Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated March 28, 2017, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The processing of records responsive to your request is ongoing and has yielded an additional 614 documents. After reviewing these documents, we have determined that 134 may be released in full and 480 may be released with excisions.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released. All released material is enclosed.

Want to flag for you since holbrooke will raise with you.

Holbrookes office is asking you to call the saudi foreign minister soon to request a donation for the pakistan donors conference on the 17th. Steinberg reported to jake that miliband spoke to the saudis and they won't contribute directly to the conference but will likely be willing to set up a separate trust fund to which they'll contribute. Zardari is too big a problem for them to make a pledge at the conference but they are up for a separate arrangement. So, do you still want to call saudis and see if they say something different if you make the ask? How should we proceed?

Iraqi War Widows Initiative

Concept

Years of conflict in Iraq have led to a serious but frequently neglected challenge for Iraq – an estimated 750,000 to one million women whose plight has been drastically changed by war and violence. The individual circumstances of Iraqi war widows may vary but their underlying needs are essentially the same: to lift themselves up from desperation; to support themselves and their surviving dependents; to belong to and fully engage as equal partners in society; and – importantly – to contribute to Iraq's re-emergence as a stable and diverse country. Iraq's war widows and disadvantaged women face inadequate business know-how and/or basic education, insufficient income-generating opportunities and access to credit, social and economic isolation and limited voice to advocate for their critical issues, such as legal support, human rights, health and child care.

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) proposes an innovative and flexible new initiative to assist Iraq's war widows and other disadvantaged women of Iraq. A new \$5 million project for war-widows will combine with several other existing USAID/Iraq programs to form the multi-sectoral Iraqi War Widows Initiative (IWWI). IWWI will provide services, advocacy, critical job skills and business management training for Iraq's widows and disadvantaged women. USAID is also dedicating \$3.5 million from the Marla Ruzicka War Victims' Fund to provide war widows assistance that includes housing, skills training and business start-up. The province-based Iraq Rapid Assistance Program (IRAP) will be a source of micro-loans and job skills development for war widows in areas as diverse as textiles production, local handicrafts, computers, sewing, bee-keeping, animal husbandry, and business training. USAID's Tijara program, which promotes access to credit and delivers business skills training through the SBDCs in Iraq, will also contribute to IWWI's goals.

The IWWI will team USAID with, emerging local women's organizations, Small Business Development Centers (SBDC) and non-governmental organizations (NGOs). Capitalizing on the creativity and energy that was sparked by this week's visit to Baghdad by the heads of leading US technology and media innovators, several new ideas for technology-oriented private sector participation in the IWWI are being explored. We welcome the interest of the private sector in addressing one of Iraq's most serious social problems.

PJ & I talked about the 60 Mins & Leibovich ideas a couple weeks back, but obviously there's a lot of detail to figure out, especially on the 60 Mins piece, before a final decision is made. But I am as gung ho as ever, even more so after having a very long conversation with CBS this past Wednesday to hear what they're thinking. Their approach is as I'd hoped, genuinely on her as SecState, not a retrospective. They had some internal debate about who would do the interview, Scott Pelley or Katie Couric, and the network has decided that if an interview happens, it would be Pelley-which is huge for us, he is much less likely than Katie to wander to domestic politics and the past, and will convey a better tone. I took the opportunity of the 7 hours of flight on Friday to take HRC's temperature, and it was one of those things where she started as a No Way but after about 20 mins of back and forth and listening to my thinking, I can see she is more open to it then she let on. I'm going to go at her again one of the next couple of days. My general argument with her is that the US public as evidenced by her approval ratings obviously thinks she is doing a great job, and the primary way they have been learning about her work has been through the heavy US network television presence we have ensured on every trip. This project with 60 mins would be an extension of that on a show that can dedicate more than the standard 3-5 minutes, possible as much as half the show to really demonstrate how much she is doing. I said her story as SecState can only properly be told on TV, and nobody is in 60 Mins class. Huma can attest that I think I made a lot of headway.

A big part of this is working around out April travel schedule, which seems to me to be pretty fluid. Would be important to give them a good trip to tag along on.

Past 100 days, Caroline and I spent a few hours off campus the other day getting together thoughts on longer term media - with a large focus on magazines in the summer/fall - that we'd like to sit with PJ about before presenting to the wider group.

When I am back, would love to sit early in the week of April 6th to discuss



The United States and the Netherlands Two Countries - One Spirit United by Values, History and a Vision for the Future // Presented to Secretary of State Hillary Clinton by Dutch Minister of Foreign Affairs Maxime Verhagen // This gift illustrates the oldest pictorial map of the New York region (Joan Vingboon, 1639) and the purchase of Manhattan by the Dutch for 60 guilders (Peter Schagen Letter, 1626) In honor of Dutch-American Friendship Day, April 19, 2009

WASHINGTON (AP) — Her videos aren't quite viral yet and she's not tweeting, but Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton is embracing new media, using the Web to promote the agency and her role as the nation's top envoy

In less than three months, Clinton's State Department has embarked on a digital diplomacy drive aimed at spreading the word about American foreign policy and restoring Washington's image. Part of a broader Internet outreach by President Barack Obama's administration. Clinton's Web efforts already have outpaced those of her producessors.

Since taking over at Foggy Bottom, Clinton's team has built on e-diplomacy innovations developed during George W. Bush's presidency.

- They have revamped the department's Web site (http://www.state.gov) and the Dipnote blog (http://blogs.state.gov and http://twitter.com/dipnote) with a fresh array of features, graphics and colorful posts
- Users can track her foreign travel on an interactive map (http://www.state.gov/secretary/trvl/map/?tnp_td5)
- They can keep up virtually with her every move through Facebook. Twitter, Flickr and YouTube (http://www.voutube.com/user/statevideo).
- They can pose questions through an "ask-the-secretary" column (http://www.state.gov/r/pa/ei/ask/secretary/117297.htm) that recently was revised to "text the secretary." (http://www.state.gov/r/pa/ei/ask/secretary/1,20236.htm)

"New media is critical in this new era of diplomacy, where smart power and expanded dialogues are essential to achieving our foreign policy goals," said Cheryl Mills. Clinton's longtime confidente and chief of staff

Even for a government Web site, early indications show a surge in interest, according to internal State Department statistics provided to The Associated Press.

Daily views of the Dipnote have doubled from 10,000 a year ago to 20.000 today, with 700 subscribers to its RSS feed, twice as many as in March 2008. The number of followers of the department on Twitter has tripled since Jan. 20, when Obama took office, while the department's Facebook friends have increased by 2 1/2 times in the same period.

"What they are bringing in is more willingness to experiment," said Peter Daou, who was Clinton's Web guru during her 2008 presidential run. "They are starting to push the envelope."

What remains unclear, though, is whether the spike in interest reflects the revamped Web site or the public's fascmation with Clinton's latest career shift

"The personality behind it can't be dismissed," said Daou, who now blogs on human rights and other issues for U.N. Dispatch (http://www.undispatch.com)

Like Obama, Clinton carries a Blackberry, but she is not allowed to use it on the department's secure seventh floor where her office is. Aides say she takes an active role in answering questions from the Web, responding to bloggers and pushing her agency's new media agenda

"The United States Government is behind nearly everybody, except in certain discrete areas: in terms of technology," she told department employees at a town hall meeting in February. "We are, in my view, wasting time, wasting money, wasting opportunities, because we are not prepared to communicate effectively with what is out there in the business world and the private world."

Clinton was quick to embrace new media at the start of her presidential campaign. She announced her entry into the race in February 2007 on the Web and followed with regular Internet chats and Internet fundraising appeals.

Nonetheless, Clinton was surpassed by the Obama campaign's mastery of the Internet and social networking sites. Obama used the Web to raise record donations and identify and orchestrate an army of volunteers.

Clinton was first lady when the first White House Web site debuted in 1994. It was a bare-bones operation compared with what is available now. Three years later, the State Department went online during Secretary of State Madeleine Albright's tenure,

But it wasn't until 2007, under Secretary of State Condoleczza Rice's spokesman, Sean McCormack, that the department's public affairs shop began exploring new media in earnest. McCormack started the Dipnote blog, which some foreign service veterans predicted would fail, given the private and stuffy nature of diplomacy

The site endured under Rice. Clinton has retooled Dipnote with a Twitter feed and a broader range of posts from diplomats.

It's more than just window dressing. This past week, diplomats used Twitter to "tweet" down false rumors they feared might lead to a siege on the U.S. Embassy in Madagascar

On her first two foreign trips, to Asia and then the Middle East and Europe, local bloggers were "embedded" with the traveling press corps, broadening the audience for Clinton's official meetings and public appearances, which often produce more personal than policy questions

On her question site, Clinton has responded to a varied questions, from "Should the U.S. engage in direct dialogue with Hamas?" to "How did you like meeting the Japanese students?"

By the end of Clinton's trip to the Mideast, her "text the secretary" feature had received nearly 2,000 text messages. On both trips, Clinton also participated in Webcasts One in Beijing on climate change generated more than 10.2 million page views, more than 50,000 comments and 7.000 questions, according to the statistics.

Clinton's staff say they plan to venture further into the realm of social networking, an animated online world called Second Life, and cell phone technology. The department hopes to follow through on a Bush administration organized project that brought together Facebook, Google, Howcast, YouTube, AT&T, MTV, Columbia Law School, Access360Media and Gen-Next for an Alliance of Youth Movements summit.

It also wants to expand on X-Life, a mobile phone game launched in February that is aimed at helping youth in the Middle East learn English and teaching them about American history, culture and values.

Havana Cubavision in Spanish at 0042 GMT on 17 April carries during the evening news broadcast a recording of President Raul Castro's second speech at the Bolivarian Alternative for the Americas (Alba) Summit in Cumana, Venezuela, on 16 April. Reception is good.

At 0042 GMT, Castro begins thanking the heads of state in attendance for their expressions of support for Cuba. He and Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez briefly mention the possibility that Castro will "speak for all of us" at the rally to be held following the meeting. He says that the whole

world "with the exception of the United States, their principle ally Israel," and a few other countries, has condemned the US embargo against Cuba. He then states that "I do not want to talk about the OAS [Organization of American States]" and suggests that the organization has a "bloody history" beginning with their acceptance of the CIA-backed coup in Guatemala in 1954.

At 0047 GMT, Castro recalls that Fidel Castro declared that Cuba was socialist on 16 April 1960, just days before the Bay of Pigs invasion, which he says was planned by the same people who planned the Guatemalan coup. He says the invasion was planned before Cuba declared itself socialist, and asks why the OEA did not condemn the invasion. He then asserts that US forces were prepared to invade Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis, and suggests that the government the United States was planning to set up would then have petitioned for help from the OEA. He asserts that this is the reason Cuba was not expelled from the OEA until after the crisis.

At 0053 GMT, Castro, becoming visibly upset, asks "what would have happened had the United States invaded Cuba?" He suggests Cuba would have experienced a civil war similar to the one that followed the Guatemala coup. He then mentions that the United States broke off diplomatic relations with Cuba on 3 January 1961. He also says that the resolution to the Cuban Missile crisis made by then Soviet Prime Minister Khrushchev "ignored" Cuba and "no one ignores us, not even the biggest country in the world, not even groups of the biggest countries of the world, not the G-7, not the G-20."

At 0057 GMT, Castro says, "Some times, as you, Evo, and some other comrades were saying about democracy, liberty, human rights, we have sent messages to the US Government in private and in public that we are willing to discuss everything, human rights, freedom of press, political prisoners, everything, everything they want to talk about, but as equals, without the smallest shadow cast on our sovereignty, and without the slightest violation of the Cuban people's right to self determination." All applaud.

Castro then says that there is really only one political party in the United States, citing as evidence the fact that the Bay of Pigs invasion was first conceived under a Republican president and then carried out under a Democrat. At this point he knocks over the microphone while gesticulating.

After righting the microphone, Castro says, "That is the reality. We could say many more things here. We may make mistakes. We admit it. We are human beings. We are willing to accept it and discuss it whenever, as I said.

"In conclusion, what is going now is that, it is evident, it is evident that they have to form --whoever says something--they will keep [words indistinct] about democracy, liberty, prisoners. The other day in Brazil, or rather in Brasilia, an insolent and provocative journalist, after a meeting with Lula, he was present, in an interview he [the journalist] asked me [about it]. First, how many journalists have they executed? He said nothing, and he started to tremble when I answered him in the way I know how. He was trembling. And I said yes, those dissidents paid by the United States, go and see the last

budget that was approved, \$57 million to fund all those dissidents, patriots, so-called journalists, and so forth. Why don't they release our five heroes, heroic youths that did not cause any harm to the United States or look for information against the United States, but against the terrorists that have attacked our country to one degree or another for almost fifty years?

"Whenever they want, I say it now, if they want us to free those political prisoners—among them some confessed terrorists, Guatemalans and Salvadorans that were given the death penalty, which still exists though we have not applied it for a long time, and their sentences were later commuted to life in jail, that is true—let them release our prisoners and we will send those so-called dissidents and patriots to them with their families and whatever else they want." All applaud.

Castro continues: "We could say a few things along those lines. Evo, if after what you said today they expel you from the OAS because Marxism-Leninism is incompatible, Bolivia and Cuba will form something else that is not called OAS or anything close to it, and we will only admit those who are with us." All applaud.

Castro says, "Well, Chavez, forgive me. Forgive me for taking this time and the informal way in which I spoke. I was on my way out, I came to apologize to Daniel and I took his time. This has been an abuse of power, probably because I am in uniform." All laugh.

At 0105 GMT, Chavez calls Raul "the voice of Cuba." The broadcast then returns to the evening news.

La crisis económica y también social ya tiene carácter global y no se limita al sector financiero. Es un flagelo mundial con profundas raíces estructurales. Incluye una fuerte caída de los valores bursátiles y de la actividad productiva; la paralización y encarecimiento del crédito y la recesión económica en las principales potencias del primer mundo. A continuación intervinieron los presidentes de Bolivia, Honduras, Nicaragua y Paraguay; y los primeros ministros de Dominica, y San Vicente y las Granadinas, este último solicitó oficialmente el ingreso de su país al ALBA.

También hicieron uso de la palabra el Canciller de Ecuador y Miguel D¢ Escoto, presidente de la Asamblea General de la ONU. Todos ellos expresaron acuerdo con los documentos sometidos a la consideración de la Cumbre, su apoyo a Cuba y el rechazo al bloqueo.

Encuentro con Miguel D'Escoto, presidente de la Asamblea General de la onu.

Raúl agradeció en nombre del pueblo cubano y de Fidel estas sinceras manifestaciones solidarias hacia nuestra patria, idea que comparten la inmensa mayoria de los países, salvo las pocas y conocidas excepciones.

Respecto a la OEA, señaló que no iba a contestar las declaraciones de su secretario general, pues ya lo hizo Fidel en una de sus Reflexiones. Señaló que la historia de esa organización rezuma sangre por todas partes.

Recordó el ignominioso papel desempeñado por la OEA en las agresiones contra el pueblo de Guatemala en la década de los años cincuenta y posteriormente su complicidad en los ataques y actos de terrorismo contra Cuba, causantes de varios miles de víctimas.

La jornada tuvo como colofón la visita al Cuartel Sucre, campamento militar donde estuvo Chávez destacado siendo un joven teniente. En dicho lugar, ante la tropa formada, afirmó el mandatario venezolano, comenzaron a surgir sus inquietudes políticas.

CUMANÁ, Sucre.— El General de Ejército Raúl Castro Ruz, Presidente de los Consejos de Estado y de Ministros, afirmó la tarde de este jueves aquí que los países miembros de la Alternativa Bolivariana para los Pueblos de Nuestra América (ALBA) tienen el privilegio de contar con un modesto esquema integrador, construido sobre bases y principios de igualdad, cuya naturaleza niega las prácticas que originaron la actual crisis mundial.

En ese sentido, Chávez inició la cruzada contra ese foro, poniendo sobre las íes los puntos que lleva, al considerar que debe ser la última, al menos con ese formato. Esta es la Cumbre de nuestros pueblos, aquí está nuestro compromiso, afirmó.

Cuba siempre ha sido un símbolo para todos los que soñamos con un mundo más justo, expresó el mandatario hondureño. En nuestra reunión anterior celebrábamos el Aniversario 50 de la Revolución Cubana, y hoy estamos conmemorando 48 años de la victoria de su pueblo en Girón. A Cuba, mi reconocimiento y mi solidaridad, apuntó.

Las propuestas de Evo

Momento emotivo de la Cumbre Extraordinaria del ALBA fue escuchar a Evo, el presidente de Bolivia, quien llegó a este encuentro luego de ganar una gran batalla en su país, a favor de su pueblo. Aunque la ocasión fue propicia para rememorar los días en que estuvo de huelga y denunciar los intentos de asesinato contra su persona, dedicó la mayor parte de su intervención para hablar de los grandes retos que tienen por delante los países miembros del ALBA, los cuales no pueden permitirse que los enemigos de las revoluciones y de nuestra gente ponga en peligro la construcción de una sociedad diferente, mejor, que se preocupe y ocupe de las inmensas mayorías excluidas durante años.

Tomando como referencia lo sucedido en Bolivia, Evo propuso la creación del Consejo de Derechos Humanos del ALBA para denunciar semejantes acciones y defendernos.

Otra de sus propuestas estuvo vinculada con Cuba. Con esa humildad que le caracteriza, pidió permiso para darle lectura a una suerte de Declaración de los Países amigos de la Isla que participarán en la Cumbre de las Américas, en la cual exigirán el levantamiento inmediato del bloqueo impuesto por sucesivas administraciones norteamericanas.

En otro momento, Fernando Lugo, presidente del Paraguay, uno de los invitados especiales de la Cumbre, señaló que en América estamos en una nueva época, «somos genuinos autores de nuestro destino y ningún país en el mundo nos puede juzgar. Nosotros creemos en la integración».

La primera jornada de la Cumbre Extraordinaria del ALBA, que tuvo como sede al Museo de Arte Contemporáneo de Cumaná, confirmó, primero, que solo la unidad entre nuestros pueblos permitirá seguir avanzando en la construcción de la gran Patria que soñó Bolívar; y, segundo, Cuba cuenta no solo con el apoyo y la solidaridad de los países miembros de este mecanismo integracionista, sino también de la inmensa mayoría de las naciones del mundo.

Casi en los finales de esta primera jornada, y rompiendo el protocolo de las cumbres, el compañero Raúl agradeció esas infinitas muestras de admiración y respeto hacia la Revolución Cubana y su pueblo.

Luego de exponer ante la Cumbre las razones del por qué la Isla fue expulsada de la OEA, y la larga historia de agresiones de que ha sido objeto por parte de Estados Unidos, Raúl expresó que «sabemos que el mundo entero, a excepción del Gobierno norteamericano y su principal aliado Israel, y algún que otro país, en otros momentos, el planeta entero condena el bloqueo.

Havana Cubavision in Spanish at 0042 GMT on 17 April carries during the evening news broadcast a recording of President Raul Castro's second speech at the Bolivarian Alternative for the Americas

(Alba) Summit in Cumana, Venezuela, on 16 April. Reception is good.

At 0042 GMT, Castro begins thanking the heads of state in attendance for their expressions of support for Cuba. He and Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez briefly mention the possibility that Castro will "speak for all of us" at the rally to be held following the meeting. He says that the whole world "with the exception of the United States, their principle ally Israel," and a few other countries, has condemned the US embargo against Cuba. He then states that "I do not want to talk about the OAS [Organization of American States]" and suggests that the organization has a "bloody history" beginning with their acceptance of the CIA-backed coup in Guatemala in 1954.

At 0047 GMT, Castro recalls that Fidel Castro declared that Cuba was socialist on 16 April 1960, just days before the Bay of Pigs invasion, which he says was planned by the same people who planned the Guatemalan coup. He says the invasion was planned before Cuba declared itself socialist, and asks why the OEA did not condemn the invasion. He then asserts that US forces were prepared to invade Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis, and suggests that the government the United States was planning to set up would then have petitioned for help from the OEA. He asserts that this is the reason Cuba was not expelled from the OEA until after the crisis.

At 0053 GMT, Castro, becoming visibly upset, asks "what would have happened had the United States invaded Cuba?" He suggests Cuba would have experienced a civil war similar to the one that followed the Guatemala coup. He then mentions that the United States broke off diplomatic relations with Cuba on 3 January 1961. He also says that the resolution to the Cuban Missile crisis made by then Soviet Prime Minister Khrushchev "ignored" Cuba and "no one ignores us, not even the biggest country in the world, not even groups of the biggest countries of the world, not the G-7, not the G-20."

At 0057 GMT, Castro says, "Some times, as you, Evo, and some other comrades were saying about democracy, liberty, human rights, we have sent messages to the US Government in private and in public that we are willing to discuss everything, human rights, freedom of press, political prisoners, everything, everything they want to talk about, but as equals, without the smallest shadow cast on our sovereignty, and without the slightest violation of the Cuban people's right to self determination." All applaud.

Castro then says that there is really only one political party in the United States, citing as evidence the fact that the Bay of Pigs invasion was first conceived under a Republican president and then carried out under a Democrat. At this point he knocks over the microphone while gesticulating.

After righting the microphone, Castro says, "That is the reality. We could say many more things here. We may make mistakes. We admit it. We are human beings. We are willing to accept it and discuss it whenever, as I said.

"In conclusion, what is going now is that, it is evident, it is evident that they have to form --whoever says something--they will keep [words indistinct] about democracy, liberty, prisoners. The other day in Brazil, or rather in Brasilia, an insolent and provocative journalist, after a meeting with Lula, he was present, in an interview he [the journalist] asked me [about it]. First, how many journalists have they executed? He said nothing, and he started to tremble when I answered him in the way I know how. He was trembling. And I said yes, those dissidents paid by the United States, go and see the last budget that was approved, \$57 million to fund all those dissidents, patriots, so-called journalists, and so forth. Why don't they release our five heroes, heroic youths that did not cause any harm to the United States or look for information against the United States, but against the terrorists that have attacked our country to one degree or another for almost fifty years?

"Whenever they want, I say it now, if they want us to free those political prisoners--among them some confessed terrorists, Guatemalans and Salvadorans that were given the death penalty, which still exists though we have not applied it for a long time, and their sentences were later commuted to life in jail, that is true—let them release our prisoners and we will send those so-called dissidents and patriots to them with their families and whatever else they want." All applaud.

Castro continues: "We could say a few things along those lines. Evo, if after what you said today they expel you from the OAS because Marxism-Leninism is incompatible, Bolivia and Cuba will form something else that is not called OAS or anything close to it, and we will only admit those who are with us." All applaud.

Castro says, "Well, Chavez, forgive me. Forgive me for taking this time and the informal way in which I spoke. I was on my way out, I came to apologize to Daniel and I took his time. This has been an abuse of power, probably because I am in uniform." All laugh.

At 0105 GMT, Chavez calls Raul "the voice of Cuba." The broadcast then returns to the evening news.

Distinguidos invitados:

La crisis económica y también social ya tiene carácter global y no se limita al sector financiero. Es un flagelo mundial con profundas raíces estructurales. Incluye una fuerte caída de los valores bursátiles y de la actividad productiva; la paralización y encarecimiento del crédito y la recesión económica en las principales potencias del primer mundo. Va acompañada del retraimiento del comercio mundial, y del aumento del desempleo y la pobreza. Está afectando y dañará sensiblemente la vida y el bienestar de miles de millones de seres humanos. Los países del Sur serán, como siempre, los que más sufrirán.

Son las consecuencias de prácticas irresponsables vinculadas a la desregulación, la especulación financiera y la imposición del neoliberalismo. El General de Ejército Raúl Castro Ruz, Presidente de los Consejos de Estado y de Ministros, preside la delegación cubana a la VII Cumbre Presidencial de la Alternativa Bolivariana para los Pueblos de Nuestra América (ALBA), que inició sus sesiones ayer en Cumaná, capital del estado venezolano de Sucre.

Chávez dio inicio a la reunión saludando a todas las delegaciones presentes y a continuación pasó a analizar con sólidos argumentos la actual crisis económica internacional, el carácter criminal, ilegal e injusto del bloqueo a Cuba y su absurda exclusión del sistema interamericano.

De inmediato cedió la palabra al mandatario cubano. No nos expulsaron de la OEA a comienzos de 1961 —dijo—, para que dicha organización pudiera reconocer el gobierno títere que pretendía trasladar Estados Unidos hasta la cabeza de playa que intentaría ocupar en Cuba, el cual solicitaría de inmediato la invasión de las fuerzas armadas norteamericanas, acción que hubiera costado cientos de miles de víctimas a nuestro pueblo, como ocurrió en Guatemala sin que se produjera la menor protesta de la OEA.

CUMANÁ, Sucre.— El General de Ejército Raúl Castro Ruz, Presidente de los Consejos de Estado y de Ministros, afirmó la tarde de este jueves aquí que los países miembros de la Alternativa Bolivariana para los Pueblos de Nuestra América (ALBA) tienen el privilegio de contar con un modesto esquema integrador, construido sobre bases y principios de igualdad, cuya naturaleza niega las prácticas que originaron la actual crisis mundial.

Fue Raúl el primer orador de la Cumbre Extraordinaria del ALBA, luego de que el presidente venezolano Hugo Chávez, en su condición de anfitrión, diera la bienvenida a los mandatarios de los países que integran este mecanismo integracionista latinoamericano y caribeño, y a los que asistieron en calidad de invitados especiales.

En su breve pero contundente discurso, Raúl resaltó la «particular significación de los trabajos que venimos llevando a cabo los países miembros del ALBA, más Ecuador desde noviembre de 2008, para crear el Sistema Único de Compensación Regional de Pagos (SUCRE), que será un factor fundamental para fomentar el comercio y la integración económica entre nosotros».

Uno de los resultados de esta nueva Cumbre resultó precisamente la firma de un Acuerdo Marco del SUCRE, minutos antes de que Chávez invitara a sus homólogos a poner punto final a las sesiones de trabajo de este jueves, para irse a un encuentro con el pueblo de Cumaná que desde «hace varias horas nos espera en la Plaza Antonio José de Sucre, en el Parque Ayacucho».

Hoy comienza en Trinidad y Tobago la Cumbre de las Américas. Imposible no hablar del momento en que tiene lugar y de lo que ella representa en un escenario donde la América cambió.

En ese sentido, Chávez inició la cruzada contra ese foro, poniendo sobre las íes los puntos que lleva, al considerar que debe ser la última, al menos con ese formato. Esta es la Cumbre de nuestros pueblos, aquí está nuestro compromiso, afirmó.

Los presidentes de los países miembros del ALBA se pronunciaron de manera enérgica contra la exclusión de Cuba de ese foro y la negativa de los Estados Unidos de levantar el bloqueo impuesto a nuestro país por más de cuatro décadas.

Conmovedoras y muy reconfortantes resultaron las palabras de todos y cada uno, en especial las del presidente de Honduras, José Manuel Zelaya, y del Primer Ministro de Dominica, Roosevelt Skerrit, quienes dejaron bien claro que Cuba es parte del sistema de las Américas. «Dejarla fuera sería injustificable e imperdonable».

La Cumbre de las Américas, apuntó Skerrit, tiene que cambiar su enfoque y su dirección hacia Cuba. Nosotros vamos a ser parte de las voces que se van a escuchar en contra de la exclusión de la Isla.

Zelaya, por su parte, se refirió al hecho de que asociarse al ALBA es un símbolo de libertad, es romper cadenas, es volver a creer que hay esperanzas en este mundo. Tiene fundamentos que

están dando resultados extraordinarios.

Cuba siempre ha sido un símbolo para todos los que soñamos con un mundo más justo, expresó el mandatario hondureño. En nuestra reunión anterior celebrábamos el Aniversario 50 de la Revolución Cubana, y hoy estamos conmemorando 48 años de la victoria de su pueblo en Girón. A Cuba, mi reconocimiento y mi solidaridad, apuntó.

Las propuestas de Evo

Momento emotivo de la Cumbre Extraordinaria del ALBA fue escuchar a Evo, el presidente de Bolivia, quien llegó a este encuentro luego de ganar una gran batalla en su país, a favor de su pueblo. Aunque la ocasión fue propicia para rememorar los días en que estuvo de huelga y denunciar los intentos de asesinato contra su persona, dedicó la mayor parte de su intervención para hablar de los grandes retos que tienen por delante los países miembros del ALBA, los cuales no pueden permitirse que los enemigos de las revoluciones y de nuestra gente ponga en peligro la construcción de una sociedad diferente, mejor, que se preocupe y ocupe de las inmensas mayorías excluidas durante años.

Tomando como referencia lo sucedido en Bolivia, Evo propuso la creación del Consejo de Derechos Humanos del ALBA para denunciar semejantes acciones y defendernos.

Otra de sus propuestas estuvo vinculada con Cuba. Con esa humildad que le caracteriza, pidió permiso para darle lectura a una suerte de Declaración de los Países amigos de la Isla que participarán en la Cumbre de las Américas, en la cual exigirán el levantamiento inmediato del bloqueo impuesto por sucesivas administraciones norteamericanas.

Si Obama, dijo, quiere tener el apoyo de todo el mundo, como lo tiene Cuba, tiene que respetar las resoluciones de las Naciones Unidas, tiene que levantar el bloqueo.

En otro momento, Fernando Lugo, presidente del Paraguay, uno de los invitados especiales de la Cumbre, señaló que en América estamos en una nueva época, «somos genuinos autores de nuestro destino y ningún país en el mundo nos puede juzgar. Nosotros creemos en la integración».

La primera jornada de la Cumbre Extraordinaria del ALBA, que tuvo como sede al Museo de Arte Contemporáneo de Cumaná, confirmó, primero, que solo la unidad entre nuestros pueblos permitirá seguir avanzando en la construcción de la gran Patria que soñó Bolívar; y, segundo, Cuba cuenta no solo con el apoyo y la solidaridad de los países miembros de este mecanismo integracionista, sino también de la inmensa mayoría de las naciones del mundo.

Casi en los finales de esta primera jornada, y rompiendo el protocolo de las cumbres, el compañero Raúl agradeció esas infinitas muestras de admiración y respeto hacia la Revolución Cubana y su pueblo.

Luego de exponer ante la Cumbre las razones del por qué la Isla fue expulsada de la OEA, y la larga historia de agresiones de que ha sido objeto por parte de Estados Unidos, Raúl expresó que «sabemos que el mundo entero, a excepción del Gobierno norteamericano y su principal aliado Israel, y algún que otro país, en otros momentos, el planeta entero condena el bloqueo.

Allí los esperaba el pueblo para dar a los presidentes del ALBA la bienvenida y el saludo de la gente que cree que un mundo mejor es posible.





With four days to go for the start of the Fifth Summit of the Americas, chairman of the Inter-Ministerial Committee, Mariano Browne, says all stakeholders are working together "to get everything right." Browne, who is also Trade and Industry Minister, made this comment during a visit to the Summit Village at Hyatt Regency Hotel, Wrightson Road, Port-of-Spain. The Summit Village is being organised by 2009 reigning bandleader Brian Mac Farlane. The theme of the Summit is "Securing Our Citizens Future by Promoting Human Prospenty, Energy Security and Environmental Sustainability"

The klosks which are intended to showcase all aspects of T&T heritage and culture are expected to be opened at midday today. Browne said "We are moving along onstream, We have to do test runs to ensure we get everything right. We will be opening the booths tomorrow (today). "We still have to work out the details of the schedules. We will be working out the specific details," he added. Browne said the Secretariat would be meeting with civil and private sector groups tomorrow. Prime Minister Patrick Manning had echoed a similar sentiment that the Summit should come off flawlessly. Speaking to reporters at Balisler House, Port-of-Spain, last Thursday, Manning had said they were the most elaborate preparations the country had ever seen.

He said the Government had gone out of its way to ensure everything went smoothly. "We recognise that much is nding, not just on a successful conference but the success of small countries in the developing world," he said. Browne said history would be created when US President Barack Obama attended the summit. Also expected are 34 heads of state from various Latin American countries. "It will be the first summit for Obama," Browne said. "We are expected to engage in talks with Latin American leaders...We will be looking at developing better economic linkages."

Trade talks with Canada

Obama is scheduled to lead a 1,000-strong delegation, including Secretary of State Hilary Clinton. On Friday, Browne confirmed Obama's call to Manning which was made made on Thursday. He said he was unable to give any further details of the conversation. Browne said they were also looking forward to engaging in trade talks with Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper. He said he was unable to give any further details of the conversation. "The talk will revolve around trade deals with Canada ...Trade is an important item," he said "More importantly, since it is the first time a summit of its kind is being held here, it will give us an opportunity to showcase our organisational skills

refugee camp to try to quell a riot and save lives of Roma (gypsy) refugees under attack. He succeeded, and went home to bed. It wasn't diplomacy around big tables in grand rooms. The U.S. embassy had no responsibility to intervene, and few who were not there ever heard about it. But the actions of Ambassador Christopher Hill highlight the power of the individual Foreign Service officer's moral and physical courage. At about 11 p.m. on June 5, 1999, my cell phone rang at home. It was Ed Joseph, an American working for Catholic Relief Services as a refugee camp manager at Stenkovac Camp, a few miles north of Skopje, the capital of the small ethnically-tense Balkan nation of Macedonia. Stenkovac housed tens of thousands of refugees from Kosovo, mostly ethnic Albanians. There was a riot going on, Ed told me, and it looked like people were going to get killed. A rumor had run through the camp that some Roma residents were Serb collaborators who had participated in a massacre of ethnic Albanians in Kosovo weeks earlier. A mob had formed in the camp to go after the two accused Roma families. The camp managers had just enough time to get to the scene, pull the Roma away, and get them inside the small building they used as an office. Two of the men had been very badly beaten and were only semi-conscious.

The building was surrounded by masses of angry people, pounding on the doors and barred windows trying to get at the Roma. If the mob got in, it was unlikely any of the Roma, including the children, would stand a chance. Ed was on the edge of the crowd by the front gate with other camp administrators, but their efforts to break up the crowd were not working. He did not know how long it would be before the mob would be able to smash its way into the building.

Ed knew that sending Macedonian police into the camp would only inflame the situation. We quickly ran through some ideas — NATO troops, Western European police officers from an OSCE training mission, a couple of others — but none had any prospect of working in time, if ever. The one trump card we could think of was the immense respect of the Kosovar Albanians for the United States, and for our ambassador in Skopje, Chris Hill, admired by Kosovar Albanians for his efforts to prevent the Kosovo conflict. Maybe he could calm the mob. It was a long shot, and we could not rule out the grim possibility that in the confusion Hill himself could be attacked or trampled. We could think of no other options, so I called Ambassador Hill.

Hill listened to my explanation of what was going on and our vague idea for his .

intervention, then simply said, "Yes, I want to get out there right away." Minutes later, Deputy Chief of Mission Paul Jones, Refugee Coordinator Ted Morse, Ambassador Hill, and I were standing at the gate to the camp, looking at the milling mass of people surrounding the building that held the Roma. We were met by Ed, an interpreter, and 88 Inside a U.S. Embassy

a gaggle of worried but seemingly powerless camp elders. As I listened to the din of noise from the unseen center of the crowd, the plan we'd concocted on the drive out began to seem a bit light.

We had decided to start with the interpreter using a bullhorn to announce that Ambassador Hill was coming into the camp to address the residents. The people closest to us would be able to hear it, and we'd wait for their reaction. Hill would then enter the camp flanked by Ted and Paul, holding lights. I would troop along with both arms overhead, displaying a towel-sized American flag I'd grabbed on the way out of my house. Between the flag and Hill's face we hoped to be allowed to pass far enough into the crowd for him to be able to make a speech at a spot where he could be seen and heard by as many people as possible. If he was able to calm things down, I'd try to get vehicles up to the building and we'd load the families and get out as fast as we could. There was no Plan B. Ambassador Hill looked around, said he was as ready as he was going to get, and headed for the gate. Initially, our biggest problem was visibility, but the people on the edge of the crowd quickly turned to face us, recognized Ambassador Hill, and let us pass. With each step farther into the crowd, though, it got hotter, denser, and darker. Paul Jones grabbed a plastic crate for a podium as we pushed on. Around us the crowd swirled but people's attention increasingly turned to us. When we were about midway to the building, Hill stood on the crate while the interpreter continued announcing, "Ambassador Hill is here!" People yelled at each other in Albanian, "The Americans! Ambassador Hill!" Hill raised his arms for quiet and people began to shout, "Quiet! Everyone sit down!" Astoundingly, hundreds of men all around us began to sit on the ground so everyone could see and hear the ambassador. Hill started to speak, and bit by bit, word by word, proceeded to transform the mob into an audience. He announced that NATO had just presented Milosevic with its non-negotiable plan to enter Kosovo. He told them how close Milosevic was to giving in, how close they were to being able to go back home. He said he knew they had suffered grievously and knew they thought the people in the building were guilty of atrocities, but they would bring

"Give me the chance to take custody of these people and determine their guilt or innocence. I will do right by you. We have been through too much together to shame ourselves by making a horrible mistake." People listened, whispered among themselves. The whole crowd was now quiet, a mass of half-seen faces disappearing off into the darkness all around us. As Hill spoke, I moved back toward the gate, using my awkward Albanian to ask people to clear a way for "the cars Ambassador Hill wants." This did not result in anyone actually moving — I was no Hill! — but at least they knew that vehicles were going to head that way. Two vans were waiting, and we inched them through the crowd and up to the building. The staff inside quickly loaded the battered Roma into the vans as hundreds of stillsurly but now quiet men stood packed against the building, glaring. We drove out fast. I jumped out at the gate and the vans tore off for a hospital. Ambassador Hill was thanking the crowd and urging everyone to return to their tents. He was given a loud ovation and, amazingly, people started to drift off into the darkness. It was over.

Within a few days we confirmed from records that these particular Roma had all been in Macedonia during the time they were accused of having committed war crimes in Kosovo. Tension, rumor, and mass hysteria had created the mob that had come so close to killing them. Within weeks, Stenkovac Camp was virtually empty, its former residents back in Kosovo trying to pick up the pieces of their lives. The beaten men recovered, and those families, too, went their own ways.

We never talked much about that night again — each day at Embassy Skopje brought too many new problems and issues connected with the Kosovo crisis. But I've come to realize that night was characteristic of much of our work in the Foreign Service: We confront so many unknowns, we have so little time, and — on scales large and small — the consequences of our actions and inactions can be so extraordinarily profound.

I was happy to hear that the President created a White House Council on Women and Girls. I remember last summer how you said women's issues and health care were what you now wanted to focus on And I know you want to help with health care. I think you can I hesitate to ask anything of you, but feel compelled because we are at a turning point for health care and our nation latent with possibility, but fraught with danger. There is now a small window of opportunity that may not be seen for another generation. That's why I am writing this letter (and I apologize in advance for its length). I live on the ground as a practicing doctor with real people suffering real problems that I know have real solutions that are being overlooked and hold the key to saving our health care system from self-destruction

Last night I went to hear Howard Dean give a talk in the Berkshires on health care reform. The core tenets of the Obama plan are solid. But absent from the conversation was the need to face the reality that more access to acute care medicine for chronic disease will cost more and provide poorer outcomes. And prevention, as it is being discussed, mostly refers to application of "early detection" according the Clinical Preventive Services Guidelines, and stops far short of what is needed We do not need to simply give more access to the medicine we have, but to do something different. It is the puth elephant in the room

A very different model based on systems/functional medicine has to be the "intel inside" for our health care system and guide reform, from what is reimbursed, to how doctors are educated, to how medical care facilities are designed to create enrollment by patients in their "health" care through education, classes in nutrition, stress management delivered by integrated health care teams, to how we design electronic records, to how conduct systems based research, and comparative effectiveness research to compare not drug to drug, but whole systems approaches to conventional approaches

I believe that key avenues for sustainable change are being overlooked. I know you know these issues backwards and forwards, and care deeply about this. I know the exigencies and restrictions of your position, but I hope you can open a few doors so the right people in the administration get the right information and guidance as policies are crafted. There is a coalition of key leaders in medicine who can help create fundamental change, rather than simply re-arranging deck chairs on the litanic. Their voices need to be front and center

Is there a way you can help arrange a meeting with Secretary Designate Ms. Sibelius, Nancy-Ann Min DeParle, key Senate and congressional leaders, Zeke. Peter Orzag, Zeke and perhaps you and the Prosident with a few key thought leaders who can present a model for change that is out of the box, but at the center of what where medicine is heading including Wayne Jonas, Jeffrey Bland, Ralph Synderman, John Podesta, myself and a few key others. John Podesta has been instrumental in developing a proposal called WIN (Wellness Initiative for the Nation) that provides a systems oriented model for developing policy, strategy and initiatives extend the potential for change beyond direct reform of health care delivery and financing.

We would like the opportunity to suggest a key wellness policy team within the White House that would work with the Office of Health Care Reform and draw on national experts (a SWAT team) to help interface with the rapidly evolving transformation of medicine to systems medicine and wellness rooted in the model of Functional medicine.

I am faxing that proposal so you have the detail behind it and sending it in a separate email in ease those with attachments get blocked. I will also send you the executive one page summary of the proposal. It can be the vehicle for ongoing coordination and strategy

I am also attaching (and will fax to your house because I don't know if attachments get through), an essay of mine to be published next month that details key reforms that can change the "intel inside" for real heath care reform. There won't be this chance for another generation. I hope you can help us. If not we will find another way. God willing.

SUMMARY DOCUMENT

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Wellness Initiative for the Nation (WIN) is to proactively prevent disease and illness, promote health and productivity, and create well-being and flourishing for the people of America. WIN can also prevent the looming fiscal disaster in our health care system. In fact, effectively addressing preventable chronic illness and creating a productive, self-care society is our only long-term hope for changing a system that costs too much and is delivering less health and little care to fewer people. 1, 3

OVERVIEW AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- The overarching recommendation is to create a Wellness Initiative for the Nation focused on promotion of health through lifestyle change and integrative health practices. WIN would be overseen by the White House, with a Director and staff to guide relevant aspects of health reform, as described in the recent report, The Health Care Delivery System: A Blueprint for Reform (the "Blueprint"). 4
- WIN will focus primarily on accomplishing goal three of the Obama/Biden Health Reform Plan - "improve prevention and public health" - and support development of an educational workforce and informational toolkit for delivery of this goal in local populations. WIN leadership will provide program analysis, develop policies, guide curriculum and evidence standards, and establish incentives and mechanisms that support these efforts in national health care reform.
- WIN will align with overarching goals of the "Blueprint" and Healthy People 2010 (Increasing Quality and Years of Healthy Life and Eliminating Health Disparities) 5 and link to recommendations such as the "Wellness Trust," 5 a "Federal Health Reserve," 7 the Institute of Medicine's reports on health care quality, 8 transformation, 9 integrative medicine, 10 and the White House Commission on Complementary and Alternative Medicine Policy. 11

The initial step towards a Wellness Initiative for the Nation (WIN) is to create a White House office, with a Director and staff, specifically focused on developing policies and programs for lifestyle-based chronic disease prevention and management, integrative health care practices and health promotion.

- The policies and programs of WIN would be grounded in the continuity of health and the prevention of illness throughout the human lifecycle and would approach this continuity through comprehensive lifestyle and integrative health care approaches that have demonstrated effectiveness.

Other specific recommendations are as follows:

1. SYSTEMS WELLNESS ADVANCEMENT TEAMS NETWORK ("THE INNOVATORS")

- ★ Establish a network of Systems Wellness Advancement Teams (SWAT) with national and then local leaders in health promotion/disease prevention and integrative practices to maintain the wellness vision and guide the White House in the implementation of this new paradigm.
- ★ Empower the SWAT network to continuously evaluate and translate effective prevention and health promotion practices into local delivery tools and policy changes.
- * Create learning communities that evaluate and translate innovations in lifestyle and integrative health practices into new settings and populations across the network.

2. HEALTH AND WELLNESS PROFESSIONAL COACH TRAINING ("THE ADVOCATES")

- ★ Establish educational and practice standards in delivery of effective, comprehensive lifestyle and integrative health care approaches, and train individuals qualified to focus full-time on prevention, creating health and healing, and enhancing productivity and flourishing.
- Facilitate any qualified and state licensed health care practitioner or educator to gain specialist certification in prevention, health and wellness delivery, or attain sub-specialist status for integrative health care delivery in specific settings and populations--for example, schools, worksites, health care settings, and long-term care facilities.
- * Create a Health Corps to provide an army of young and older people that would learn and model wellness behavior and support delivery of wellness education and training by the coaches.

3. HEALTH AND WELLNESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY TOOLKIT ("THE AVATARS")

- ★ Create an advanced information tracking and feedback system (an applied health promotion technology toolkit) for delivery of personalized wellness education, customized to each person's level of readiness, IT capabilities and stage of life.
- * Interface this applied wellness toolkit with electronic health records for use by the public, the health and wellness coaches, the Health Corps, and the medical and health care delivery systems.
- * Coalesce current health promotion/prevention knowledge into a science-based Health Quotient Index (HQI) for personalized delivery of information to individuals and communities through multiple interface.

4. ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL INCENTIVES ("THE INDUSTRY")

- ★ Create economic incentives (through bundling, capitation, premium reductions, tax reductions and other methods) for individuals, communities, and public and private sector institutions to create and deliver self-care training, wellness products and preventive health care practices.
- ★ Establish intellectual property protection policies that reward wellness innovations, using the latest technologies with evidence-based and comparative cost-value determinations.
- ★ Establish incentives for both personal and community activities that establish social and cultural change, which creates public wellness values and a flourishing society.

These recommendations are designed to work in a coordinated fashion on the specific leverage points of cultural and institutional change. If applied in concert, theses recommendations are a "triple multiplier" of health, productivity and economic stimulus for the country by: 1) creating new jobs in the educational, health and technology sectors; 2) increasing health and productivity across the population in both the short and long-run; and, 3) stimulating innovation and investment by the private sector into the creation of a health and wellness industry and society.

The United States is first in spending for health care but 37th in health status among industrialized nations. If applied in concert, theses recommendations are a "triple multiplier" of health, productivity and economic stimulus for our nation.


A PHASED PROGRAM

The WIN will use a phased approach to assure that prevention and health promotion programs are rolled out in a coordinated, systematic, stepwise and effective manner with full input from the public and stakeholders involved in wellness delivery. **Recommended phases** include:

- Phase 1: Create a working group and coordinating office within the White House that is specifically focused on creating policies and programs for lifestyle-based chronic disease prevention and management, integrative health care practices and health promotion;
- Phase 2: Establish a lead Systems Wellness Advancement Team (SWAT) of national leaders in health promotion, disease prevention, and integrative practices to guide the office;
- Phase 3: Define the "new paradigm" the key vision, strategies, and tactics and the effective elements and metrics of comprehensive lifestyle and integrative health care practices that will be the focus of WIN;
- Phase 4: Collate, coordinate and align current health promotion and prevention policy efforts such as,
 House Concurrent Resolution 406, The Health Promotion First Act, the Healthy Workforce Act, The Health
 Project, the 1st Dollar Clinical Preventive Services Coverage, the Medicare Improvement Act, the Public Health
 Advisory Committee, and consensus statements by the Partnership for Prevention, the Prevention Institute, the
 American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, and other programs and recommendations;¹²
- Phase 5: Use and evaluate current Department of Defense, Veterans Health Affairs, Medicare and workforce health, performance enhancement and wellness initiatives to rapidly establish models for delivery of national WIN projects;
- Phase 6: Create and evaluate new demonstration projects in each of the WIN lifecycle populations (e.g., children, worksites and aging; see below for details) to improve the cost-value of national programs created by the WIN; set up selection, modeling and evaluation parameters using indices such as COMPARE and Health Impact Assessment (HIA) processes;¹³ 14
- Phase 7: Create parallel legislative tracks to support and incentivize effective public and private wellness initiatives throughout the nation;

BACKGROUND

Too many Americans go without high-value preventive services and health promotion practices. ⁵ As a result, they get slck and utilize expensive medical interventions. ¹ Examples of underutilized preventive and health promotion practices include cancer screening to prevent advanced colon disease, immunizations to protect against flu or pneumonia, fitness and resilience training to enhance productivity and well-being, self-care and integrative health practices to treat chronic pain and enhance healing, and healthy lifestyle education to prevent diabetes, hypertension, stroke, cardiovascular disease and cancer.

The nation (and increasingly the world) faces epidemics of obesity, mental illness and chronic disease, as well as new threats of pandemic flu and bioterrorism. ^{15, 16} Yet despite all of this, less than four cents of every health care dollar is spent on prevention and public health. ¹⁷ We are first in spending for health care and 37th in health of the industrialized nations. ¹⁸ At current cost rates, health care will make up 25% of the GNP by 2025 and 49% by 2082! ¹⁹ The first of the "baby boomers" will turn 65 in 2011, creating an avalanche of aging care needs that will bury the current Medicare system. Our health care system is a broken disease treatment system, and the time for change is well overdue.

True prevention and health promotion requires something different than just access to current services. It requires a new vision of health and disease based on the primary components of human flourishing. Science has now clearly demonstrated a radically new view of chronic health and disease than the one developed over 100 years ago and currently in use. No longer is it reasonable to wait until disease reaches an advanced diagnostic threshold before our system provides expensive interventions.

In his book The Power of Progress, John Podesta summarizes the situation succinctly. "It is not enough to merely expand access to the current system. Americans must also secure better value for their health care dollars through improved health care quality, outcomes, and efficiency. First, we must create a national focus on disease prevention and health promotion. The United States is plagued by preventable diseases that have a devastating impact on personal health and contribute to the nation's soaring health costs. Yet our current system focuses on treating these diseases after they occur, rather than promoting good health and reducing the incidence of disease in the first place."2 (pg. 182)

THE COST OF AVOIDABLE CHRONIC ILLNESS

- * A recent Milken Institute report showed that the combined cost of the top seven modifiable chronic diseases (cancer, diabetes, hypertension, stroke, heart disease, pulmonary conditions, and mental disorders) exceeds \$270 billion per year in direct care costs and, with the addition of lost productivity, reaches over \$1 trillion annually. 20
- ★ These costs are largely avoidable by changes in behavior. A modest focus on prevention, early intervention and behavioral change could save annually in treatment and productivity loss costs an estimated \$217 billion and \$1.6 trillion, respectively. This could add over \$6.9 trillion to the GDP between now and 2023—27% of the GDP's economic impact.
- Modest gains in just smoking and obesity control, for example, would reduce illness in the top seven conditions by 24-30 million, save up to \$100 billion in treatment costs, and add from \$340-500 billion to the GDP in the next 15 years.
- Application of the top 20 proven clinical preventive services (CPS) would save an additional \$4 billion in treatment costs and increase quality of life years by over 2 million. ²¹ WIN will focus on effective delivery for the 10 CPS recommendations that address core primary prevention and lifestyle change factors. ²¹

Suffering associated with chronic disease and pain produces an even greater burden, the cost of which is not quantifiable. Self-care practices can reduce pain, improve quality of life and enhance well-being. ^{22, 23, 24} Complementary health care practices are especially useful in this regard. ^{25,26}


CAUSES OF AVOIDABLE CHRONIC DISEASE

- Seventy percent of avoidable costs could be mitigated by behavior changes that involve healthy lifestyle development, wellness enhancement, and early detection and intervention for the conditions listed above. Two-thirds of chronic illness is caused by lifestyle and behavioral factors that are influenced by our mental, social or physical environments. ²⁷
- ★ Five behavioral factors contribute the most to mitigating costs and to increasing sustainable wellness. These are: 1) reducing toxic substance exposure (smoking, alcohol, drugs and pollution); 2) sufficient exercise; 3) healthy diet; 4) psychosocial integration and stress management; and 5) early detection and intervention. 20, 28
- To achieve gains in wellness and productivity requires a change in the nature of the culture and services provided to our communities. Increased access to our current disease treatment system is not sufficient and will increase costs. We need a concerted investment in creating a flourishing human capital focused on prevention, productivity, healing and well-being. ²⁹

COMPONENTS OF HUMAN HEALTH BEHAVIOR AND PRODUCTIVITY OPTIMIZATION

We know now that health and disease are a continuum and we know the fundamental elements that move us along that continuum. Both before and after the threshold, between health and disease, the basic elements of health promotion can slow or prevent chronic disease progression and enhance function, productivity and well-being. No matter what the illness or stage of life we now know that the same components of human health behavior and productivity optimization apply. These components are:


- Stress Management and Resilience. The first
 component is the induction of mind-body states known to
 counter the stress response and improve readiness and
 motivational factors for lifestyle change. Recent research
 has demonstrated that mind/body practices can be taught
 and can counter the physical and psychological effects of
 stress, prevent PTSD, increase fitness and weight
 management, and enhance cognitive and physical function.
- Physical Exercise and Sleep. The second component
 is physical exercise. Optimum physical exercise can reduce
 stress hormone swings and improve brain function,
 improve fitness and enhance weight control. Fitness, along
 with proper rest and sleep, and rapid management of
 injury from physical training, will maintain functioning and
 productivity.



3. Optimum Nutrition and Substance Use. Third, ideal weight and optimal physiological function occurs best in the context of proper nutrition and reduced exposure to chemicals (such as smoking, alcohol and drugs) that impair

function. Food and substance management requires systematic motivational systems, environmental control, food and substance selection training, and family and community involvement.

4. Social Integration. Finally, the social environment is key. Social integration is not only health enhancing in its own right, but is essential for sustainability of behavior change. Health promotion is best achieved in a group and community context, in which common issues in the culture around behavior and lifestyle change are valued and shared with peers, friends and family. Both health and happiness are socially contagious. Social integration allows individuals, their families and communities the opportunity to spread healthy behavior and find day-to-day solutions for maintaining well-being and resilience.

A culture and industry that values and optimizes these components will produce a flourishing, productive society. In addition, the impending economic disaster of continuing to solely apply the current sickness treatment system to our rapidly aging population can be altered at its core. The policy recommendations of WIN are designed to focus directly on optimizing these components for individuals and communities.

CREATING SOURCES OF PREVENTION, PRODUCTIVITY, HEALING AND WELLNESS

- ★ Public policy should support, stimulate and enhance each individual's inherent wellness and healing capacities since this provides the most powerful force we have for maintaining health and productivity when well, and for enhancing recovery and well-being when ill. 30
- Approaches to the prevention of chronic disease, detection of early risk factors, and enhancement of well-being are well known but not done well or systemically by our health care system.
- ★ Central to a new model of prevention and health care are the development of Optimal Healing Environments (OHE) ³¹ and integrative health care practices ²⁶ that can support and stimulate inherent healing capacities on mental, social, spiritual and physical levels. As described below, many of these practices provide lower cost alternatives to current conventional practices. ^{32, 33}
- * Of the "Blueprint" recommendations, WIN will focus specifically on

 supporting areas in "Patient Activation" (pp 81-95) and "Public Health" (pp.

 96-111) but also contribute to other areas, including nurse and geriatric

 training (p. 9, 23), wellness information technology (p. 27, 47), and developing bundling, capitation and tax relief approaches for delivery of evidence-based health promotion and integrative health care practices (p. 69-71).


MODELS OF SUCCESSFUL PREVENTION AND HEALTH PROMOTION

THE MILITARY

The military has been at the forefront of health promotion and performance enhancement innovations for decades and has recently developed a renewed effort in "human performance optimization". ³⁴ The non-profit Samueli Institute is working closely with a coalition of military partners to develop the next generation "Systems Wellness System" as a model for combining systems biology with lifestyle change to develop personalized prevention and health promotion tools. ³⁵ This program could become a model for national application.




HEALTH CARE DELIVERY SYSTEMS

The health care delivery industry has a major role in advancing prevention and wellness and the "Blueprint" is primarily focused on this area. A recent study of eight "exemplar" OHE programs in health systems demonstrated the ways in which WIN could translate current innovations in health promotion and healing into our health care systems. 36 The use of health information technology could further extend skills in health promotion and self-care and disease management beyond the walls of the hospital and into communities and the home. 37

SELF-CARE AND INTEGRATED CARE

The widespread application of selected, evidence-based integrated health care practices could markedly improve quality of life and reduce costs. 33 Behavioral and mind-body practices have been repeatedly demonstrated to enhance quality of life, improve self-care and reduce costs. 38 Acupuncture has now been definitively shown to improve chronic pain conditions (head, neck, knee and back) at almost twice the rate of guidelinebased conventional treatment. 39,40 Massage may be even more cost effective in back pain. 41 Massage has also been shown in



multiple studies to accelerate recovery of premature babies, with projected cost savings of \$4.7 billion per year if widely used. 42 Training retired persons to deliver this infant massage results in reduced depression and enhanced quality of life in those giving the massage – a double benefit. 43 Herbs and dietary supplements are widely used by the population but with little to no guidance on what is safe and effective. 44 Under current policies, these practices and products are not sufficiently profitable to provide economic incentives for research and investment. Thus, they remain underinvestigated and unutilized at the expense of higher cost and more heroic treatment approaches. A properly focused wellness policy would change this situation.

WORKSITES


It is now well established that multi-component worksite wellness programs enhance productivity, well-being and return on investment (ROI) in industry. 45 For example, Procter and Gamble and the Dow Chemical Company have improved productivity and reduced health care costs, with a positive ROI for their programs at multiple sites. 46, 47 Companies are now extending these efforts to reducing costs of medical treatment and for chronic disease prevention and management. 48 Health promotion efforts for America's workers is a double multiplier for the economy by improving productivity and creating jobs. 49 The C. Everett Koop Awards of The Health Project have selected some of the most successful and innovative health promotion programs that could be applied nationally by the WIN. 50

COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS

Community-based, comprehensive lifestyle modification programs have demonstrated effectiveness for mitigating cardiovascular risk factors⁵¹, stroke prevention⁵², smoking cessation ⁵³, treating obesity⁵⁴ and osteoporosis⁵⁵, and diabetes prevention⁵⁶, as well as other chronic conditions. ⁵⁷ In Japan, comprehensive lifestyle modification programs including physical exercise and diet/nutrition education have been implemented and extensively evaluated in work sites and in elderly populations, and results have shown dramatic improvements for obesity and lifestyle-related disease. 58 The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has targeted community-based programs as an effective vehicle for delivering health promotion and disease prevention campaigns.

CHILDREN

Wellness must start with children by teaching them lifelong healthy habits. Healthy habits need to be a core competency delivered by our educational system. A number of exemplar programs in schools have produced major impacts on wellness behavior, including effects on obesity. For example, a school program in underserved elementary school children has demonstrated improved health behaviors that spread to families and the surrounding community. ⁵⁹ Other examples are the *Planet Health Program*, and the VERB Program. ^{60, 61, 62, 63, 64} The Wellspring Academy's schools, camps and community programs have produced marked success in improved weight management, enhanced self-esteem and improved mental health during adolescence, a difficult time of life to affect change. ^{60, 65}



The Wellness Initiative for the Nation will select the best of these programs and develop policies to establish them throughout the United States. The long-term impact of such policies would be a golden age of health, productivity and wellbeing; a flourishing and great society.



AGING

Our population is rapidly aging, resulting in ballooning of chronic disease and illness. The majority of health care costs are expended in the last years of life. The older population is highly motivated for self-care and makes extensive use of complementary and alternative practices, some helpful and some harmful. ^{66, 67} Extending functional years through prevention (such as vaccination), early detection (such as screening), lifestyle and self-management training can also reduce costs of chronic disease treatment. For example, simple procedures (such as providing a health coach or call nurse) significantly reduce health care costs and mortality in cardiovascular disease. ⁶⁸ Extension of health care into the home with TeleHealth (the delivery of health-related services and information via telecommunications technologies) could further maintain function and reduce costs in the senior population up to 70% with current technologies. ^{69,70,71} A set of recently funded Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) demonstration projects of health promotion in older people are examples of programs that serve as national models under the WIN. ⁷²

THE UNDERSERVED

The widening gap in health disparities is one of the major moral failures of our society. ⁷³ Social isolation and socioeconomic class are major determinants of chronic disease and premature death. ²⁷ The poor often seek out and use self-care and complementary medical practices, but get little guidance on which practices are effective or harmful. ⁷⁴ Self-care and integrative health care approaches, when properly delivered, can significantly improve health in these populations. For example, a recent Medicaid demonstration project providing integrative health care found an 86% reduction in pain, 25% reduction in health care utilization and 20% reduction in prescription drug use in an underserved community. ^{75, 76} The Samueli Institute, along with the Institute for Alternative Futures and the Health Resources and Services Administration recently brought together integrated health care programs for the underserved as possible models for WIN. ⁷⁴


These examples are only a few of the practices that could improve health, productivity and well-being, and reduce costs from disease and disability in our nation. 



I met yesterday with Palau's new President who HRC is to meet with tomorrow at 11. I'm writing to give HRC some perspective beyond what she may get from EAP and to suggest points for her to make. I'll start with the points. I'd like to discuss questions.

- I'm delighted to meet you, President Toribiong (Tohr-rib-e-yong), my opposite number, Minister Pierantozzi (Peer-antoe-zee), and the other members of the delegation. I tried hard to get a better job than Sandra was elected to as vice-president ... but we have pretty good jobs now, don't we, Sandra?
- I'm proud that the Compact was entered into in my husband's administration.
- It's disappointing the Bush Administration didn't do what it should have to complete the Compact Review process this
 year.
- But now we have new administrations. I understand you will re-evaluate your predecessor's proposal. I'll look at our position too.
- I hope, however, we can complete the process soon, although I understand it will take some time. I promise high-level, understanding, and sympathetic attention. I will designate a representative shortly.
- The U.S. and Palau have a special bond formed by decades of territorial administration and I know our responsibilities.
- And I understand that free association is not pure independence and you want to continue a very close relationship.
- The President's Budget is largely completed but I will look into your FY10 request and will work with OMB and Congress
 on it. I also understand the problem of the trust fund created by the market and earlier expectations.
- I've been to Guam. I understand that Palau has some of the most beautiful islands in the world, the 'rainbow's end.'
- Thanks for coming. We'll work with you on the Review and in the years ahead seriously, fairly, and responsibly.

Now, some background. We took Palau from Japan in bloody WWII battles and administered it for the UN. It became a 'freely associated state' in 1994. HRC and I have discussed this status as one of Puerto Rico's options. In free association, nations share governing responsibilities. We have full security rights in strategic Palau, provide Pell Grants, and Postal Service, etc. At the staff level, I guided congressional changes that Palauan reformers sought to the Compact of Free Association which the Reagan and Bush 1 Administrations tried to force on the territory. It was a tough battle that included the suicide of the corrupt first president allied with Reagan and Bush. Minister of State Pierantozzi was a leading reformer. President Toribiong was in the group.

A Review of the Compact is due this year with a focus on whether Palau's operational needs are being met. After years of US appropriations, a trust fund was supposed to fully meet the needs after year 15. But the trust, unrealistically expected by the US to grow 12% per year, will not be able to replace all appropriations according to the GAO. Early last year, Palau's last president made a Compact extension proposal but the Bush Administration failed to respond. Palau's lawyer, who I know from the Carter WH, quoted the head of the Australia, NZ, & Pacific Islands Office, Alcy Frelick (who he gives good marks to) saying she hadn't been able to get support within DoS.

Toribiong wants to revise his predecessor's proposal a bit and has three requests. 1) HRC ask OMB for current funding to continue through FY10 to provide time for talks since they didn't really begin as they should have last year, there are new administrations here and there, and it is unrealistic to get the talks done and legislation passed this fiscal year. This position is supported in the attached letter sent HRC Monday by the chairs of the Senate and House committees, Sen. Lugar, and others.

2) The talks be serious and consider his administration's proposal (vs. his predecessor's) 3) The U.S. be represented by someone who can command the necessary attention. (I think EAP is planning to have Frelick. She is capable but maybe there should be someone higher or more special. There was a special Negotiator for the Reviews with the other two freely associated states.)

Toribiong says Palau needs \$20 m in Compact funding in FY10. \$15 m will come from the trust but he would like \$5 m through continued Compact appropriations. A fallback would be to take it from the trust but that would further deplete the trust.

Finally, the Bush Administration's inclination was to transform free association into pure independence. Palau wanted and wants a closer relationship with the US and this is important as a precedent for US territories for which statehood is not an option.

I met yesterday with Palau's new President who HRC is to meet with tomorrow at 11. I'm writing to give HRC some perspective beyond what she may get from EAP and to suggest points for her to make. I'll start with the points. I'd like to discuss questions.

- I'm delighted to meet you, President Toribiong (Tohr-rib-e-yong), my opposite number, Minister Pierantozzi (Peer-antoe-zee), and the other members of the delegation. I tried hard to get a better job than Sandra was elected to as vicepresident ... but we have pretty good jobs now, don't we, Sandra?
- I'm proud that the Compact was entered into in my husband's administration.
- It's disappointing the Bush Administration didn't do what it should have to complete the Compact Review process this vear.
- But now we have new administrations. I understand you will re-evaluate your predecessor's proposal. I'll look at our position too.
- I hope, however, we can complete the process soon, although I understand it will take some time. I promise high-level, understanding, and sympathetic attention. I will designate a representative shortly.
- The U.S. and Palau have a special bond formed by decades of territorial administration and I know our responsibilities.
- And I understand that free association is not pure independence and you want to continue a very close relationship.
- The President's Budget is largely completed but I will look into your FY10 request and will work with OMB and Congress on it. I also understand the problem of the trust fund created by the market and earlier expectations.
- I've been to Guam. I understand that Palau has some of the most beautiful islands in the world, the 'rainbow's end.'
- Thanks for coming. We'll work with you on the Review and in the years ahead seriously, fairly, and responsibly.

Now, some background. We took Palau from Japan in bloody WWII battles and administered it for the UN. It became a 'freely associated state' in 1994. HRC and I have discussed this status as one of Puerto Rico's options. In free association, nations share governing responsibilities. We have full security rights in strategic Palau, provide Pell Grants, and Postal Service, etc. At the staff level, I guided congressional changes that Palauan reformers sought to the Compact of Free Association which the Reagan and Bush 1 Administrations tried to force on the territory. It was a tough battle that included the suicide of the corrupt first president allied with Reagan and Bush. Minister of State Pierantozzi was a leading reformer. President Toribiong was in the group.

A Review of the Compact is due this year with a focus on whether Palau's operational needs are being met. After years of US appropriations, a trust fund was supposed to fully meet the needs after year 15. But the trust, unrealistically expected by the US to grow 12% per year, will not be able to replace all appropriations according to the GAO. Early last year, Palau's last president made a Compact extension proposal but the Bush Administration failed to respond. Palau's lawyer, who I know from the Carter WH, quoted the head of the Australia, NZ, & Pacific Islands Office, Alcy Frelick (who he gives good marks to) saying she hadn't been able to get support within DoS.

Toribiong wants to revise his predecessor's proposal a bit and has three requests. 1) HRC ask OMB for current funding to

continue through FY10 to provide time for talks since they didn't really begin as they should have last year, there are new administrations here and there, and it is unrealistic to get the talks done and legislation passed this fiscal year. This position is supported in the attached letter sent HRC Monday by the chairs of the Senate and House committees, Sen. Lugar, and others. 2) The talks be serious and consider his administration's proposal (vs. his predecessor's). 3) The U.S. be represented by someone who can command the necessary attention. (I think EAP is planning to have Frelick. She is capable but maybe there should be someone higher or more special. There was a special Negotiator for the Reviews with the other two freely associated states.)

Toribiong says Palau needs \$20 m in Compact funding in FY10. \$15 m will come from the trust but he would like \$5 m through continued Compact appropriations. A fallback would be to take it from the trust but that would further deplete the trust.

Finally, the Bush Administration's inclination was to transform free association into pure independence. Palau wanted and wants a closer relationship with the US and this is important as a precedent for US territories for which statehood is not an

Obama names general who was top US military commander in Afghanistan as new ambassador there

Associated Press March 11, 2009

WASHINGTON - President Barack Obama on Wednesday named a career military officer who once was the top U.S. commander in Afghanistan to be the next ambassador to the war-torn country and tapped a veteran diplomat to be the new American envoy in Iraq.

The White House said Obama had nominated Lt. Gen. Karl W. Eikenberry, who served in Afghanistan twice, including an 18-month tour that ended in 2007, to be ambassador in Kabul, and Christopher Hill, a seasoned negotiator who led the U.S. team at nuclear disarmament talks during the Bush administration, to be ambassador in Baghdad.

He also named:

_ Ivo Daalder, a former Clinton administration National Security Council official, to be ambassador to NATO.

Aléxander Vershbow, a former ambassador to Russia and South Korea, to be assistant secretary of defense for international security.

Richard Verma, a lawyer and former Senate aide, to head the State Department's legal team.

"These extraordinarily accomplished individuals have served their country with great distinction, and they have

each agreed to take on tough assignments," Obama said in a statement. "I am confident that they will work with a sense of purpose and pragmatism ... as we renew American diplomacy, strengthen our military, and advance our values and interests around the world."

The picks for the two most prominent jobs announced on Wednesday, Eikenberry and Hill, had been known well in advance. Obama, in fact, already had announced his choice of Hill to succeed Ryan Crocker as ambassador in Iraq.

The formal nominations set the stage for Senate confirmation hearings and eventual votes on their selections.

Sen. Sam Brownback said he was disappointed in Hill's appointment. In a statement released Wednesday, Brownback, R-Kan., said Obama should reconsider Hill because he lacked experience in the Middle East and had been "evasive and unprofessional" in past dealings with Congress.

With his Afghanistan experience, Eikenberry knows the issues facing the troubled country and its players, including the challenge of a resurgent Taliban and the need to build up an Afghan army to take on that fight. He has warned repeatedly that the U.S. cannot win in Afghanistan and defeat global terrorism without doing something about al-Qaida fighters holed up in neighboring Pakistan.

Those issues are at the heart of a sweeping strategy review the Obama administration is conducting to define and reshape the U.S. mission in Afghanistan and Pakistan. Obama recently announced a plan to send 17,000 additional U.S. troops there, and is weighing a request by ground commanders to send even more.

Obama is expected to announce the results of the Afghanistan review before traveling to Strasbourg, France, for a NATO summit in early April.

Hill is a career foreign service officer who before heading the U.S. negotiating team with North Korea had served as ambassador to Poland and Macedonia and as a negotiator in the crises in Bosnia and Kosovo.

Put Peace Before Justice

IN 2001 a hospital operated by my relief organization in the southern Sudanese town of Lui was bombed nine times by forces of President Omar

Hassan al-Bashir Two years later, I had what would be my first of three meetings with Mr Bashir, now one of the most wanted men on the planet

I confronted him about these attacks he was fully aware of them. After our

meeting they stopped Mr. Bashir is rightly accused of great cruelty and destruction. But I have been able to deal with him

It now looks as if the International Criminal Court will finally bring

Bashir to his knees Tomorrow the court is expected to announce its decision

to issue an arrest warrant for the president, the first time it has sought

the detention of a sitting head of state. Yet arresting Mr. Bashir now

likely only create further chaos in Sudan, which in recent years has been

convulsed by separate conflicts in the south and in the Darfur region in the west.

The court may have good intentions. After all, any civilized person would condemn Mr. Bashir for his behavior. I have done so to his face

In 16 years of relief work in Sudan, I have witnessed much of the violence

that his government has inflicted. An estimated 300,000 people in Darfur have died and 2.5 million people have fled their homes in the wake of fighting among rebels, government forces and their allied Janjaweed militias. Nor does the destruction stop there: Our organization has identified nearly 500 churches that were destroyed by Mr Bashir's

But arresting Mr Bashir now threatens to undo the progress his country has

made. In 2005, Sudan's government and the Sudan People's Liberation Movement

signed an accord ending the civil war in the south. The agreement paved

way for elections in the south later this year, as well as for a referendum

on southern independence scheduled for 2011. The accord has brought

to Sudan, but it isn't clear that they will last Mr Bashir, who fought members of his own party to approve the deal, is critical to the peace process.

I want to see justice served, but my desire for peace in Sudan is

Mr Bashir, accused of genocide and crimes against humanity, is hardly

ideal peacemaker But given all the warring factions in Sudan, there is

guarantee that his replacement would be better

For all his faults, Mr. Bashir has demonstrated that he is able to cooperate. On several occasions he has complied with my requests. When a liospital we operated in eastern Sudan was seized by government forces,

Bashir granted us limited access. Mr Bashir also made television time available for us to broadcast a Christian program at Christmas and

More important, Mr. Bashir helped make the peace agreement a reality. Now.

his arrest could threaten the south's elections and referendum, and hurl the

country back into civil war. His removal could also spur retaliation by Bashir loyalists and other forces against civilians, United Nations peacekeepers or international aid workers.

We do have other options. The statute that established the court allows for

the United Nations Security Council to postpone the court's proceedings

12 months, giving Sudan the time it will need to achieve peace. In that period President Bashir should do everything he can to ensure that the provisions of the agreement go fully into effect, and to cooperate with the

United Nations and the United States to bring about political stability in Darfur

President Obama can also do his part He should move quickly to appoint

a special envoy to Sudan, as he has wisely done in other hot spots of the world. Economic problems at home should not distract America's president from exerting leadership to avert a crisis that threatens the future of Africa's largest nation.

The removal of Mr Bashir will make it harder to negotiate an end to the crisis in Sudan. Ultimately, justice will be served by a power higher

the International Criminal Court. In the meantime, justice without peace would be a hollow victory.

Burns:

I hope this email finds you well-situated with the Eleison Group since the rigors of the campaign, when we met at Saddleback Church in California in conjunction with then-Senator Clinton's appearance at the AIDS & the Church conference prior to the start of the primary season.

Perhaps you have been following news this past week about the trip to Sudan by Rev. Franklin Graham, son of Billy Graham, for whom I have represented for 28 years, and about whom I met privately with Mrs. Clinton at her request. Franklin Graham met for 45 minutes with President Omar al-Bashir - four hours before the International Criminal Court (ICC) issued a warrant for his arrest. Franklin then went to Juba and met with Dalva Kiir, President of Government of South Sudan.

Samaritan's Purse, the Boone, NC-based relief and development organization headed by Rev. Graham, has more than 300 staff on the ground in all conflict areas of Sudan -- including Darfur, Nuba, Blue Nile, Hamesh Koreb and South Sudan.

Rev. Graham has a unique relationship with both leaders and an informed perspective on the situation, the longstanding involvement and presence of his work in the region. He asked me to inquire on his behalf whether Secretary Clinton would be interested in meeting with him upon his return this week as the only American to talk to Bashir, to discuss his perspective about Sudan and its future, as well as the situation of South Sudan and the fragile Comprehensive Peace Agreement.

I have reached out to Josh DuBois to see if President Obama might have similar interest, but did not know how to best reach out to Secretary Clinton in her new responsibilities - which make her the likely Administration representative to have such a meeting, if interested or available.

I look forward to hearing from you at your earliest convenience. Thanks, Burns.

Put Peace Before Justice

IN 2001 a hospital operated by my relief organization in the southern Sudanese town of Lui was bombed nine times by forces of President Omar Hassan al-Bashir Two years later, I had what would be my first of three meetings with Mr. Bashir, now one of the most wanted men on the planet When I confronted him about these attacks he was fully aware of them. After our meeting they stopped Mr. Bashir is rightly accused of great cruelty and destruction. But I have been able to deal with him.

It now looks as if the International Criminal Court will finally bring Mr. Bashir to his knees. Tomorrow the court is expected to announce its decision to issue an arrest warrant for the president, the first time it has sought the detention of a sitting head of state. Yet arresting Mr. Bashir now will likely only create further chaos in Sudan, which in recent years has been convulsed by separate conflicts in the south and in the Darfur region in the west.

The court may have good intentions. After all, any civilized person would condemn Mr Bashir for his behavior. I have done so to his face.

In 16 years of relief work in Sudan, I have witnessed much of the violence that his government has inflicted. An estimated 300,000 people in Darfur have died and 2.5 million people have fled their homes in the wake of fighting among rebels, government forces and their allied Janjaweed militias. Nor does the destruction stop there: Our organization has identified nearly 500 churches that were destroyed by Mr. Bashir's forces.

But arresting Mr. Bashir now threatens to undo the progress his country has made. In 2005, Sudan's government and the Sudan People's Liberation Movement signed an accord ending the civil war in the south. The agreement paved the way for elections in the south later this year, as well as for a referendum on southern independence scheduled for 2011. The accord has brought benefits to Sudan, but it isn't clear that they will last. Mr. Bashir, who fought members of his own party to approve the deal, is critical to the peace process.

I want to see justice served, but my desire for peace in Sudan is stronger. Mr. Bashir, accused of genocide and crimes against humanity, is hardly an ideal peacemaker. But given all the warring factions in Sudan, there is no guarantee that his replacement would be better.

For all his faults, Mr. Bashir has demonstrated that he is able to cooperate. On several occasions he has complied with my requests. When a hospital we operated in eastern Sudan was seized by government forces,

Mr. Bashir granted us limited access. Mr. Bashir also made television time available for us to broadcast a Christian program at Christmas and Easter.

More important, Mr. Bashir helped make the peace agreement a reality. Now, his arrest could threaten the south's elections and referendum, and hurl the country back into civil war. His removal could also spur retaliation by Bashir loyalists and other forces against civilians, United Nations peacekeepers or international aid workers.

We do have other options. The statute that established the court allows for the United Nations Security Council to postpone the court's proceedings for 12 months, giving Sudan the time it will need to achieve peace. In that period President Bashir should do everything he can to ensure that the provisions of the agreement go fully into effect, and to cooperate with the United Nations and the United States to bring about political stability in Darfur.

President Obama can also do his part He should move quickly to appoint a special envoy to Sudan, as he has wisely done in other hot spots of the world Economic problems at home should not distract America's president from exerting leadership to avert a crisis that threatens the future of Africa's largest nation.

The removal of Mr. Bashir will make it harder to negotiate an end to the crisis in Sudan. Ultimately, justice will be served by a power higher than the International Criminal Court. In the meantime, justice without peace would be a hollow victory.







Five Options for Student Event

Auditorium photo backdrop, auditorium-style seating for up to 300 students, media, and staff




The largest venue for the student event is an auditorium on the second floor of the power plant. The plant has offered to provide a wall-sized photo of the GE turbine, a photo of the plant, or another visual of our choice to use as a backdrop, as the auditorium has no windows. There is a raised stage; a podium or presidium table could be placed on the stage. Seating is auditorium-style and could hold 250 students, plus 50 seats for media and staff. Q & A would be done with a passed microphone. This venue is the most standard venue for a large speech.

Pros: Nice auditorium, large photo backdrop could be tailored to our needs - turbine, overview of plant, etc. The venue has good audio and plenty of room for a camera riser and cutaway photo.

Cons: No natural shot of the power plant (would have to create this using a backdrop). Large, formal setting is not as intimate as some of the other venues.

2. Large room, photo backdrop, flexible configuration for up to 70 people



The plant has offered to provide a wall-sized photo of the GE turbine, a photo of the plant, or another visual of our choice. Seating could be classroom style that can seat 70 students or an expanded roundtable that can seat 20 students.

Pros: Nice room, good visual with photo, good audio, and sizable press area.

Cons: No natural shot of the power plant (would have to create this using a backdrop.)

3. Conference room, good shot of "smokeless" smoke stacks in background, 20 students around table with standing room for media and staff




Roundtable discussion could take place at an oval table that seats 20. Good natural views of the power plant. It would allow for plenty of Q&A and an in-depth conversation with the students.


Pros: Fairly good natural visuals, easy-to-manage controlled space.

Cons: Smallest option, not much room for staff, Q & A portion of the event would need to be longer to make the intimate venue seem natural.

Main lobby, good shot of "smokeless" smoke stacks in background, flexible configuration for up to 40 people, plus media and staff.









Students would be involved in a panel discussion in another venue, then while the Secretary tours the plant, the students would be seated in this area. That way they would not be present during S's "meet and greet" with VIPs from GE and the Power Plant.

Pros: No walk time, good natural views out the windows of the smoke stacks, seating flexible. Easy to pre-place media.

Cons: Area could get noisy if not tightly controlled.

The plant can construct a square conference table around the scale model of the plant. It would allow for p enty of Q&A and an in-depth conversation with the students. Alternatively, they can have the discussion standing up.

Pros: Good visuals including scale model, Chinese screen, red lanterns, and possible cutaway backdrop. Space is large enough to accommodate media and staff on the side. No walk time required,

Cons: Space is in a three-story atrium with possible audio challenges. Plant manager's meet and greet would also have to be incorporated into the student roundtable event.


