My friend [redacted] with two decades of extensive dealings in Kyrgyzstan, and [redacted] has been in close contact with his high-level sources there over the past 72 hours, and sends me the following memo. It is particularly well informed on the new interim leader, Roza Otunbayeva, whom he knows well, the internal politics post-revolution, and how DOD and State are relatively regarded and what that means.

I have worked in the Kyrgyz Republic continuously since 1991 [redacted]. I became acquainted with each of the three Kyrgyz leaders from about that time, first meeting Askar Akayev in 1990 in Moscow, Kurmanbek Bakiyev in Djalalabad in 1993, and Roza Otunbayeva in Bishkek in 1992. I have had extended dealings with each of them on many different matters, largely inside Kyrgyzstan, although I first dealt extensively with Otunbayeva when she served as Kyrgyz ambassador in the United States.

Assessment of Otunbayeva: The opposition forces selected Otunbayeva for several reasons: (i) among them she is the only figure who commands recognition and respect abroad; (ii) in the eyes of the Kyrgyz people she is closely associated with the Kyrgyz Tulip Revolution of 2005, yet she alone among the leaders of that revolution upheld its idealism, openly castigated Bakiyev and others for their corruption and failure to follow through on promises, and personally avoided corruption and graft; and (iii) she lacks a strong domestic power base and therefore is seen as less of a threat to the alternative candidates. Based on these factors, several of the opposition leaders tell me a quick consensus was reached that Otunbayeva should be the provisional leader and the "face to the world" of the new revolution.

Otunbayeva, who is 59, launched her career in the diplomatic service, obtaining the position of foreign minister of the Kyrgyz SSR at a precocious age. She served in the Soviet Foreign Ministry and caught the eye of Eduard Shevardnadze, who appointed her as a vice minister—an unprecedented accomplishment for a Central Asian and for a woman then in her late 30s. Shevardnadze told me in 2002 that he had viewed Otunbayeva as a person of extraordinary skills, well qualified to succeed him as Soviet foreign minister. He noted her ability quickly to grasp complex problems and to propose novel and interesting solutions. He called her a "natural diplomat" with an instinctive tendency to reconcile, but also with a clear grasp of policy objectives and a methodical approach to their accomplishment. My own experience in dealing with Otunbayeva confirms these observations. She has a measure of idealism that often guides her policy orientation, but she is instinctively pragmatic in her approach.

Otunbayeva defies categorization in terms of political philosophy. Her political parties, first Ata-Jurt ("Fatherland"), then the Social Democrats, are often portrayed as "leftists" on the political scale in Kyrgyzstan, but the party orients itself to continental European social democrats and to the British Labour Party (with which Otunbayeva has solid connections, including with Tony Blair). While schooled in basic concepts of Marxism-Leninism, which occasionally appear in conversation (though often as not in a joking way), her politics is fundamentally one of pragmatic engagement. She advocates maintenance of the republic's Soviet era social net and pays particular attention to health and education issues. She was a vigorous advocate for and supporter of the American University in Bishkek and was repeatedly identified for board membership—she declined one offer saying that her role as an opposition leader would probably complicate the university's relations with the government. As ambassador, Otunbayeva went to bat aggressively for foreign investors, helped them secure concessions, and advocated for them against government red tape. I am unaware of any instance in which she ever sought personal gain or advancement in connection with these deals, however. She is very unusual among Kyrgyz political figures in her rejection of rent-seeking and her loud denunciation of political figures who use their office for personal gain. Indeed, this aspect of her personality has won her some respect in the public, but general disdain among the political class, who frequently disparage her as "unrealistic."

Otunbayeva served extended periods in Washington and London as the Kyrgyz ambassador. She has a fluent and subtle command of the English language, and a broadly positive view of the United States and the United Kingdom. Of the three Kyrgyz leaders to date, she is clearly the one with the deepest understanding of American culture and the American political environment and the one with the most instinctively pro-American leanings.

Israeli Ministers Continue Consultations on Response to US Demands

Israeli media on the morning of 18 March report that Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu is continuing to consult with his top ministers over the response to the US demands regarding construction in East Jerusalem and the future of the peace process. One report says that a possible solution could be that Israel will make it clear that although it has the right to build everywhere in Jerusalem there will be a freeze on construction in the Arab neighborhoods. A spokesman for Qadima leader Tzipi Livni refused to comment on a US report that the US pressure on Netanyahu is aimed at having Interior Minister Eli Yishay fired and his SHAS party replaced by Qadima in the coalition. The reports also say that Netanyahu might cancel his visit to the United States next week if no meetings were arranged for him with US officials, and that he would consider it a deep insult if meetings were arranged for

Qadima leader Tzipi Livni, who is also due in the US capital next week.

There are conflicting reports in the Israeli media this morning about the nature of the strained relations between the United States and Israel, the Americans' expectations of Israel and projections of what is likely to come next. *Ma'ariv* reports that Israeli and American officials are in the midst of coordinating a series of meetings between Prime Minister Netanyahu, who is scheduled to be in Washington next week for the AIPAC conference, and senior American officials, including Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Vice President Joe Biden. Alternatively, *Yedioth Ahronoth* reports that the Americans are adamant not to schedule any such meetings with Netanyahu unless they receive Israeli answers to recent American demands of Israel that are deemed to be "satisfactory." *Yedioth* reports that the administration might try to coordinate meetings with Opposition Chairwoman Tzippi Livni, who will also be in Washington next week as a way of taking "revenge" on the snubbed Netanyahu, whereas *Ma'ariv* reports that the Americans are disinclined to take that sort of action. *Ma'ariv* reports this morning that Israeli officials were led to understand from conversations with their American counterparts that the Americans had rather expected to see Eli Yishai dismissed from his post as interior minister in the wake of the Ramat Shlomo fiasco. No other newspapers have reported this implied American demand.

Against the backdrop of the above, the forum of seven convened last night in an attempt to come up with an Israeli response that might satisfy the Americans and allow for Israeli-US relations to be restored to their former state. However, if any decisions were made in that meeting that ran into the night, they have not leaked to the Israeli media yet. According to a report in *Yedioth* this morning, there are at least two competing views of the reasons for the current strain in relations with the Americans. Some ministers surmise that this an American attempt to secure an extension of the ten-month settlement construction freeze, which is due to expire in September; others said they believed that it was an attempt to force Netanyahu to clash with the right wing of his coalition in hope that this might lead to the coalition's dissolution and Netanyahu's downfall.

At any event, the Israeli newspapers all report this morning about President Barack Obama's interview to Fox News yesterday in which he denied that US-Israeli relations were in crisis. Rather, the president described the current situation as one that stemmed from disagreements. Obama's statements make the front-page headlines in *Yedioth Ahronoth* and *Israel Hayom*, but are less prominently reported by the other papers.

* **Obama remarks:** President Barack Obama said that there was no crisis in relations between Washington and Jerusalem. He said that although there were differences, the two countries had a special relationship that would not stop. That said, the president said that the announcement of the construction of 1,600 apartments in Jerusalem in the course of Vice President Joe Biden's visit did not help the peace process. He said this to the Fox network.

The State Department spokesman said last night that the US was still waiting for clarifications from Prime Minister Netanyahu on the matter of construction in Jerusalem. Spokesman Mark Toner said that Secretary of State Hillary Clinton was expecting to hold a talk with the Israeli prime minister. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton left for Moscow for a meeting of the international Quartet.

* **Barak speaks to Mitchell:** Defense Minister Barak spoke by phone last night with envoy Mitchell and the idea was discussed of Mitchell coming to Israel on Sunday.

* **Kassam rocket to Sderot:** A Kassam rocket was fired at the Sderot area last night. No one was injured and no damage was caused. Yesterday evening another rocket was fired at the area. No one was hurt by that one either.

* **Financial fraud:** The Israel Securities Authority yesterday questioned under caution three top officials of the Psagot Investment House. They are suspected of receiving, in real time, reports on the activities of the investment house's account and of approving some of them.

Troubled Relationship**Between Shas and Obama**

Ma'ariv (p. 2) by Ben Caspit and Eli Bardenstein -- "If this had happened in the US, heads would have rolled," said a high-ranking American official to his Israeli counterpart in a conversation last week after the crisis broke out over construction in Ramat Shlomo in the course of Vice President Joe Biden's visit to Israel. The official's criticism was interpreted by his interlocutor as an American "recommendation" to Binyamin Netanyahu to dismiss Interior Minister Eli Yishai, who was responsible for the ministerial failure.

Furthermore, the American official said in the same conversation, "this incident shows that the alliance with Shas is more important to Netanyahu than Israel's strategic interests, among them the relationship with the US." A high-ranking government official in Israel said yesterday that the Americans expected a real step by Netanyahu, perhaps even the dismissal of Shas Chairman Eli Yishai over the incident, and said that is how they themselves would have acted if this mishap had occurred in the US.

Yesterday a troubling public opinion poll was released in the US. Rasmussen Reports found that only 58% of the American public would now describe Israel as an ally, compared to 70% who did so just a few months ago. This, said an Israeli official, is a dramatic drop that reflects "the spirit of the commander," i.e., President Obama.

Behind the scenes, talks have begun to work out a petition to be signed by dozens of "Zionist" MKs calling on the US administration not to force on Israel a construction freeze in the Jewish neighborhoods of Jerusalem. Israeli sources say that it turns out that one of Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's demands was a temporary freeze of construction in 12 Jewish neighborhoods of Jerusalem located beyond the Green Line. One of the authors of the petition is MK Otniel Schneller of Kadima, who yesterday said that the wording was not yet complete and he hoped to complete it in the course of the day.

Other sources say that the Prime Minister's Bureau is involved in preparing the petition, with the knowledge and encouragement of Netanyahu himself, and that some of the wording was discussed in the meeting of the forum of seven yesterday night. The goal is to display a united Zionist front, one that spans all the parties, to the US administration, in light of the escalation in the crisis and the belief that the Americans plan to go all out if Netanyahu refuses Clinton's demands, which were basically dictated by President Obama.

In light of the deepening crisis with the US, the forum of seven met last night for a series of discussions that went on into the night in an attempt to formulate an Israeli response to Washington's demands.

Some of the forum of seven believe that ultimately, Israel will not have to meet all the demands of Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, which mainly refer to canceling construction in East Jerusalem and renewing the talks on the core issues. "Our opposition is not due to right wing invective or ideology, but rather due to diplomatic tactics and perspective," said sources close to the forum of seven.

In the course of the meeting, some of the ministers—including Defense Minister Ehud Barak—spoke with special US envoy to the Middle East George Mitchell. In the course of this talk, various options

for a solution to the crisis between Israel and the US were broached. Furthermore, the possibility was discussed that Mitchell would come to Israel on Sunday, immediately after the Quartet meeting in Moscow.

As for the Quartet, Hillary Clinton left yesterday for Moscow, where she will take part in an international summit devoted to formulating strategy for policy in the Middle East. The meeting, which will be attended by high-ranking Quartet representatives, was to have been part of the indirect talks between Israel and the Palestinians. However, because of the crisis that broke out with the announcement of construction of 1,600 housing units in the Ramat Shlomo neighborhood, it is expected to turn into a discussion on the question of how to act now toward Israel. This was reported last night by AP.

Michelle Dunne, an expert on the Middle East at the Carnegie Institute believes that at the end of its talks, the Quartet may issue an official statement of support for the US's demands of Israel—to freeze construction in Jerusalem, and to make a series of gestures toward the Palestinians.

Lieberman: "American Demands Are Unreasonable"

Yedioth Ahronoth (p. 3) by Itamar Eichner -- After his meeting with EU Foreign Affairs Chief Catherine Ashton, Foreign Minister Avigdor Lieberman chose yesterday to send a sharp message to the US and to Europe, in which he rejected the demand made of Israel to freeze construction in Jerusalem and in which he accused them of an attempt to exploit the opportunity to attack Israel.

The demand to forbid Jews from buying or building in East Jerusalem is unreasonable, Lieberman said at a joint press conference with EU Foreign Affairs Chief Catherine Ashton after their meeting, which was held in private. This is an opportunity to attack Israel and to put pressure on it. Let's think what would happen if we were to forbid Arabs from East Jerusalem from buying in west Jerusalem. I've asked this question of all the leaders with whom I spoke in the last few days. They say that we are an apartheid state. This is an unacceptable symmetry. Jerusalem is the capital of Israel and there must be access to people of all faiths. Everyone is entitled to buy or build wherever they like. There are thousands of Arabs from East Jerusalem who live in Jerusalem neighborhoods in western Jerusalem and that will continue.

Lieberman also criticized President Obama—without stating his name—for his approach to dialogue with Iran. He said: now is a critical time. The Iranian policy of gaining time is unacceptable. A Churchill policy is what we need, not a Chamberlain policy. Ashton said about the Iranian issue that steps must be taken to ensure that Iran not continue with its nuclear program.

Lieberman also said that Israel had no interest in clashing with the US or Europe. He said that Israel was trying, through the accepted channels, to make its position clear and to explain what is going on. He said he hoped that an understanding would be found. He said: I suggest we don't exploit this affair for some overall clash—that will not contribute anything positive to the peace process and will not bring the sides closer or make it easier for them.

Netanyahu's Brother in Law: Obama is an Anti-Semite

Ma'ariv (p. 3) by Amihai Attali -- "There is an anti-Semitic president in America," said yesterday Hagi Ben-Artzi, Binyamin Netanyahu's brother-in-law, causing the Prime Minister's Bureau a great deal of embarrassment.

In an interview to Army Radio, Ben Artzi said that not only was Obama an anti-Semite, but that Netanyahu knew that to be the case. The Prime Minister's Bureau swiftly issued a statement condemning those statements and disassociating itself from them. The statement that was issued by the Prime Minister's Bureau read: "the prime minister profoundly appreciates President Obama's commitment to Israel's security—which he voiced many times—and the deep relationship between the countries."

In the aftermath of that hastily-made condemnation, Ben Artzi said to *Ma'ariv*: "Of course the Prime Minister's Bureau is going to issue a statement of condemnation, what else? Bibi can't go to America when he calls Obama an anti-Semite." Ben Artzi further said: "Bibi is a smart man, and I find it hard to believe that he can't see that we're talking about a person who acts out of hatred and hostility towards Israel. I believe that deep inside Bibi also knows that Obama is an anti-Semite."

Ben Artzi said that he held his tongue after the settlement construction freeze in Judea and Samaria was announced in the wake of American pressure on Israel. But when he saw the American response to the construction plan in Ramat Shlomo he decided that he "could not remain silent any longer."

Bibi, Say No

Makor Rishon-Hatzofe (p. 1) by Ariel Kahane -- This is Jerusalem. It is ours. It is yours. You have no mandate to give it up or to stop construction there, which, incidentally, is the same thing. The same is true for the core problems. Just like heart problems [the word for heart and core is the same in Hebrew], these are not solved (if, in

this case, that can even be solved), by remote control. You know this. The forum of seven knows this. The public knows this. The only person who does not know is Barack Obama, whose term you happened to coincide with.

Yes, these are decisive days. The decision that will be made today or tomorrow will be remembered and will determine events for many years, and therefore this clash should be examined in proportion and in context. One meeting more or one less in Washington will, at most, be a footnote in history. On the other hand, giving up Jerusalem will be something that will be remembered for generations. That is the issue that is on your desk.

Therefore, you have no choice but to say no. No more. There are situations in which the only choice is to insist on your position, to hold on tight and to hope that it will end well. All the corners have already been cut. All the maneuvers exhausted. What remains is the choice between turning Israel into a trembling leaf or to project strength. And this time, you have no choice, Mr. Prime Minister, but to project strength and to say no.

Incidentally, Israel is not alone. Because not only the Americans, but also the world is beginning to tire of him. The British are discovering that the "special historic relationship" with America is no longer what it was. Poland has an unsettled score with him since the missile project was canceled. The European Union doesn't understand how it is that the American president does not find the time to meet the first prime minister of the united continent. Sarkozy's France has never been enthusiastic about Barak Hussein. As for Obama's relations with China, there is no need to expand.

And in short, Mr. Netanyahu, you are facing a serial bridge burner who knows nothing about statesmanship. Behind you stand the people of Israel, its strength, its land and its capital. Do you have any doubt about which to choose?

Visit Doubtful

US: No Meetings Without Concessions

Yediot Ahronoth (p. 2) by Itamar Eichner and Orly Azulai -- The sense in the Prime Minister's Bureau is that a game of diplomatic chess is now being played with the United States. The US administration made its powerful move, and now State Department officials are waiting for a phone call from the prime minister to hear his answer. But it would seem that no solution has yet been found in Jerusalem to the crisis. Netanyahu convened the forum of seven yesterday evening for a meeting that ran into the night, in the course of which they all racked their brains in an attempt to decide what the next step ought to be.

On Tuesday Prime Minister Netanyahu spoke with US Vice President Joe Biden in hope of smoothing out the situation. That telephone conversation lasted for two whole hours and was held after midnight (Israel time). The length of that phone conversation and its lack of results demonstrate the depth of the crisis on the one hand, but also the efforts being made to find a way of letting the parties back down, on the other.

In the absence of a solution, it remains unclear what will happen in the course of Netanyahu's visit to the United States. Netanyahu is scheduled to arrive in Washington in another four days to attend the annual AIPAC conference, but no meetings have yet been set for him with top US administration officials, such as Vice President Biden, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and National Security Adviser James Jones.

Representatives of the prime minister have put in requests on his behalf for meetings with top administration officials, but have yet to receive an affirmative answer. US administration officials have confirmed that they are demanding answers from Netanyahu before agreeing to schedule meetings with him. The assessment is that in the event that Netanyahu either does not respond to the Americans' demands or responds in a way that is not to the administration's satisfaction, no meetings will be scheduled.

Israeli diplomats in Washington said that if no meetings are held with the prime minister, that will be construed as a far-reaching step that is being taken against Israel and an insult. The diplomats also said that it was possible that if the senior administration officials ultimately refused to meet with Netanyahu, he might decide at the last minute to cancel his trip. An even more stinging insult to Netanyahu would be a scenario in which top administration officials boycotted his visit, but met with Opposition Chairwoman Tzippi Livni, who is going to be in Washington at the same time. Livni has not asked to meet with administration officials so as not to embarrass Netanyahu, but it is not inconceivable that she might be invited to a meeting by administration officials as a way of taking revenge on Netanyahu. Netanyahu has a series of meetings scheduled with US Senators and Members of Congress, most of whom are Republicans.

Meanwhile, Washington is waiting—not for Netanyahu's arrival but for answers from him. We are still waiting for Netanyahu's answers, said State Department Spokesman Philip Crowley last night. The US administration is demanding that Netanyahu announce the cancellation of the plan to build 1,600 new housing units in the Jerusalem neighborhood of Ramat Shlomo. "The moment of truth has arrived. Netanyahu now has to give clear and concrete

answers," said last night to *Yedioth Ahronoth* a US administration official. "We are expecting from Netanyahu something that can set talks in motion. Nothing less than that."

Alongside pressure to freeze construction in Ramat Shlomo, the US administration has other demands as well. It wants Netanyahu to agree to discuss core issues in the first stages of the talks, starting with marking borders and then dealing with Jerusalem. Netanyahu has thus far refused that demand. Another demand pertains to the release of Palestinian prisoners. Netanyahu's attitude on this issue, as it has been conveyed to the Americans, appears to be more flexible.

But the central American demand has to do with the continued construction in Jerusalem. The prime minister convened the forum of seven in his office. He received their support to tell the Americans "no" on a construction freeze. Lieberman took the lead on the more extremist line and sent the Americans a stern message in which he called on them not to exploit the opportunity to pounce on Israel, and called their demand for a construction freeze in Jerusalem unreasonable.

Netanyahu would like to appease the Americans to a certain degree, but not in a way that might destabilize his coalition. Officials in Jerusalem believe that the American tactics are geared to extort from Netanyahu his agreement to extend the settlement construction freeze—which is due to expire in another half a year—beyond the initial ten-month period. "The Americans realize that if the bulldozers return to the settlements, that will result in the derailment of the negotiations with the Palestinians," said a high-ranking source in Jerusalem last night. "They're trying to railroad Netanyahu."

Other top Israeli officials have offered a different analysis of the crisis and surmise that the Americans are trying to set a trap for Netanyahu: "If the Americans continue to insist on the issue of Jerusalem, that is clear proof that they want to topple his government. But they don't understand that there is no chance that he'll capitulate to their demands on the issue of Jerusalem. Jerusalem is a red line."

Some members of the forum of seven suggested that Netanyahu pass the ball into the Palestinians' court and to promise the Americans that Israel would consider a continued construction freeze if the Palestinians promised to do x, y and z. Another proposal that was raised was to declare a freeze on Jewish construction in Palestinian neighborhoods, such as Silwan, which might cool the Americans' temper. Lieberman was vehemently opposed to any such step. By agreeing to taking that course of action, Netanyahu would be risking alienating the right wing.

Last night the harbinger of the end of the crisis appeared. Defense Minister Ehud Barak spoke on the telephone with special US envoy to the Middle East George Mitchell, who was supposed to have arrived in Israel on Tuesday but canceled his visit at the last minute. In the course of their conversation the two men discussed the possible ways of resolving the current crisis and launching the peace process between Israel and the Palestinians. The two men also discussed the possibility that Mitchell might arrive in Israel on Sunday. It remains uncertain whether he will arrive, and much of that depends on the results of the talks with the Americans.

Yesterday in an interview that he gave to Fox News, US President Barack Obama discussed the tension with Israel and said: Israel is one of our closest allies and we have a special relationship with it. There is no crisis. Friends sometimes disagree about certain issues, and we currently have a disagreement about how to advance the peace process... I sent Biden to give a message of support for Israel. The steps taken by Israel didn't help, and Netanyahu apologized for that. We need to focus now on renewing the peace process. When the Palestinians protested the opening of a synagogue the other day we condemned them.

Business as Usual in US Embassy

Ma'ariv (p. 2) by Eli Berenstein and Maya Bengal -- The Israeli embassy in Washington and the Prime Minister's Bureau are making the usual preparations in advance of Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu's visit to Washington next week, and have been coordinating meetings for him with Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Vice President Joe Biden.

A delegation of representatives from the Prime Minister's Bureau has already arrived in Washington and is working with its American counterparts to schedule meetings with Clinton, Biden, Senators and Members of Congress. Israeli officials in Washington said they believed those meetings would be held as scheduled because, among other reasons, of the Americans' wish to meet with Netanyahu in any event.

The assessment is that Netanyahu and Clinton will ultimately agree on the details of their meeting in the course of a telephone conversation that the two will hold in the very near future. "But until then, we're all on hold," said an Israeli official in Washington. A different political source told *Ma'ariv* that the phone conversation that Biden and Netanyahu held on Tuesday had been very lengthy, and in the course of it the two men discussed various possible ways of resolving the crisis during Netanyahu's sojourn in Washington.

Opposition Chairwoman Tzippi Livni will also be in the United States while Netanyahu is there, but her official meetings have been reduced to the bare minimum necessary. The Americans are being diplomatically cautious: they don't want to embrace Livni publicly while giving Netanyahu a cold shoulder.

Quiet Restored**Hamas: PA Made Us Fail**

Israel Hayom (p. 5) by Efrat Porsher, Daniel Serioti and Yehuda Schlesinger -- Quiet was restored yesterday to the capital. After a number of days in which residents of East Jerusalem clashed with troops from the Jerusalem District Police and the Border Police, yesterday it appeared that the storm had mostly passed. Hamas officials accused the Palestinian Authority of having thwarted its efforts to stage violent protests.

Aside from a small number of disturbances, such as at the Kalandia roadblock and Abu Tur, Jerusalem remained quiet yesterday. In the morning, when it became apparent that no rioting was going to ensue on the Temple Mount, Commander of the Jerusalem District Police Cmdr. Aharon Franco decided to allow tourists to visit the Temple Mount.

The heightened state of alert and the deployment of thousands of police and Border Police troops in the alleys of the Old City, the neighborhoods of East Jerusalem and the surrounding villages are going to continue at least through Friday. The intelligence assessment is that disturbances should be anticipated on Friday on the Temple Mount.

Senior PA officials in Ramallah voiced their satisfaction with the results of the "day of rage," and with the fact that the Palestinian protest had placed the issue of Jerusalem at the top of the world agenda. One high-ranking Palestinian Authority official said that it had been in Ramallah's interest that the demonstrations not develop any further than pinpoint protests, and that they not devolve into mass violent riots across the West Bank.

"It should be chalked up to the credit of the Palestinian security forces on the West Bank that the majority of the Palestinian public did not accede to Hamas's call to take violent action," said the senior Palestinian Authority official. "With all due respect to Hamas and its calls to unite the ranks in the Palestinian people in light of the events of the day of rage, we conducted ourselves responsibly and controlled the incidents. We desire to continue to improve the security situation and the quality of life in the West Bank," said the senior Palestinian official. That said, he underscored that the political deadlock between Israel and the Palestinian Authority could undermine the relative quiet in the West Bank, if it were to continue.

Hamas officials yesterday also admitted that they had failed, for all intents and purposes. "The efforts to set things on fire and to get the Palestinians out to demonstrate against the occupation government and its actions in Jerusalem failed," said yesterday a senior Hamas official in a conversation with *Israel Hayom*. He accused the Palestinian Authority of having thwarted Hamas's efforts to achieve that end. Ribhi Rantisi, a high-ranking Hamas official in Gaza, said yesterday: "If the Zionists hadn't had the help and collaboration of the security forces of the Abu Mazen-Fayyad administration, tens of thousands would have come out to demonstrate."

Meanwhile, a mere 30 people turned out last night for a demonstration in Jaffa. The demonstrators waved the Palestinian flag, beat drums and raised placards calling for the liberation of "al-Quds" and chanted slogans against Israel and the "occupation."

Dahlan Tells Hamas: Let's Join Forces

Nana10.co.il (online service) by Yonatan Gonen -- The former director of the PA's Preventive Security Service made a surprising statement and said that reconciliation between the factions would send an important message to Israel and to the international community. Fatah Central Committee member Mohammed Dahlan called on Hamas on Wednesday to join forces for a common battle against Israel, in light of recent events in Jerusalem.

Talking to reporters in Cairo, where Dahlan is visiting, he said that such a uniting of forces and a speedy reconciliation would send an important message to Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu, to the US administration and the international community that the Palestinians are united. "The crisis between Israel and the US is great," Dahlan pointed out.

Earlier Hamas issued calls to launch a new Intifada. Hamas Political Bureau Director Khaled Mashal called on the masses to respond to Israel's "religious war."

"They want a religious war. We say to them: a religious war will cost you a high price," Mashal threatened. He said that Israel was exploiting religion. "We respect religion and do not exploit it," said Mashal.

Hamas's military wing, the Iz al-Din al-Kassam Brigades, also related to recent developments in Jerusalem. "What is taking place in Jerusalem will push the region to an explosion and we are studying the response that will bring victory for the sake of the el-Aksa Mosque," officials said.

Investment House Fraud

Part 1

Psagot Directors Questioned by Israel Securities Authority

Yedioth Ahronoth (p. 6) by Tzah Spitz and Eli Simhoni -- Top officials of the Psagot Investment House—CEO Roy Vermus, Chairman of the Board Arik Steinberg and Psagot Securities CEO and stock market member Shai Yaron—were questioned under caution last night by the Israel Securities Authority's investigation and intelligence department.

Traders from the investment house are suspected of trying, by fraudulent means, to influence the value of securities. It is suspected that Vermus, Yaron and Steinberg received, in real time, ongoing reports about what was taking place in the house's account and also approved some of this forbidden activity.

In early February, the Israel Securities Authority's investigation department raided Psagot's offices and seized many document and computers. They also arrested David Edri and Shai Ben David, major suspects, and former employees of the investment house. Edri was once the deputy CEO of the brokerage department and Ben David ran the trading room.

They were arrested on suspicion of fraud and rigging shares valued at billions of shekels. Edri and Ben David managed the investment house's private investment portfolio. Their success gained them profits because their salary was based on bonuses for their success in managing the portfolio. But their success was also good for the investment house, which made considerable profit from its private portfolio.

It is suspected that Psagot's traders caused distortions in the value of Delek Real Estate corporate bonds and in government bonds. This did not hurt investors in Psagot's provident funds and trust funds, and all the activity related only to its private portfolio. [...]

The Psagot Investment House is the largest in Israel and until the investigation, enjoyed a clean image. It says of itself that it manages NIS 126 billion in various financial tracks. [...]

Rockets Away**Kassam Rocket Lands in Shaar Hanegev**

Israel Hayom (p. 5) by Gadi Golan -- A Kassam rocket was fired yesterday out of the northern Gaza Strip. The rocket landed and exploded in the Shaar Hanegev Regional Council. No one was injured and no damage was caused. The sound of the exploding rocket was clearly audible in Sderot, sending two residents into shock. They received treatment and were subsequently discharged to their homes.

**The US and China:
Where's the Reciprocity?

Google, perhaps the most free-spirited, successful and iconic company in America has now departed China, perhaps the most politically well-controlled, but economically dynamic, country in the world. The uncoupling of these two dissimilar titans leaves not only a major global business deal gone awry, but a critical diplomatic relationship in an increasingly precarious state. Even here in Beijing where nationalism is in evidence, it is nonetheless easy to discern real worry about how rapidly last year's promise of a more collaborative relationship between the US and China has eroded.

Chinese netizens have been fascinated by the Google affair, with blogs and chat rooms ablaze with defensive rebuttals to the implicit critique that the company's departure makes of the Communist Party's ground rules for operating foreign IT businesses in China. Not a few insist that "filtering" of the Internet (it is rarely referred to here as "censorship") is simply part of China's

quotidien "rules and regulations" for doing business. They charge Google with hypocrisy for having first opportunistically accepted the terms for entry, only to perfidiously changes their minds later on to not only leave, but morally rebuke their host as well. In talking about Google's decision, some even sight the rather tawdry Chinese expression: *Dangbiaozi, Shupaifang*, or, "To go whoring and then erect a memorial arch to one's virtue."

Back in Washington officials in the Obama Administration have also been disturbed by the Google affair, especially by evidence that the Chinese Government may have hacked into Google (and other corporate) computers and stolen privileged code. But, they are also alarmed by how rapidly US relations with China now seem to be deteriorating. After having spent a year laying down track for what they thought, or hoped, would be a new dawn of friendlier relations, many now wonder whether their agenda for cooperation was not far too roseate. After all, in the wake of Beijing's negative reaction to US arms sales to Taiwan (approved by the Bush Administration); the February visit of the Dalai Lama to the White House; US protests on Chinese

currency evaluation policy; and to tighter sanctions on Iran and North Korea, suddenly everything seems to be conspiring against the Obama Administration's hopes for a more cooperation.

Washington's increasingly pessimistic view was highlighted for me as early as the World Economic Forum in Davos this January when one senior US official stopped our dinner-time conversation on China, and with an air of uncharacteristic perplexity, interjected: "Do you think the Chinese really want to have friendly relations with us?"

They do. But Beijing's pugnacious diplomatic bedside manner has certainly left a sense of bewilderment, even betrayal, among key American officials for whom China's lack of reciprocation to their gestures of accommodation has left a distinctly unrequited feeling. How, they are wondering, could it be that all their signals that the US is, in fact, serious about finding a new and more constructive relationship, have failed so completely to register in Beijing?

Ever since China was first “opened up” by western gunboats a century and a half ago, the US-China playing field has been tipped, with the preponderance of economic, military and cultural power vested on the American side. With China’s rise and a concomitant decline in US power, the field has, at last, begun to level off and the Obama Administration has sought to acknowledge this new reality by emphasizing that problems such as world trade, climate change and nuclear proliferation now put both countries on an equal footing within a new global commons from which there can only be a collective escape.

Given China’s evident obduracy, there is a growing perception in the US that concessionary American gestures have not only failed to elicit an equal and opposite response from Beijing, but that each time the US has demonstrated flexibility, the Chinese have just taken another step forward, and then called for even more American back-pedaling. Fair or not, there is a growing perception that the Chinese side does not seem to understand the notion of, “Give a little, Get a little.”

The Chinese explanation for their posture is that issues like Tibet, social stability, Taiwan arms

sales, etc. are all *hexinli*, or, “core interests,” which brook no compromise. As State Councilor, Dai Bingguo, who oversees China’s foreign policy, explains, “China’s number one core interest is to maintain its fundamental system and state security; next is state sovereignty and territorial integrity; and third is the continued stable development of the economy and society.” With so many “interests” coming under the rigid rubric of “core,” a very narrow margin of territory in which Chinese diplomats are able to maneuver and actually negotiate is left over.

So, what are the concessionary signals to which the US views the Chinese as having inadequately responded?

When Secretary of State Clinton went to China last February, she was in an extremely conciliatory frame of mind, going so far as to declare that “pressing” on issues like human rights violations “can’t interfere on the global economic crisis, the global climate change crisis and the security crisis.”

Although her rhetorical effort to demonstrate how important the US now viewed cultivating a

better working relationship with China came at some real cost at home by provoking substantial criticism from human rights groups, it did not appear to precipitate much in return from Beijing.

When President Obama himself was preparing for his Beijing summit with President Hu Jintao eight months later, he too bent over backwards to send signals of US flexibility. Hoping to highlight the importance he placed on the upcoming summit, he delayed a previously scheduled October White House meeting with the Dalai Lama. And then, upon arriving in China, he evinced such deference for his hosts and both side's desire for a conflict-free summit that he exposed himself to criticism back home that he had been too supine, too willing to act out a script handed to him by Beijing.

What is more, when he finally did reschedule his meeting with the Dalai Lama - as everyone knew he must - instead of acknowledging his manifestly conciliatory gesture of delaying it, Beijing only renewed its harangues, as if the US were engaging in some new, uncalled-for and provocative form of insult.

In the predatory world of the past century and a half, it was perhaps understandable that Chinese should have come to view international relations as a ruthless competition in which the interests of weak nations like China were almost always trumped by those of the more powerful. But with China's dynamic rise and new kinds of global problems arising that beg a more interactive response, the old territorial worldview in which one nation's gain is another's loss, is not only outmoded, but counter-productive.

So, if China's future interest does, in fact, now increasingly depend on a more conciliatory, collective and less nation-centric response to problems, what source of inspiration might its leaders turn to for a course correction? As it turns out, China does have a highly-evolved philosophical conception of reciprocal relations readily available right within its own cultural tradition.

The Analects, or *Lunyu*, the classic of Confucian political philosophy which has been described by Sinologist Simon Leys as being "to Confucius what the Gospels are to Jesus," provides a virtual "roadmap" for creating and maintaining
