

Commissioner General's periodic report on World Expo Shanghai 2010

SUMMARY:

This periodic report serves as a record of major events and observations by the U.S. Commissioner General Jose H. Villarreal regarding the U.S Pavilion and U.S. presence at the Shanghai Expo.

MAJOR EVENTS:

- On April 29, 2010, the day before the opening ceremonies of World Expo Shanghai 2010, Commissioner General Villarreal and U.S. Shanghai Consul General Bea Camp hosted President Hu Jintao and Vice Premier Wang Qishan at the U.S. Pavilion. Helping host this visit were the U.S. Pavilion Student Ambassadors. The Student Ambassadors are a group of Mandarin speaking U.S. college students/recent graduates who play an integral role in how the U.S. presents itself at the World Expo.
- On April 30, simultaneously with the Expo opening ceremonies, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton hosted a celebration at the State Department commemorating the opening of World Expo. Commissioner General Villarreal, along with the Student Ambassadors, U.S. Pavilion staff members and Shanghai consulate officials, participated in this event via live video feed. U.S. Ambassador to China Jon Huntsman also joined via teleconference from the opening ceremony venue.
- On May 1, Ambassador Huntsman, joined by Commissioner General Villarreal and Consul General Camp, welcomed the first visitors to the U.S. Pavilion. A photo of the occasion was distributed worldwide. Since opening, the U.S. Pavilion has averaged more than 23,000 visitors per day. It is anticipated that by May 15, 500,000 people will have visited the U.S. Pavilion.
- On May 2, Chinese Minister of Foreign Affairs Yang Jiechi and his wife, Li Aimei, visited the
 U.S. Pavilion. In addition to Minister Yang, dozens of foreign dignitaries and VIPs have
 visited in the first twelve days. A full list is attached at the end of this report.
- On May 3, Commissioner General Villarreal and Consul General Camp officially inaugurated the U.S. Pavilion with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Highlighting the event was a swearing in of our Student Ambassadors. More than 75 Chinese and foreign media attended.
- On May 7, several of the Student Ambassadors and U.S. Pavilion staff members attended a

- concert put on by the Philadelphia Orchestra. The evening commemorated the Philadelphia Orchestra's historic concert in 1973 when, at the special request of President Nixon, they were the first U.S. ensemble to play in China.
- Commissioner General Villarreal visited the Chinese, Canadian, Mexican and Columbian
 pavilions, and plans on visiting at least ten more this month. He also attended the Tianjin
 province and Xiamen province opening ceremonies. These events resulted in discussions
 with central, provincial and municipal government officials, with all of them expressing
 appreciation and support for the United States' participation in the Expo.

VISITOR REACTION:

- The crowd reactions to the U.S. Pavilion's four presentations and Student Ambassadors are
 overwhelmingly positive. Pavilion staff members often hear positive comments, punctuated
 by clapping, laughing and photo taking. In fact, several guests have been seen trying to
 sneak into both Act One and Two for a second viewing, and using the Overture and Act Three
 spaces to take photos with the Student Ambassadors.
- In the Overture, Pavilion Staff members regularly observe positive reactions to Ambassador and Mrs. Huntsman's appearance in which they recite a classic Chinese saying. As evidenced by their laughing, the audience understands the intended humor of Overture, in which everyday Americans struggle to speak basic Mandarin. Many audience members clap when the individuals on-screen finally get it right. Interestingly, the Department of State seal in Overture is a popular backdrop for photos.
- In Act One, President Obama receives the most positive reaction. His appearance results in a flurry of camera flashes and murmurs of approval. Secretary of State Clinton also draws similar reactions from the crowd.
- With its 4-D effects, such as rain and vibrating seats, Act Two quickly establishes itself as a
 different experience from Act One. Visiting dignitaries chuckle when they see guests open
 their umbrellas to shield themselves from the mist. Audience members laugh and look
 under their seats to see what made them shake.
- In Act Three, General Electric's high-tech Body Machine draws much attention. The
 replica New York Stock Exchange backdrop, which marks the opening and closing of the
 market, is one of the most popular photo areas. The Committee of 100's "Chinese in
 America" exhibit is of particular interest to many visitors as it highlights America's diversity
 and longstanding bonds with China.
- The gift shop did very well in the first twelve days. Most notably, a week's supply of cowboy hats sold out in just the first day. The basketballs are also very popular.

MEDIA TRACTION:

• The U.S. Pavilion has leveraged the opening week to build momentum and bring awareness to the United States' strong participation in Expo 2010 Shanghai. Beginning with the May 1 Welcome Event and the May 3 Official Opening, the U.S. Pavilion has been covered extensively by Chinese and International media. A brief sampling of media statistics include:

o May 1 – May 7

U.S.: 394 stories
China: 986 stories
Other: 62 stories
Total = 1,442 stories

- Media interviews were conducted with first- tier media outlets including:
 - Foreign Media: CNN, Bloomberg TV, ABC News, CNBC, The New York Times, Forbes
 - Chinese Domestic Media: CCTV, Shanghai TV, Phoenix TV, Dragon TV, Xin Hua News, Xinmin Evening News, Wenhui Daily
- In addition to traditional media campaigns, the U.S. Pavilion has launched a comprehensive web 2.0 campaign that Sohu.com has called "one of the best" in Expo 2010 Shanghai. The strategy includes cross-promoting the U.S. Pavilion via blogging, visual media, and social media platforms. Some of the new initiatives include:
 - o The U.S. Pavilion Official Blog: Launched on May 1 blog.usapavilion2010.com.

## After the flotilla attack, it's time for a new, kinder Israeli narrative

Of the many confounding aspects of Monday's <u>flotilla fiasco</u>, one of the most curious is the monotone quality of Israel's response. Within hours of the Israeli assault on an aid ship bound for Gaza, while the dead and wounded were still being evacuated from the scene, Israel's deputy foreign minister delivered a verbal broadside that became his nation's public line: The flotilla organizers are terrorist sympathizers, they ambushed Israeli forces, and they are responsible for what followed.

Even so adept a communicator as Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu, in a prepared statement Wednesday that attacked Israel's critics as much as it defended Israel's actions, could manage only one sentence of regret for civilian casualties.

Why, even to its friends, has Israel sounded so shrill, even tone deaf? Where are the grief and sadness that Israelis ought to feel about a military operation gone awry? The French philosopher Bernard-Henri Levy expressed anger with the tendency of some Israeli leaders to believe that "they are alone in the world and will always be blamed, and to act accordingly."

Israel's friends know that the country has a case to make. But by hunkering down in self-justification, Israel has confused that case. And now the jury of world public opinion, comprising at least as many friends as foes, has stopped listening. At the United Nations, speaker after speaker condemned Israel's action, and even the United States joined in a harsh statement of condemnation. Normally pro-Israel editorial writers added to the chorus of ostracism.

Israel has long seen itself as the Alamo, a fortress under siege. Decades ago, a song titled "The Entire World is Against Us" hit the Israeli pop charts. At the time, there was some truth to the words: Arab states rejected Israel's existence. An Arab economic boycott persuaded major companies in Europe and Asia to decline to do business in Israel. Trade with many countries had to be conducted through third parties.

Indeed, Israel has faced recurring threats to its security and existence, a reality reflected in a maxim I heard often during my time as U.S. ambassador there early this decade: Israel goes to sleep with memories of the Holocaust and wakes up to the Arab-Israeli conflict. In this context, the nation's military power was seen as a necessary response. And in turn, Israel's narrative portrayed the country as a David facing an Arab Goliath.

Although the 1967 war changed this reality, Israel's narrative never really caught up. Newly demonstrated military superiority and deepening ties with the United States provided a measure of security the country had not enjoyed before. Egypt's President Anwar Sadat was the first Arab leader to recognize this new strategic reality, and in 1979, he made peace with Israel.

But even as the outdated David vs. Goliath theme lingered in the minds of many Israelis, among other segments of the population a new, religious-national narrative that centered on settling and holding all of Eretz Israel was taking hold. Even though settlements complicated Israel's relations with the Palestinians, and even though Israel had evacuated the Sinai settlements to make peace with Egypt -- a move that vitiated the argument that settlements were required for security -- activists such as Ariel Sharon continued to argue that they enhanced security.

For a while, conditions allowed this new narrative to take root: The Palestine Liberation Organization was busy attacking Israel from Jordan, Lebanon and the United Nations and pursuing a tactical moderation designed to lull Israel into complacency.

But soon this reality, too, began to change. The PLO decided in 1988 to officially support a two-state solution to the conflict and entered into dialogue with the United States. In 1991, Arab states participated in multilateral negotiations with Israel on water, the environment, economic development and regional security. Arab and Israeli business leaders met at international conferences. Israel's diplomatic isolation eased as China, India and others established formal ties, and Israeli liaison offices opened in Morocco and Arab states in the Persian Gulf. In 1994, Jordan made peace, removing the security justification for Israeli settlements in the West Bank. And in 2002, Arab states announced an "Arab peace initiative" offering peace and security in return for Israel's withdrawal from lands taken in the 1967 war.

But the Palestinian intifada put a brake on these developments, ushering in a decade of violence. As Palestinian terrorists attacked not only soldiers and settlers in the occupied territories, but also civilians in Israeli cities, the Israeli storyline of the 1950s -- David vs. Goliath -- revived.

I arrived in Israel as the U.S. ambassador in 2001, right after the first Palestinian suicide bombing, and discussed these issues often with then-Prime Minister Sharon, usually in the context of the choices Israel made in dealing with terrorism. Sharon believed that a strong and unyielding military response was all that was needed to persuade Palestinians to stop the intifada. A terrorist attack in Tel Aviv would often lead him to impose a closure on Gaza, preventing the movement of people and goods.

A typical conversation with Sharon on this subject went something as follows: I would suggest that the closure on Gaza would be seen by the media and even friendly governments as collective punishment, would shift the media's story line from Palestinian violence to Israel's reaction and could even drive Palestinians hurt by the closure into the terrorist camp. Sharon would reply that his responsibility was to protect Israelis, that the Gaza closure was designed to prevent further attacks and that the media were to blame for distorting reality.

His underlying point was clear: Any impact on Israel's image and on the long-term possibility of a widened conflict was outweighed by the need to prevent the next suicide bombing. Whatever the consequences of its actions, Israel would not apologize for defending itself.

Netanyahu would echo this refrain almost a decade later, after years marked not only by the intifada but by an Israeli decision to build a security barrier. The decade saw a brutal war in Lebanon in 2006, sparked by Hezbollah's kidnapping and killing of Israeli soldiers and ended by Israel's destruction of Lebanese civilian infrastructure and significant civilian casualties. The decade saw Hamas's election victory in 2006, its violent takeover of Gaza in 2007, its unrelenting rocket attacks against Israel in 2008 and Israel's massive response, again involving great numbers of civilian casualties and the destruction of infrastructure. By decade's end, a frustrated Israel had sealed off and blockaded Gaza to try to stem the flow of arms to Hamas, but because of the worsening humanitarian situation there, it was losing the battle for international legitimacy.

Narratives, as self-justifications, do little to explain the complexities, ironies and paradoxes of the Arab-Israeli conflict. In the early 1980s, while I was assigned to the American Embassy in Tel Aviv, I met a Palestinian nationalist figure in Gaza who was unrelentingly opposed to the Israeli occupation. He shocked me one day when he said he also admired Israel. After a near-fatal car accident in Gaza, his son had been evacuated to one of Israel's leading hospitals, where doctors saved his life. My Palestinian contact hated the Israel of the occupation, but he admired the Israel that was blind to the nationality of a boy in need of care.

When an Israeli military plan goes awry and civilians are killed -- as happened last week off the shores of Gaza -- should Israel's narrative take in the human dimension? Should it express empathy for those affected by the conflict and by Israeli military actions? Marla Braverman, an editor of Azure, an Israeli neoconservative journal, thinks not. In the current issue, she writes that despite a longtime tendency toward self-effacement, "Israel must learn to adopt a clear, unapologetic stance befitting a sovereign state."

The fact is, however, that sovereign states make mistakes, and they apologize. Sovereign states rely not only on military might and insistent rhetoric to defend their people, but also on diplomacy and values of empathy and understanding. Sovereign states can be strong while fostering a narrative of caring about the consequences of their policies.

In the aftermath of the flotilla fiasco, it is not just Israel's military tactics and its blockade of Gaza that need a thorough reexamination. Its narrative does, too. A dose of empathy might be a place to start. Israel will not break by military force and tough rhetoric alone the political and moral double standards by which the world judges its actions. But it can make its case better by tempering force with diplomacy, by caring as much about the humanitarian distress among Palestinians as it does about humanitarian causes elsewhere in the world, and by developing a storyline infused with the moral and ethical standards by which Israelis judge their own behavior.

In order to keep things moving, and as part of the 2012 budget process, I have instructed my staff to recommence their review of Department of Defense information operations and, based on the information we have been able to obtain so far, draw up a list of DoD programs that we believe may be better executed by State.
In one of my conversations with Michelle, she floated the idea of using the "shared responsibilities, pooled resources" model for a small number of trial programs, along the lines of the model proposed by Secretary Gates in December 2009 for military training activities. However, this approach will not resolve either the policy or practical arguments against continued DoD involvement in many of the activities in question.
I intend to continue personally engaging with senior DoD leadership in Washington and commanders in the field to articulate our position and encourage their support and will ask my staff to do the same at the appropriate levels. Recently, in a speech he gave at the Marshall Center, General Petraeus stated that he supported increasing State's capacity to expand our public diplomacy efforts and that he was working with me to achieve this objective.
I am leaving for London this afternoon and will be seeing Petraeus at dinner on Tuesday I'm going to Doha on Wednesday to have my meetings with al Jazeera and will also be visiting CENTCOM to be briefed on their Middle East information operations.
I'll continue to keep you posted at things move forward.

Israel as a Strategic Liability?

America's ties to Israel are not based primarily on U.S. strategic interests. At the best of times, an Israeli government that pursues the path to peace provides some intelligence, some minor advances in military technology, and a potential source of stabilizing military power that could help Arab states like Jordan. Even then, however, any actual Israeli military intervention in an Arab state could prove as destabilizing as beneficial. The fact is that the real motives behind America's commitment to Israel are moral and ethical. They are a reaction to the horrors of the Holocaust, to the entire history of Western anti-Semitism, and to the United States' failure to help German and European Jews during the period before it entered World War II. They are a product of the fact that Israel is a democracy that shares virtually all of the same values as the United States.

The U.S. commitment to Israel is not one that will be abandoned. The United States has made this repeatedly clear since it first recognized Israel as a state, and it has steadily strengthened the scale of its commitments since 1967. The United States has provided Israel with massive amounts of economic aid and still provides enough military assistance to preserve Israel's military superiority over its neighbors. The United States has made it clear that any U.S. support for Arab-Israeli peace efforts must be based on options that preserve Israel's security, and its recent announcements that it will consider "extended regional deterrence" are code words for a U.S. commitment that could guard Israel, as well as its neighbors, against an Iranian nuclear threat

At the same time, the depth of America's moral commitment does not justify or excuse actions by an Israeli government that unnecessarily make Israel a strategic liability when it should remain an asset. It does not mean that the United States should extend support to an Israeli government when that government fails to credibly pursue peace with its neighbors. It does not mean that the United States has the slightest interest in supporting Israeli settlements in the West Bank, or that the United States should take a hard-line position on Jerusalem that would effectively make it a Jewish rather than a mixed city. It does not mean that the United States should be passive when Israel makes a series of major strategic blunders--such as persisting in the strategic bombing of Lebanon during the Israeli-Hezbollah conflict, escalating its attack on Gaza long after it had achieved its key objectives, embarrassing the U.S. president by announcing the expansion of Israeli building programs in east Jerusalem at a critical moment in U.S efforts to put Israeli-Palestinian peace talks back on track, or sending commandos to seize a Turkish ship in a horribly mismanaged effort to halt the "peace flottlla" going to Gaza.

It is time Israel realized that it has obligations to the United States, as well as the United States to Israel, and that it become far more careful about the extent to which it test the limits of U.S. patience and exploits the support of American Jews. This does not mean taking a single action that undercuts Israeli security, but it does mean realizing that Israel should show enough discretion to reflect the fact that it is a tertiary U.S. strategic interest in a complex and demanding world.

Israel's government should act on the understanding that the long-term nature of the U.S.-Israel strategic relationship will depend on Israel clearly and actively seeking peace with the Palestinians—the kind of peace that is in Israel's own strategic interests. Israelis should understand that the United States opposes expansion and retention of its settlements and its efforts to push Palestinians out of greater Jerusalem. Israeli governments should plan Israeli military actions that make it clear that Israel will use force only to the level actually required, that carefully consider humanitarian issues from the start, and that have a clear post-combat plan of action to limit the political and strategic impact of its use of force. And Israel should not conduct a high-risk attack on Iran in the face of the clear U.S. "red light" from both the Bush and Obama administrations. Israel should be sensitive to the fact that its actions directly affect U.S. strategic interests in the Arab and Muslim worlds, and it must be as sensitive to U.S. strategic concerns as the United States is to those of Israel.

The United States does not need unnecessary problems in one of the most troubled parts of the world, particularly when Israeli actions take a form that does not serve Israel's own strategic interests. This Israeli government in particular needs to realize that as strong as U.S.-Israel ties may be, it is time to return to the kind of strategic realism exemplified by leaders like Yitzhak Rabin. No aspect of what happened this week off the coast of Gaza can be blamed on Israeli commandos or the Israel Defense Forces. Israel's prime minister and defense minister had full warning about the situation, and they knew the flotilla was deliberately designed as a political provocation to capture the attention of the world's media in the most negative way possible. They personally are responsible for what happened, and they need to show far more care and pragmatism in the future.

But was the raid really bungled? Did the Israeli military command and Netanyahu government have no clear strategy going in? Or was the violence they meted out against the flotilla activists deliberate and methodically planned?

Statements by senior Israeli military commanders made in the Hebrew media days before the massacre revealed that the raid was planned over a week in advance by the Israeli military and was personally approved by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Minister of Defense Ehud Barak. The elite Israeli commando unit known as Unit 13 was tasked with carrying out the mission and its role was known by the Israeli public well before the raid took place. Details of the plan show that the use of deadly force was authorized and calculated. The massacre of activists should not have been unexpected.

On May 28, three days before the raid, top Israeli military officials revealed details of their strategy to Maariv, Israel's most widely circulated paper. The caption of the Maariv article reflected the military command's plan to use force: "On the way to violence; one of the boats is on its way."

Here is a translation of relevant portions of the article:

Maariv, 5/28/10 P. 4

Title: Head to Head in the Heart of the Sea

Caption: On the way to violence; one of the boats is on its way."

Subhead: The sea encounter that will occur at the end of the weekend is already planned detail by detail. From the moment that the ships will pass the "red line" on their way to Gaza, the fighters of Unit 13 will take control and transfer 800 passengers from their boats back to where they came from And special arrest units were set up.

From the body of article: This operation was approved by Prime Minister Netanyahu and Defense Minister Barak and will be led by the commander of the Navy, Lieutenant Colonel Eliezer Maron, who is nicknamed "Cheney." If the people aboard the boats will not agree to turn around, the operation will transfer to the stage of force. "We are afraid that there will be a terror attack by the boats," said a high ranking officer. "If terrorists have gotten on the boats or if there is an intention to use hot weapons against our forces, we will use full seriousness and caution. We want to avoid using force but as soon as there will be danger to the life of our forces we will be forced to use live fire as a last resort.

After our fighters take over the boats, OKETZ unit dogs and forces of the IHLM unit corps of engineers will inspect them looking for sabotage materials and fighting tools.

A Maariv article from 5/28/10, page 4, reveals the Israeli military command's flotilla raid plan So the Israeli military broadcast its plan for violence, inciting the Israeli public and the soldiers of Unit 13 with fevered visions of a kill-or-be-killed encounter with a group of Arab "terrorists." The stated conditions for using live fire were arbitrary and poorly defined, giving the commandos little direction and lots of leeway to kill — at the very least the plan demanded force in some form.

After the initial violent stages, the plan called for the gathering of the activists' "fighting tools," an acknowledgment by the Israeli military that the activists might try to repel its commandos once they forced their way on the ships. The plan to search for "sabotage materials" also foreshadowed the IDF's post-raid propaganda campaign.

An alternative plan that would have been likely to avert violence could have been set into motion. Though Israel may be more isolated than ever as a result of the massacre, the Netanyahu administration is reaping considerable political benefits at home.

The day after the massacre, spontaneous celebrations broke out in Ashdod, Tel Aviv, and throughout the country, bringing together right-wing elements with everyday Israelis. Over a thousand Israelis gathered tonight outside the Turkish embassy in Tel Aviv to rally against the Turkish government and express their support for the raid. Multiple demonstrators including one man who has lived in Israel for 60 years told me, "What Turkey [the sponsor of the Mavi Marmara boat] has done is great. I have never seen this country more united in my entire life. We are all standing together now." (Video coming soon).

Israeli newscasters are routinely using the term "mechabel," or terrorist, to refer to the flotilla activists, while the violence that broke out on the deck of the Mavi Marmara is called "the lynch." (Nevermind that zero commandos were hung and nine activists were killed, including an American citizen <a href="http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/06/03/AR2010060301931.html?hpid=topnews">http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/06/03/AR2010060301931.html?hpid=topnews</a> who was shot in the head four times.) No evidence is required to support claims in the Israeli media. The public desperately wants to believe that its government is right, so much so that Israel's media is not even making a token effort to challenge the increasingly hysterical press releases disseminated by the IDF press office every few hours.

Hanin Zoabi, a Palestinian-Israeli member of the Knesset who was on the Mavi Marmara, was physically accosted <a href="http://www.jpost.com/Israel/Article.aspx?id=177321">http://www.jpost.com/Israel/Article.aspx?id=177321</a> in the Knesset by fellow legislators for attempting to relate her experience aboard the flotilla. MK Miri Regev of Likud called her a "traitor," while Yoel Hasson of Kadima, a supposedly centrist party, denounced Zoabi as a "terrorist." In the meantime, Israel's Interior Minster Eli Yishai is "looking into" <a href="http://www.ynetnews.com/articles/0,7340_L-3898874.00.html">http://www.ynetnews.com/articles/0,7340_L-3898874.00.html</a>> means of stripping Zoabi of her citizenship.

The Obama administration, caught between two allies during this week of crisis, has signaled Israel and Turkey that the blockade of Gaza should be loosened to allow more humanitarian aid to reach the Palestinian population there.

From the first news early Monday of the Israeli commando attack < http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/05/31/AR2010053101209.html> on a flotilla of Turkish relief ships, the White House has been trying to balance the interests of two prickly friends. The immediate aim, said a senior official, has been to "defuse the electricity of the moment" by freeing the ships' passengers and passing a U.N. resolution calling (in fuzzy language) for an investigation of the raid.

Beyond crisis management, administration officials have begun to urge Israel to use this incident to untangle the Gaza mess. U.S. officials hope Israel will take action on its own, before international condemnation grows any louder or another relief convoy tests the blockade. "The humanitarian aperture is not wide enough," argues the U.S. official. "We need to convince the Israelis that not everything can be made into a weapon."

The Obama team recognizes that Israel will act in its interests, but it wants Jerusalem to consider U.S. interests, as well. The administration has communicated at a senior level its fear that the Israelis sometimes "care about their equities, but not about ours."

This cautionary message -- that Israel must act as a more reliable and responsible partner -- may be the most important one conveyed this week.

One issue on which the administration believes Israel would benefit from a more farsighted view is the investigation of the incident. Israel has argued that this is a purely internal matter for the Israeli military, whose operations to enforce the Gaza blockade were lawful and appropriate.

But by defying calls for an international inquiry, the Israelis will compound their isolation. "They have an image problem, a perception problem," says the U.S. official. The White House hopes the Israelis will embrace some mechanism for an international probe -- perhaps a French proposal for an inquiry by the International Committee of the Red Cross. Such a move would be in Israel's interest, the administration believes.

The trickiest problem in the first hours of the crisis was dealing with Turkey <a href="http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/06/01/AR2010060103877.html">http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/06/01/AR2010060103877.html</a>, whose leaders treated the commando raid as a pirate attack on Turkish citizens. Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton and Gen. Jim Jones, the national security adviser, met with Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu Then came a lengthy phone call between President Obama and Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

Obama told Erdogan that "we need to find a solution" for the Gaza humanitarian problem, according to a U.S. official. Erdogan is said to have agreed with the president that a good relationship between Israel and Turkey was crucial for regional stability -- and that Turkey didn't want to see any further degradation.

The Obama administration deserves credit for its repair work in the first days after the Gaza attack. But this is another example where the administration has been reacting to events that it should have tried better to control. The Gaza confrontation has been developing for weeks; administration officials reportedly cautioned Israel about provocative moves <a href="http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dvn/content/article/2010/06/02/AR2010060200858.html">http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dvn/content/article/2010/06/02/AR2010060200858.html</a> , but not emphatically enough to make a difference. U.S. officials were blindsided about

the commando operation partly because they don't spy on a key ally.

Similarly, the Obama White House has been too reactive in its relationship with Turkey. A glaring example of this diplomatic drift is the Turkish mediation effort with Iran to revive an October plan for enrichment of uranium abroad. Davutoglu thought he had Obama's blessing for his shuttle diplomacy, and the White House was given frequent updates. But when Turkey and Brazil announced they had clinched the deal, the administration did the diplomatic equivalent of shrugging its shoulders -- and went ahead with plans for U.N. sanctions.

One of the perverse secrets of Middle East diplomacy is the importance of riding several horses at once. In the heyday of Henry Kissinger's shuttle mediation, the Americans were the supreme masters of playing both sides of the street.

Obama has been talking about engagement and mediation but without much to show for it. Instead, the administration has been responding to events rather than driving them. That won't do As former ambassador Chas. W. Freeman says in his collection of aphorisms, "The Diplomat's Dictionary": "If you're not at the table, you're on the menu."

Operation Make the World Hate Us
The assault on the 'Mavi Marmara' was wrong, and a gift to Israel's enemies.

Israel does not need enemies: it has itself. Or more precisely: it has its government The Netanyahu-Barak government has somehow found a way to lose the moral high ground, the all-important war for symbols and meanings, to Hamas. That is quite an accomplishment. Operation Make the World Hate Us, it might have been called.

I leave it to others to make the operational criticisms of the Israeli action, and will say only that even my amateurish understanding of the tactical challenge posed by the interdiction of the boats suffices to suggest that there were other ways to do this. I also will not pretend to a perfect grasp of what happened on board the Mavi Marmara. I have pondered the videos that both sides have released, and concluded that the Israeli soldiers sliding down that rope had no intention of attacking the people on board and that the people on board had no way of being confident of this. I cannot expect Palestinians and their supporters to believe the best about the Israeli army (This is what Israeli hardliners call "the restoration of deterrence.") I do not doubt that some of the activists on the ship welcomed a confrontation with Israel, but the Israelis should not have obliged them. In any event, what took place on that deck looks to me like a tragic misunderstanding. Yet there was no reason to think that anything else would have transpired.

The important point is that the killing of civilians on the Mavi Marmara—I understand that they were "armed" with metal bars and a knife, but still they were civilians, and soldiers are trained to respond unlethally to the recklessness of a mob—cannot be extenuated by reference to "asymmetrical warfare" and Israel's right to defend itself. This was not warfare, at least of the physical sort. Israel was not under attack. A headline in The Washington Post <a href="http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/05/31/AR2010053103445.html">http://www.washingtonpost.com/wp-dyn/content/article/2010/05/31/AR2010053103445.html</a> yesterday reported that "Israel says Free Gaza Movement poses threat to Jewish state." Such a claim is absurd. It is true that the movement has grown in recent years, and is now troublesome to Israel's policy in Gaza; and it is also true that the Turkish charity that sponsored the "Freedom Flotilla" has ties to Islamicist groups But this is hardly what Israel likes to call, in the Iranian context, and there quite plausibly, an "existential threat." The extension of the definition of a security threat to include hostile activities that have little or no bearing upon security is an ominous development.

It is also the inevitable consequence of Benjamin Netanyahu's cunning pronouncement last year that Israel is now endangered by "the Iran threat, the missile threat, and the threat I call the Goldstone threat." The equivalence was morally misleading, and therefore dangerous. Ideological warfare is not military warfare. I have studied the entirety of the Goldstone Report, and whereas I do not doubt (and wrote in this magazine <a href="http://www.tnr.com/article/75284/the-window">http://www.tnr.com/article/75284/the-window</a> in the days before Goldstone) that Operation Cast Lead caused the unjustifiable death of non-combatants, I also do not doubt that the Goldstone Report, which was nastily indifferent to Israel's security predicament and to the ethical challenges of Israeli self-defense, was an instrument in a broad campaign of delegitimation against Israel—and yet the threat of delegitimation is not like the threat of destruction. It is different in kind. A commando operation is not an appropriate response to an idea. "This was no Love Boat," Netanyahu said yesterday <a href="http://www.jpost.com/Home/Article.aspx?id=177286">http://www.jpost.com/Home/Article.aspx?id=177286</a>. "It was a hate boat." He is right, but so what? The threat of delegitimation is not a military problem and it does not have a military solution. And the attempt to give it a military solution has now had the awful consequence of making the threat still greater. The assault on the Mavi Marmara was a stupid gift to the delegitimators.

You do not have to be a general to grasp these distinctions. In fact, judging by Israel's recent history, it might help not to be one. But the militarization of the Israeli government's understanding of Israel's situation—this has been the most sterile period for diplomacy in all of Israel's history—is not all that led to the debacle at sea. Rules of military engagement that allow soldiers to fire on political activists (I leave aside the question of their humanitarianism for a moment) may signify something still deeper and even more troubling. It is hard not to conclude from this Israeli action, and also from other Israeli actions in recent years, that the Israeli leadership simply does not care any longer about what anybody

thinks. It does not seem to care about what even the United States—its only real friend, even in the choppy era of Óbama—thinks This is not defiance, it is despair. The Israeli leadership seems to have given up any expectation of fairness and sympathy from the world. It is behaving as if it believes, in the manner of the most perilous Jewish pessimism, that the whole world hates the Jews, and that is all there is to it. This is the very opposite of the measured and empirical attitude, the search for strategic opportunity, the enlistment of imagination in the service of ideals and interests, that is required for statecraft.

The complication—the one that deprives anybody who acknowledges it of membership in any of the gangs of commentary—is that there is a partial basis in the actually existing world for a degree of Israeli pessimism. There are leaders, states, organizations, and peoples whose hostility to the Jewish state is irrational and absolute and in some cases murderous. Things are said critically about Israel that wildly burst the bounds of thoughtful criticism. The language in which Israel is described by some governments and international organizations is lurid and grotesque and foul. Anti-Semitic tropes—the conspiracy theory about the Jews, most conspicuously—are regularly encountered in otherwise respectable places. The analysis of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict that absolves the Palestinians of any significant role in it is widespread. I do not see how any of this can be denied, or shunted aside, or explained entirely in terms of Israeli behavior. But it is emphatically not the whole picture, except for those Israelis and Jews whose political interests and ideological inclinations prefer it to be the whole picture. For there are forces in Israel, and in its government, that have a use for Jewish hopelessness.

There is a verse in Numbers that Jewish pessimists like to cite: "the people shall dwell alone, and not be reckoned among the nations." It is Balaam's divinely inspired description of the Israelites—Balaam, who came to curse and stayed to bless But I have always regarded it as a curse, this promise of loneliness. I have heard it intoned lachrymosely and proudly—in our time Jewish pride has a disturbingly parasitic relationship with Jewish lachrymosity—all my life. It chills me to the bone. It is a locution for prophets, not prime ministers. The Jews cannot dwell alone. In fact, their history shows that they never did dwell alone. It is not a tale of insularity and isolation. The apartness of the Jews was never a complete secession from their environment. The engagement of the Jews with the world was a matter not only of practical necessity, but also of theological conviction. And not even the darkest and most dire adversity succeeded in driving them entirely into themselves.

When, in the modern era, the Zionists concluded, quite correctly, that the Jews must extract themselves from anti-Semitic societies and establish a society of their own, a sovereign one, in the land of Israel, it was in part to "normalize" them by making them "reckoned among the nations," and therefore like other nations. Zionism was a reversal of Balaam's phony blessing. The state was not supposed to be a bunker, even if it had enemies. But Netanyahu is a creature of the bunker. He talks about peace, but not like a man who hungers for it. He takes no steps toward peace except as the consequence of a crisis—a crisis not with the Palestinians but with the Americans. He liturgically intones his warnings, some of them true, about the external dangers facing Israel, and mistakes brutishness for toughness, and offers nothing. He is a gray, muddling, reactive figure. His preferred strategy for his country is: one quiet week after another unto eternity. His problem is that there are not many quiet weeks.

But about those activists: a great deal of bathetic rubbish has been written about them. Insofar as they were bringing food and medicine to Gaza, they were humanitarians, but insofar as they were striking a blow for the government of Gaza, they were anti-humanitarians. A real "Freedom Flottlla" would have sailed for Gaza to liberate it from its rulers. For Hamas stifles Gaza from within even as Israel stifles it from without. It oppresses the Palestininans who live under its sway and has brought them min. When did it become progressive to support a theocracy? Consider the case of Henning Mankell, the Swedish writer of thrillers (and the son-in-law of Ingmar Bergman) who was a passenger on one of the boats in the "Freedom Flotilla." In his youth he took part in anti-Vietnam and anti-apartheted demonstrations, presumably in the spirit of secular reason. For a while he lived in Norway and participated in the activities of a radical Maoist party: let us call that secular unreason. Now he does the work of Hamas and its mullahs. Last year Mankell attended the Palestine Festival of Literature in east Jerusalem—or would have attended it, if the Israeli authorities had not idiotically closed it down. When he returned to Sweden, he wrote that "there is a straight line between Soweto, Sharpeville, and what recently happened [I presume he was referring to the war] in Gaza." And: "Is it strange that some [Palestinians] in pure desperation, when they cannot see any other way out, decide to become suicide bombers? Not really. Maybe it is strange that there are not more of them." And. "The state of Israel in its current form has no future. Moreover, those who advocate a two-state solution have not got it right. ... The question is whether it will be possible to talk sense into the Israelis in order for them to willingly accept the end of their own apartheid state." This man has rights, at sea and on land, but he can hardly be lauded as a champion of peace and reconciliation. You are not for co-existence if you advocate the dis

And yet the screw must be turned again: the anti-Israeli virulence of Henning Mankell and his maritime comrades does not make Israel's assault on the Mavi Marmara more just or more wise. Now the Israeli government may find it impossible not to modify or even to lift the blockade of Gaza—an outcome that no decent person can decry, as long as Hamas does not exploit the respite to acquire weapons or what it needs to make them, and the past is not encouraging in this regard. Netanyahu will do what he can to get past the mess, hoping that the approach of the midterm elections in the United States will rescue him from the pressure, and the deadening hand of the status quo will be back. And Israel will be known to more and more people—in a wounding misrepresentation—mainly for cruelty.

Nicholas D. Kristof's column could have been written by the peacemaking Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin or Israel's founder and first prime minister, David Ben-Gurion, if they were alive today.

Mr. Rabin told me shortly before he was assassinated by a right-wing Israeli extremist that Israel, while pursuing peace, must never play into the hands of Palestinian terrorists, who would try to sabotage the talks with attacks intended to provoke disproportionate retaliation. Yes, Israel would fight the terrorists, but not the Palestinian people. And it would certainly not initiate bloody conflict.

Mr. Ben-Gurion told me that Israel would regret maintaining control of Arab-inhabited regions and another people after the 1967 Six-Day War He said the war would never end as long as Israel occupied the area, an occupation he felt was both strategically and morally wrong.

And if succeeding right-wing governments had taken his advice, the war might well have been over years ago, preventing Hamas from ruling Gaza, giving Iran no excuse for threatening Israel with nuclear destruction, and making life much easier for the United States.

The Israeli assault on the pro-Palestinian flotilla is a symbolic result of the tragic survival-imperiling refutation by Israeli right-wingers of the visionary views of their country's two greatest leaders.

Re: Ideas on Israel/Turkey, etc.

These are some ideas and options you can follow or not as they seem practical. Just throwing these out:

- 1. The situation should be understood and depicted as much as a crisis in US-Turkish relations as in US-Israeli-Arab relations. Everything now done will impact on US-Turkey, which happens to be, and not incidentally, an internal NATO matter. The lever of Turkey should be shaped and used to US advantage in the Middle East now, however possible. Certainly every action should be conditioned with Turkey in mind.
- 2. The immediate crisis is not over. We are not in the aftermath. Another aid ship is due to arrive in Gaza tomorrow, June 2. How it is handled by the Israelis will be another occasion for international outrage even without an armed attack and casualties. Intercepting it will intensify any reaction. Once again, the Turks are behind the ship. The ship should be allowed to land. It should be met by the UN—and the UN, not the Israelis, should be in charge of cataloging and distributing its aid.
- 3. The US should not be in the business of reinforcing Israeli propaganda on the incident. No assistance should be provided on its public diplomacy. The US position should be a calm but insistent demand to seek the facts.
- 4. There must not be a repetition of this sort of incident—a fait accompli without informing the US yet fully expecting the US to defend the consequence even if a total fiasco. Otherwise, at best, you become Condi Rice during the last Lebanon war. Someone in authority needs to read the riot act to the Israelis. This would be a job for Richard Holbroke, but he's occupied. The Brookings boys, et al are weak, untrustworthy and have their own agendas. If Jim Jones is not up to the task, then this should fall to Joe Biden. The clean faced Michael Oren has been ubiquitous on US TV with the bald faced lie that Hamas is unelected. Biden, given extensive talking points, including on US and Israeli relations at the breaking point, should summon Oren and subject him to the full-dress Biden treatment.
- 5. The incident was a failure of US intelligence. If the US wasn't informed officially before the action, then why didn't US intelligence pick it up in adance, providing information

- that could have allowed the administration to intervene? The President should query Panetta on the failure.
- 6. The Gaza embargo is obviously wildly counterproductive, especially from the Israeli interest, though the more it fosters negative results the more fervently the Israelis reinforce it. Dear Cheryl -

In my last email (Friday, 5/28), I attached the letter from the bipartusan Co-Chairs and Executive Committee members of the Tom Lantos Human Rights Commission sent to Assistant Secretary Mike Posner expressing grave concern about the recent rise in death threats, attacks and murders of Colombian human rights defenders, religious, community and other NGO leaders. Congressman McGovern also strongly encouraged the Secretary to meet with representatives of those organizations and individuals being threatened, with a particularly effort to reach out to and invite the Bishops of Tumaco (Nariño), Barrancabermeja/Medio Magdalena (Santander), and we would now add Putumayo, since the Colombian Catholic Church just advised us yesterday of increased death threats against religious workers there. In addition, we recommended inviting Monseñor Hector Fabio Henao, director of Pastoral Social, at the Archdiocese in Bogotá, who represents all the pastoral work of the Church throughout the country, as well as representatives from the Mennonite and Lutheran churches, in particular.

While in Colombia, the most important thing the Secretary can do is avoid effusive praise for President Álvaro Uribe, who leaves office in August. Inside Colombia, the visit by the Secretary is being described as focusing solely on the free trade agreement and continuing support of the counterdrug strategy/Plan Colombia. Without changes in the human rights situation and the culture of impunity, it is unlikely that anything the Secretary might say or do will alter the equation on Capitol Hill regarding the trade agreement. It should be noted that the October 2008 GAO report on the counter-drug operations in Colombia concluded that U.S. assistance was successful in increasing security in parts of the country, but a failure in the areas of counter-narcotics (GAO-09-71), and a subsequent April 2009 USAID evaluation on U.S. aid for Plan Colombia for illegal crop reduction and Colombian counternarcotics policies actually contribute to increased coca production.

The Colombian president has been a solid backer of U.S. policy and U.S. interests in the region, and has achieved some important improvements in the country's security situation. It is important to recognize that, but to do so without repeating the tone of Defense Secretary Gates' April visit, in which he called Uribe a "great hero" <a href="http://www.defense.gov/news/newsarticle.aspx?id=58754">http://www.defense.gov/news/newsarticle.aspx?id=58754</a> and failed even to mention any concerns.

These concerns are of critical importance, and while the Secretary need not list them all, at least some deserve public acknowledgement – some recognition that it is important to the United States that Colombia, including the current government and its successor, show the necessary political will to deal with them:

A sharp rise in alleged military killings of civilians. In many cases, these are so-called "false positives": non-combatants murdered and later presented as members of armed groups killed in combat. These, notes <a href="http://www.extrajudicialexecutions.org/colombia">http://www.extrajudicialexecutions.org/colombia</a> VIN Special Rapporter for Extrajudicial Executions Philip Alston, "began occurring with a disturbing frequency across Colombia from 2004" Citing prosecutors' and NGOs' reports, Alston indicates that Colombia's security forces may have killed 1,486 civilians during the first six years of Álvaro Uribe's presidency. Alston notes that the Defense Ministry only began to address the situation after the media broke the story of the false-positives and the subsequent negative publicity and hornified public outcry.

The prosecution of "false positives" is moving with excruciating slowness. In perhaps the most notorious case – the murders of about twenty young men from the poor Bogoid suburb of Soacha – nearly all of the accused soldiers and officers have been released from prison <a href="http://www.ipsnews.net/news.asp?idnews=49968">http://www.ipsnews.net/news.asp?idnews=49968</a>>, pending trial, as deadlines for timely prosecution have run out. Since their arrest in late 2008, their case has been prolonged by numerous delaying factics by the defense, including attempts to have their cases tried in the military court system as "acts of service." Alston reports that the impunity rate on these extrajudicial murders by security forces may be as high as 98.5 percent.

Mounting allegations that the President's intelligence service, the DAS, was put at the service <a href="http://www.cipcol.org/?p=1123">http://www.cipcol.org/?p=123</a> of paramilitary leaders and narcotraffickers; used to spy on and intimidate <a href="http://www.cipcol.org/?p=752">http://www.cipcol.org/?p=752</a> Supreme Court justices, opposition politicians, journalists and human rights defenders; and employed in a campaign of sabotage and smears <a href="http://www.cipcol.org/?p=1467">http://www.cipcol.org/?p=1467</a> against political opponents.

Prosecutors are alleging that the orders to have the DAS carry out wiretaps, surveillance and "political warfare" came from high up in the Colombian presidency <a href="http://www.caracoltv.com/noticias/justicia/articulo168592-tres-asesores-de-unibe-son-investigados-chuzadas-ilegales">http://www.caracoltv.com/noticias/justicia/articulo168592-tres-asesores-de-unibe-son-investigados-chuzadas-ilegales</a>, though the question of "what President Uribe knew, and when he knew it" remains unanswered. Meanwhile efforts to reform or dissolve the DAS are stalled in Colombia's Congress

President Uribe's political coalition has also been hit by a scandal known in Colombia as "para-politics." This coalition has included dozens of political bosses from regions beyond the capital. Many are large landholders with ties to narcotrafficking, the same local leaders who created and fostered the brutal pro-government paramilitary groups that killed tens of thousands of non-combatants in the 1990s and early 2000s.

Evidence, much of it from former paramilitary leaders, has brought about 300 criminal investigations against legislators, governors, mayors and other local officials, nearly all of them Álvaro Unibe's political supporters, who made common cause with the far-right warlords. To date, of the 278 congresspeople and senators elected in 2006, 68 <a href="http://www.nuevoarcoiris.org.co/sac//q=node/64">http://www.nuevoarcoiris.org.co/sac//q=node/64</a> are under official investigation, on trial, or convicted for paramilitary ties. Those embroiled in parapolitics include the President's cousin, Mario Uribe; the brother of his former foreign minister; and individuals whom the President had named to be Colombia's ambassadors to Chile, the Dominican Republic, and Canada.

The Colombian prosecutors, investigators, witnesses and non-governmental organizations trying to uncover the truth about these abuses are working under conditions of great personal risk. They, too, are heroes and would benefit greatly from a public expression of concern about the cases they are investigating, and a reminder that their work is legitumate and important to U.S. interests in Colombia.

At the same time, it is important to avoid appearing to endorse any candidate in the June 20 runoff elections. Between the first and second rounds of a country's presidential election is a politically awkward time for a high-level official visit. Though President Uribe's former defense minister, Juan Manuel Santos, is the overwhelming favorite given his margin of success in the May 30th first round of balloting over former Dogotá mayor Antanas Mockus, it is necessary at this stage to convey a sense of balance and a willingness to work closely with whoever wins. As a result, any kind words for one candidate should be balanced by praise for the

Finally, it would be helpful to remind the Colombian people that the United States supports a peaceful resolution of Bogotá's worsening differences with Venezuela. White President Chávez's behavior is a significant concern, it would be most unhelpful to be perceived on this trip as fanning the flames of conflict with Colombia – or playing into the Chavez rhetoric that the U.S. and Colombia have military aspirations in the region.

Hope this memo, along with last week's copy of the TLHRC letter to Assistant Secretary Posner, are helpful and useful materials for the Secretary as she plans her trip.



#### Opening Statement by General David H. Petraeus To the Senate Armed Services Committee 16 June 2010

**RELEASE IN FULL** 

Mr Chairman, Senator McCain, members of the committee: thanks for the opportunity for a "redo hearing" after I demonstrated yesterday the importance of following my first Platoon Sergeant's order 35 years ago – to always stay hydrated. I'll try not to forget that again. In fact, my daughter provided me this nifty Camelbak to help me remember it!

If I could, before the questioning resumes, I'd like to ensure that my answer to questions by the Chairman and Senator McCain on July 2011 are very clear. As I noted yesterday, I did support and agree at the end of the President's decision-making process last fall with the July 2011 date described by the President as the point at which a process begins to transition security tasks to Afghan forces at a rate to be determined by conditions at the time. I also agreed with July 2011 as the date at which a responsible drawdown of the surge forces is scheduled to begin, at a rate to be determined by the conditions at the time. As I noted yesterday, I did believe there was value in sending a message of urgency - July 2011 - as well as a message of commitment - substantial additional forces. But it is important that July 2011 be seen for what it is - the date when a process begins, based on conditions, not the date when the US heads for the exits. Moreover, my agreement with the President's decisions was based on projections of conditions in July 2011. Needless to say, we will do all that is humanly possible to achieve those conditions, and we appreciate the resources provided by Congress to enable us to do that. Of course, we will also conduct rigorous assessments as we get closer to next summer - as we do periodically. in any event, to determine where adjustments in our strategy are needed. And, as July 2011 approaches, I will provide my best military advice to the Secretary and to the President on how I believe we should proceed based on the conditions at that time. Providing one's forthright advice is a sacred obligation military leaders have to our men and women in uniform, and I know that's what the RELEASE IN PART and wants his military leaders to provide as well. None

Beyond that, Mr Chairman, in response to some of your questions yesterday, I want to be very clear as well that I fully recognize the importance of Afghan Security Forces leading in operations. Indeed, the formation of the NATO Training Mission-Afghanistan, the many initiatives it is pursuing, and the vastly increased partnering ordered by General McChrystal are intended to help the Afghan forces achieve the capability to take the lead in operations. To that end, I think we should note that Afghan forces are in the lead in Kabul and in a number of other areas and missions. And they are very much in the fight throughout the country, so much so that their losses are typically several times our losses. In short, our Afghan comrades on the ground are, indeed, sacrificing enormously for their country as are, of course, our troopers and our ISAF partners.

DIANA NYAD CUBA SWIM

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY** 

At the end of July, 2010, just a month from now, I will attempt to become the first person in history to swim the 103 miles from Cuba to Florida without the aid of a shark cage.

In 1978, I swam out of Havana into a raging sea. 41hrs, 49mins later, it was not to be.

I'm 60 now This time, when I do walk up onto the Florida shore, I will send a loud message to all the millions my age that 60 is not irrelevant, that we are still strong, vital, vibrant individuals, that our best days are not by any means all behind us

For 30 years, I hadn't swum a stroke. I valued physical fitness to an extreme degree, but just hadn't swum at all for 30 years. And now this past year's training is done. It has been intense Many, many 10, 12, 15 hour swums in the Caribbean. Grueling tests of both body and spirit

But I was naive to think the training would be the tough part. I am feeling strong and confident But the government permissions for me to walk off the Cuban shore are keeping me from my Dream

I first went to the Cuban Interest Section and was told the Cubans would eagerly welcome my event. They remember my first attempt and I have been back many times for clinics and such. But they said I would definitely need to first have approval from the State Department. I was told there that it is a sensitive time politically, that both Ohama and Hilary Clinton are very much pro-embargo and it would take perhaps a year to procure State Department clearance

On advice from three lawyers from Sonnenschein in D.C., I was told that it would take a direct green light from Hilary herself to get this expedition cleared.

Because I have been styrmed by Treasury and the State Dept, I let the Cuban Interest Section permissions go so now I don't have permissions from their end, either.

I am going to make one last attempt to get this done legally by contacting Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz. Perhaps in light of a positive story vis a vis Florida Tourism....there is beautifully clean water, not far from the oil disaster ....and the heroic message of a 60-year-old swimming 100 miles and walking up onto the shores of her own country, her own home state, Congresswoman Schultz could champion the project into full legal status, from both the Cuban and the State Department sides.

CNN is the exclusive broadcast coverer of my swim. I am just tonight on the front page of CNN.com.

There will no doubt be much positive news to come from this story...and to Florida...throughout my endeavor.

I will do a 24-hour training swim off Key West the week-end of July 10-11 CNN will cover live

And then the hope is to go over to Havana on July 23 (or wait at a training camp in Key West starting on July 23) and then get the Cuba swim started whenever Mother Nature gives us a forecast of calm seas

Meeting with Benjamin Netanyahu last week, President Obama could not have been more effusive "I believe Prime Minister Netanyahu wants peace," Obama said <a href="http://www.nytimes.com/2010/07/09/world/middleeast/09mideast.html">http://www.nytimes.com/2010/07/09/world/middleeast/09mideast.html</a> "I believe he is ready to take risks for peace."

A newly revealed tape of Netanyahu in 2001, being interviewed while he thinks the cameras are off, shows him in a radically different light. In it, Netanyahu dismisses American foreign policy as easy to maneuver, boasts of having derailed the Oslo accords with political trickery, and suggests that the only way to deal with the Palestinians is to "beat them up, not once but repeatedly, beat them up so it hurts so badly, until it's unbearable" (all translations are mine).

Netanyahu is speaking to a small group of terror victims in the West Bank settlement of Ofra two years after stepping down as prime minister in 1999. He appears laid-back. After claiming that the only way to deal with the Palestinian Authority was a large-scale attack, Netanyahu was asked by one of the participants whether or not the United States would let such an attack come to fruition.

"I know what America is," Netanyahu replied. "America is a thing you can move very easily, move it in the right direction. They won't get in their way" He then called former president Bill Clinton "radically pro-Palestinian," and went on to belittle the Oslo peace accords as vulnerable to manipulation. Since the accords state that Israel would be allowed to hang on to pre-defined military zones in the West Bank, Netanyahu told his hosts that he could torpedo the accords by defining vast swaths of land as just that.

"They asked me before the election if I'd honor [the Oslo accords]," Netanyahu said. "I said I would, but ... I'm going to interpret the accords in such a way that would allow me to put an end to this galloping forward to the '67 borders. How did we do it? Nobody said what defined mulitary zones were. Defined military zones are security zones, as far as I'm concerned, the entire Jordan Valley is a defined military zone. Go argue."

Smiling, Netanyahu then recalled how he forced former U.S. Secretary of State Warren Christopher to agree to let Israel alone determine which parts of the West Bank were to be defined as military zones. "They didn't want to give me that letter," Netanyahu said, "so I didn't give them the Hebron agreement [the agreement giving Hebron back to the Palestinians]. I cut the cabinet meeting short and said, 'I'm not signing.' Only when the letter came, during that meeting, to me and to Arafat, did I ratify the Hebron agreement. Why is this important? Because from that moment on, I de facto put an end to the Oslo accords."

#### **RELEASE IN Executive Summary** PART B5,B6 Wikileaks release of Afghanistan/Pakistan-related documents 23 Jul 2010

Background: The USG has learned that Wikileaks has in its possession and intends to release publicly via its website on Sunday, July 25, 2010, tens of thousands of documents related to Afghanistan and Pakistan. The documents are believed to be both Dept. of Defense and Dept. of State originated documents and are suspected to be those compromised by PFC Manning, who has been charged and is in pretrial confinement in Kuwait awaiting possible court martial. The types of documents have been described by news organizations that reviewed them as situation reports, casualty reports, incident (SIGACT) reports, meeting notes and other internal documents. There are estimated to be as many as 90,000 documents, covering the period from Jan 2004 to Dec 2009.

Wikileaks' publication of the documents is expected to occur during the afternoon (EDT) of July 25. Wikileaks purportedly showed some number of the documents to news organizations, including The New York Times and Der Spiegel. The Times and Der Spiegel may be partnering to publish stories related to the Wikileak documents on Sunday evening (July 25) and Monday morning (July 26) – web and print respectively.

Representatives of the NYT have described to USG officials the nature of some documents as casting US-Pakistani relations in an unfavorable light, particularly with respect to the ISI. The ISI is allegedly described as continuing to support AQ, the Haqqani network and Taliban (Quetta Shura) in opposition to US and Afghan interests. The documents allegedly do not provide "blockbuster" revelations but instead present a richness of detail previously not known or released and a damning portrait of US - Pakistani relations sustained over several years. The documents related to Afghanistan portray day-to-day activities there through combat operations, incidents and accidents and casualty events, both civilian and military.

## **Draft Statement by DoD Senior Leaders**

RELEASE IN FULL

The release these classified documents is a serious and potentially damaging act that this Department strongly condemns.

The disclosed documents detail military activities between January 2004 and December 2009. I want to make clear that they represent an incomplete snapshot in time, and they are not representative of current efforts and progress in the war in Afghanistan and in our relationship with Pakistan.

The disclosure of classified information by individuals and organizations puts the lives of the U.S. and partner service members at risk and threatens our national security. So again, we strongly denounce the release of these documents because ultimately, it makes it more difficult for this Department to protect and defend our nation.

# **Talking Points**

It would be off the mark to focus on the past at the expense of understanding the present:

- We have a new integrated strategy that takes into consideration the interrelated regional factors influencing Afghanistan and Pakistan.
- We have a new commander who brings a wealth of experience to our mission in Afghanistan.
- The tireless efforts of the Afghan National Security Forces and the National Directorate of Security resulted in the safety of the largest ever gathering of foreign leaders in Kabul on July 19th, when the Government of Afghanistan's reaffirmed its commitment to taking full authority over its own security in 2014.
- Additional U.S. and Allied forces continue to flow into Afghanistan to provide security for the population and to train with the security forces, as well as to provide critical assistance to improving governance and development. In addition to now partnering with about 60% of Afghan units, these forces have allowed us to confront the Taliban in ways and in areas never reached before, and increasingly to separate them from the population.

- Since last November, recruiting and retention have improved, such that over 42,000 Afghans have joined their security forces and received training, and an additional 80,000 will join the ranks in the next 15 months to become over 305,000 strong.
- Even as we begin to transition security responsibility to Afghans over the next year, we will sustain a robust commitment in Afghanistan going forward. We will partner with the Afghan people for the long term - toward a future of greater security, prosperity, justice, and progress.
- We have said repeatedly how hard this effort is going to be, and that progress will be slow and deliberate. But in places like Marja and elsewhere, polls tell us that the Afghan people see themselves as more secure than they were one year ago.
- To accomplish our mission to disrupt, dismantle, defeat and destroy al Qaeda and its extremist allies, we will continue to deny them safe haven by strengthening the capacity of the Afghan security forces and the Afghan government. To that end, we also are working side-by-side with our Pakistani partners.

## AGOA Forum

The 2010 forum will center on the theme: "AGOA at 10: New Strategies for a Changing World." The ministerial sessions of the forum will be in Washington, D.C. at the Ronald Reagan Building August 2-3. In a departure from past years, follow-on sessions, focusing on boosting trade connections between Americans and Africans, will be held in Kansas City, Missouri, August 4-6. The forum will focus on possible upcoming changes to U.S. preference programs, the importance of African countries developing stronger intra-regional trade, and how entrepreneurs, especially women, can help grow Africa's economy. The forum is an opportunity to highlight U.S. initiatives that demonstrate our sustained engagement with Africa, including the Global Hunger and Food Security Initiative (Feed the Future), Global Health Initiative, Millennium Challenge Corporation, and USAID programs for economic growth and poverty alleviation.

In Washington, the forum will consist of ministerial-level plenary sessions that highlight critical policy issues in health, education, agriculture, and trade. The plenaries will be co-chaired by officials from the United States and participating African nations. In Kansas City, the sessions will include matching African and American businesspeople as well as visits to local companies and the Kansas City Board of Trade. With the help of Special Representative Reta Jo Lewis and her staff, there will be broad participation by state and local elected officials. In addition, the AGOA legislation encourages private sector and civil society groups to host related meetings in conjunction with the forum. These meetings are scheduled for the week prior to the AGOA Forum, beginning July 28. The AGOA Forum will include a number of representational events: a reception and luncheon in Washington and two breakfasts, a lunch and a reception hosted by the Kauffman Foundation in Kansas City.

#### The President's Participation

• The President will not attend the AGOA Forum but has agreed to host the African ministers at the Eisenhower Executive Office Building on Tuesday, August 3. The meeting is now tentatively scheduled to begin at 5:05 p.m., when the President will speak for approximately five minutes and then shake hands and mingle with his guests.

# Your Participation

- You are scheduled to address the AGOA Forum from 3:30-3:45 p.m. on Tuesday, August 3. Your remarks will highlight the progress of AGOA, the future of U.S.-African trade, women's empowerment, and the critical importance of intra-Africa trade to drive growth and expand opportunities.
- Just prior to your remarks at the plenary, you briefly will meet and take a photo with the 35 women entrepreneurs in the African Women's Entrepreneurship Program (AWEP). The program was coordinated between AF, EEB, and the Department's International Visitor Leadership Program. AWEP is taking place in Washington July 26-August 3 and in Kansas City August 4-6. Program participants will participate in meetings and networking opportunities with U.S. policy makers, companies and industry associations. The women will interact with ministers of trade, finance, and agriculture in the AGOA plenary session entitled "Integrating Africa's Women into the Global Economy," scheduled for Tuesday, August 3.

# The President's Forum with Young African Leaders

The President's Forum with Young African Leaders, scheduled for August 3-5, will convene a broad cross-section of Africa's next generation of leaders. Selected by U.S. missions throughout sub-Saharan Africa, the approximately 120 young leaders are all potential catalysts for change and growth in their societies. They come from a range of professions and disciplines – law and business, social action and human rights advocacy, family health, and publishing. The two-and-one-half day forum, with complementary partner events, will enable us to hold an intensive dialogue with these young leaders about their vision for the future.

The forum is premised on the idea that the United States can be a stronger partner to Africa if we start building better relationships with next-generation

leaders and deepen our strategic outlook. It should serve as a springboard to catalyze new thinking in American policymaking and private sector circles about change and growth in sub-Saharan African states. Technology and new media are being utilized in the lead-up, during, and after the forum to leverage participation, harness voices, and extend opportunities created by the forum. There is planning for a vigorous follow-up program on the continent.

#### The President's Participation

• The President will host a town hall with the leaders on August 3. The President will lead a discussion focused on the outlook for Africa's next 50 years, discussing with participants their aspirations for change.

With a victory like this...

The direct negotiations between Israel and the Palestinians have preconditions - dictated by Israel.

Two years ago, a basketball tournament was held at Tel Aviv University with the participation of student teams from 14 countries, including a Palestinian team from the occupied territories. The games were purportedly held "without preconditions," and every team put its best players on the court and aimed to win.

But unsurprisingly, the Shin Ben security service permitted only seven Palestinian players, including bench players, to enter Israel. Some of the key players on the team were compelled to stay at home. After several losses (by 30 to 40 points), when it was the Palestinians' turn to face a team from one of the Israeli colleges, their coach announced that he had decided to spare his players another humiliation, and requested that the game be canceled.

The illuminating movie "Friendship Games," to be shown tonight on the Yes Docu channel (directed by Ram Levy, along with Ibtisam Mara'ana, Duki Dror and Yoav Shamir), documents the tournament, which was the initiative of Ed Peskowitz, an American Jew and co-owner of the Atlanta Hawks basketball team in the NBA. The camera follows the Israeli coach to the Palestinian locker room. After a long while, he tells his players that in order to even out the teams, two of them will join the other side. He tells two of the Israeli bench players, including one known as Fatso, to don the shirts of the Palestinian team. The game ends with a decisive victory for the Israeli team and a strong sense of missed opportunity.

The direct negotiations between Israel and the Palestinians, like the basketball game, have preconditions. Not the conditions demanded

by the Palestinians, but conditions dictated by Israel. The refusal to freeze Israeli building in East Jerusalem is a precondition, just like the demand to freeze it. The refusal to resume negotiations from the point where talks between the previous prime minister, Ehud Olmert, and Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas left off after the Annapolis conference is no less a precondition than the demand to resume talks from square one.

The head referee, the president of the United States, has twisted the arms of his colleagues in the Quartet and is dragging Abbas to Washington. Barack Obama decided that the negotiations will be held without any commitment regarding building in East Jerusalem, and will be opened without even a declaration of principles stating that the talks will be held on the basis of a general formula, like peace and security for Israel and a state along the 1967 borders for the Palestinians. It's time to jump into the fountain in Rabin Square and cheer: The Palestinians have been shafted!

If Benjamin Netanyahu's aim is to play around as much as possible with the ball, and sometimes kick the opponent, then he can really chalk up another victory. But Israel's success in the negotiations, like the success of the student team in the tournament, is not measured by the terms "victory" or "defeat." What is victory over a weak Palestinian team worth, if it was won in friendly games that ended with virtually no interaction between the participants? What is a political process with the Palestinians worth if it erodes Abbas' standing and leads nowhere?

What have we to gain from humiliating our partner before his constituency on the way to the negotiating table? If Israel's approach on every one of the core issues is that winning is everything, there's no point in bothering so many VIPs with another unnecessary summit. Let's assume that we'll succeed, with the help of the Jewish power around Obama, to twist Abbas' arm some more and extract, for example, an agreement in which he concedes sovereignty over the Temple Mount. How many hours would such an agreement last?

All we need is a few more "victories" like the invitation to the launch of direct negotiations, "without preconditions," and we'll lose our last partners to a settlement that will prevent Israel from turning into an apartheid state or a Palestinian state (the binational model is a nightmare, as far as I'm concerned).

What will we do if Abbas announces that he's had enough of losing in purportedly friendly games, and that he's decided the time has come to step down? Will we declare another victory and invite Hamas leader Khaled Meshal and Iranian president Mahmoud Ahmadinejad to the party?

David H. Koch in 1996. He and his brother Charles are lifelong libertarians and

have quietly given more than a hundred million dollars to right-wing causes.

On May 17th, a black-tie audience at the Metropolitan Opera House applauded as a

tall, jovial-looking billionaire took the stage. It was the seventieth annual

spring gala of American Ballet Theatre, and David H. Koch was being celebrated

for his generosity as a member of the board of trustees, he had recently donated

\$2.5 million toward the company's upcoming season, and had given many millions

before that. Koch received an award while flanked by two of the gala's

co-chairs, Blaine Trump, in a peach-colored gown, and Caroline Kennedy

Schlossberg, in emerald green. Kennedy's mother, Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, had

been a patron of the ballet and, coincidentally, the previous owner of a Fifth

Avenue apartment that Koch had bought, in 1995, and then sold, eleven years

later, for thirty-two million dollars, having found it too small.

The gala marked the social ascent of Koch, who, at the age of seventy, has

become one of the city's most prominent philanthropists. In 2008, he donated a

hundred million dollars to modernize Lincoln Center's New York State Theatre

building, which now bears his name. He has given twenty million to the American

Museum of Natural History, whose dinosaur wing is named for him. This spring,

after noticing the decrepit state of the fountains outside the Metropolitan

Museum of Art, Koch pledged at least ten million dollars for their renovation

He is a trustee of the museum, perhaps the most coveted social prize in the

city, and serves on the board of Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, where,

after he donated more than forty million dollars, an endowed chair and a

research center were named for him.

One dignitary was conspicuously absent from the gala: the event's third honorary

co-chair, Michelle Obama. Her office said that a scheduling conflict had

prevented her from attending. Yet had the First Lady shared the stage with Koch

it might have created an awkward tableau. In Washington, Koch is best known as

part of a family that has repeatedly funded stealth attacks on the federal

government, and on the Obama Administration in particular.

With his brother Charles, who is seventy-four, David Koch owns virtually all of

Koch Industries, a conglomerate, headquartered in Wichita, Kansas, whose annual

revenues are estimated to be a hundred billion dollars. The company has grown

spectacularly since their father, Fred, died, in 1967, and the brothers took

charge. The Kochs operate oil refineries in Alaska, Texas, and Minnesota, and

control some four thousand miles of pipeline. Koch Industries owns Brawny paper towels, Dixie cups, Georgia-Pacific lumber, Stainmaster carpet, and Lycra, among other products. Forbes ranks it as the second-largest private company in the country, after Cargill, and its consistent profitability has made David and Charles Koch—who, years ago, bought out two other brothers—among the richest men in America. Their combined fortune of thirty-five billion dollars is exceeded only by those of Bill Gates and Warren Buffett.

The Kochs are longtime libertarians who believe in drastically lower personal and corporate taxes, minimal social services for the needy, and much less oversight of industry—especially environmental regulation. These views dovetail with the brothers' corporate interests. In a study released this spring, the University of Massachusetts at Amherst's Political Economy Research Institute named Koch Industries one of the top ten air polluters in the United States. And Greenpeace issued a report identifying the company as a "kingpin of climate science denial." The report showed that, from 2005 to 2008, the Kochs vastly outdid ExxonMobil in giving money to organizations fighting legislation related to climate change, underwriting a huge network of foundations, think tanks, and political front groups. Indeed, the brothers have funded opposition campaigns against so many Obama Administration policies—from health-care reform to the

economic-stimulus program—that, in political circles, their ideological network

is known as the Kochtopus.

In a statement, Koch Industries said that the Greenpeace report "distorts the environmental record of our companies." And David Koch, in a recent, admiring article about him in New York, protested that the "radical press" had turned his family into "whipping boys," and had exaggerated its influence on American politics. But Charles Lewis, the founder of the Center for Public Integrity, a nonpartisan watchdog group, said, "The Kochs are on a whole different level. There's no one else who has spent this much money. The sheer dimension of it is what sets them apart They have a pattern of lawbreaking, political manipulation, and obfuscation I've been in Washington since Watergate, and I've never seen anything like it. They are the Standard Oil of our times." few weeks after the Lincoln Center gala, the advocacy wing of the Americans for Prosperity Foundation—an organization that David Koch started, in 2004—held a different kind of gathering. Over the July 4th weekend, a summit called Texas Defending the American Dream took place in a chilly hotel ballroom in Austin. Though Koch freely promotes his philanthropic ventures, he did not attend the

summit, and his name was not in evidence. And on this occasion the audience was

roused not by a dance performance but by a series of speakers denouncing

President Barack Obama. Peggy Venable, the organizer of the summit, warned that

Administration officials "have a socialist vision for this country."

Five hundred people attended the summit, which served, in part, as a training

session for Tea Party activists in Texas. An advertisement cast the event as a

populist uprising against vested corporate power. "Today, the voices of average

Americans are being drowned out by lobbyists and special interests," it said.

"But you can do something about it." The pitch made no mention of its corporate

funders. The White House has expressed frustration that such sponsors have

largely eluded public notice David Axelrod, Obama's senior adviser, said, "What

they don't say is that, in part, this is a grassroots citizens' movement brought

to you by a bunch of oil billionaires."

In April, 2009, Melissa Cohlmia, a company spokesperson, denied that the Kochs

had direct links to the Tea Party, saying that Americans for Prosperity is "an

independent organization and Koch companies do not in any way direct their

activities." Later, she issued a statement: "No funding has been provided by

Koch companies, the Koch foundations, or Charles Koch or David Koch specifically

to support the tea parties." David Koch told New York, "I've never been to a

tea-party event. No one representing the tea party has ever even approached me."

At the lectern in Austin, however, Venable—a longtime political operative who draws a salary from Americans for Prosperity, and who has worked for Koch-funded political groups since 1994—spoke less warily. "We love what the Tea Parties are doing, because that's how we're going to take back America!" she declared, as the crowd cheered. In a subsequent interview, she described herself as an early member of the movement, joking, "I was part of the Tea Party before it was cool!" She explained that the role of Americans for Prosperity was to help "educate" Tea Party activists on policy details, and to give them "next-step training" after their rallies, so that their political energy could be channelled "more effectively." And she noted that Americans for Prosperity had provided Tea Party activists with lists of elected officials to target. She said of the Kochs, "They're certainly our people. David's the chairman of our board I've certainly met with them, and I'm very appreciative of what they do." Venable honored several Tea Party "citizen leaders" at the summit: The Texas branch of Americans for Prosperity gave its Blogger of the Year Award to a young woman named Sibyl West. On June 14th, West, writing on her site, described Obama as the "cokehead in chief." In an online thread, West speculated that the President was exhibiting symptoms of "demonic possession (aka schizophrenia,

etc.)." The summit featured several paid speakers, including Janine Turner, the actress best known for her role on the television series "Northern Exposure."

She declared, "They don't want our children to know about their rights. They don't want our children to know about a God!"

During a catered lunch, Venable introduced Ted Cruz, a former solicitor general of Texas, who told the crowd that Obama was "the most radical President ever to occupy the Oval Office," and had hidden from voters a secret agenda—"the government taking over our economy and our lives." Countering Obama, Cruz proclaimed, was "the epic fight of our generation!" As the crowd rose to its feet and cheered, he quoted the defiant words of a Texan at the Alamo: "Victory, or death!"

Americans for Prosperity has worked closely with the Tea Party since the movement's inception. In the weeks before the first Tax Day protests, in April,

2009, Americans for Prosperity hosted a Web site offering supporters "Tea Party

Talking Points." The Arizona branch urged people to send tea bags to Obama; the Missouri branch urged members to sign up for "Taxpayer Tea Party Registration" and provided directions to nine protests. The group continues to stoke the rebellion. The North Carolina branch recently launched a "Tea Party Finder" Web site, advertised as "a hub for all the Tea Parties in North Carolina."

The anti-government fervor infusing the 2010 elections represents a political triumph for the Kochs By giving money to "educate," fund, and organize Tea Party protesters, they have helped turn their private agenda into a mass movement. Bruce Bartlett, a conservative economist and a historian, who once worked at the National Center for Policy Analysis, a Dallas-based think tank that the Kochs fund, said, "The problem with the whole libertarian movement is that it's been all chiefs and no Indians. There haven't been any actual people, like voters, who give a crap about it. So the problem for the Kochs has been trying to create a movement." With the emergence of the Tea Party, he said, "everyone suddenly sees that for the first time there are Indians out there—people who can provide real ideological power." The Kochs, he said, are "trying to shape and control and channel the populist uprising into their own policies.'

A Republican campaign consultant who has done research on behalf of Charles and David Koch said of the Tea Party, "The Koch brothers gave the money that founded it. It's like they put the seeds in the ground. Then the rainstorm comes, and the frogs come out of the mud—and they're our candidates!"

The Kochs and their political operatives declined requests for interviews.

Instead, a prominent New York public-relations executive who is close with the

Kochs put forward two friends: George Pataki, the former governor of New York,

and Mortimer Zuckerman, the publisher and real-estate magnate. Pataki, a

Republican who received campaign donations from David Koch, called him "a

patriot who cares deeply about his country." Zuckerman praised David's "gentle

decency" and the "range of his public interests."

The Republican campaign consultant said of the family's political activities,

"To call them under the radar is an understatement. They are underground!"

Another former Koch adviser said, "They're smart. This right-wing, redneck stuff

works for them. They see this as a way to get things done without getting dirty

themselves." Rob Stein, a Democratic political strategist who has studied the

conservative movement's finances, said that the Kochs are "at the epicenter of

the anti-Obama movement. But it's not just about Obama. They would have done the

same to Hillary Clinton. They did the same with Bill Clinton. They are out to

destroy progressivism."

ddly enough, the fiercely capitalist Koch family owes part of its fortune to

Joseph Stalin. Fred Koch was the son of a Dutch printer who settled in Texas and

ran a weekly newspaper. Fred attended M.I.T., where he earned a degree in

chemical engineering. In 1927, he invented a more efficient process for

converting oil into gasoline, but, according to family lore, America's major oil companies regarded him as a threat and shut him out of the industry. Unable to succeed at home, Koch found work in the Soviet Union. In the nineteen-thirties, his company trained Bolshevik engineers and helped Stalin's regime set up fifteen modern oil refineries. Over time, however, Stalin brutally purged several of Koch's Soviet colleagues. Koch was deeply affected by the experience, and regretted his collaboration. He returned to the U.S. In the headquarters of his company, Rock Island Oil & Refining, in Wichita, he kept photographs aimed at proving that some of those Soviet refineries had been destroyed in the Second World War. Gus diZerega, a former friend of Charles Koch, recalled, "As the Soviets became a stronger military power, Fred felt a certain amount of guilt at having helped build them up. I think it bothered him a lot." In 1958, Fred Koch became one of the original members of the John Birch Society, the arch-conservative group known, in part, for a highly skeptical view of governance and for spreading fears of a Communist takeover. Members considered President Dwight D. Eisenhower to be a Communist agent. In a self-published broadside, Koch claimed that "the Communists have infiltrated both the Democrat

and Republican Parties." He wrote admiringly of Benito Mussolini's suppression

of Communists in Italy, and disparagingly of the American civil-rights movement.

"The colored man looms large in the Communist plan to take over America," he warned. Welfare was a secret plot to attract rural blacks to cities, where they would foment "a vicious race war." In a 1963 speech that prefigures the Tea

Party's talk of a secret socialist plot, Koch predicted that Communists would

"infiltrate the highest offices of government in the U.S. until the President is
a Communist, unknown to the rest of us."

Koch married Mary Robinson, the daughter of a Missouri physician, and they had four sons: Freddie, Charles, and twins, David and William. John Damgard, the president of the Futures Industry Association, was David's schoolmate and friend. He recalled that Fred Koch was "a real John Wayne type." Koch emphasized rugged pursuits, taking his sons big-game hunting in Africa, and requiring them to do farm labor at the family ranch. The Kochs lived in a stone mansion on a large compound across from Wichita's country club; in the summer, the boys could hear their friends splashing in the pool, but they were not allowed to join them. "By instilling a work ethic in me at an early age, my father did me a big favor, although it didn't seem like a favor back then," Charles has written. "By the time I was eight, he made sure work occupied most of my spare time." David Koch recalled that his father also indoctrinated the boys politically. "He was

constantly speaking to us children about what was wrong with government," he told Brian Doherty, an editor of the libertarian magazine Reason, and the author of "Radicals for Capitalism," a 2007 history of the libertarian movement. "It's something I grew up with—a fundamental point of view that big government was bad, and imposition of government controls on our lives and economic fortunes was not good."

David attended Deerfield Academy, in Massachusetts, and Charles was sent to military school. Charles, David, and William all earned engineering degrees at their father's alma mater, M.I.T., and later joined the family company. Charles eventually assumed control, with David as his deputy; William's career at the company was less successful. Freddie went to Harvard and studied playwriting at the Yale School of Drama. His father reportedly disapproved of him, and punished him financially. (Freddie, through a spokesperson, denied this.) In 1967, after Fred Koch died, of a heart attack, Charles renamed the business Koch Industries, in honor of his father. Fred Koch's will made his sons extraordinarily wealthy. David Koch joked about his good fortune in a 2003 speech to alumni at Deerfield, where, after pledging twenty-five million dollars, he was made the school's sole "lifetime trustee." He said, "You might

ask. How does David Koch happen to have the wealth to be so generous? Well, let me tell you a story. It all started when I was a little boy. One day, my father gave me an apple. I soon sold it for five dollars and bought two apples and sold them for ten. Then I bought four apples and sold them for twenty. Well, this went on day after day, week after week, month after month, year after year, until my father died and left me three hundred million dollars!" David and Charles had absorbed their father's conservative politics, but they did not share all his views, according to diZerega, who befriended Charles in the mid-sixties, after meeting him while browsing in a John Birch Society bookstore in Wichita. Charles eventually invited him to the Kochs' mansion, to participate in an informal political-discussion group. "It was pretty clear that Charles thought some of the Birch Society was bullshit," diZerega recalled DiZerega, who has lost touch with Charles, eventually abandoned right-wing views, and became a political-science professor. He credits Charles with opening his mind to political philosophy, which set him on the path to academia; Charles is one of three people to whom he dedicated his first book But diZerega believes that the Koch brothers have followed a wayward intellectual trajectory, transferring their father's paranoia about Soviet Communism to a distrust of the U.S. government, and seeing its expansion, beginning with the New Deal, as a

tyrannical threat to freedom. In an essay, posted on Beliefnet, diZerega writes,

"As state socialism failed ... the target for many within these organizations shifted to any kind of regulation at all. 'Socialism' kept being defined downwards."

Members of the John Birch Society developed an interest in a school of Austrian economists who promoted free-market ideals. Charles and David Koch were particularly influenced by the work of Friedrich von Hayek, the author of "The Road to Serfdom" (1944), which argued that centralized government planning led, inexorably, to totalitarianism. Hayek's belief in unfettered capitalism has proved inspirational to many conservatives, and to anti-Soviet dissidents; lately, Tea Party supporters have championed his work. In June, the talk-radio host Glenn Beck, who has supported the Tea Party rebellion, promoted "The Road to Serfdom" on his show, the paperback soon became a No 1 best-seller on Amazon. (Beck appears to be a fan of the Kochs; in the midst of a recent on-air parody of Al Gore, Beck said, without explanation, "I want to thank Charles Koch for this information." Beck declined to elaborate on the relationship.) Charles and David also became devotees of a more radical thinker, Robert LeFevre, who favored the abolition of the state but didn't like the label

"anarchist"; he called himself an "autarchist." LeFevre liked to say that "government is a disease masquerading as its own cure." In 1956, he opened an institution called the Freedom School, in Colorado Springs. Brian Doherty, of Reason, told me that "LeFevre was an anarchist figure who won Charles's heart," and that the school was "a tiny world of people who thought the New Deal was a horrible mistake." According to diZerega, Charles supported the school financially, and even gave him money to take classes there. Throughout the seventies, Charles and David continued to build Koch Industries. In 1980, William, with assistance from Freddie, attempted to take over the company from Charles, who, they felt, had assumed autocratic control In retaliation, the company's board, which answered to Charles, fired William. ("Charles runs it all with an iron hand," Bruce Bartlett, the economist, told me.) Lawsuits were filed, with William and Freddie on one side and Charles and

me.) Lawsuits were filed, with William and Freddie on one side and Charles and David on the other. In 1983, Charles and David bought out their brothers' share in the company for nearly a billion dollars. But the antagonism remained, and (litigation continued for seventeen more years, with the brothers hiring rival private investigators, in 1990, they walked past one another with stony expressions at their mother's funeral. Eventually, Freddie moved to Monaco, which has no income tax. He bought historic estates in France, Austria, and

elsewhere, filling them with art, antiques, opera scores, and literary

manuscripts. William founded his own energy company, Oxbow, and turned to

yachting, he spent an estimated sixty-five million dollars to win the America's

Cup, in 1992.

With Charles as the undisputed chairman and C.E.O., Koch Industries expanded

rapidly. Roger Altman, who heads the investment-banking firm Evercore, told me

that the company's performance has been "beyond phenomenal." Charles remained in

Wichita, with his wife and two children, guarding his privacy while supporting

community charities. David moved to New York City, where he is an executive

vice-president of the company and the C.E.O. of its Chemical Technology Group. A

financial expert who knows Koch Industries well told me, "Charles is the

company. Charles runs it." David, described by associates as "affable" and "a

bit of a lunk," enjoyed for years the life of a wealthy bachelor. He rented a

yacht in the South of France and bought a waterfront home in Southampton, where

he threw parties that the Web site New York Social Diary likened to an "East

Coast version of Hugh Hefner's soirées." In 1996, he married Julia Flesher, a

fashion assistant. They live in a nine-thousand-square-foot duplex at 740 Park

Avenue, with their three children. Though David's manner is more cosmopolitan,

and more genial, than that of Charles, Brian Doherty, who has interviewed both

brothers, couldn't think of a single issue on which the brothers disagreed.

As their fortunes grew, Charles and David Koch became the primary underwriters

of hard-line libertarian politics in America. Charles's goal, as Doherty

described it, was to tear the government "out at the root." The brothers' first

major public step came in 1979, when Charles persuaded David, then thirty-nine,

to run for public office. They had become supporters of the Libertarian Party,

and were backing its Presidential candidate, Ed Clark, who was running against

Ronald Reagan from the right. Frustrated by the legal limits on campaign

donations, they contrived to place David on the ticket, in the Vice-Presidential

slot, upon becoming a candidate, he could lavish as much of his personal fortune

as he wished on the campaign. The ticket's slogan was "The Libertarian Party has

only one source of funds: You." In fact, its primary source of funds was David

Koch, who spent more than two million dollars on the effort.

Many of the ideas propounded in the 1980 campaign presaged the Tea Party

movement. Ed Clark told The Nation that libertarians were getting ready to stage

"a very big tea party," because people were "sick to death" of taxes. The

Libertarian Party platform called for the abolition of the F.B.I. and the

C.I.A., as well as of federal regulatory agencies, such as the Securities and

Exchange Commission and the Department of Energy. The Party wanted to end Social

Security, minimum-wage laws, gun control, and all personal and corporate income

taxes, it proposed the legalization of prostitution, recreational drugs, and

suicide. Government should be reduced to only one function: the protection of

individual rights. William F. Buckley, Jr., a more traditional conservative,

called the movement "Anarcho-Totalitarianism."

That November, the Libertarian ticket received only one per cent of the vote.

The brothers realized that their brand of politics didn't sell at the ballot

box. Charles Koch became openly scornful of conventional politics. "It tends to

be a nasty, corrupting business," he told a reporter at the time. "I'm

interested in advancing libertarian ideas." According to Doherty's book, the

Kochs came to regard elected politicians as merely "actors playing out a

script." A longtime confidant of the Kochs told Doherty that the brothers wanted

to "supply the themes and words for the scripts." In order to alter the

direction of America, they had to "influence the areas where policy ideas

percolate from: academia and think tanks."

fter the 1980 election, Charles and David Koch receded from the public arena.

But they poured more than a hundred million dollars into dozens of seemingly

family foundations gave money to thirty-four political and policy organizations, three of which they founded, and several of which they direct. The Kochs and their company have given additional millions to political campaigns, advocacy groups, and lobbyists. The family's subterranean financial role has fuelled suspicion on the left; Lee Fang, of the liberal blog ThinkProgress, has called the Kochs "the billionaires behind the hate."

Only the Kochs know precisely how much they have spent on politics. Public tax records show that between 1998 and 2008 the Charles G. Koch Charitable Foundation spent more than forty-eight million dollars. The Claude R. Lambe Charitable Foundation, which is controlled by Charles Koch and his wife, along with two company employees and an accountant, spent more than twenty-eight million. The David H. Koch Charitable Foundation spent more than a hundred and twenty million. Meanwhile, since 1998 Koch Industries has spent more than fifty million dollars on lobbying. Separately, the company's political-action committee, KochPAC, has donated some eight million dollars to political campaigns, more than eighty per cent of it to Republicans. So far in 2010, Koch Industries leads all other energy companies in political contributions, as it has since 2006. In addition, during the past dozen years the Kochs and other

family members have personally spent more than two million dollars on political contributions. In the second quarter of 2010, David Koch was the biggest individual contributor to the Republican Governors Association, with a million-dollar donation. Other gifts by the Kochs may be untraceable, federal tax law permits anonymous personal donations to politically active nonprofit groups.

In recent decades, members of several industrial dynasties have spent parts of their fortunes on a conservative agenda. In the nineteen-eighties, the Olin family, which owns a chemicals-and-manufacturing conglomerate, became known for funding right-leaning thinking in academia, particularly in law schools. And during the nineties Richard Mellon Scaife, a descendant of Andrew Mellon, spent millions attempting to discredit President Bill Clinton. Ari Rabin-Havt, a vice-president at the Democratic-leaning Web site Media Matters, said that the Kochs' effort is unusual, in its marshalling of corporate and personal funds: "Their role, in terms of financial commitments, is staggering."

much as a hundred million dollars a year in America. Soros has also made

generous private contributions to various Democratic campaigns, including Obama's. But Michael Vachon, his spokesman, argued that Soros's giving is transparent, and that "none of his contributions are in the service of his own economic interests." The Kochs have given millions of dollars to nonprofit groups that criticize environmental regulation and support lower taxes for industry. Gus diZerega, the former friend, suggested that the Kochs' youthful idealism about libertarianism had largely devolved into a rationale for corporate self-interest. He said of Charles, "Perhaps he has confused making money with freedom."

Some critics have suggested that the Kochs' approach has subverted the purpose of tax-exempt giving. By law, charitable foundations must conduct exclusively nonpartisan activities that promote the public welfare. A 2004 report by the National Committee for Responsive Philanthropy, a watchdog group, described the Kochs' foundations as being self-serving, concluding, "These foundations give money to nonprofit organizations that do research and advocacy on issues that impact the profit margin of Koch Industries."

The Kochs have gone well beyond their immediate self-interest, however, funding organizations that aim to push the country in a libertarian direction. Among the institutions that they have subsidized are the Institute for Justice, which

files lawsuits opposing state and federal regulations; the Institute for Humane Studies, which underwrites libertarian academics; and the Bill of Rights Institute, which promotes a conservative slant on the Constitution. Many of the organizations funded by the Kochs employ specialists who write position papers that are subsequently quoted by politicians and pundits. David Koch has acknowledged that the family exerts tight ideological control. "If we're going to give a lot of money, we'll make darn sure they spend it in a way that goes along with our intent," he told Doherty. "And if they make a wrong turn and start doing things we don't agree with, we withdraw funding." he Kochs' subsidization of a pro-corporate movement fulfills, in many ways, the vision laid out in a sècret 1971 memo that Lewis Powell, then a Virginia attorney, wrote two months before he was nominated to the Supreme Court. The antiwar movement had turned its anger on defense contractors, such as Dow Chemical, and Ralph Nader was leading a public-interest crusade against corporations. Powell, writing a report for the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, urged American companies to fight back. The greatest threat to free enterprise, he warned, was not Communism or the New Left but, rather, "respectable elements of society"-intellectuals, journalists, and scientists. To defeat them, he wrote,

business leaders needed to wage a long-term, unified campaign to change public opinion.

Charles Koch seems to have approached both business and politics with the deliberation of an engineer. "To bring about social change," he told Doherty, requires "a strategy" that is "vertically and horizontally integrated," spanning "from idea creation to policy development to education to grassroots organizations to lobbying to litigation to political action." The project, he admitted, was extremely ambitious. "We have a radical philosophy," he said. In 1977, the Kochs provided the funds to launch the nation's first libertarian think tank, the Cato Institute. According to the Center for Public Integrity, between 1986 and 1993 the Koch family gave eleven million dollars to the institute. Today, Cato has more than a hundred full-time employees, and its experts and policy papers are widely quoted and respected by the mainstream media. It describes itself as nonpartisan, and its scholars have at times been critical of both parties. But it has consistently pushed for corporate tax cuts, reductions in social services, and laissez-faire environmental policies. When President Obama, in a 2008 speech, described the science on global warming as "beyond dispute," the Cato Institute took out a full-page ad in the Times to contradict him. Cato's resident scholars have relentlessly criticized political

attempts to stop global warming as expensive, ineffective, and unnecessary. Ed

Crane, the Cato Institute's founder and president, told me that "global-warming

theories give the government more control of the economy."

Cato scholars have been particularly energetic in promoting the Climategate

scandal. Last year, private e-mails of climate scientists at the University of

East Anglia, in England, were mysteriously leaked, and their exchanges appeared

to suggest a willingness to falsify data in order to buttress the idea that

global warming is real. In the two weeks after the e-mails went public, one Cato

scholar gave more than twenty media interviews trumpeting the alleged scandal.

But five independent inquiries have since exonerated the researchers, and

nothing/was found in their e-mails or data to discredit the scientific consensus

on global warming.

Nevertheless, the controversy succeeded in spreading skepticism about climate

change. Even though the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration recently

issued a report concluding that the evidence for global warming is unequivocal,

more Americans are convinced than at any time since 1997 that scientists have

exaggerated the seriousness of global warming. The Kochs promote this statistic

on their company's Web site but do not mention the role that their funding has

played in fostering such doubt.

In a 2002 memo, the Republican political consultant Frank Luntz wrote that so long as "voters believe there is no consensus about global warming within the scientific community" the status quo would prevail. The key for opponents of environmental reform, he said, was to question the science—a public-relations strategy that the tobacco industry used effectively for years to forestall regulation. The Kochs have funded many sources of environmental skepticism, such as the Heritage Foundation, which has argued that "scientific facts gathered in the past 10 years do not support the notion of catastrophic human-made warming." The brothers have given money to more obscure groups, too, such as the Independent Women's Forum, which opposes the presentation of global warming as a scientific fact in American public schools. Until 2008, the group was run by Nancy Pfotenhauer, a former lobbyist for Koch Industries. Mary Beth Jarvis, a vice-president of a Koch subsidiary, is on the group's board. Naomi Oreskes, a professor of history and science studies at the University of California, San Diego, is the co-author of "Merchants of Doubt," a new book that chronicles various attempts by American industry to manipulate public opinion on science. She noted that the Kochs, as the heads of "a company with refineries and pipelines," have "a lot at stake" She added, "If the answer is to phase out

fossil fuels, a different group of people are going to be making money, so we shouldn't be surprised that they're fighting tooth and nail."

David Koch told New York that he was unconvinced that global warming has been

caused by human activity. Even if it has been, he said, the heating of the

planet will be beneficial, resulting in longer growing seasons in the Northern

Hemisphere. "The Earth will be able to support enormously more people because

far greater land area will be available to produce food," he said.

n the mid-eighties, the Kochs provided millions of dollars to George Mason

University, in Arlington, Virginia, to set up another think tank. Now known as

the Mercatus Center, it promotes itself as "the world's premier university

source for market-oriented ideas—bridging the gap between academic ideas and

real-world problems." Financial records show that the Koch family foundations

have contributed more than thirty million dollars to George Mason, much of which

has gone to the Mercatus Center, a nonprofit organization. "It's ground zero for

deregulation policy in Washington," Rob Stein, the Democratic strategist, said.

It is an unusual arrangement. "George Mason is a public university, and receives

public funds," Stein noted. "Virginia is hosting an institution that the Kochs

practically control."

The founder of the Mercatus Center is Richard Fink, formerly an economist. Fink heads Koch Industries' lobbying operation in Washington. In addition, he is the president of the Charles G. Koch Charitable Foundation, the president of the Claude R. Lambe Charitable Foundation, a director of the Fred C. and Mary R. Koch Foundation, and a director and co-founder, with David Koch, of the Americans for Prosperity Foundation. Fink, with his many titles, has become the central nervous system of the Kochtopus. He appears to have supplanted Ed Crane, the head of the Cato Institute, as the brothers' main political lieutenant. Though David remains on the board at Cato, Charles Koch has fallen out with Crane. Associates suggested to me that Crane had been insufficiently respectful of Charles's management philosophy, which he distilled into a book called "The Science of Success," and trademarked under the name Market-Based Management, or M.B.M. In the book, Charles recommends instilling a company's corporate culture with the competitiveness of the marketplace. Koch describes M.B.M. as a "holistic system" containing "five dimensions. vision, virtue and talents, knowledge processes, decision rights and incentives." A top Cato Institute official told me that Charles "thinks he's a genius. He's the emperor, and he's convinced he's wearing

clothes." Fink, by contrast, has been far more embracing of Charles's ideas.

(Fink, like the Kochs, declined to be interviewed.)

At a 1995 conference for philanthropists, Fink adopted the language of economics when speaking about the Mercatus Center's purpose. He said that grant-makers should use think tanks and political-action groups to convert intellectual raw materials into policy "products."

The Wall Street Journal has called the Mercatus Center "the most important think tank you've never heard of," and noted that fourteen of the twenty-three regulations that President George W. Bush placed on a "hit list" had been suggested first by Mercatus scholars. Fink told the paper that the Kochs have "other means of fighting [their] battles," and that the Mercatus Center does not actively promote the company's private interests. But Thomas McGarity, a law professor at the University of Texas, who specializes in environmental issues, told me that "Koch has been constantly in trouble with the E.P.A., and Mercatus has constantly hammered on the agency." An environmental lawyer who has clashed with the Mercatus Center called it "a means of laundering economic aims." The lawyer explained the strategy: "You take corporate money and give it to a neutral-sounding think tank," which "hires people with pedigrees and academic. degrees who put out credible-seeming studies. But they all coincide perfectly

with the economic interests of their funders."

In 1997, for instance, the E.P.A. moved to reduce surface ozone, a form of pollution caused, in part, by emissions from oil refineries. Susan Dudley, an economist who became a top official at the Mercatus Center, criticized the proposed rule. The E.P.A., she argued, had not taken into account that smog-free skies would result in more cases of skin cancer. She projected that if pollution were controlled it would cause up to eleven thousand additional cases of skin cancer each year.

In 1999, the District of Columbia Circuit Court took up Dudley's smog argument.

Evaluating the E.P.A. rule, the court found that the E.P.A. had "explicitly disregarded" the "possible health benefits of ozone" In another part of the opinion, the court ruled, 2-1, that the E.P.A. had overstepped its authority in calibrating standards for ozone emissions. As the Constitutional Accountability

Center, a think tank, revealed, the judges in the majority had previously attended legal junkets, on a Montana ranch, that were arranged by the Foundation for Research on Economics and the Environment—a group funded by Koch family foundations. The judges have claimed that the ruling was unaffected by their attendance.

deas don't happen on their own," Matt Kibbe, the president of FreedomWorks, a

Tea Party advocacy group, told me "Throughout history, ideas need patrons" The Koch brothers, after helping to create Cato and Mercatus, concluded that think tanks alone were not enough to effect change. They needed a mechanism to deliver those ideas to the street, and to attract the public's support. In 1984, David Koch and Richard Fink created yet another organization, and Kibbe joined them. The group, Citizens for a Sound Economy, seemed like a grassroots movement, but according to the Center for Public Integrity it was sponsored principally by the Kochs, who provided \$7.9 million between 1986 and 1993. Its mission, Kibbe said, "was to take these heavy ideas and translate them for mass America. . . . We read the same literature Obama did about nonviolent revolutions—Saul Alinsky, Gandhi, Martin Luther King We studied the idea of the Boston Tea Party as an example of nonviolent social change. We learned we needed boots on the ground to sell ideas, not candidates." Within a few years, the group had mobilized fifty paid field workers, in twenty-six states, to rally voters behind the Kochs' agenda. David and Charles, according to one participant, were "very controlling, very top down. You can't build an organization with them. They run it." Around this time, the brothers faced a political crisis. In 1989, the Senate

Select Committee on Indian Affairs investigated their business and released a

scathing report accusing Koch Oil of "a widespread and sophisticated scheme to steal crude oil from Indians and others through fraudulent mismeasuring." The

· · ·

Kochs admitted that they had improperly taken thirty-one million dollars' worth

of crude oil, but said that it had been accidental. Charles Koch told committee

investigators that oil measurement is "a very uncertain art."

To defend its reputation, Koch Industries hired Robert Strauss, then a premier

Washington lobbyist, the company soon opened an office in the city. A grand jury

was convened to investigate the allegations, but it eventually disbanded,

without issuing criminal charges. According to the Senate report, after the

committee hearings Koch operatives delved into the personal lives of committee

staffers, even questioning an ex-wife. Senate investigators were upset by the

Kochs' tactics. Kenneth Ballen, the counsel to the Senate committee, said,

"These people have amassed such unaccountable power!"

By 1993, when Bill Clinton became President, Citizens for a Sound Economy had

become a prototype for the kind of corporate-backed opposition campaigns that

have proliferated during the Obama era. The group waged a successful assault on

Clinton's proposed B.T.U. tax on energy, for instance, running advertisements,

staging media events, and targeting opponents. And it mobilized anti-tax rallies

outside the Capitol-rallies that NPR described as "designed to strike fear into

the hearts of wavering Democrats." Dan Glickman, a former Democratic congressman from Wichita, who supported the B.T.U. tax, recalled, "I'd been in Congress eighteen years. The Kochs actually engaged against me and funded my opponent.

They used a lot of resources and effort—their employees, too." Glickman suffered a surprise defeat. "I can't prove it, but I think I was probably their victim,"

The Kochs continued to disperse their money, creating slippery organizations with generic-sounding names, and this made it difficult to ascertain the extent of their influence in Washington. In 1990, Citizens for a Sound Economy created a spinoff group, Citizens for the Environment, which called acid rain and other environmental problems "myths." When the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette investigated the matter, it discovered that the spinoff group had "no citizen membership of its own."

In 1997, another Senate investigation began looking into what a minority report called "an audacious plan to pour millions of dollars in contributions into

Republican campaigns nationwide without disclosing the amount or source," in order to evade campaign-finance laws. A shell corporation, Triad Management, had paid more than three million dollars for attack ads in twenty-six House races.

and three Senate races. More than half of the advertising money came from an obscure nonprofit group, the Economic Education Trust. The Senate committee's minority report suggested that "the trust was financed in whole or in part by Charles and David Koch of Wichita, Kansas." The brothers were suspected of having secretly paid for the attack ads, most of which aired in states where Koch Industries did business. In Kansas, where Triad Management was especially active, the funds may have played a decisive role in four of six federal races. The Kochs, when asked by reporters if they had given the money, refused to comment. In 1998, however, the Wall Street Journal confirmed that a consultant on the Kochs' payroll had been involved in the scheme Charles Lewis, of the Center for Public Integrity, described the scandal as "historic. Triad was the first time a major corporation used a cutout"—a front operation—"in a threatening way. Koch Industries was the poster child of a company run amok." uring the Clinton Administration, the energy industry faced increased scrutiny and regulation. In the mid-nineties, the Justice Department filed two lawsuits against Koch Industries, claiming that it was responsible for more than three hundred oil spills, which had released an estimated three million gallons of oil into lakes and rivers. The penalty was potentially as high as two hundred and fourteen million dollars. In a settlement, Koch Industries paid a record

thirty-million-dollar civil fine, and agreed to spend five million dollars on environmental projects.

In 1999, a jury found Koch Industries guilty of negligence and malice in the deaths of two Texas teen-agers in an explosion that resulted from a leaky underground butane pipeline. (In 2001, the company paid an undisclosed settlement.) And in the final months of the Clinton Presidency the Justice Department levelled a ninety-seven-count indictment against the company, for covering up the discharge of ninety-one tons of benzene, a carcinogen, from its refinery in Corpus Christi, Texas. The company was liable for three hundred and fifty million dollars in fines, and four Koch employees faced up to thirty-five years in prison. The Koch Petroleum Group eventually pleaded guilty to one criminal charge of covering up environmental violations, including the falsification of documents, and paid a twenty-million-dollar fine David Uhlmann, a career prosecutor who, at the time, headed the environmental-crimes section at the Justice Department, described the suit as "one of the most significant cases ever brought under the Clean Air Act." He added, "Environmental crimes are almost always motivated by economics and arrogance, and in the Koch case there was a healthy dose of both."

During the 2000 election campaign, Koch Industries spent some nine hundred thousand dollars to support the candidacies of George W. Bush and other Republicans. During the Bush years, Koch Industries and other fossil-fuel companies enjoyed remarkable prosperity. The 2005 energy bill, which Hillary Clinton dubbed the Dick Cheney Lobbyist Energy Bill, offered enormous subsidies and tax breaks for energy companies. The Kochs have cast themselves as deficit hawks, but, according to a study by Media Matters, their companies have benefitted from nearly a hundred million dollars in government contracts since

In 2004, Citizens for a Sound Economy was accused of illegitimately throwing its weight behind Bush's reelection. The group's Oregon branch had attempted to get Ralph Nader on the Presidential ballot, in order to dilute Democratic support for John Kerry. Critics argued that it was illegal for a tax-exempt nonprofit organization to donate its services for partisan political purposes. (A complaint was filed with the Federal Election Commission; it was dismissed.)

That year, internal rivalries at Citizens for a Sound Economy caused the organization to split apart. David Koch and Fink started a new group, Americans for Prosperity, and they hired Tim Phillips to run it. Phillips was a political veteran who had worked with Ralph Reed, the evangelical leader and Republican

activist, co-founding Century Strategies, a campaign-consulting company that

became notorious for its ties to the disgraced lobbyist Jack Abramoff

Phillips's online biography describes him as an expert in "grasstops" and

"grassroots" political organizing. The Kochs' choice of Phillips signalled an

even greater toughness. The conservative operative Grover Norquist, who is known

for praising "throat slitters" in politics, called Phillips "a grownup who can

make things happen."

Last year, Phillips told the Financial Times that Americans for Prosperity had

only eight thousand registered members. Currently, its Web site claims that the

group has "1 2 million activists." Whatever its size, the Kochs' political

involvement has been intense; a former employee of the Cato Institute told me

that Americans for Prosperity "was micromanaged by the Kochs." And the brothers'

investment may well have paid off: Americans for Prosperity, in concert with the

family's other organizations, has been instrumental in disrupting the Obama

Presidency.

In January, 2008, Charles Koch wrote in his company newsletter that America

could be on the verge of "the greatest loss of liberty and prosperity since the

1930s." That October, Americans for Prosperity held a conference of conservative

operatives at a Marriott hotel outside Washington. Erick Erickson, the editor-in-chief of the conservative blog RedState.com, took the lectern, thanked David Koch, and vowed to "unite and fight . . . the armies of the left!" Soon after Obama assumed office, Americans for Prosperity launched "Porkulus" rallies against Obama's stimulus-spending measures. Then the Mercatus Center released a report claiming that stimulus funds had been directed disproportionately toward Democratic districts; eventually, the author was forced to correct the report, but not before Rush Limbaugh, citing the paper, had labelled Obama's program "a slush fund," and Fox News and other conservative outlets had echoed the sentiment. (Phil Kerpen, the vice-president for policy at Americans for Prosperity, is a contributor to the Fox News Web site. Another officer at Americans for Prosperity, Walter Williams, often guest-hosts for Limbaugh.) Americans for Prosperity also created an offshoot, Patients United Now, which organized what Phillips has estimated to be more than three hundred rallies against health-care reform. At one rally, an effigy of a Democratic congressman was hung, at another, protesters unfurled a banner depicting corpses from Dachau. The group also helped organize the "Kill the Bill" protests outside the Capitol, in March, where Democratic supporters of health-care reform alleged that they were spat on and cursed at. Phillips was a featured speaker.

Americans for Prosperity has held at least eighty events targeting cap-and-trade legislation, which is aimed at making industries pay for the air pollution that they create. Speakers for the group claimed, with exaggeration, that even back-yard barbecues and kitchen stoves would be taxed. The group was also involved in the attacks on Obama's "green jobs" czar, Van Jones, and waged a crusade against international climate talks. Casting his group as a champion of ordinary workers who would be hurt by environmentalists, Phillips went to Copenhagen last year and staged a protest outside the United Nations conference on climate change, declaring, "We're a grassroots organization. . . . I think it's unfortunate when wealthy children of wealthy families . . . want to send unemployment rates in the United States up to twenty per cent." Grover Norquist, who holds a weekly meeting for conservative leaders in Washington, including representatives from Americans for Prosperity, told me that last summer's raucous rallies were pivotal in undermining Obama's agenda. The Republican leadership in Congress, he said, "couldn't have done it without August, when people went out on the streets. It discouraged deal-makers"—Republicans who might otherwise have worked constructively with Obama. Moreover, the

appearance of growing public opposition to Obama affected corporate donors on K

Street. "K Street is a three-billion-dollar weathervane," Norquist said. "When

Obama was strong, the Chamber of Commerce said, 'We can work with the Obama

Administration.' But that changed when thousands of people went into the street

and 'terrorized' congressmen. August is what changed it. Now that Obama is weak,

people are getting tough."

As the first anniversary of Obama's election approached, David Koch came to the

Washington area to attend a triumphant Americans for Prosperity gathering.

Obama's poll numbers were falling fast. Not a single Republican senator was

working with the Administration on health care, or much else. Pundits were

writing about Obama's political ineptitude, and Tea Party groups were accusing

the President of initiating "a government takeover" In a speech, Koch said,

"Days like today bring to reality the vision of our board of directors when we

started this organization, five years ago." He went on, "We envisioned a mass

movement, a state-based one, but national in scope, of hundreds of thousands of

American citizens from all walks of life standing up and fighting for the

economic freedoms that made our nation the most prosperous society in history.

... Thankfully, the stirrings from California to Virginia, and from Texas to

Michigan, show that more and more of our fellow-citizens are beginning to see

the same truths as we do."

While Koch didn't explicitly embrace the Tea Party movement that day, more recently he has come close to doing so, praising it for demonstrating the "powerful visceral hostility in the body politic against the massive increase in government power, the massive efforts to socialize this country." Charles Koch, in a newsletter sent to his seventy thousand employees, compared the Obama Administration to the regime of the Venezuelan strongman Hugo Chávez. The Kochs' sense of imperilment is somewhat puzzling. Income inequality in America is greater than it has been since the nineteen-twenties, and since the seventies the tax rates of the wealthiest have fallen more than those of the middle class. Yet the brothers' message has evidently resonated with voters: a recent poll found that fifty-five per cent of Americans agreed that Obama is a socialist. Americans for Prosperity, meanwhile, has announced that it will spend an additional forty-five million dollars before the midterm elections, in November. Although the group is legally prohibited from directly endorsing candidates, it nonetheless plans to target some fifty House races and half a dozen Senate races, staging rallies, organizing door-to-door canvassing, and running ads aimed at "educating voters about where candidates stand."

Though the Kochs have slowed Obama's momentum, their larger political battle is

far from won. Richard Fink, interviewed by FrumForum.com this spring, said, "If you look at where we've gone from the year 2000 to now, with the expansion of government spending and a debt burden that threatens to bankrupt the country, it doesn't look very good at all." He went on, "It looks like the infrastructure that was built and nurtured has not carried the day." He suggested that the Kochs needed "to get more into the practical, day-to-day issues of governing." n 1991, David Koch was badly injured in a plane crash in Los Angeles. He was the sole passenger in first class to survive. As he was recovering, a routine physical exam led to the discovery of prostate cancer. Koch received treatment, settled down, started a family, and reconsidered his life As he told Portfolio, "When you're the only one who survived in the front of the plane and everyone else died-yeah, you think, 'My God, the good Lord spared me for some greater purpose.' My joke is that I've been busy ever since, doing all the good work I can think of, so He can have confidence in me." Koch began giving spectacularly large donations to the arts and sciences. And he became a patron of cancer research, focussing on prostate cancer. In addition to his gifts to Sloan-Kettering, he gave fifteen million dollars to New York-Presbyterian Hospital, a hundred and twenty-five million to M.I.T. for cancer research, twenty million to Johns Hopkins University, and twenty-five

million to the M. D. Anderson Cancer Center, in Houston. In response to his

generosity, Sloan-Kettering gave Koch its Excellence in Corporate Leadership

Award: In 2004, President Bush named him to the National Cancer Advisory Board,

which guides the National Cancer Institute.

Koch's corporate and political roles, however, may pose conflicts of interest.

For example, at the same time that David Koch has been casting himself as a

champion in the fight against cancer, Koch Industries has been lobbying to

prevent the E.P.A. from classifying formaldehyde, which the company produces in

great quantities, as a "known carcinogen" in humans.

Scientists have long known that formaldehyde causes cancer in rats, and several

major scientific studies have concluded that formaldehyde causes cancer in human

beings-including one published last year by the National Cancer Institute, on

whose advisory board Koch sits. The study tracked twenty-five thousand patients

for an average of forty years; subjects exposed to higher amounts of

formaldehyde had significantly higher rates of leukemia. These results helped

lead an expert panel within the National Institutes of Health to conclude that

formaldehyde should be categorized as a known carcinogen, and be strictly

controlled by the government. Corporations have resisted regulations on

formaldehyde for decades, however, and Koch Industries has been a large funder of members of Congress who have stymied the E.P.A., requiring it to defer new regulations until more studies are completed.

Koch Industries became a major producer of the chemical in 2005, after it bought Georgia-Pacific, the paper and wood-products company, for twenty-one billion dollars. Georgia-Pacific manufactures formaldehyde in its chemical division, and uses it to produce various wood products, such as plywood and laminates Its annual production capacity for formaldehyde is 2.2 billion pounds. Last December, Traylor Champion, Georgia-Pacific's vice-president of environmental affairs, sent a formal letter of protest to federal health authorities He wrote that the company "strongly disagrees" with the N.I H. panel's conclusion that formaldehyde should be treated as a known human carcinogen. David Koch did not recuse himself from the National Cancer Advisory Board, or divest himself of company stock, while his company was directly lobbying the government to keep formaldehyde on the market. (A board spokesperson said that the issue of formaldehyde had not come up.)

James Huff, an associate director at the National Institute for Environmental

Health Sciences, a division of the N.I.H., told me that it was "disgusting" for

Koch to be serving on the National Cancer Advisory Board "It's just not good

for public health. Vested interests should not be on the board." He went on,

"Those boards are very important. They're very influential as to whether N.C.I.

goes into formaldehyde or not. Billions of dollars are involved in

formaldehyde."

Harold Varmus, the director of the National Cancer Institute, knows David Koch

from Memorial Sloan-Kettering, which he used to run. He said that, at

Sloan-Kettering, "a lot of people who gave to us had large business interests.

The one thing we wouldn't tolerate in our board members is tobacco." When told

of Koch Industries' stance on formaldehyde, Varmus said that he was "surprised."

he David H. Koch Hall of Human Origins, at the Smithsonian's National Museum of

Natural History, is a multimedia exploration of the theory that mankind evolved

in response to climate change. At the main entrance, viewers are confronted with

a giant graph charting the Earth's temperature over the past ten million years,

which notes that it is far cooler now than it was ten thousand years ago.

Overhead, the text reads, "HUMANS EVOLVED IN RESPONSE TO A CHANGING WORLD." The

message, as amplified by the exhibit's Web site, is that "key human adaptations

evolved in response to environmental instability." Only at the end of the

exhibit, under the headline "OUR SURVIVAL CHALLENGE," is it noted that levels of

carbon dioxide are higher now than they have ever been, and that they are projected to increase dramatically in the next century. No cause is given for this development, no mention is made of any possible role played by fossil fuels. The exhibit makes it seem part of a natural continuum. The accompanying text says, "During the period in which humans evolved, Earth's temperature and the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere fluctuated together." An interactive game in the exhibit suggests that humans will continue to adapt to climate change in the future. People may build "underground cities," developing "short, compact bodies" or "curved spines," so that "moving around in tight spaces will be no problem." Such ideas uncannily echo the Koch message. The company's January newsletter to employees, for instance, argues that "fluctuations in the earth's climate predate humanity," and concludes, "Since we can't control Mother Nature, let's

employees, for instance, argues that "fluctuations in the earth's climate predate humanity," and concludes, "Since we can't control Mother Nature, let's figure out how to get along with her changes" Joseph Romm, a physicist who runs the Web site ClimateProgress.org, is infuriated by the Smithsonian's presentation. "The whole exhibit whitewashes the modern climate issue," he said. "I think the Kochs wanted to be seen as some sort of high-minded company, associated with the greatest natural-history and science museum in the country.

But the truth is, the exhibit is underwritten by big-time polluters, who are

Cristian Samper, the museum's director, said that the exhibit is not about climate change, and described Koch as "one of the best donors we've had, in my tenure here, because he's very interested in the content, but completely hands off." He noted, "I don't know all the details of his involvement in other

The Kochs have long depended on the public's not knowing all the details about them. They have been content to operate what David Koch has called "the largest company that you've never heard of." But with the growing prominence of the Tea Party, and with increased awareness of the Kochs' ties to the movement, the brothers may find it harder to deflect scrutiny. Recently, President Obama took aim at the Kochs' political network. Speaking at a Democratic National Committee fund-raiser, in Austin, he warned supporters that the Supreme Court's recent ruling in the Citizens United case—which struck down laws prohibiting direct corporate spending on campaigns—had made it even easier for big companies to hide behind "groups with harmless-sounding names like Americans for Prosperity."
