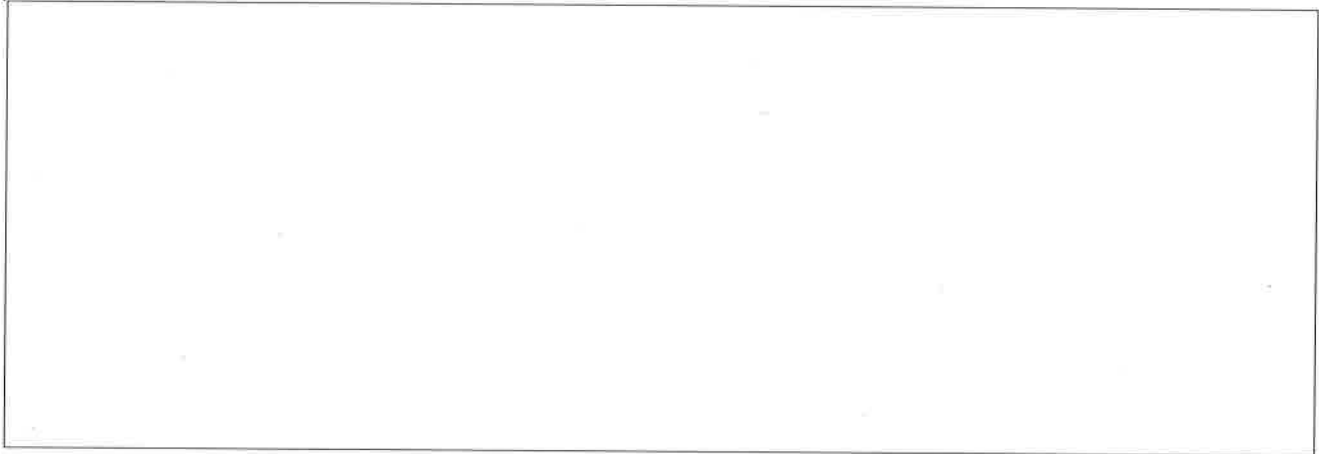

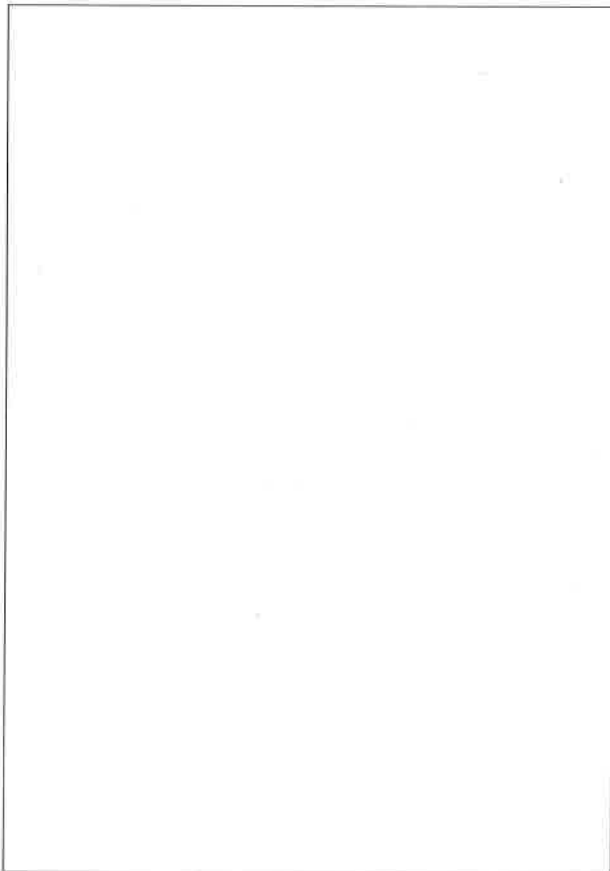

Jewish Anger at Obama

When Secretary of State Hillary Clinton addresses some 7,500 delegates to the American Israel Public Affairs Committee's Washington policy conference on Monday morning, the moment will be fraught.

It's just possible that Clinton, accustomed to being love-bombed by the powerful pro-Israel lobby's conventioners whenever she spoke as New York's junior senator, will be greeted with chilly silence or, worse, scattered boos --the AIPAC membership's angry response to the frayed and apparently deteriorating relationship between Israel and the United States.

"Man, I wouldn't want to be Hillary Clinton going there at this point in time," says Manhattan billionaire James S. Tisch, chief executive of Loews Corp. -- the hotel, insurance and oil exploration conglomerate and a longtime activist in Jewish causes and philanthropies. "I wouldn't be surprised if she gets a 'cold' -- a diplomatic sickness."

"I think this could really be an important point of demarcation for Jewish public opinion of the president," Tisch says.

The 57-year-old Tisch, a big-money political donor who gives to both Democrats and Republicans and supported John McCain in the 2008 presidential election, is typical of wealthy Jewish supporters of Israel, especially in New York, who are bitterly opposed to President Obama's Middle East policies and harshly critical of the officials who are carrying them out.

Tisch was one of a number of Jewish leaders interviewed by the Daily Beast who were angry at Obama -- so much so that they think the issue could affect Jewish donations to Democratic candidates this fall.

But Tisch is unusual in his willingness to air his indignation in public. "I'm outraged, but not surprised," Tisch says about the past week's unpleasantness, in which Vice President Joe Biden was blindsided and embarrassed during his official visit to Israel, when housing authorities there suddenly announced plans for the expansion of U.S.-opposed residential construction in the disputed Arab quarter of East Jerusalem.

Despite Binyamin Netanyahu's sheepish apology and Biden's gracious acceptance, Secretary Clinton phoned the Israeli prime minister last Friday to scorch him for damaging the peace process and Israel's relations with the United

States, and demand that Israel immediately rescind the new construction plans.

White House adviser David Axelrod continued the public thrashing of Israel on last Sunday's Washington talk shows, condemning our historic ally's construction announcement as "an affront" and "an insult" to the United States.

"I don't think he's pro-Israel," Tisch says, voicing the suspicions of many. "I think the president comes to this from Jeremiah Wright's church, and there's no doubt in my mind that in Jeremiah Wright's church, the Palestinians were portrayed as freedom fighters and not as terrorists."

Tisch adds the flap is bound to influence the traditionally Democratic Jewish electorate, nearly 80 percent of which voted for Obama in 2008.

"Now, for the first time, there are a significant number of people in the organized Jewish community that feel that the president has gone too far," Tisch says. It will be interesting to watch "what happens to the president's approval rating among Jewish voters. I think this could really be an important point of demarcation for Jewish public opinion of the president."

Other wealthy Jewish New Yorkers, who are active in the pro-Israel cause as well as Democratic Party politics, agree the issue could depress Jewish support for Democrats next November.

"Obama has done zero favors for the Democratic candidates in 2010," says a prominent Democratic fundraiser who, like most of Jewish activists who spoke for this story, was unwilling to go on the record. "I know a lot of historical Democrats who are big check-writers and even bundlers, who have told me that until things settle down they have no interest in helping any Democrats."

Another politically active Jewish billionaire confirms this assessment. "I think anyone writing a check now is doing it with shaking fingers," this man says. "Not only is Obama changing the nature of our relationship with Israel, he is pushing through health care legislation that will cost everybody more money, he is demonizing Wall Street and the 'big fat cats,' attacking people who gave a lot of money to the Democrats and their candidates for Congress and the presidential race. So this latest thing is the third strike."

A dovish minority approves of Obama's taking Israel to the woodshed. "I am utterly supportive of the president here," Democratic money man Orin Kramer tells The Daily Beast's political reporter, Benjamin Sarlin. "I think the president is on the firmest possible ground."

Former California congressman Mel Levine, an AIPAC board member, seconds Kramer's sentiment, adding that longtime Democrats will remain loyal. "I believe that the donors will overwhelmingly stay with Obama," Levine says. "I fear that our Israeli friends are miscalculating the reaction in the U.S., including among American Jews."

But Abraham Foxman, national director of the influential Anti-Defamation League, is among the Jewish leaders who in the past few days have issued harsh condemnations of the Obama White House. The ADL criticized Obama's "gross overreaction to a point of policy difference among friends," adding that "we are shocked and stunned at the administration's tone and public dressing down of Israel."

"The issue here, for 78 percent of the Jews who voted for Obama, is you condemn your ally and your friend," Foxman says. "But when Syria spits in the president's face by continuing to back Hezbollah, we don't say anything? I think it's nuts."

As for Hillary Clinton, once the darling of the pro-Israel community, "she is just an employee," Foxman says disdainfully. "She is reflecting him."

Los Angeles billionaire and entertainment mogul Haim Saban, who over the past two decades has given tens of millions of dollars to the Democratic Party, says such comments are counterproductive, and counsels all sides to zip their lips.

"I think we should stop talking about this," says Saban, an Egyptian-born Israeli who emigrated to the United States three decades ago.

"It's a crisis. It's a family disagreement between two great friends. Let the powers that be address whatever issues that need to be addressed in private. Israel and the United States are two staunch allies and have been so for sixty-plus years. The relationship is bigger and stronger than any one disagreement or exchange."

Clinton's appointed replacement in the Senate, Kirsten Gillibrand—a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, who irked some Jewish Democrats early last year when she seemed to support Obama's use of tough measures to pressure Israel -- this week issued a statement of strong support for the Jewish state and its "unbreakable" bond with America. Gillibrand is campaigning for election this year.

But former Bush administration official Dan Senor, the co-author of a book-length paean to Israeli economic ingenuity, who's been considering jumping into the race as a Republican, sees the current controversy as an opportunity to attract cross-over Democratic support.

James Tisch expresses skepticism that an Israel-focused Senate campaign would work. "If Dan Senor is going to hang his Senate race on this issue, he might as well save everybody the grief and trouble and not run in the first place," Tisch says.

But Senor, who is expected soon to announce whether or not he's a candidate, sees Israel as just one of host of issues on which to base a campaign—including health care, the economy, and taxes.

"Obama's Israel policy is symptomatic of a larger criticism of Obama's foreign policy," says a person familiar with Senor's thinking. "And that is, the president is downgrading our historic alliances while reaching out to our adversaries."

That was certainly not the impression Obama gave to Jewish organizations during the presidential campaign. As the Democratic primary season came to an end, that AIPAC members cheered Clinton when she vouched for Barack Obama's pro-Israel bona fides. When Obama followed her to the podium at the Washington Convention Center, he elicited whoops of joy as he declared the security of the Jewish state "sacrosanct" and "non-negotiable" and added in a burst of mutual adoration: "Jerusalem will remain the capital of Israel and it must remain undivided."

James Tisch, for one, took it with a grain of salt -- and indeed Obama's campaign quickly softened and fuzzed up his red-meat vow to the AIPAC faithful.

"I'm from the 'don't listen to what they say, watch what they do' school of politics," Tisch says. "It's easy in a Senate race or a presidential race to say you're for an undivided Jerusalem, and now Hillary Clinton is going in exactly the opposite direction. Pay close attention to the AIPAC conference. This is coming up at a truly hot time."

Is the Jewish love affair with the Democratic Party about to end?

For all of my loooooong life, the Jews have been so deep in the pocket of the Democratic Party it would make Chris Matthews blush. Maybe... just maybe... (I know old habits die hard).... thanks to Barack Obama, that is about to end. The well-put lead from this morning's WSJ opinion piece

In recent weeks, the Obama Administration has endorsed "healthy relations" between Iran and Syria, mildly rebuked Syrian President Bashar Assad for accusing the U.S. of "colonialism," and publicly apologized to Moammar Gadhafi for treating him with less than appropriate deference after the Libyan called for "a jihad" against Switzerland.

When it comes to Israel, however, the Administration has no trouble rising to a high pitch of public indignation. On a visit to Israel last week, Vice President Joe Biden condemned an announcement by a mid-level Israeli official that the government had approved a planning stage—the fourth out of seven required—for the construction of 1,600 housing units in north Jerusalem. Assuming final approval, no ground will be broken on the project for at least three years.

The Obama administration has taken the admonition to "Keep your friends close but your enemies closer" to a new level.

They want to make love with their enemies while taking their friends to the woodshed and beating the living daylight out of them. And take them they did, time after time.

First Biden, then Hillary, then some semi-anonymous character at the State Department dressing down Ambassador Oren (talk about disrespecting your betters!), then on to the talk show circuit with the droning Gibbs and Obama's "best Jew" David Axlerod. His other "best Jew" Rahm Emanuel was nowhere in evidence, as far as I know. (Interesting, that).

But back to my lead: Is the Jewish love affair with the Democratic Party about to end? I know many will be skeptical. And they should be. But I suspect something is brewing. The love affair between African-Americans and the Democratic Party has been similarly useless for blacks. In the forty years I have lived in Los Angeles, I haven't noticed life getting significantly better in South Central, a region of the city in which Republicans are about as scarce as killer whales.

For Jews, Obama's behavior is indeed a "teaching moment." The bizarre over-reaction to a minor incident in Israel should serve as a wake up call.

Will it? It won't be easy to tell at first. The coming AIPAC meeting in Washington, at which Clinton and Netanyahu will speak, will undoubtedly contain a certain amount of nice-nice talk. But beneath the surface sands are shifting. We shall see if this morphs into a tectonic plate.

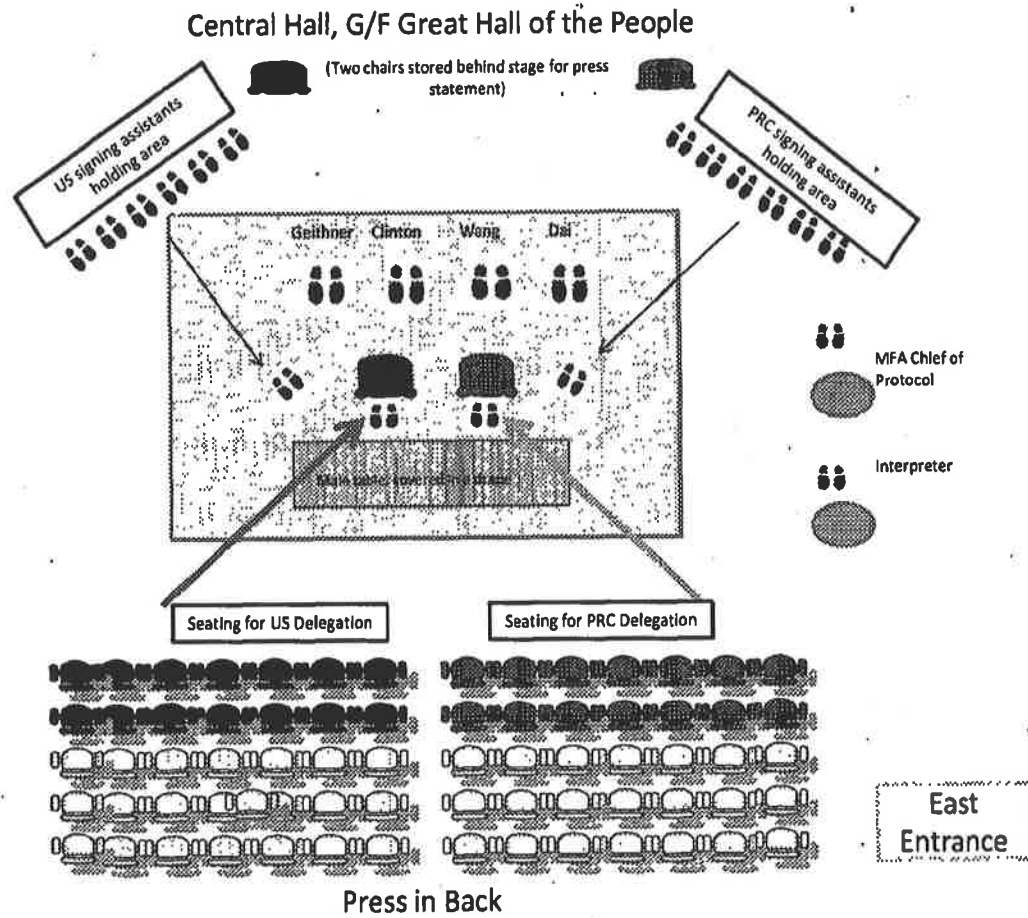






SITE FLOOR DIAGRAM:

Global Opinion in Perspective

Western Europe: Publics Credit U.S. for Relief to Haiti

Britons, French, Germans, Italians, and Spaniards say the United States has done more than other countries to assist Haiti following the devastating January earthquake. Though relief efforts in Haiti have not themselves directly impacted opinion of the United States, the belief that the United States generally assists disaster-stricken countries does positively affect U.S. image.

Awareness of Haiti relief efforts is high in Europe: majorities of Britons (66%), French (92%), Germans (85%), Italians (85%), and Spaniards (70%) have heard at least a fair amount about the earthquake and relief effort in Haiti.

U.S. Credited For Relief Effort

Though certain West European media, particularly in France and in Italy, were initially critical of the U.S. relief effort, editorials in leading media gave way to mostly positive commentary.¹ Public opinion among those who have heard about the Haiti earthquake reflects this more positive take. West Europeans with a definite opinion volunteer the United States as contributing the most to earthquake relief in Haiti, though a third or more in Britain, Spain, and Germany are unsure (Figure 1).

Few in these five countries say their own country contributed the most to earthquake relief. In France, where early editorials were most critical of the U.S., only a quarter say that their country has done the most to aid Haitian relief (Box, next page).

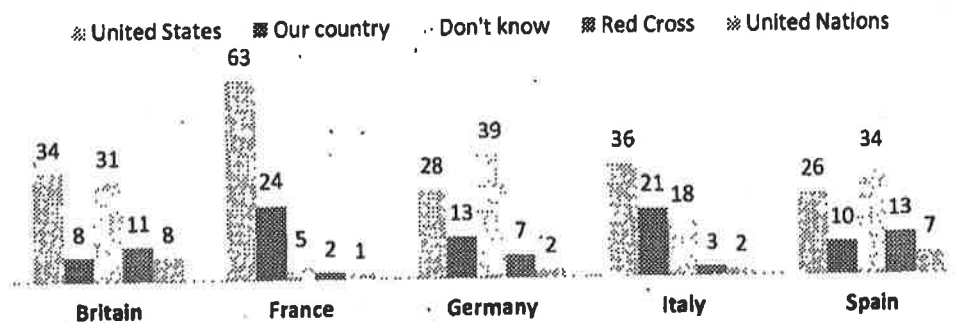
Among those who followed events in Haiti, majorities believe that the United States has done a good job in continuing to help Haitians after the earthquake. Western European publics also give their own countries and the Red Cross high marks for responding (see Appendix Table).

Haiti Aid Has Not Boosted U.S. Image

West Europeans remain generally positive toward the U.S. (Figure 2, next page), but their overall impressions are not significantly influenced by U.S. assistance to Haiti.

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While specific instances of Haiti relief may not move the needle of U.S. image in Western Europe, a broader perception that the United States provides disaster relief in general is a factor in more favorable views. Majorities in Great Britain (77%), Italy (79%), Germany (86%), and France (72%) and half of Spaniards (52%) think the United States aids in disaster relief around the world. West Europeans who perceive the U.S. as generous with its disaster aid are more likely to have a positive view of the U.S.

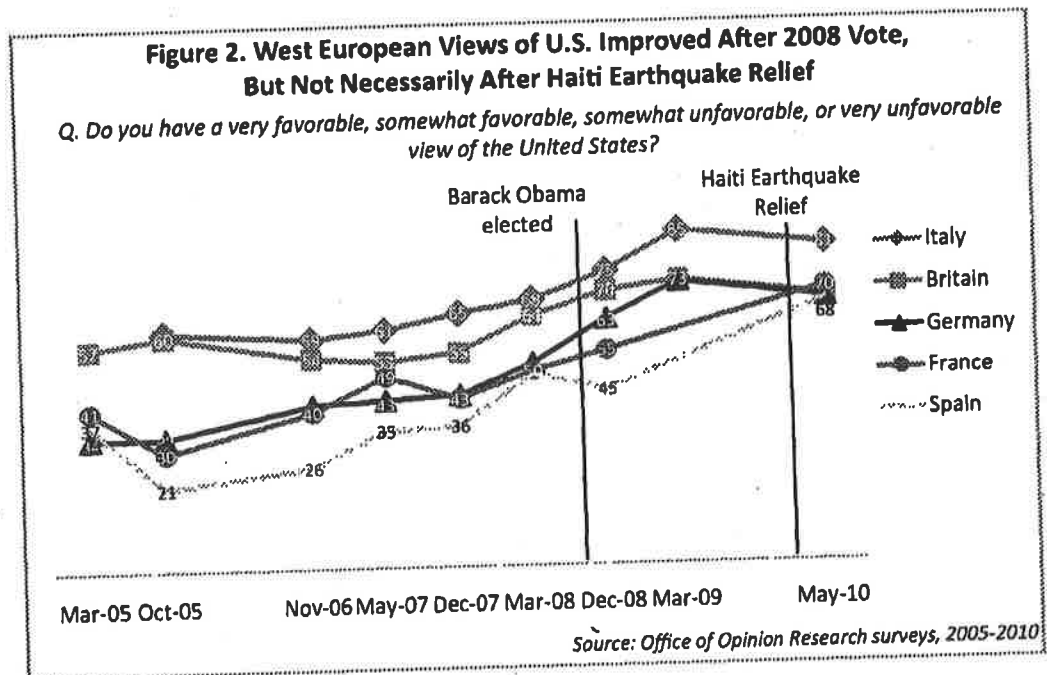
European Publics Satisfied with Their Own Country's Level of Aid

Among those aware of the Haiti earthquake, most are satisfied with their country's contributions to the earthquake relief effort in Haiti, but would be open to some additional financial assistance for the reconstruction effort. When asked if their government should contribute more money to Haiti, majorities in France (80%), Spain (74%), and Italy (60%) and half of Britons (53%) agree.

French Generous With Help for Haiti, Praise for U.S.

The French stand out in Europe in terms of being concerned and willing to help their former colony. An overwhelming majority (92%) have heard or read about the earthquake and the relief effort, including 65 percent who have heard a great deal. Large majorities also show a willingness to give more assistance funds and take in refugees. A majority (63%) recognizes the United States as the prime contributor to the relief effort and 80 percent say Washington has done a good job.

Helping refugees by allowing them to immigrate is much more controversial. Seven-in-ten French (72%) and Spanish (73%) say they would be willing to accept refugees, while majorities in Britain (63%) and Italy (71%) are *unwilling* to accept refugees.

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How This Poll Was Conducted

This report is based on data from nationally representative telephone surveys conducted in Britain (n=1,002) April 21-26; France (n=1,002) April 19-23; Germany (n=1,000) April 23-May3; Italy (n=1,000) April 22-27; and Spain (n=1,000) April 26-May5 among adults age 18 and over. Local survey organizations carried out nationwide fieldwork. Questions were written by the Office of Opinion Research. The vernacular translations were prepared by the local firms and checked by the Office of Opinion Research. The margin of error for each country is approximately +/-4% for the overall sample.

Additional information on the methodology of the surveys may be obtained from the analysts.

I. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Thanks Nancy, for that introduction. I'd like to thank you and CGD for hosting me today, both for articulating that development matters, and for their call to seek meaningful reforms to both USAID and the development community.

II. INTRODUCTION – THE MODERN DEVELOPMENT ENTERPRISE

Nearly every member of this Administration—myself included—has described our approach to development: focused on sustainable growth, committed to mutual accountability, selective in scope and concentrated on results.

I'm not here to do that today. You don't need another speech on the principles that define our approach.

Instead, I hope to describe how USAID has been busy executing that approach and to ask for your help and support to capture the opportunity to elevate development as a major part of how America engages with the rest of the world.

[Pause]

When I took office one year ago, the development community made clear: if the US was to play a leading role in international

development, USAID would have to be strengthened and empowered with certain authorities that had been stripped from the Agency over the course of decades.

[Pause]

We heard you.

[Pause]

One year ago, Secretary Clinton began that effort, pledging that USAID would be rebuilt into the world's premier development agency.

Four months ago, President Obama stood in front of the UN General Assembly and declared that goal to the world, making it a central pillar of his Presidential Policy Directive on development.

And just one month ago, we laid a blueprint for meeting that goal in the Quadrennial Diplomacy and Development Review.

But we didn't wait. Earlier this year we instituted a series of reforms we now call USAID Forward. Thanks to those reforms our Agency is fundamentally changing, becoming more efficient, more effective and more business-like, freeing our talented staff to deliver real results.

We have embarked on this effort to transform how development is delivered because development is not—and cannot be—a sideshow. As the President, and the Secretaries of State, Treasury and Defense have all made clear: development is as critical to our economic prospects and our national security as diplomacy and defense.

That's why our reforms are not trying to build an updated version of a traditional aid agency. We have an obligation to perform at even higher level. That is why we are seeking to build something greater: a modern development enterprise.

III. EXECUTING A CLEAR AND FOCUSED STRATEGY

Like an enterprise, we are developing and executing more innovative and more focused strategies across each of our areas of excellence.

When we unveiled our government's strategy for meeting the Millennium Development Goals, we recognized the enormous development progress the world had made in recent decades. Since 1990, hundreds of millions of people have moved out of poverty and the number of children that die before the age of five has been cut in half.

But we also realized that much more had to be done, and that simply doing more of the same would not lead to further success. As a result, we have changed the way we work in each of our areas of focus.

Food Security

Instead of merely providing food aid in times of emergency, we are helping countries develop their own agricultural sectors, so that they can feed themselves.

We launched Feed the Future – bringing together resources across the federal government and engaging in deeper partnerships to extend the impact of our efforts. We are now leveraging more investment from countries themselves and from other donors. Firms ranging from General Mills to local African seed companies are all doing more.

As a result, in just five of our twenty focus countries we will be able to help nearly 6.5 million poor farmers – most of them women – grow enough food to feed their families and break the grip of hunger and poverty for tens of millions of people.

Global Health

In our Global Health Initiative, instead of a scattered approach that fights individual diseases one at a time, we are pursuing an integrated approach that will generate efficiencies and strengthen health systems.

We are now working with partners such as the NIH, CDC and PEPFAR to leverage recent advances in science and technology, especially in high return areas such as vaccinating children, preventing HIV, malaria and TB and focusing on childhood nutrition during pregnancy and the first two years of life.

Disaster and Crisis Response

Our relentless focus on getting better results at a lower cost applies to everything we do. After our response to the tragic earthquake in Haiti, I commissioned a lessons learned review led by CGD Alum Ruth Levine. Today, we are acting on its findings by speeding the time between response, recovery and long-term development in every crisis in which we engage.

Economic Growth

Because we know that we are safer and more prosperous in a world with more South Koreas and fewer North Koreas, we have prioritized economic growth and democratic governance in everything we do.

But in doing so we are rejecting the traditional assumption that a series of development projects alone will lead to growth. Instead, we are developing partnerships for growth with countries committed to enabling the private sector investment that is the basis of sustainable economic development. And we are stretching our dollars. Through our Development Credit Authority, for example, we can attract twenty seven dollars from the private sector for every dollar we invest.

Democracy and Governance

Instead of merely paying to hold elections, we are now funding new open government technologies to quickly and significantly increase transparency, so can citizens can hold their governments accountable. For example, our new Development Innovation Venture Fund supported an effort to test the use of a mobile phone-based electronic election monitoring system for Afghanistan.

We are bringing a similar spirit of innovation, science and technology and strategic thinking to areas such as education, water, and climate. In each of these core areas, we either have already or will soon release comprehensive strategies that detail how we can achieve development gains faster, more sustainably, and at lower cost so more people can benefit.

IV. MEASURING AND EVALUATING OUR WORK

Like an enterprise, we are relentlessly focused on delivering results and learning from successes and failures.

Remember, USAID used to be the world leader in development evaluation, creating many of the standards currently employed by our community. When DFID uses a logical framework to define the path between inputs and impact, they are using tools USAID pioneered.

But we've fallen far from that world class distinction: in 1994, USAID conducted nearly 500 evaluations; by the time I arrived, only 170 evaluations were submitted to Washington, despite a threefold increase in the programs we managed.

In many instances our project evaluations have been commissioned by the same organizations that implement them. Often what passes for evaluation follows a 2-2-2 model: two contractors spending two weeks abroad conducting two-dozen interviews. For about \$30,000 they produce a report no one needs and no one reads.

And the results they claim often have little grounding in fact: one of our implementing partners claimed over a quarter-of-a-million people benefitted from \$14,000 spent rehabilitating an Iraqi morgue.

This has led to a relationship between implementing partners and evaluators akin to that between investment banks and rating agencies. Just like investors couldn't tell the difference between triple-A investments and junk, taxpayers can't tell the difference between a development breakthrough and projects that fall short.

[Pause]

None of us should settle for subprime development.

Today, I'm announcing a new evaluation policy that I believe will set a new standard in our field. By aggressively measuring and learning from our results, we will extend the impact of our ideas and knowledge.

- Every major project will require a performance evaluation conducted by independent third parties, not by the implementing partners themselves.
- Instead of simply reporting our results, like nearly all Aid agencies do, we will collect baseline data and employ study designs that explain what would have happened without our interventions, so we can know for sure the impact of our programs.
- And in the spirit of the extreme transparency I promised when I joined USAID, we will release the results of all of our evaluations within three months of their completion, whether they tell a story of success or failure.

We're going to integrate this project level evaluation data into our new foreignassistance.gov dashboard, an easy-to-use, intuitive Web site that highlights State and USAID's spending across the world.

We also are committed to increasing our partnerships to strengthen our ability to learn from others. To do so we have joined the International Initiative for Impact Evaluations.

I want the American taxpayer to know that every dollar they invest in USAID is being invested in the smartest, most efficient, and most transparent way possible.

V. RECRUITING AND PROMOTING TALENT

Like an enterprise, we realize the crucial importance of our talent.

At points throughout our history, USAID was a top destination for talented men and women pursuing the discipline of development. I know that because many of those talented civil service employees are still here, even in the face of budget cuts and the erosion of USAID's capacity over the last many years. People like George Laudato our Middle East Bureau head, and Bambi Arellano, the Agency's Counselor.

I'm proud to say that USAID is now once again a top destination for those pursuing the discipline of development.

Just last week, I was late to a meeting because I got caught up in a hallway debate between Steve Radelet and Michael Kremer, two of the world's leading development economists.

Anyone who has worked with us recently knows how valuable it is to have a Senate-confirmed leader like Nancy Lindborg in charge of our Democracy, Conflict and Humanitarian Assistance portfolio, or a leading Foreign Service Officer like Susan Reichle in charge of our Policy Bureau.

DLI

But we've also strengthened pathways for bright students and distinguished mid-career professionals to join our Agency, like the Development Leadership Initiative.

This initiative gained bipartisan congressional support because the previous Administration correctly made the case that recruiting smart, experienced and capable colleagues into our Agency would be cheaper and more effective than hiring contractors. The DLI program is well-structured and highly selective: for every person we hire, more than 20 apply.

We are making improvements to this program – bring on more mid-career technical professionals capable of managing complex contracts and deploying them more quickly to key tasks. That has allowed us to staff priority initiatives like Feed the Future, priority countries like Haiti, Afghanistan and Pakistan, and our USAID Forward reform priorities. To achieve serious reform in development, it is critical we continue this effort.

VI. DELIVERING SHAREHOLDER VALUE

Like an enterprise, we are focused on delivering the highest possible value for our shareholders—in our case, the American people.

We will deliver that value by scaling back our footprint to shift resources to critical regions; rationalizing our operations, insourcing functions we currently outsource at great expense; and vigilantly fighting fraud, waste and corruption.

USAID has successfully established a new budget office, giving us the flexibility and control we need to be selective and targeted in our work. We've already used this authority to generate \$X savings across the next five years.

Mission Closings

Some of these savings come from closing missions, especially in countries where rapid economic growth and development successes have created the conditions where American assistance is frankly no longer necessary.

Countries that were former recipients of aid, like India and Brazil have become donors themselves. We need to develop new strategic partnerships with these countries that respect their rise and leverage their technical expertise to help others – as we are doing with the newly launched Feed the Future partnership with India to support efforts to eliminate hunger in Africa.

I have asked my teams to continue to work with the State Department to accelerate graduations from assistance where practical. By 2015, we believe USAID can graduate away from assistance in at least seven countries, starting with Montenegro in 2012.

I have also called for the elimination and restructuring of costly senior positions in Paris, Geneva, Rome and Tokyo, saving us a total of \$7.5 million over five years. These moves allow us to reallocate talent to priority regions like Afghanistan, Pakistan, Haiti and sub-Saharan Africa.

When I joined USAID, I was shocked to discover that over 40% of our positions in sub-Saharan Africa were vacant. Any effort that is serious about ending hunger, or stopping the spread of disease, or preventing the emergence of safe havens for terrorism, or creating the markets of tomorrow, must tackle the development challenges of sub-Saharan Africa. It is the epicenter of our work.

People say bureaucracies cannot reorient quickly, but we have realigned our talent and are closing the staffing gap in Africa completely.

Squeezing Operations

All great enterprises relentlessly focus on efficiency, searching for savings no matter how small they may seem. Our team has found opportunities to save \$50 million over 5 years in administrative savings by eliminating or renegotiating high-cost leases, consolidating our back office operations and reconfigure our IT systems. Even something as seemingly miniscule as changing our default font size can save us money in printing costs.

Fraud, Waste and Corruption

But the real savings will come from how we manage our implementing partners.

Every enterprise relies on contractors and depends on them to succeed. USAID is no different.

But I want to make it clear: we do not work for our contractors, our contractors work for us.

We are building a culture of oversight to prevent waste, fraud and abuse in the first place, and vigorously respond when it does occur.

We will hold all our implementing partners to strict account, regardless of their size. Too big to fail does not exist in our world.

To further demonstrate our resolve, I've created a new suspension and debarment taskforce, led by our Deputy Administrator Don Steinberg. This task force will provide a coordinated effort to closely monitor, investigate and respond to suspicious activity. As many of you know, we recently suspended one of our largest implementing organizations pending an ongoing investigation.

VIII. SERVING OUR CUSTOMERS

Lastly, like an enterprise, we are listening to and improving the way we serve our customers in our case the people of the developing world.

Frankly, this is the area in which official development agencies – all of them including USAID—have struggled.

In our case, as our workforce shrank while our obligations grew, the road to the developing world increasingly ran through the beltway.

Fifty years ago, almost to the day, President Eisenhower gave a remarkable farewell address warning about the emergence of a military-industrial complex; a war machine that would justify its own existence and expansion.

Today, the development community faces a similar crossroads. Our industry is full of incentives designed to prolong our efforts, rather than reduce them.

As a result, handoffs rarely happen; development loans, grants and contracts are extended in perpetuity while goals remain just out of reach. There is always another high-priced consultant that must take another flight to attend another conference or lead another training.

I say today to the development contractors, large NGOs and all practitioners of development: these days must end.

We need to understand that unlike other industries—unlike an enterprise—we have no interest in our own growth.

We must seek to put ourselves out of business, replaced over time by efficient local governments, thriving civil societies and vibrant private sectors.

USAID is aggressively doing its part. This Agency is no longer satisfied with writing big checks to big contractors and calling it development.

We've already accelerated our funding for local NGOs and local entrepreneurs—change agents who have the cultural knowledge and in-country expertise to ensure assistance leads to lasting growth.

All of this is part of the most aggressive procurement and contracting reform our Agency has ever seen.

One of the best days I had as Administrator last year was signing an order that created a vehicle to compensate local partners based on performance—the number of health workers trained, or the volume of crops produced—rather than on how many people employed, or trucks procured. With the single stroke of a pen, I felt I was making the world a better place.

Today I'm announcing another new reform. I'm proud to say that the vast majority of USAID's assistance is competitively awarded—nearly 87%. But we can do better. As of today, any project extensions in excess of \$5 million granted without a competitive process will require the personal, expressed clearance of our procurement executive. By making this shift, USAID will incentivize partners to achieve the outcomes they seek in the time they suggest, and present them with significant competition when they do not.

This year, USAID will celebrate its 50th anniversary. Our legacy is filled with incredible accomplishments. Throughout those fifty years, we have contributed greatly toward ending an incomprehensible measure of human suffering, and I urge you to learn more about our Agency's rich legacy through our newly launched anniversary Web site, <http://50th.usaid.gov>.

But if I am lucky enough to live another 50 years, I hope I am also lucky enough to witness problems we work on resolved. Instead, I hope we will be commemorating the success of USAID's mission.

IX. FROM THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE

Reflecting on our anniversary has reminded me of the first time I ever heard about USAID. I was a young child travelling to Bombay—now Mumbai—to see my relatives. Before returning home, my uncle insisted that I travel with him to one of the slums near his family's home. I was shocked by what I saw. There were pits of open sewage, and children were running through garbage and waste. It was clear that none of the kids went to school, and despite being around my own age, they all looked thinner and smaller and more frail than I.

The images of those children has stuck with me for a long, long time. We were the same age and the same race, but the lottery of life guaranteed that we would have very different futures.

[Pause]

As we were leaving that slum, there was another image that also stuck with me. There was a billboard describing a local water treatment system that the city was putting in place, with the support of the US government. And right in the middle of this billboard was a logo depicting a handshake; the logo of USAID.

In recent years, we've added a tagline that represents that handshake: "From the American People."

But in my time at USAID, I've come to learn that our assistance is not just from the American people, it's also for the American people.

ECONOMIC BENEFITS

Economically, our assistance develops the markets of the future; long-time aid recipients like India, Indonesia, Poland and South Korea have now become strong trade partners and markets for American goods.

I travelled back to India with the President last year where we saw a solar-powered microirrigation pump, whose solar cells were manufactured by a small company in Georgia called Suniva. That company is growing; they've already created hundreds of manufacturing jobs in Georgia, and they soon plan to build another manufacturing plant in Michigan.

That transaction, which brought a solar manufacturer from the American South to a rural village in India, could not have happened without the sustained commitment of foreign assistance.

Our nation's economic future will in part be determined by the countries in which USAID currently has a presence. In 10-20 years, being competitive as a nation will require being able to sell products to the growing middle class in Asia, Latin America, the Middle East and sub-Saharan Africa. In fact, the combined economic potential of African countries is higher than the GDP of China – one of the reasons China is expanding its work in Africa at a much higher rate than Western countries.

But even today, the developing world looms large in America's economic fortunes. Our country's fastest growing markets—representing roughly half of US exports—are developing countries. In 2009, we exported over half-a-trillion dollars to those countries, and 97% of those export revenues went to small- and-medium US companies, precisely those firms that are the engine of American job growth. That's why for every 10% increase we see in exports, there is a 7% decrease in unemployment here at home.

NATIONAL SECURITY

In addition to helping us compete in tomorrow's global economy, our assistance also keeps us safe now.

AfPak

In the most volatile regions of Afghanistan and Pakistan, we work side-by-side with the military, playing a critical role in our nation's effort to stabilize those countries and build responsive local governance.

On a daily basis, our people put themselves in harm's way and suffer casualties, working on the same problems as our military while utilizing a different set of tools.

In Afghanistan, we helped improve agricultural yields in the Arghandab Valley, stabilizing a region in which our military suffered casualties to secure. As a result, farmers shipped the first agricultural export out of the Kandahar airport in 40 years. We've also rebuilt the civil service in the South East of the country and helped fuel a 40% reduction in the growth of opium poppies that fund Taliban operations.

In Pakistan, our Foreign Service National workforce and support of local organizations allow us to go where others cannot. Through our Office of Transition Initiatives alone, we now administer nearly 1,400 projects and programs in the Federally Administered Tribal Areas of Pakistan, responding quickly to local needs. In the Malakand province, we've renovated 150 schools so that children seeking an education can look beyond extremist madrasahs.

I visited both countries multiple times over the last year and I can report to you: whether it's establishing basic health services for 80% of Afghans within a two hour distance of their homes, or it is setting up local Shuras in Northwest Pakistan to build viable sub-national governance in lawless regions, USAID's work is absolutely essential to keeping us safe.

That isn't just my opinion; it is the belief of Secretary Gates who has been loud and vocal advocate of USAID and has repeatedly called for greater investment in our capabilities.

As a community, we must strengthen the role we play in these situations.

Based on decades of experience working in these environments, next month we will unveil USAID's first ever policy on the role of development assistance in countering violent extremism and insurgency. Our policy will build on tools like the District Stabilizations Framework, built in close collaboration with the Pentagon, allowing local commanders to hone in the precise data that describes what issues are at the heart of local unrest.

Ultimately, our work needs to increase short-term stability, while easing the transition between conflict, fragile peace and long-term development.

Colombia

But when it comes to national security, our work goes far beyond partnering with the military to combat Al Qaeda and the Taliban.

Over the last several decades, USAID, in partnership with the Colombian government, has launched several successful programs aimed at directing farmers away from coca cultivation. We've seen coca cultivation plummet by as much as 85% since 2005 in areas of the country where we had an integrated whole of government plan.

The lesson we learned in Colombia is that we are most successful when we target our assistance on the drivers of conflict, working in partnership with local communities, leaders and governments to overcome them.

Sudan

And while USAID can work in active conflict, or help countries transition away from violence, the most important thing we can do is prevent conflict in the first place. As Secretary Gates has said when supporting our work in the past: "Development is a lot cheaper than sending soldiers."

In Southern Sudan, the USAID mission is working hard to ensure that an inspiring expression of democracy does not lead to yet another bout of regional bloodshed.

Our team in Juba has been in place for years, implementing projects which set the stage for the recent, historic referendum. In fact, many other bilateral and multilateral partners, like DFID and the World Bank, are co-investing in our programs and using our implementation mechanisms to foster peace.

Five months ago, when the world seemed convinced the referendum would not occur, our team worked with the UN and NGO partners to design, procure and pre-position ballots. We believed in being prepared. That foresight aided the historic referendum to proceed on schedule in a peaceful and orderly manner. So far the region has avoided a descent into violence that many feared.

But if peace escapes the people of Sudan yet again, we have food and humanitarian supplies at the ready, and teams on the ground supporting conflict mitigation efforts in contested areas. Having lived through genocides in Rwanda and Darfur, we remain committed to preventing the kind of ethnic persecution we've seen so often in the region from ever occurring again.

AMERICAN VALUES

When we prevent violence in Southern Sudan, we're not just avoiding future military involvement; we're also expressing American values.

When schoolchildren organize bakesales to pay for anti-malarial bednets, they are expressing American values.

When more American families give more money to the Haiti relief efforts than watch the Super Bowl, they are expressing American values.

When church groups across the US raise money and volunteer to support children orphaned by AIDS, they are expressing American values.

Just last week, I attended a mass commemorating the one year anniversary of the Haiti earthquake. I was impressed by a flier Catholic Relief Services distributed describing their work to support survivors in Port-Au-Prince.

I'm proud to know that USAID is one of CRS's largest supporters. But I'm also proud to know that we support a wide-range of faith-based organizations, from Samaritan's Purse to the American Jewish World Service.

Faith-based organizations not only express the moral values of millions of Americans, they also provide some of the most dependable support systems for millions in the developing world. In Kenya for example, 30% of all healthcare services are provided by Christian Hospitals.

Our success depends on listening to these groups actively, connecting with them deeply, and supporting the vital work they perform around the world.

X. CONCLUSION: WHAT I BELIEVE ABOUT AID

I know that my remarks today reflect a lot of tough calls for change. I know that over the last year, and in the coming years, I've called for a lot of shifts in how this community operates. Change is never easy, and I thank for the difficult choices you've already made.

But I ask for this change because I believe it is critical to achieving the peace, prosperity and security we all seek.

I believe what leading CEOs like Indira Nooyi of PepsiCo and AG Lafley of Proctor and Gamble believe—that the future of American prosperity will rest on the progress of the developing world.

I believe what military leaders like General David Petraeus and Admiral Mike Mullen believe—that development is critical to keeping America safe and American soldiers out of harm's way.

I believe what religious leaders like Pastor Rick Warren and Bishop Charles Blake believe—that as beneficiaries of peace and prosperity, Americans have a responsibility to assist those less fortunate.

I believe what political leaders like Bill Frist and Tom Daschle believe—that promoting international development is not a Democratic value or a Republican value but an American value.

I believe what President Obama and Secretary Clinton believe—that together we have the power to create the world we seek, if we have the courage to embrace the opportunity.

Now is the time to invest in USAID's capabilities, so we see the day when our assistance is no longer necessary.

We have worked tirelessly to build a better path to the world we seek. Now we must have the courage to follow it.

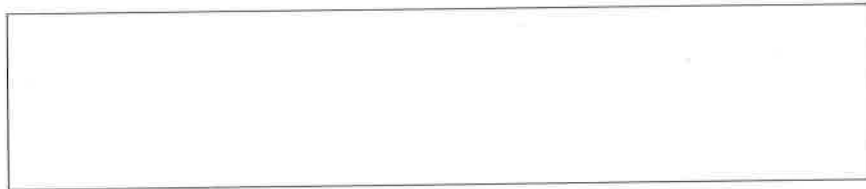

Am certain you had a productive trip. Your public comments were right on the mark!

I was initially disappointed you could not get to Iraq, Af/Pak, the ME. on your first trip, given their priority and POTUS near term decisions on Iraq/Afg. But I do understand, the special envoys were in the region and I assume you did not want to undermine the significance of their visit by following in on their heels.

I respect your choice, the far east, our second most challenging neighborhood and avoiding, at least initially, the normal tendency to visit our friends in Europe. Am convinced in the 21st C the center of gravity for international security and strife has moved east, out of Europe, where it was centered for most of the 20thC.

I visited Sheikh Muhammad (Def MIn) for a few hours on last Saturday, in a private discussion, at his residence in Abu Dhabi. I found him to be quite impressive, a young dynamic leader who is surprisingly modest, yet a visionary leader who is well grounded in reality. The most powerful influence in UAE, despite his older brother, the President; he is destined to succeed him. Believe when you and the POTUS are formulating plans for the region, you should rely on the wisdom of certain key regional leaders whose judgment you trust (know you are doing this but POTUS, has few, if any, relationships in the region). SM is one of the new forward looking leaders, in addition to the Emir and CP of Bahrain and the Sultan of Oman. I was struck by how similar SM is in temperament and personality to the POTUS. We discussed many of his concerns, and of course, he wanted advice on all of it (would prefer to discuss this on the phone). One issue is that he desires an early and influential relationship with the Obama Team and is planning to officially seek a visit during last 2 weeks of March. Anything you can do to assist is appreciated. BTW, I have no financial relationship with SM although he did host my stay at the Emirates Palace Hotel. He desires me to return to discuss the same issues with his brothers and some other UAE influential leaders in the next few months.

Ms Mills;

Jack Lew's office suggested that I go through you to offer some ideas for Secretary Clinton's trip to Mexico next week. If she wants me to expand, I will be happy to do so.

As introduction, I was US Ambassador to Mexico (1993-97), former Member of Congress (Budget Committee Chairman & Ways & Means), former CEO of American Stock Exchange, the last chief of staff to President Lyndon Johnson, and full-fledged supporter of Hillary's campaign last year

Our firm does considerable business in Mexico but deliberately we do not represent any government entities. I go to Mexico at least twice monthly on behalf of foreign direct investors and visit regularly with Calderon ministers and Mexican congressional leaders

Most important words for the Secretary to drive home are collaboration, partnership and stability. Secretary Rice is criticized for identifying Mexico as a "failed state." President Sarkozy was not well received on his recent visit to Mexico because he "sounded much like US political leaders of the past." Given that, I suggest that she address the Mexican Senate or Chamber of Deputies. Sarkozy addressed the Senate. The leader of the Senate with whom I had breakfast in Mexico City last Friday will issue an invitation if there is an interest.

In other words, she can stand in very positive contrast by building on those three words -- collaboration, partnership and stability. I won't suggest texts unless there is interest.

Education is another theme common to both governments. Stressing education reforms, the difficulties but the necessity for our economic future are common threads to build on.

Investment in technology both for security and business development are important. Here I have some ideas about developing bi-national "green innovation zones."

Finally, there is general concern about not having an Ambassador in

place or announced. As the Secretary knows well from our peso crisis days etc, the sensitivity of our bilateral relationship is keenly felt in Mexico and the US Ambassador is an important symbol of the respect it wants. It is not necessary to announce a nominee, but just be prepared to answer that the Obama Administration is aware and will choose a qualified person who will be close to the President and Secretary of State. (I have recommended at least two such persons among many who should be considered.)

The Secretary's trip is very important. If I can be helpful in anyway for briefings or working with the speech writers, I'm happy to do so.

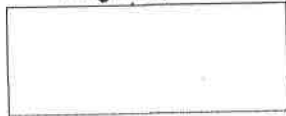

South African MTN to Acquire Lebanon's Investcom

Beirut & London- South African MTN will acquire Investcom for 5.5 billion dollars (4.3 billion euros) in a deal to create the biggest mobile operator in Africa and the Middle East according to MTN group chief executive Phuthuma Nhleko.

Investcom, owned by Mikati group, is based in Beirut and is also listed in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

MTN said in a statement here: "The MTN Group and Investcom LLC announced the landmark deal to create the pre-eminent mobile operator in the emerging markets of Africa and the Middle East.

"The companies have reached an agreement on a transaction through a recommended offer in which the MTN group will offer to acquire the entire issued share capital of Investcom for a total of 5.526 billion dollars (4.3 billion euros)," the company said.

The offer was priced at 3.85 dollars per share in cash, with shareholders also offered a cash and share alternative, MTN said adding that the share-price was based on Investcom's closing share price on Friday.

MTN's Nhleko, says M1 Limited, which owns 70.6% of Investcom – a mobile telecommunications group with a secondary listing in London – has opted to accept a combination of cash and MTN shares for its stake in Investcom.

MTN has given Investcom shareholders the opportunity to accept, instead of cash of \$19.25 per global depositary share (\$3.85 per ordinary share), an alternative offer of \$10.4047 in cash plus 0.9035 MTN shares per Investcom global depositary share.

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This equates to \$2.0809 in cash and 0.1807 MTN shares per Investcom share.

MTN would become the largest mobile operator in Africa and the Middle East and one of the largest players in the world, operating networks in 21 countries with a total of more than 28 million subscribers.

MTN group chief executive Phuthuma Nhleko said: "We are delighted with this transaction which delivers the next stage in the MTN Group's emerging markets growth strategy.

"It substantially enhances MTN's growth prospects, securing a number of important new markets for the MTN Group."

Investcom chief executive Azmi Mikati said that the deal "represents the ideal platform for Investcom to realize its goal of being a leading emerging markets telecom enterprise".

The offer is subject to approval by MTN shareholders and the fulfillment of certain conditions, the company said, without giving details.

The Johannesburg-listed MTN had more than 23 million subscribers across 10 countries in Africa at the end of 2005.

The deal with Investcom is to add Benin, Ghana, Guinea Bissau, Liberia and Sudan in Africa to the list, as well as enlarge its business in the Middle East, notably in Syria and Yemen

Mikati's family could own up to 10% of MTN

Speaking at the presentation of the deal, Nhleko said this meant M1 Limited would end up with between 7% and 10% of MTN, depending on the choices of the other shareholders.

M1 was founded by brothers Taha and Najib Mikati. Taha Mikati is Investcom's chairman while Najib Mikati is the vice-chairman. Investcom CEO Azmi Mikati is Taha Mikati's son.

The acquisition means former Lebanese prime minister Najib Mikati's family could own up to 10% of MTN's shares.

Najib Mikati (pictured above) was appointed prime minister of Lebanon in April last year after the collapse of Omar Karami's government. Mikati's role was to prepare the country for an election, after which he was succeeded by Fouad Siniora in July last year.

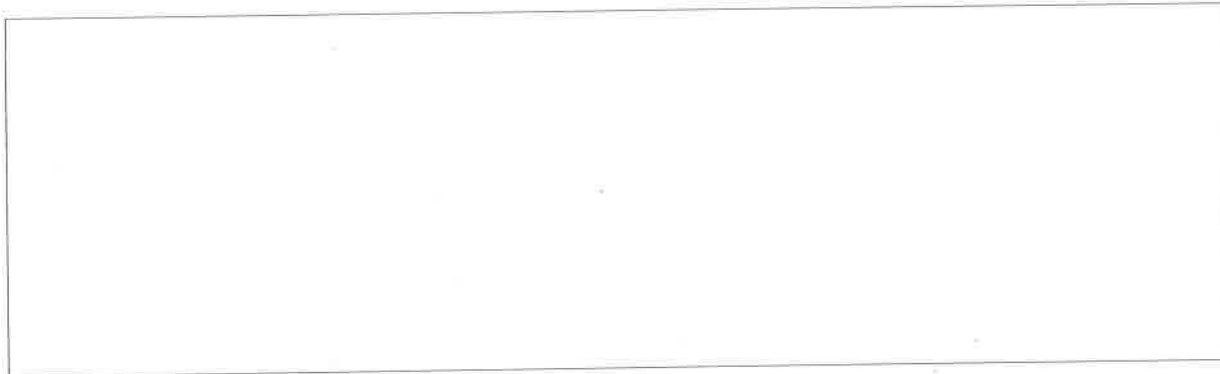

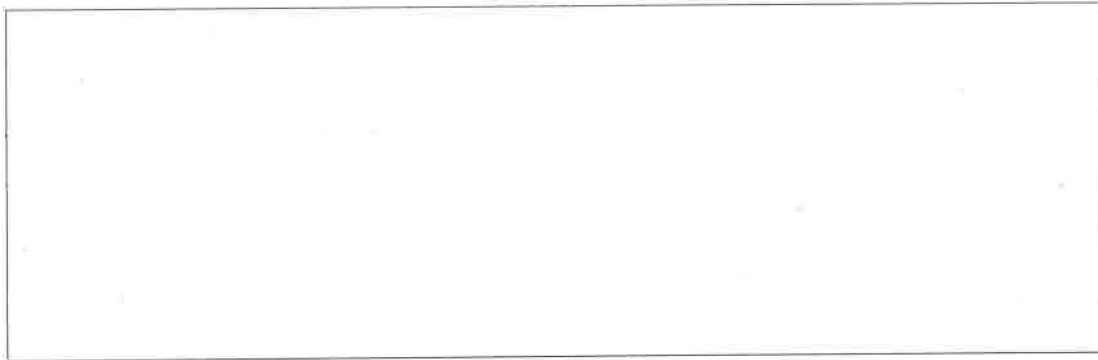
