's surgical teams perform outreach surgery in North Kivu and Maniema provinces in local general hospitals, linked at the same time with in-service training of local staff, and referring only the most complicated cases to Goma. These services are recognized by reputable agencies since the United States through IRC, through UNICEF and through Engenderhealth, has invested in HEAL Africa staff, equipment and infrastructure over the past five year. The Spanish Embassy has supported HEAL Africa's prevention of fistula initiatives over the past four years, through their wide-reaching Safe Motherhood program, working through local associations of mothers-to-be for maternity insurance and access to safe deliveries.

HEAL Africa has a clearly defined place within the government medical system of North Kivu where they are recognized as the tertiary referral hospital of the province. Thus they are a recognized clinical training centre of the Medical Faculty of the University of Goma, offering the first two years of accredited clinical specialization in Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Family Medicine, Surgery and Orthopedics.

HEAL Africa is a Congolese not for profit association which has completely rebuilt itself after total destruction by the volcano, with assistance from many friends in USA and around the world. They have a state of the art surgical suite, but the buildings hastily erected in the aftermath of the volcano are inappropriate for the quality of care they wish to offer to patients: they deserve better.

We wish to request that the State Department give assistance to HEAL Africa to increase the quality of their services and training capacity through the newly announced package of financial aid. We would like to ask you to fund the construction of the three storey building which is the final stage of reconstruction of the hospital after the catastrophe of the volcano in January 2002. The second floor of this building will be entirely devoted to women's fistula services; and the whole hospital is devoted to teaching and preparing Congolese doctors to give excellent service in the most underserved areas of Congo.

They are hoping that, through your visit, you will be able to advocate for the physical plant that will enable them to serve their patients even better than before, and train the next generation of doctors in an environment where it is possible to practice excellent medicine.

Purpose of Call: To express your condolences regarding the deaths of Iraqi MFA personnel in the August 19 attack on the Iraqi Foreign Ministry.

- I want to personally express my heartfelt condolences to you for the savage attack on the Iraqi Ministry of Foreign Affairs today and for the tragic loss of so many Iraqi lives around Baghdad and particularly at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- I remember fondly our meeting at the MFA in April – I was proud to be the first senior U.S. official to attend a meeting there, and I was deeply saddened to hear that your Ministry was attacked.
- This is a trying day for Iraqis and the Government of Iraq, but brutal attacks like these only deepen the need for dedicated Iraqis like you and those in your Ministry, to remain committed to the new Iraq.
- Know that the United States will continue to stand by Iraq as it faces these challenges.

Background: On Wednesday, August 19, what appears to be a series of VBIED and additional rocket attacks in Baghdad resulted in the bloodiest day in Baghdad since the June 30 withdrawal of U.S. forces from urban areas. Although exact numbers have not been confirmed, media is reporting that approximately 75 people were killed across Baghdad with over 100 injuries. The most devastating attack appears to have been against the Iraqi MFA, where a VBIED was exploded in front of the main gate. Zebari's Chief of Staff estimated that there were 35-40 fatalities and up to 40 injuries resulting from this attack, with 70% of the building damaged. In April, you were the first senior U.S. official to hold a meeting at the MFA. Deputy Foreign Minister Labid Abbawi, who attended your meeting at the MFA and who's wife led your meeting with Iraqi war widows, was reportedly slightly injured and quite shaken by the attack. He may have lost a number of staff members. At this point, we do not know if other senior-ranking MFA officials were killed or wounded in the attack.

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Chairs' Summary

1. The fifth Forum for the future, co-chaired by UAE and Japan, has been convened in Abu Dhabi, 18, 19 October 2008 with broad participation of ministers and representatives of the BMENA, G8 and other partner countries as well as international organizations and the civil society.
2. The participants appreciated the efforts made by the UAE for hosting the Forum including strong contributions made by Japan, in addition to the efforts made by Yemen and Germany in the framework of the previous session of the 2007 Forum.
3. The participants reviewed the progress of G8-BMENA initiative and reaffirmed its objectives of this important dialogue and partnership.
4. The participants expressed concern over the consequences of the international financial crisis, and committed to continue working together to stabilize the financial market and to support global economic growth. Several participants stressed on the negative impacts of this crisis on developing countries and confirmed the importance of Doha's UN Millennium Conference and Kuwait's Arab Economic and Social Summit Conference.
5. The participants affirmed the importance of coordinated efforts aimed at achieving a just and comprehensive peace of the Arab Israeli conflict, and supported the full implementation of the Road map and expressed their support for the Arab Peace Initiative as an effective vehicle to deal with the conflict.
6. The participants emphasized the need to solve the Darfur crisis, in all its humanitarian and political aspects, and supported the Arab League's and the African Union's initiative, sponsored by the State of Qatar, as it secures Sudan's sovereignty and unity and achieves justice.
7. The participants expressed their support for the national unity, independence and territorial integrity of Iraq, as well as supporting its comprehensive national reconciliation, constitutional political process, and the enhancement of governmental institutions and comprehensive development efforts.
8. The participants stressed the importance of resolving international disputes through peaceful means, in accordance with international law and UN charters, and stressed the importance of mutual respect of national priorities, sovereignty, independence and integral territories of all countries.
9. The participants highlighted the importance of enforcing the momentum of political, economic and social reforms stemmed out of the local environment, that are compatible with cultural, historical and religious



characteristics of the region in conjunction with available capabilities and resources. In addition, the participants agreed that the course and span of reforms do vary from one country to another; and that the lasting progress of political reform in the region is a joint responsibility between governments and the civil society.

10. The participants recognized the progress achieved in educational reform and recognized the important role of educational and vocational-technical training in development. In addition, the participants recognized the measures taken to further joint cooperation between governments and the civil society in development efforts; particularly, in the domains of environment, sustainable energy, human rights issues, food security, humanitarian aid and creating employment opportunities.
11. The participants acknowledged the progress achieved in the area of women's empowerment and enhancing women's participation in all sectors.
12. The participants reaffirmed their commitment to guarantee freedom of expression, human rights, justice, equality, rule of law, respect of diversity, transparency and combating corruption. The participants also reaffirmed their commitment to renouncing terrorism, extremism and violence and for supporting joint regional and international efforts to combat such phenomena in the international environment.
13. The participants emphasized their keenness to support efforts exerted on enhancing and promoting dialogue among civilizations, religions and cultures; and disseminating a culture of tolerance, respect of differences, and not offending religious characters and convictions of all nations and peoples.
14. The participants expressed their hopes to achieve peaceful diplomatic solutions on the Iranian nuclear issue; that will deepen mutual trust and enhance regional and international security and stability. The participants also stressed the importance of ensuring a Middle East, including the Arabian Gulf, that is free of all weapons of mass destruction and in compliance with obligations under the non proliferation treaty. The participants recognized that the region's countries have the right to acquire peaceful nuclear technology in the framework of relevant international agreements.
15. The participants reviewed the progress of the Forum for the Future, since it was launched in Sea Island, U.S.A., in 2004, and affirmed the importance of supporting the Forum as a podium for dialogue and mutual cooperation among BMENA, G8 , partner governments, international organizations and the civil society. In addition, the participants affirmed their commitment to develop the Forum's mechanisms and to support Democracy Assistance Dialogue (DAD) efforts for the promotion of dialogue and cooperation between governments and the civil society.



16. The participants acknowledged the activities of the "Foundation for the Future" and appreciated the efforts and grants submitted by donors to support the foundation's activities.
17. The participants expressed their appreciation for the constructive work done by all parties to expand cooperation and engagement between governments and the civil society.
18. The participants appreciated the presentation by the DAD and expressed their hope that governments and the civil society further promote cooperation on reforms and sustainable developments in the region.
19. The participants acknowledged the document on "Partnership between G-8 BMENA Governments and The Civil Society" and welcomed the efforts made by the DAD.
20. The participants renewed commitments to continue their dialogue and collaboration, and noted continued progress and cooperation among all partners of Forum for the Future. They look forward to continued cooperation during the coming Italian Presidency of G8 in 2009, and the hosting of the sixth session by Kingdom of Morocco.
21. The participants expressed their appreciation to the UAE for its generous hospitality and efficient organization of the fifth forum.

This event would most likely take place on Thursday, September 24, at 3:30pm. If you cannot co-host the meeting, I would welcome the participation of your representative at the meeting.
- **Event Content:** We would like this event to be an opportunity for a broad group of global stakeholders to commit to the food security principles agreed to at the L'Aquila summit. We hope to extend the L'Aquila food security principles to countries that were not present at the summit. The event will also focus on highlighting country-led processes, such as the Comprehensive African Agricultural Development Program (CAADP). 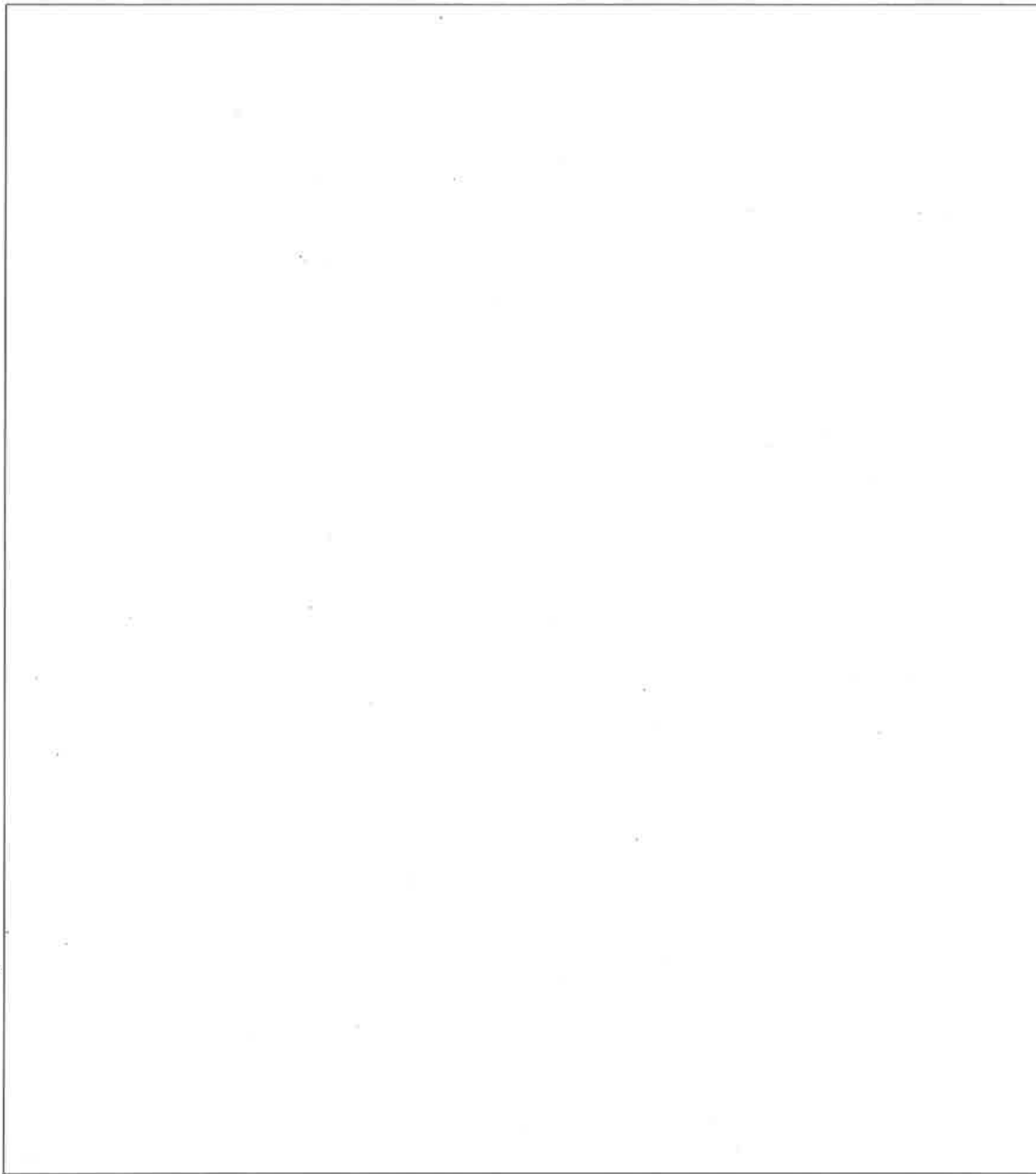

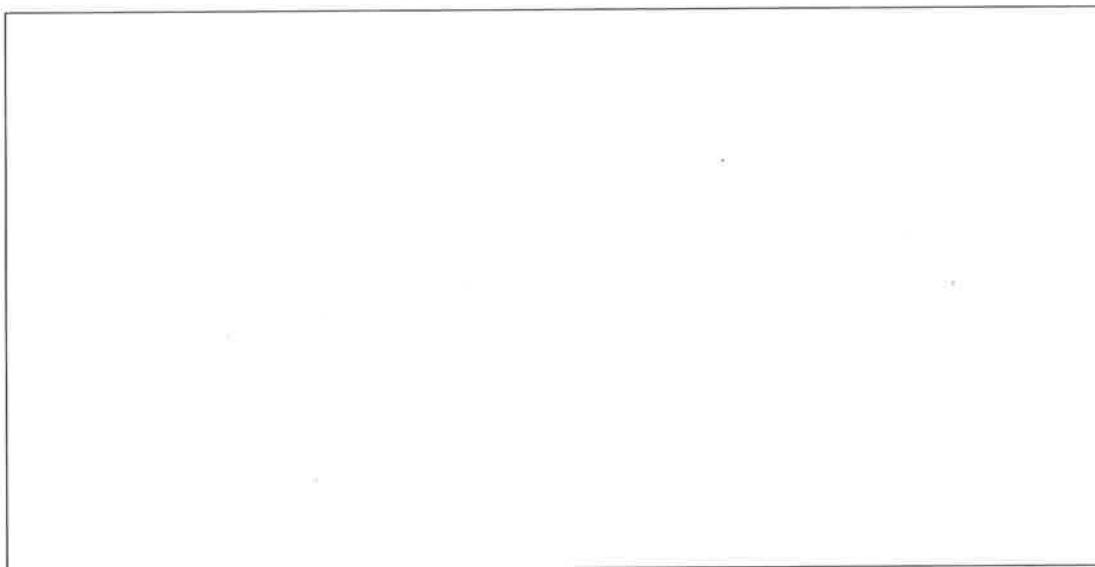

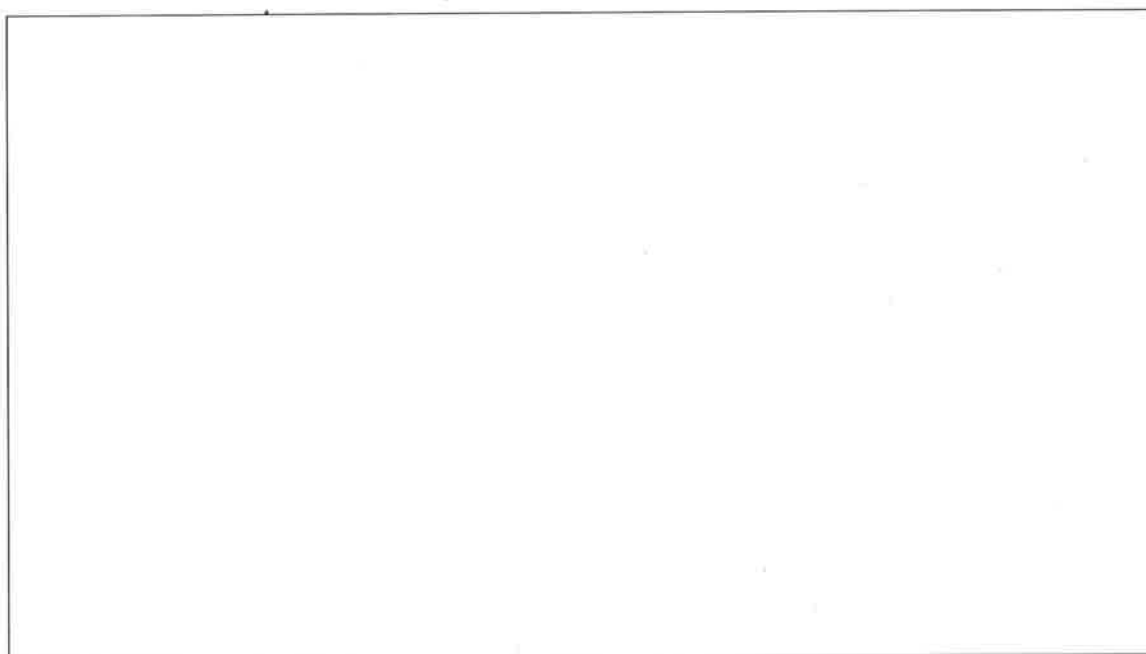

We are writing about press articles regarding the State Department's negotiations with the Government of Colombia to establish a semi-permanent military presence with base access in that country.

Despite the obvious foreign policy and budgetary implications of such an agreement, neither the Foreign Relations Committee nor the State, Foreign Operations Subcommittee of the Appropriations Committee was even informed of the negotiations, much less consulted on them. Even after press reports divulged their existence, the negotiations were acknowledged only in response to staff inquiries.

Given this lack of consultation, we respectfully request a written summary of the negotiations and their results. Specifically, we would like to know:

- What sort of U.S. military presence in Colombia and the region do these negotiations envision? What would be the operational and policy purposes of such a presence? How would the basing agreement affect limitations on the U.S. role in Colombian counternarcotics/counterinsurgency operations?
- How many U.S. troops, what rotation schedule, what hardware, and what support infrastructure would be intended, where and at what cost? What benefits of any kind would accrue to the Colombian Government, and specifically to the Colombian military, under such an arrangement? And what programs, if any, would be reduced in order to pay for this semi-permanent military presence?
- Where would semi-permanent base access fit into the U.S. interagency commitment – as previously briefed to the Committees on Appropriations and Foreign Relations – to gradually reduce U.S. military assistance to Colombia and “nationalize” major elements of Plan Colombia? Under what conditions would you anticipate closing the base(s) short of the reported 10-year period?
- What are the implications of further deepening our relationship with the Colombian military at a time of growing revelations about the widespread *falsos positivos* (“false positives”) scandal, in which the Colombian military recruited many hundreds (some estimates are as high as 1,600) of boys and young men for

jobs in the countryside that did not exist and then summarily executed them to earn bonuses and vacation days? In your judgment, what signal does a deepening of our partnership with the Colombian military send before investigations gain momentum and accountability for these atrocities is established? How, given these circumstances, would deeper institutionalized cooperation with the Colombian military fit in with our strategic interest in and commitment to human rights and the rule of law?

- What implications does a basing agreement hold for other U.S. interests in South America, and how were those implications weighed in the negotiation? What consultation or notification with Colombia's neighbors was made before press reports about the basing proposals appeared, and how did they react? What impact would the Department expect such a basing agreement to have in the region and on our relations with other South American countries?
- How long have the negotiations been going on, and why was there no consultation with the above-mentioned congressional committees or with NGO experts on Colombia? Was the lack of consultation as pervasive on the Colombian side as well, and, if so, did the Department judge, or concur in the Colombian Government's judgment, that there should be no consultation on the Colombian side either?

We look forward to discussing this important issue with you. The decision to make semi-permanent a U.S. military presence in Colombia warrants serious debate about both the practical aspects as well as the implications for other U.S. objectives in that country and the region.

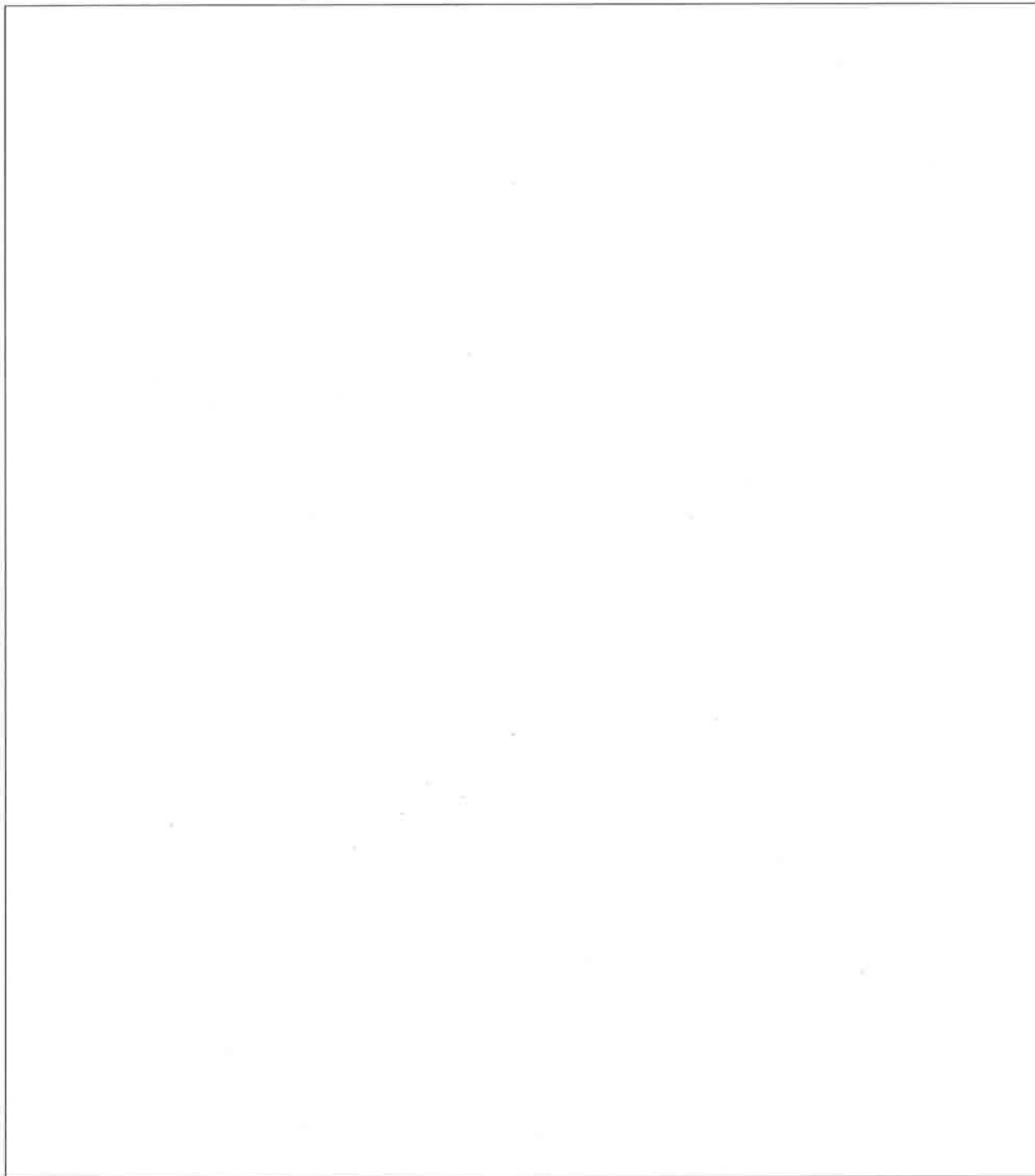

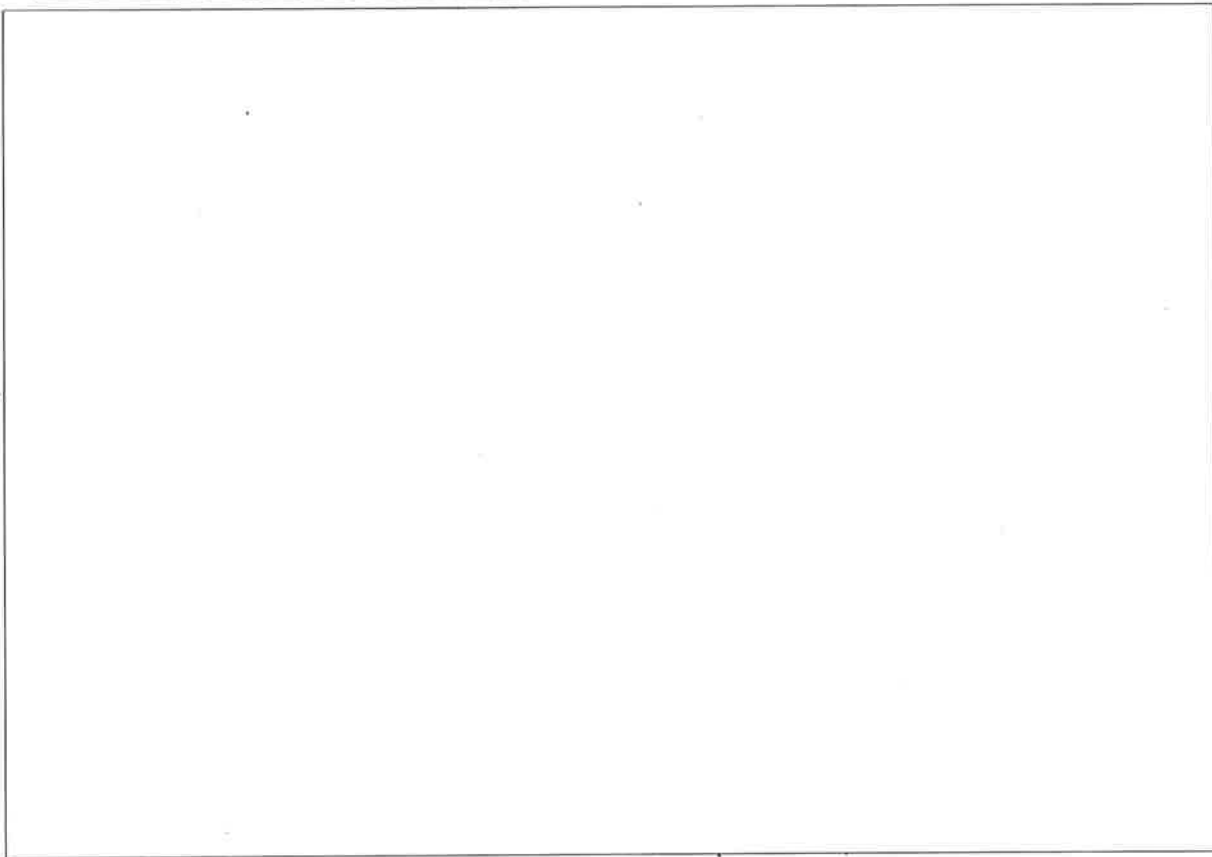
