Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated August 26, 2016, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The processing of records responsive to your request is ongoing and has yielded an additional 95 documents. After reviewing these documents, we have determined that 28 may be released in full, 65 may be released with excisions, and 2 must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released. For the documents withheld in full, we have cited FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. §§552 (b)(5) and (b)(6).

We will keep you informed as your case progresses. I promised you I would send a list of things that I am prepared *not* to do to allow me to give the time necessary to lead the QDDR and make sure it is a success. First, I should note that I have managed to clear 10-15 hours a week for it on my schedule already – when it is up and running that will be closer to 20-30 hours, including dinners and other kinds of outreach. That is the kind of time that I think it will need. Thus far it has been as rewarding to work on as I anticipated.

Of the various things I currently have underway, I would propose

1. To hand off work on reforming the U.N. Security Council and other international institutions to Esther Brimmer. Although I have worked successfully on the G-8/G-20 issues, figuring out alternatives and working with the bureaus and the White House, the Security Council is a much bigger task, in no small part because USUN has very decided views on the subject and an ability to shape the agenda and certainly the time-frame of any action. I have spent a lot of time on those issues this summer with not much result.
2. To turn over the Global Issues Dialogue with India to Maria Otero. We were going to be running it together.
3. Not to participate, except as an advisor when consulted, in developing your initiative on Higher Education, unless we do some of it through the QDDR.
4. To cut back my travel dramatically, including participation on your trips. I would plan to travel only twice this fall, once to participate in policy planning talks with Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Egypt, the UAE, and Morocco – the first round was held last year and we began planning the second round last spring, and then to participate in a second round of policy planning talks with the EU and Russia in Moscow in November. I would not accept invitations for new policy planning talks, although the Mexicans, the South Africans, the Colombians, and various other countries would like to hold them.
5. To cut back external speaking engagements to only those that would qualify as QDDR outreach and/or elaboration of your basic strategy as laid out in the CFR speech.
6. To cut back on speaking/lecturing at the Foreign Service Institute to various classes of senior executives in the foreign and civil service.
7. To hand off supervision of red team exercises to Ed Lacey, my career deputy, who is a natural skeptic and has worked for a long time on non-proliferation issues in ways that have deepened his native suspicion. Derek and I will of course be responsible for the final product, and I will have direct input, but will not run the projects as I normally would.

I would propose to continue doing the following things, all of which complement the QDDR.

1. To keep supervising my 4 S/P working groups on national security, development and democracy, 21<sup>st</sup> century statecraft, and global governance and to use them to generate ideas on key QDDR issues, although not in such a way as to compete with the QDDR staff.
2. To supervise work on the transition from the G-8 to the G-20 in whatever configurations that takes.
3. To work on the National Security Strategy with the White House. Many of the trends we are identifying and policies we are proposing are directly linked to the QDDR. This work will be done in the next 2-3 months
4. Assuming you approve the project, to work on an article on 21<sup>st</sup> century statecraft with Alec Ross and Admiral Jim Stavridis, which we have begun to exchange ideas/drafts on and which could be an opportunity to get some important ideas shaping the QDDR into the public domain before the report comes out. Doing it with a high-level military official will add credibility.
5. To continue advising on major speeches and policy initiatives as you direct.

As of today, here's where we are on the G-20. At Pittsburgh it will be announced that the G-20 will have a continuing role as the global forum on economic, financial, "and related issues." Canada will host the next G-20 mtg in June 2010 and Korea will hold the following mtg in November 2010 on the margins of APEC.

Based on today's negotiations, there will still be a role for the G-8, as well as for other political forums, but it will not meet as a separate summit, but rather on the margins of the NATO summit or some other summit. 5 G-8 members are apparently on board with this, but France is holding out strongly for the G-14, apparently supported by Japan and Italy. China, as a member of the G-5, is opposed to the G-14 b/c it feels like a second class citizen in the g-8 + 5 format. The G-5 as a whole are asking that the G-20 be trimmed back to the original 20 to cut down on European over-representation.

The actual nature/future of the G-8 is still to be fought out -- as I have argued in the past, we have a lot to gain with the G-20 members who are not in the G-14 by opposing the G-14 as a political replacement for the G-8. But for now, it is critical that before the US publicly commits to the G-20 (as POTUS may do in a speech on Monday) we secure two key commitments from him.

1) You attend the G-20 (after Pittsburgh) together w/ Treasury and that there be a co-sherpa process for the G-20 as with the G-8 now. The "related issues" that Treasury contemplates addressing in the G-20 include climate change, food security, and other development issues. We simply have to be there. Other G-20 countries, like Mexico, have their foreign ministries as sole sherpas.

2) That we be tasked with figuring out which parts of the g-8 apparatus (lots of working groups and ministerials) be moved to the G-20 and which stay with the G-8 or be constituted independently.

[redacted] is obviously the most direct source of information, altho I have deliberately not raised any attendance/sherpa issues w/ him.

REMARKS AT THE BROOKINGS INSTITUTION  
WASHINGTON, DC  
SEPTEMBER 18, 2009**

I appreciate the opportunity to join you on the eve of the United Nations General Assembly and to outline some key issues that the Obama Administration will focus on in New York and in the weeks and months ahead.

Let me begin, though, by echoing the President's statement yesterday that he has approved the recommendations of the Pentagon and his entire national security team to deploy a stronger and more comprehensive missile defense system in Europe. This decision came after a lengthy and in-depth review of our assessment of the threat posed by Iran's ballistic missile program, and the technology that we have to confront it. And it is a decision that will leave America stronger, and more capable of defending our troops, our interests, and our Allies.

Let's be clear about what this new system will do relative to the previous program – which was many years from being deployed. With the President's decision, we will deploy missile defense sooner than the previous program, so that we will be able to swiftly counter the threat posed by Iran's short and medium-range ballistic missiles.

We will deploy missile defense that is more comprehensive than the previous program, with more interceptors in more places, and a better capacity to protect all of our friends and allies in the region. We will deploy technology that is actually proven so that we do not waste time or taxpayer money, and we will preserve the flexibility to adjust our approach to the threat as it evolves.

So make no mistake: if you support missile defense, then this is a stronger and smarter approach than the previous program. It does what missile defense is actually supposed to do – it defends America and our Allies.

Now I know we have heard criticism of this plan from some quarters. But much of it is not connected to facts. We are not “shelving” missile defense, we are deploying missile defense sooner than the Bush Administration planned to, and we are deploying a more comprehensive system. We are not reducing our capacity to protect our interests and our Allies from Iran, we are increasing that capacity and focusing it on our understanding of Iran’s capabilities. And most of all, we would never walk away from our Allies – instead, we are deploying a system that enhances their security, that advances our cooperation with NATO, and that actually places more resources in more countries.

Two of those Allies are Poland and the Czech Republic, and we deeply appreciate their willingness to host parts of the previously planned system. We will continue to cooperate closely with both nations – for instance, through rotation of a Patriot battery in Poland, and close missile defense research and development work with Czech companies. As we explore land based interceptors going forward, we have made it clear that those two countries will be at the top of the list. And let me underscore that we are bound together by our common commitment as NATO Allies, and also by deep historical, economic, and cultural ties that will never be broken.

Finally, let me reiterate what the President said yesterday: this decision was not about Russia; it was about Iran and the threat that its ballistic missile programs continue to pose. And because of this decision, we will be in a far stronger position to deal with that threat, and to do so with technology that works.

My main reason for being here today is to give you a review of our agenda next week in New York. Before I get to specifics, though, I want to share a quick story. A few days ago, a friend, knowing I was heading to the UN General Assembly, gave me a cartoon from The New Yorker. It showed a delegate in his seat at the United Nations passing a note to the delegate next to him. And the caption read: "Shhh. It's a birthday card for Lichtenstein. Sign it and pass it on."



Well, comic relief is essential in our line of work. But as with most humor, this cartoon is also commentary. And it represents one view of the United Nations – a caricature of what multilateral organizations spend their time doing.

As President Obama leads our US delegation at this year's General Assembly, I hope we can demonstrate that the United Nations does not have to be just a diplomatic talk shop on 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue.

At its best, it can be an institution that brings the world's nations together to solve global problems through adherence to rules and principles set forth in the UN Charter. And it is the responsibility of the 192 member nations – during the General Assembly and beyond -- to capitalize on the opportunity for global cooperation and progress that the UN affords.

I outlined earlier this summer at the Council on Foreign Relations the Obama Administration's efforts to advance our interests and solve today's problems through a global architecture of cooperation.

We must begin by taking responsibility ourselves – something that under President Obama we have already begun to do on issues from climate change to non-proliferation. And we have called on others to do the same.

By building and strengthening partnerships, institutions, and international regimes, we can forge a global consensus and use that leverage to offer clear incentives to all nations to cooperate and live up to their responsibilities, and strong disincentives to act in isolation or provoke conflict. The United Nations and this month's General Assembly offer a venue and a forum for nations to work together to live up to the founding charter and abide by and enforce international rules in service of global peace and security.

This is not only critical to the effectiveness of global institutions; it is essential to meeting the global challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. This is what Strobe describes as “The Great Experiment” – and I believe it is the heart of America’s mission in the world today.

Few issues reflect the need for a global architecture of cooperation more than nuclear non-proliferation. No issue poses a more serious threat to our security or the world’s, and it will be a main topic of discussion next week and beyond.

The President outlined a robust and ambitious arms control and nonproliferation agenda in Prague earlier this year that can move us toward a world without nuclear weapons.

As the President said, this won’t be easy. It might not even happen in our lifetimes. And, as long as nuclear weapons exist in the world, the United States will maintain a safe, secure and effective deterrent capability.

Next week, the President will chair a meeting of the U.N. Security Council on nonproliferation and disarmament. He will emphasize the importance of strengthening the international nuclear nonproliferation regime – and the critical role the Council must play in enforcing compliance with nonproliferation obligations.

The President also has asked me to lead the U.S. delegation to a conference on the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, and this will be the first time a Secretary of State has attended. It will give me the opportunity to underscore the importance of the CTBT to the global nonproliferation effort and to broader U.S. security interests.

Strengthening the non-proliferation regime means working to bring other nations into compliance. This includes North Korea and Iran. Let me take a moment to speak about Iran, another key topic on my agenda next week.

To begin, it is important to recall what's really at issue, and what's really at stake.

Iran has refused for years to address the international community's deep concerns about its nuclear program, underscored repeatedly by the International Atomic Energy Agency and the UN Security Council.

Iran's continued failure to live up to its obligations carries profound consequences – for the security of the United States and our allies; for progress on global non-proliferation and progress towards disarmament; for the credibility of the Security Council and the Non-Proliferation Treaty; and for stability in the Middle East and beyond.

Our concern is not Iran's right to develop peaceful nuclear energy, but its responsibility to demonstrate that its program is intended exclusively for peaceful purposes. This is not hard to do. Iran's continued refusal to cooperate has damaged the credibility of its claim that it does not seek a nuclear weapon.

Iran faces a choice. The international community has made abundantly clear what is possible for all Iranians if Iran lives up to its responsibilities on the nuclear issue – the benefits of economic connections to the rest of the world, cooperation on peaceful nuclear energy, and partnership in education and science.

But there will be accompanying costs for Iran's continued defiance – more isolation and economic pressure, and less possibility of progress for the people of Iran.

The Obama Administration has clearly conveyed our readiness to engage directly with Iran. We know that dialogue doesn't guarantee success. But we also know that our past refusal to engage yielded no progress on the nuclear issue, nor did it stem Iran's support for terrorist groups.

Over the past eight months, the President has reached out both to the Iranian government and people. We have made clear our desire to resolve issues with Iran diplomatically. Iran must now decide whether to join us in this effort.

Yet, since June, we have seen the Iranian government engaged in a mockery of the justice system, including show trials, and suppression of free speech. The Iranian government seeks a sense of justice in the world, but stands in the way of the justice it seeks.

Nonetheless, we remain ready to engage with Iran – not as an end in itself, but as a means of addressing the growing concerns that we and our international partners have about Iran's actions, especially on the nuclear issue. In New York next week, I will meet with my counterparts from the United Kingdom, France, Russia, China and Germany to discuss the way forward and prepare for talks that the European Union's Javier Solana is arranging at the beginning of October.

Our message will be clear: We are serious. We will soon see if the Iranians are serious. This is not about process for the sake of process. In New York, we will work with our partners to put Iran's choice into focus and to stress that engagement must produce real results and that we have no appetite for talk without action.

Let me also highlight a few other issues that I will be addressing at the General Assembly and in the months ahead: Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan; development; and women.

Iraq has made important strides with the support of the United States and the international community to build a more secure and hopeful future for its people. We look forward to the parliamentary election next January as an important milestone in this journey, and pledge to work with Iraqis and the international community, including the invaluable UN Mission to Iraq, to make these elections a success.

As a result of our common efforts, our relationship with Iraq can now enter into a period of transition as our military draws down and the role of civilian agencies increases to better meet the needs of the future and ensure a stable, sovereign and independent Iraq that contributes to peace and security in the Middle East. This reflects no lessening of our commitment – on the contrary, it demonstrates that we have entered a new, sustained and more mature partnership that will serve both of countries far into the future. I'm pleased that Vice President Biden, accompanied by my Deputy Jim Steinberg, recently returned to Iraq to continue our robust engagement with Iraq's leaders.



The partnership between our countries will continue to build security cooperation while strengthening diplomatic relations and building stronger ties in commerce, rule of law, education, science and culture through our Strategic Framework Agreement coordinating committee, a session of which Prime Minister Maliki and I co-chaired in July. [We'll seek to hold another session in the coming months].

Also on my docket for the General Assembly will be meetings related to Afghanistan and Pakistan. President Obama has stated our core goal: to disrupt, dismantle, and ultimately defeat al-Qaida and its extremist allies, and to prevent their return to either country. This is a goal we share with Afghanistan, with Pakistan and with the international community. In fact, pursuing al-Qaida and the Taliban was the basis of the original UN resolutions that authorized U.S. military action after the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks and created ISAF, the International Security Assistance Force of 42 nations helping Afghans secure their country.

Our long-term security, and that of our friends around the world, is connected to the security and well-being of the people of Afghanistan and Pakistan. To effectively squeeze the extremists fighting to destabilize both countries, the Afghan and Pakistani governments must be better able to secure their territory from extremists and meet the basic needs of their populations.

The recent Afghan elections at once illustrate the promise and the challenges of Afghanistan. Alongside our partners and the UN, we will continue to encourage all parties to respect the international and Afghan electoral institutions charged with determining the final outcome of the election process. When the next president is inaugurated, we will work to step up the level of international engagement with the new government in a strong partnership to strengthen governance at all levels.

As we address these urgent challenges, we will also work on other issues that have implications for American security and interests. Following up on my trip to Africa last month, and the President's visit to Ghana earlier in the year, he will host a lunch for leaders of sub-Saharan Africa during the General Assembly. I will meet with Costa Rican President Oscar Arias to continue our joint efforts to resolve the crisis in Honduras and

help that country restore the democratic constitutional order. I will also be meeting with donors and other stakeholders committed to helping Haiti respond to the economic dislocation caused by the global economic crisis and the hurricane. And I will continue discussions with our allies and other partners in Asia about the situation in Burma.

If the global architecture of cooperation demands responsibility of us and our partners, it also offers opportunities. Just as we are focusing intensively on urgent challenges like Iran, Iraq, and Afghanistan and Pakistan, so too are we pursuing a positive agenda devoted to expanding opportunity so that more people in more places can fulfill their dreams and live up to their God-given potential. And I will focus considerable attention on two areas of opportunity – development and women.

Many of you have heard me describe our plans to integrate diplomacy and development as two of the three pillars of our foreign policy, along with defense.

I have talked in different venues about the Obama Administration's commitment to leading with diplomacy and engaging other nations -- with and beyond government. Next week, I will outline how we will approach development in tandem with our diplomacy -- to be effective and efficient and enable the State Department, USAID, and the Millennium Challenge Corporation to pursue and execute 21<sup>st</sup> century foreign policy goals.

The foundation for our approach will be principles that will move us away from top-down assistance that too often fails to meet the needs of those we are attempting to help, or has only short-term effect. To solve the complex problems of today's world -- where issues like poverty, hunger, health, and climate change intersect -- we want to focus on root causes, and on country-driven efforts that are comprehensive, last over time, leverage existing multi-lateral institutions and foster new partnerships, and coordinate donors and stakeholders strategically.

I will have the chance to detail this approach during my stay in New York, and I also look forward to highlighting these issues when I participate in an event that the UN Secretary General will host on food security.

To successfully integrate our diplomacy and development goals at the State Department and USAID, we have launched a Quadrennial Diplomacy and Development Review – and, I regret to say that, in so doing, we have added another acronym to the State lexicon: QDDR.

The QDDR, led by Deputy Secretary of State Jack Lew, is a broad examination of our structure, policies, and budget, and will lead to better accountability and measurable results throughout the department.

Finally, our delegation, and I personally, will work to advance international efforts to recognize women as key drivers of economic progress and social stability, as well as to address impediments to women's empowerment and advancement, particularly sexual and gender-based violence.

I will chair a session of the Security Council and will speak on behalf of the adoption of a resolution on “women, peace and security” which will endorse concrete measures to implement Security Council Resolution 1820 and address sexual and gender-based violence as a tactic of war.

I saw the scale of misery caused by this violence on my recent trip to the Democratic Republic of Congo, where I met with rape survivors as well as those trying to assist them.

Next week, I will be speaking with other foreign ministers and heads of state about strategies to end this violence and to ensure that those who commit atrocities are prosecuted and not treated with impunity.

I will also work with women leaders at the General Assembly to highlight the importance of raising the status of girls and women and investing in their potential – through education, economic development, and health care. If women are free from violence, and accorded their rights, they can contribute to their local economies and become change agents generating greater prosperity and stability for their families, communities, and societies as a whole.

Every day, I go to work at the State Department and am reminded that the world has given us no shortage of urgent crises or long-range challenges. Our agenda is full and it is ambitious – from Northeast Asia to sub-Saharan Africa to Europe and the Americas. And we will remain vigilant and pro-active about all of the issues, even as our plate seems to get fuller by the day. And I will be relying on all of you to share your expertise and advice in helping us do our jobs as well as we can to serve our nation and the American people.

At this time of year, as we contemplate the agenda at the UN next week, and what the world will hold in the months and years beyond, it seems appropriate to think of new beginnings. Not only because the nations of the world are about to meet – which is an opportunity -- but because we are also celebrating the end of Ramadan and the beginning of the Jewish High Holy Days.

It is a time of reflection and renewal for hundreds of millions of our fellow citizens around the globe. A time when we can borrow from all of the world's great faiths to take stock, re-assess, and re-commit ourselves to the values and ideals that move us forward. And it is in that spirit that I am approaching the General Assembly and the months ahead.

I appreciate this opportunity to be here today. Thank you, and now I am happy to hear your ideas and answer questions.

A Bold New Strategy for Smart Aid

The Clinton Global Initiative's fifth birthday celebration this week <[http://www.clintonglobalinitiative.org/ourmeetings/meeting\\_annual.asp?Section=OurMeetings&PageTitle=CGI%20Annual%20Meeting](http://www.clintonglobalinitiative.org/ourmeetings/meeting_annual.asp?Section=OurMeetings&PageTitle=CGI%20Annual%20Meeting)> may be a less glitzy affair than in previous years but it marks an amazing comeback. Last year the Obama administration actually thought about having it shut down as a price of Mrs. Clinton becoming Secretary of State <<http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2008/11/16/AR2008111602039.html>> , fearful that Bill's schmoozing of wealthy philanthropists could compromise his wife's role as America's top diplomat. Now, Obama is going to be topping the bill, outshining the A-list celebrities, heads of state and corporate titans who pack the hall for the annual "Philanthropy Oscars."

Yet the most important speech at the event may not be delivered by either the current or the former president but by Mrs. Clinton herself. She has said the State Department is going to forge new partnerships with philanthropists to achieve America's foreign policy goals (and has already started work on a new initiative around the Middle East peace process). Her speech is an opportunity to announce a radical new departure in the way America gives aid.

The aid business in crisis. The past year may have been tough for the world's richest countries, but it has been far harder for the poorest. Markets for exports have slumped as rich consumers have reined in their spending. Government budgets are creaking under the strain of the global recession and foreign aid is threatening to dry up. At the same time, the intellectual attack on aid has escalated, led by the author of "Dead Aid" <<http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2009/04/02/AR2009040203285.html>> , the African economist, Dambisa Moyo.

The CGI has become the showcase for those who believe Moyo is wrong and that aid can be effective. The CGI is not about the old government-to-government aid model. Its members aim to deliver smart aid, based on partnerships between

business, philanthropists, and social entrepreneurs. Mrs. Clinton's speech is the perfect opportunity to show that government is ready to work with the CGI crowd to rethink how it does aid.

One promising, for-profit solution to poverty is to take the model of microfinance -- one of the more resilient corners of banking during the financial crisis -- and extend it to improve education, health care, clean water and sanitation. Loan-based investments can be more sustainable than traditional aid or charity, because they tap the far larger sums available in the capital markets and are not dependent on the whims of political leaders or budgetary wrangling. Some in government may be reluctant to give up their near monopoly on aid but it is long overdue.

A second opportunity is to get the public more involved in the aid business. New giving organizations such as Kiva <<http://www.kiva.org/about/how>> have demonstrated how the public can play an effective role in allocating money to needy people <<http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2009/07/06/AR2009070603594.html>>. Government should be doing all it can to encourage this type of mass philanthrocapitalism that leverages the generosity of the American people and taps into the wisdom of crowds. It is time for government aid to be made more democratic by letting Kiva and others like it distribute some of the tax dollars.

Finally, Mrs. Clinton should seize the opportunity to turn the aid business on its head and pass control from the bureaucrats to the poor people themselves. Technology such as the internet and the mobile phone are now widespread in the developing world, so why not use these tools to give a greater voice in aid spending to the people the money is intended to help? Much aid has gone to waste because of a lack of feedback from the intended beneficiaries. Imagine how the best technology entrepreneurs could transform the aid business, in the same way that they have changed the media, by giving the poor a say in how the aid billions are spent.

The Obama Administration has made all the right noises about making government smarter by working more with the philanthrocapitalists. At home, the creation of a White House Office of Social Innovation <[http://www.whitehouse.gov/the\\_press\\_office/President-Obama-to-Request-50-Million-to-Identify-and-Expand-Effective-Innovative-Non-Profits/](http://www.whitehouse.gov/the_press_office/President-Obama-to-Request-50-Million-to-Identify-and-Expand-Effective-Innovative-Non-Profits/)> was a welcome first move, yet it is still to be seen whether this will amount to much more than a new source of grant funding for the nonprofit sector. The big win is in remaking government through innovative partnerships with the private sector. Mrs. Clinton has been mulling over what to do with USAID for nearly a year. What better opportunity than the CGI to announce a bold new strategy for smart aid?

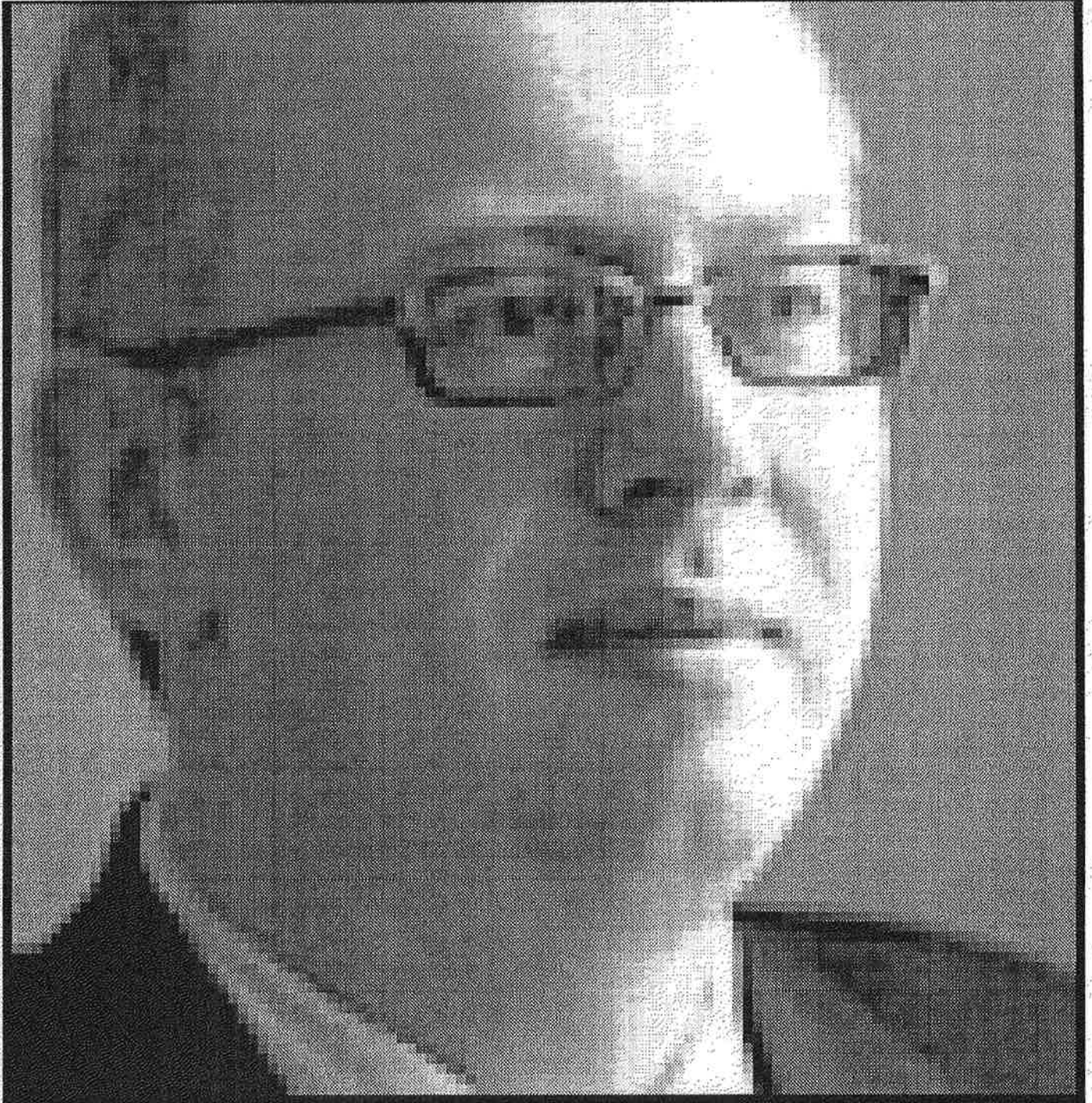

Dear Secretary Clinton:

As you are well aware, the administration is nearing completion of its policy review on Sudan. However, we believe that there is a major problem with the emerging policy: while there may be inter-agency agreement on tactical pressures and incentives, the broader diplomatic strategy through which these pressures and incentives will be enforced is fundamentally flawed. Your direct intervention will be crucial in getting the policy back on the right track.

With Africa's largest country likely to split in two in less than 18 months, we remain deeply concerned the situation in Sudan has not been elevated to sufficiently senior levels of concern in international diplomatic circles. Against the backdrop of mounting clashes in the South and the movement of significant weaponry into the area, we are writing to implore you to help revise the diplomatic strategy being implemented by Special Envoy Gration. In the interests of full disclosure, we should note that we have maintained a robust dialogue with General Gration, provided technical support to some of his efforts, and plan to continue to do so as long as that assistance is welcomed and productive. But we feel it is urgent to point out the problems in his existing diplomatic

strategy in both Darfur and the South, in the hopes that changes can be made at once, before more damage is done.

We remain deeply concerned that the Special Envoy continues to place a great deal of emphasis on incentives in dealing with the ruling National Congress Party, despite its abysmal record in implementing past peace agreements or respecting fundamental human rights. As a powerful advocate for peace in Sudan with a sophisticated understanding of effective diplomacy, your leadership is essential in helping Sudan avoid a descent into much broader conflict.

The current U.S. approach to the simmering conflict in Darfur is inadvertently leading to further divisions among rebel factions and lacks an effective endgame focused on specific proposals that will result in a lasting peace. Instead, the U.S. must adopt a diplomatic strategy that puts the horse before the cart in Darfur by developing a draft peace plan that is backed by the diplomatic structure and leverage necessary for success. U.S. support for national elections scheduled for 2010 also risk disenfranchising large numbers of Darfuris in a ballot that almost no one expects to be free or fair and will serve as de facto legitimization of President Bashir – a wanted war criminal.

We believe the actual substance of the U.S. diplomatic strategy toward implementation of the North-South Comprehensive Peace Agreement has gone badly off track and is failing to halt the accelerating slide back to North-South war.

Rather than working to create multilateral consequences for the NCP's effort to obstruct full implementation of the painstakingly negotiated Comprehensive Peace Agreement, U.S. diplomatic engagement instead has inadvertently led the NCP to believe it can renegotiate specific elements of the CPA and avoid honoring agreements or sharing power. The NCP is demanding further negotiations on post-referendum arrangements as a prerequisite to implementing existing CPA provisions connected to the referendum, including the Referendum Act. The NCP is cleverly exploiting the U.S. willingness to enter into an open-ended dialogue through the tripartite talks. Throughout its two decades-long history as the ruling party in Sudan, the NCP has signed agreements and deliberately slow-rolled and obstructed their implementation to maintain its hold on power. With a tight timetable on CPA implementation, renegotiation is an obvious delaying tactic that the U.S.—as the principal third party—cannot countenance.

The U.S. must be unequivocal in publicly supporting the strict implementation of the CPA, and strong condemnation of NCP support for ethnic-based southern militias aiming to undermine stability in the South in advance of the referendum. The Obama administration should state clearly its support for the southern referendum as the cornerstone of the CPA, and thus of maintaining the peace.

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An international coalition is needed to construct a set of genuine consequences for the NCP's obstruction of the CPA and its use of proxy ethnic militias and armed groups in the South. The same consequences should apply to the Sudan People's Liberation Movement if it undermines the peace process in any way. These consequences must include tougher economic sanctions targeted at senior regime officials and affiliated businesses, increased diplomatic isolation, an expanded arms embargo, and increased support for the work of the International Criminal Court in Sudan.

Twenty years of empirical evidence regarding the NCP suggests this course will be the most effective. A diverse set of meaningful pressures combined with deeper engagement led directly to the 2005 Comprehensive Peace Agreement, the end of government-sponsored slave raiding by the *Murahaliin* and aerial bombing by the regime's air force in the South during the 1990s, and the diminishment of the regime's once prominent role in supporting international terrorist organizations.

The same strategy must be employed today to prevent a return to war between the North and South. We fully appreciate the full load of complex foreign policy issues on your plate on a daily basis. Yet, if Sudan again dissolves into wholesale bloodshed around the independence referendum, history will likely judge that this was a tragedy that could have, and should have, been prevented. It is up to you, Secretary Clinton, as chief diplomat to right this ship.

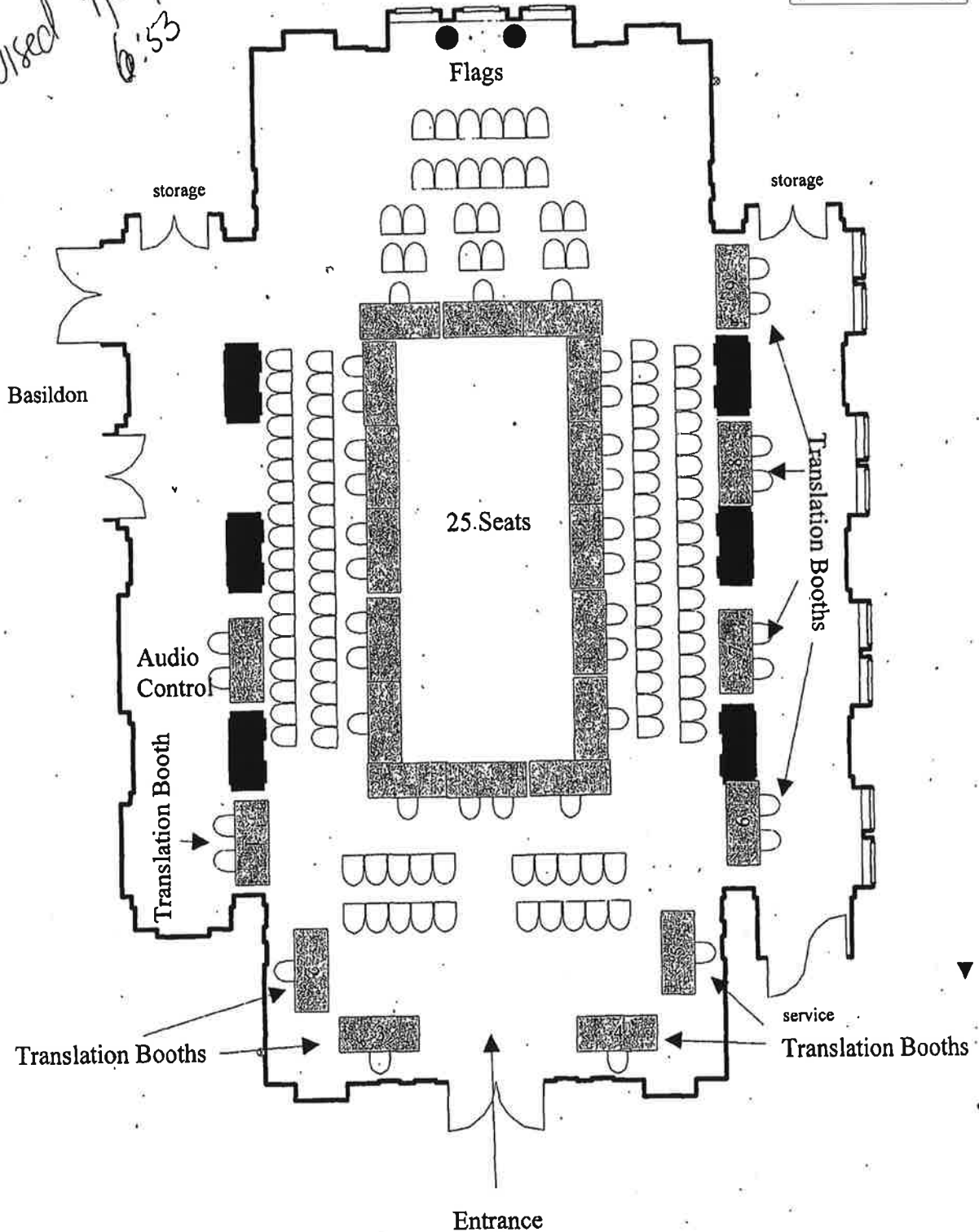

Dear Madam Secretary:

As a tremendous supporter of women's human rights including access to healthcare, I hope you will support the funding of the Ashdod Emergency Medical Center in Ashdod, Israel. The Friends of the Ashdod Emergency Medical Center (not-for profit US organization) recently submitted an application under the American Schools and Hospitals Abroad Program at USAID in order to help complete this long awaited medical facility. The Emergency Medical Center, which has been built with private contributions and commitments, is in its final phase of construction and will serve the needs of Israel's fifth-largest city, including a significant number of Americans. Further this funding from USAID will forge a long-term partnership between the Ashdod Emergency Medical Center in Israel and the United States.

This is a project that deserves US assistance. Ashdod is home to approximately 250,000 citizens – Jews and non-Jews, religious and secular, native-born Israelis and immigrants. Ashdod has absorbed more immigrants than any other city in Israel, including significant populations from India, Ethiopia and the former Soviet Union. Approximately 40,000 residents of Ashdod require emergency medical care every year. Unfortunately the closest major medical facility is located in Ashkelon, over 30 minutes away. Kidney patients requiring dialysis must travel this route twice daily. Aside from emergency medical care, the journey to a first-class medical facility is currently not possible for the 21% of Ashdod families who live below the poverty line. The need for a first-class, full-service medical center is overwhelming. The Ashdod Medical Center would answer this need.

In Ashdod and the surrounding areas there is a particular need for accessible quality, health care for women. The Ashdod Emergency Medical Center will provide primary and emergency care but also will specialize in women's mammography, emergency gynecological treatments and family medicine at its Women's Health Center. The Mammography Unit will be a key feature. One woman in eight falls victim to breast cancer in Israel, and in view of this high incidence, mammography testing is essential.

Beginning in December 2008, the residents of Ashdod were exposed to a new and serious threat. For the first time, Ashdod was within the range of rocket attacks launched from Gaza. In December 2008 and January 2009, approximately 20 rockets launched from Gaza landed in Ashdod, killing one woman and injuring a dozen others. The lack of an emergency medical center to treat the victims of these attacks magnifies the threat. The Medical Center, which has been built to conform to the stringent security standards of the Israel Defense Forces, answers this need.

The project is in its final phase of construction. Unfortunately, due to the global economic crisis, tightening credit markets, and the impact of financial scandals on public and private

supporters of the Medical Center, the financing needed to complete the Medical Center has not yet materialized. We therefore hope that USAID will be able to help facilitate the financing and completion of this important facility.

#### Health Care Update

Senator Baucus concluded Friday's session of the Finance Committee markup at noon today. The committee plans to come back on Tuesday, September 29<sup>th</sup> to continue working. Given the large number of amendments remaining, it now seems likely that the markup will go on for at least a significant part of next week. At the start of the week there had been some hope that work on the bill would have wrapped up today.

The most significant event on the horizon is a showdown over the "public option" that some are seeking to add to the legislation. Senator Rockefeller had said Thursday that he would offer an amendment to add the public option to the bill on Friday. But he and Senator Schumer decided to postpone offering it. It will now be offered and considered on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

As you know, Chairman Baucus opposes the idea of including a public, choosing instead to back consumer-owned "co-ops" as an alternative method of providing competition with private health insurance companies and bringing down costs.

Rockefeller and Schumer have said previously that they are not optimistic about winning a vote in the Finance Committee but that they want to start debate about the topic before they make their real push on the Senate floor.

Senator Kerry offered and withdrew another amendment that will likely generate debate next week – a proposal to further limit the amount insurance companies can vary premiums based on age. Currently, there are no federal limits on how much insurers can use age to make premiums more or less expensive for individuals buying insurance. Many states have no such limits either. Kerry proposed limiting the amount insurers can vary premiums to no more than twice as expensive as the least expensive premium, based on age. Currently, Baucus's proposal limits that variation to four-to-one. Kerry withdrew the amendment, but Baucus said he would work with him on the proposal and hoped to include some version of it.

#### **Talking Points: No More Time for Delay**

- America's health care status quo is unacceptable and unsustainable.
  - Premiums have more than doubled over the past decade – up five percent this year alone.
  - 14,000 people a day lose their insurance, and lack of insurance causes at least 18,000 unnecessary deaths a year.
  - We currently spend about \$2.5 trillion annually on health care, and if we continue on like this, in thirty years, we'll be spending one in every three dollars on health care costs.
- Yet despite the mounting evidence, there are some in Washington who wish to preserve the status quo for as long as possible. And recently they've been urging us to slow down and delay reform for another few weeks, or months, or longer.
  - The truth is, reform's opponents know that, in Washington, the best way to kill a good idea is to stall it to death.
  - One Republican Senator offered rare candor this week about why they want to delay action – he said they need a little more time to consult with industry lobbyists.
- Health care is a complicated issue and it's critical we take the time necessary to get it right. That's exactly what we've

done.

- o The House of Representatives has held **79 hearings** on health reform over the past two and a half years. The two Senate committees responsible for drafting legislation have held **nearly 150 bi-partisan meetings** in just the past year alone. One of **them considered 287 amendments** when drafting its proposal.

- o We've reached out to stakeholders across the spectrum – doctors, nurses, and hospitals; drug and insurance companies; business, labor, and consumer groups.

- o Members of Congress, their staffs, and the Obama Administration have devoted **thousands of hours** to this effort and considered the widest possible range of ideas and proposals.

- o As a nation, we **have debated this issue not just for years, but for generations.**

- So while President Obama welcomes constructive debate and sincere attempts to improve health insurance reform legislation before it reaches his desk, he will not tolerate attempts to stall reform to death or block reform for partisan political gain.

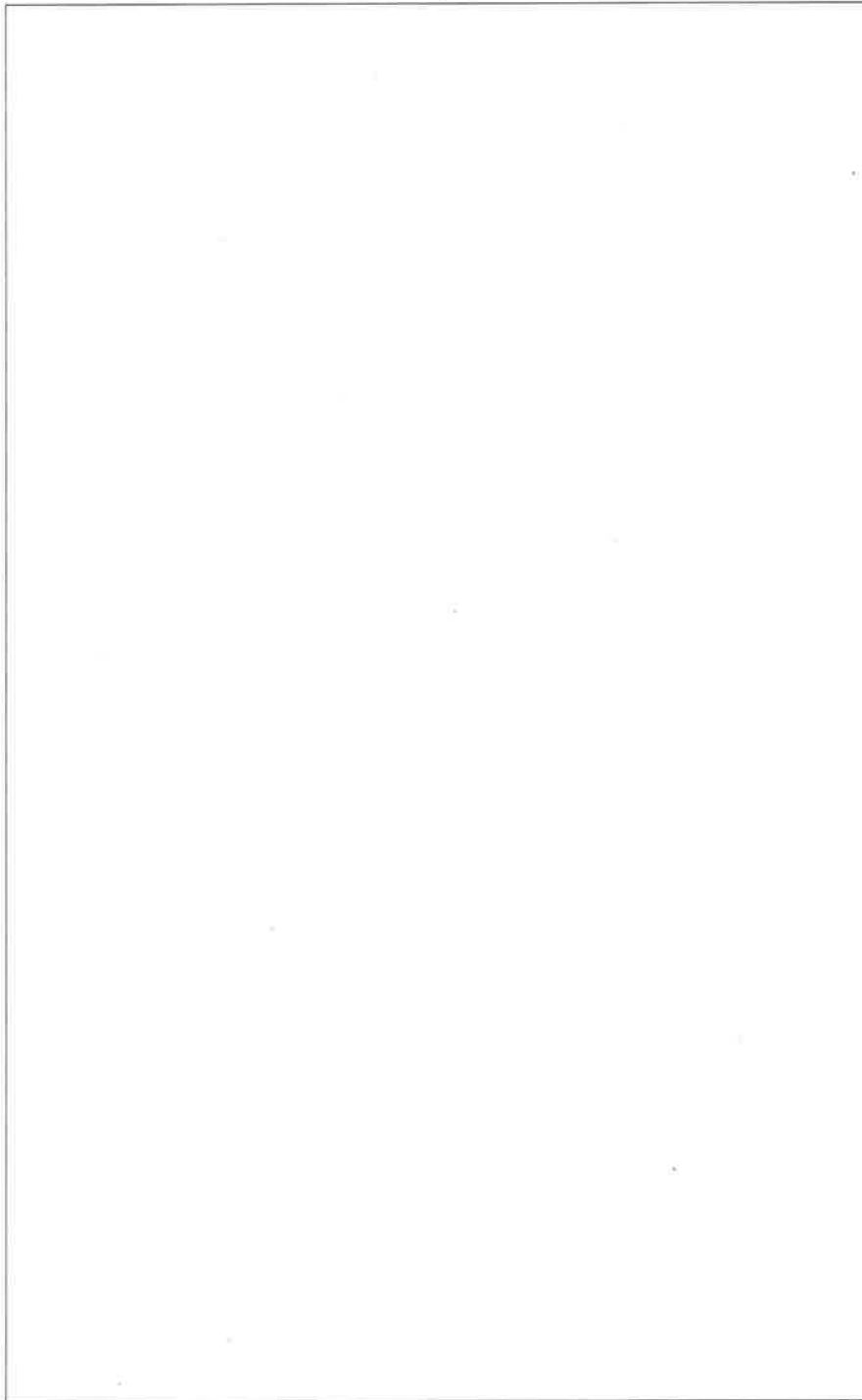

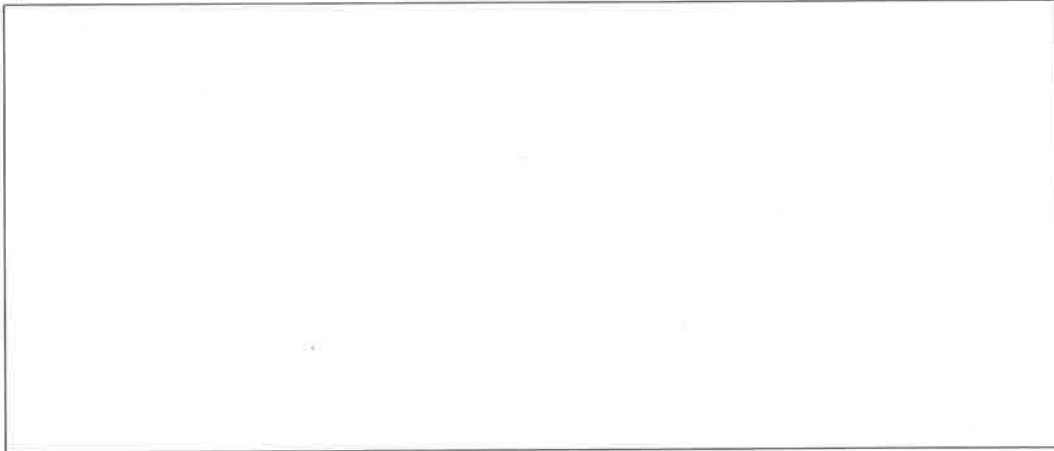
