Dear Mr. Marshall:

This is a final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). You requested records, documents, and communications, etc. regarding a Community Engagement Tour in Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport on February 18, 2016.

A search of CBP databases produced a total of 60 pages of records responsive to your request. CBP has determined that 29 pages of the records are partially released, pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(E). The remaining 31 pages are withheld in full, pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(E).

Exemption (b)(3) protects information specifically exempted from disclosure by another statute, if the statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on the issue, or (B) established particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld. Exemption 3 is asserted on behalf of the Transportation Security Administration to protect Sensitive Security Information (SSI). 49 U.S.C. § 114(r) prohibits the disclosure of information that "would be detrimental to the security of transportation" if released. The TSA regulations implementing Section 114(r) are found in 49 CFR Part 1520. Pursuant to 49 CFR Section 1520.5(b)(9)(i), security screening procedures, including selection criteria for the screening of persons, is SSI and is therefore exempt from disclosure.

Exemption (b)(5) protects from disclosure those inter- or intra-agency documents that are normally privileged in the civil discovery context. The three most frequently invoked privileges are the deliberative process privilege, the attorney work-product privilege, and the attorney-client privilege.

• Deliberative Process Privilege

The deliberative process privilege protects the integrity of the deliberative or decision-making processes within the agency by exempting from mandatory disclosure opinions, conclusions, and recommendations included within inter- or intra-agency memoranda or letters. The release of this internal information would discourage the expression of candid opinions and inhibit the free and frank exchange of information among agency personnel.

Exemption (b)(6) exempts from disclosure personnel or medical files and similar files the release of which would cause a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This requires a

balancing of the public's right to disclosure against the individual's right privacy. [The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld may consist of birth certificates, naturalization certificates, driver license, social security numbers, home addresses, dates of birth, or various other documents and/or information belonging to a third party that are considered personal.] The privacy interests of the individuals in the records you have requested outweigh any minimal public interest in disclosure of the information. Any private interest you may have in that information does not factor into the aforementioned balancing test.

Exemption (b)(7)(C) protects records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This exemption takes particular note of the strong interests of individuals, whether they are suspects, witnesses, or investigators, in not being unwarrantably associated with alleged criminal activity. That interest extends to persons who are not only the subjects of the investigation, but those who may have their privacy invaded by having their identities and information about them revealed in connection with an investigation. Based upon the traditional recognition of strong privacy interest in law enforcement records, categorical withholding of information that identifies third parties in law enforcement records is ordinarily appropriate.

Exemption (b)(7)(E) protects records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would disclose techniques and/or procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

You have a right to appeal our withholding determination. Should you wish to do so, you must send your appeal and a copy of this letter, within 60 days of the date of this letter, to: FOIA Appeals, Policy and Litigation Branch, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, 90 K Street, NE, 10^{th} Floor, Washington, DC 20229-1177, following the procedures outlined in the DHS regulations at Title 6 C.F.R. § 5.9. Details:

On February 18, 2016, CBP Field Operations, in partnership with TSA and DHS Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties (CRCL), conducted a port tour at the Minneapolis St. Paul International Airport for approximately 20 Somali community members to explain CBP and TSA processes and procedures, and to help address community stakeholder questions. Community members were provided with a tour of the FIS to include primary processing, trusted travel programs, and secondary inspection procedures. TSA representatives then provided an overview of their operations and processes. After the tour concluded, community members were given an opportunity to ask questions; many also shared comments about their experiences with DHS and the steps being taken to improve ties with local Somali community members. During the question and answer session, CBP provided an overview of the complaint and compliment system, including the methods for reporting, along with CBP's commitment to professionalism. Current CBP and TSA job vacancies were discussed. Attendees responded with requests for DHS outreach efforts during Somali community events to further advertise these positions to interested individuals.







- Jennifer lead for CBP With Jennifer now in as the Area Port Director, we've asked her to serve as our lead for local engagement in Minneapolis, including the next tour of MSP for the Somali community. She will be our speaker for the tour, serving in the role the DFO Ferrara did in the past.
- Looping in TSA I've also looped in that the next tour could be arranged in partnership with TSA as well.
- Tour-only vs tour + roundtable We'd like to adhere to our commitment to offer an annual tour of the airport
 and would like to ask for CRCL's help in sending out invitations for it. In terms of structure, we'd like to run this
 year's tour in the way we have done so before offering general information at the beginning, walking people
 through CBP's process, walking people through TSA's process (assuming they can participate), and then closing
