Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated February 27, 2017, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The processing of records responsive to your request is ongoing and has yielded an additional 193 documents. After reviewing these documents, we have determined that 22 may be released in full, 149 may be released with excisions, and 6 must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonable segregable from the exempt material has been released. For the documents withheld in full, we have cited FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. §§552 (b)(5) and (b)(6).

Handling problems the Obama way

HONOLULU There is a sense of déjà vu in the Obama administrations response to the attempted terrorist attack on Christmas Day. A by-now familiar pattern has been established for dealing with unexpected problems.

First, White House aides downplay the notion that something may have gone wrong on their part. While staying out of the spotlight, the president conveys his efforts to address the situation and his feelings about it through administration officials. After a few days, the White House concedes on the issue, and perhaps Obama even steps out to address it.

That same scenario unfolded over the summer when Obama said Sgt. James Crowley, a white Cambridge, Mass., police officer, acted stupidly when he arrested Henry Louis Gates Jr., a black Harvard professor, in his own home. It happened in March when the public was outraged over AIG dishing out hefty bonuses. More recently the public witnessed the dynamic after a security breach at President Barack Obamas first state dinner.

But the fact that the issue now is a terrorist incident - albeit an unsuccessful one - makes the stakes much higher, and the White Houses usual approach more questionable. That this test of his leadership comes while hes on vacation in tropical Hawaii further complicates things.

After delivering his first public remarks Monday about a Nigerian mans attempt to blow up a Northwest Airlines jetliner over Detroit, the president motorcaded over to the golf course at a nearby country club. Optics aside, it had taken Obama three days to issue a statement on the incident, and the administration was left struggling to get control of the message.

By the time Obama addressed the public with a brief televised statement, his critics had made such headway that the White House was left with this lede in the New York Times: President Obama emerged from Hawaiian seclusion on Monday to try to quell gathering criticism of his administrations handling of the thwarted Christmas Day bombing of an American airliner as a branch of Al Qaeda claimed responsibility.

Its the kind of story the White House might have avoided if Obama hadnt waited so long to forcefully react to the incident.

Critics on the right have predictably seized on his response as a sign of weak leadership. After Obama spoke Monday, Benjamin Friedman, a research fellow for defense and homeland security at the Cato Institute, said his remarks did not do a great job of calming the public.

He didnt try that hard, Friedman said. He just made that comment that we ought to be confident, but he didnt really go into much detail about why we ought to be confident.

But Obamas aides say that a measured approach is Obamas style. The president has said as much himself. When asked at a news conference in March why it took him days to respond to the AIG bonuses, Obama snapped: It took us a couple of days because I like to know what Im talking about before I speak alright?

Over the past few days that reticence created a vacuum his critics were only too happy to fill. As Obama let things play out, Republicans slammed him for not addressing Americans about the situation and Congress called for hearings on the matter. The White House released updates on how he was monitoring the situation, as well as background guidance to reporters to help shape the narrative. Obamas chief spokesman, Robert Gibbs, was already scheduled to be on Sunday news shows, and National Security Council chief of staff Denis McDonough said it was Obamas idea to also dispatch his Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano to explain what was going on. But Napolitano and Gibbs seemed to both be carrying a message that the White House quickly backed off of Monday morning - that the system worked.

Gibbs said on CBSs Face the Nation that in many ways, this system has worked. Napolitano also said the system worked. But by Monday morning she was on NBCs Today show explaining that her words had been taken out of context and that she was referring to what happened after the incident occurred. Our system did not work in this instance, she explained clearly.

The comments of Gibbs and Napolitano whether planned or unplanned did not come off as being slips of the tongue, such as when Vice President Joe Biden advised Americans against traveling on airlines after the swine flu outbreak, and Gibbs later cleaned up the message by explaining what Biden meant to say.

The decision for Obama to leave the talking to his aides in the aftermath of the attempted terrorist attack was not standard operating procedure, McDonough said after Obamas statement Monday.

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The White House pushed back against criticism that the president was not properly engaged.

McDonough told reporters that Obama is getting at least half a dozen briefings a day a morning briefing with administration officials about the Northwest Airlines incident and five paper briefings, two from the National Counterterrorism Center and three from the Situation Room.

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Without naming names, the White House also put blame at the feet of the departed Bush administration even as Obamas speech-to-golf-course moment Monday conjured up memories of President George W. Bush on a golf course angrily decrying recent suicide bombings in Israel, and capping off his remarks with, "Thank you. Now watch this drive."

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In general, I think that the presidents inclinations as a leader work fairly well for this issue no-drama Obama, Friedman said. In some ways Al Qaeda is trying to be relevant and trying to be politically relevant, and in some sense they achieved that. Hes denying them that relevance by acting like its not the number-one thing on his agenda. We credit them with more power and credibility than they have.

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But other times the administration seems to have a tin ear.

The White House refused to accept any responsibility for the security breach at last month's state dinner allowing the Secret Service to accept complete fault even after it became clear that Obama's social secretary Desiree Rogers had nixed a practice to have an East Wing staffer with Secret Service verifying names off of a guest list. Only after mounting pressure did the White House quietly order an internal review and reinstate that procedure.

And for days, as controversy over Obama's allegedly stupid remark about the Cambridge police officer continued to swirl, the White House downplayed its significance. Indeed on the Friday after he uttered it, Gibbs still defended Obama's remark and told reporters in his office that they had heard the last from the president on the issue. But a few hours later, Obama interrupted Gibbs during his daily briefing and stepped to his podium to apologize for his remarks and offer up the now famous beer summit.

Obama will continue to monitor the aftermath of the Northwest incident with close advisers and top aides. But Americans probably won't see more of Obama at a podium speaking about the issue again this week as he continues to balance his family vacation with his duties as commander-in-chief.

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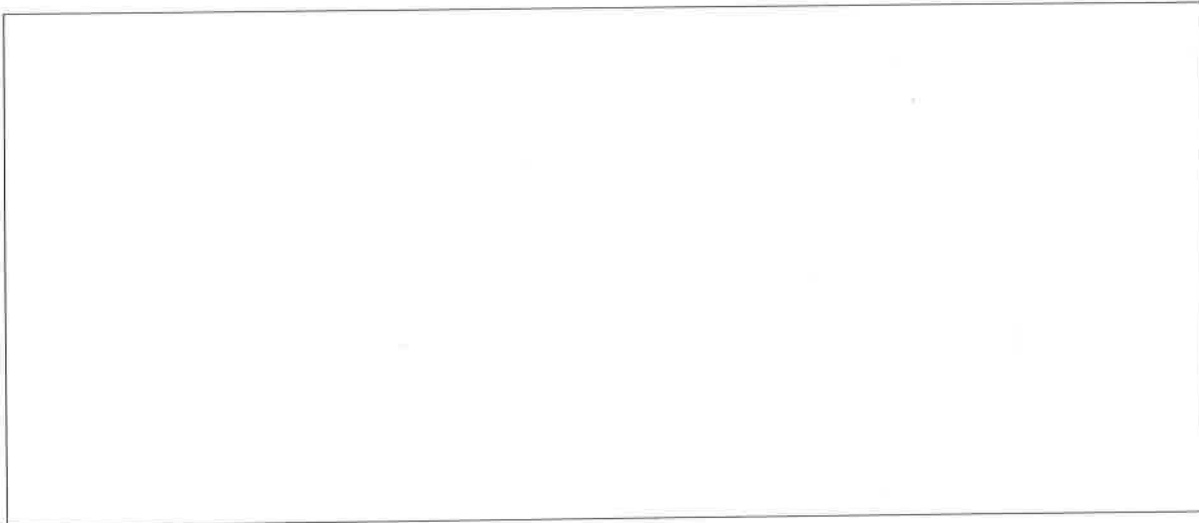

SUBJECT: Furthering Biofuels Engagement with Brazil

Summary: I chaired the U.S.-Brazil Steering Committee meeting here on December 15 with interagency support from the Departments of Energy and Agriculture. Our external partners from the Organization of American States, Inter-American Development Bank, and the United Nations Foundation also participated. We discussed ways to assist third countries to develop and utilize biofuels, how to advance research with Brazil, and the development of global standards and codes to foster an international biofuels industry. Our coordinated biofuels effort has significant strategic value: it opens the door to a broader dialogue with Brazil on energy security, oil finds, and cooperation in sustainability, and is a good platform to point to as we seek to engage Brazil more broadly.

Joint Efforts on Biofuels in Other Countries

Dominican Republic: We have helped the Dominican Republic pass biofuels legislation, draft implementing regulations, and identify investment projects. However, the Dominicans have not begun blending ethanol, due to a combination of high sugar prices, vested sugar interests, and lower oil prices. We will work with Brazil to make a political-level push with President Fernandez to demonstrate the benefits of introducing domestic biofuels to offset high oil import bills.

El Salvador: We have found the incoming Funes administration interested in submitting comprehensive energy legislation next year. El Salvador has now formally requested our continued engagement on biofuels.

Jamaica: The United States and Brazil have sent a joint mission to Jamaica and have agreed to a joint public diplomacy campaign there to support Jamaica as it begins blending ethanol into gasoline. We will provide technical support to the government as this program is implemented.

Guatemala: The country is already producing ethanol. We will harmonize the work of Brazilian and U.S. experts to assist Guatemala to establish a framework to consume biofuels at home and lower its fuel import bill.

Africa: In addition to discussing a strategy for biofuels cooperation with the countries in the Americas, we have discussed with Brazil a strategy for biofuels cooperation with select countries in Africa, notably Senegal and Guinea-Bissau. The United States asked Brazil to consider joint work in Angola, following up on our recent mission there, which identified domestic petroleum consumption as a drain on export revenues.

Areas of Cooperation

Feedstock: The United States and Brazil have been successful in quantifying the sustainability of biofuels based upon feedstock. Our cooperative efforts have enabled technical exchanges on matters addressing lifecycle greenhouse gas emission reductions and energy yield.

Information: The United States and Brazil are leading international efforts to bolster confidence and understanding of biofuels globally. Both governments agreed to develop a joint fact sheet to combat negative campaigns against biofuels.

Standards: The United States, Brazil, and the European Union have harmonized many of our respective weights and measurements standards for biofuels. Harmonization is helping to set a uniform global standard and facilitate biofuels trade among the three markets.

Sustainability: A key and sensitive challenge the United States and Brazil face is the issue of biofuels sustainability. Together with Brazil we are trying to address sustainability in global forums, like the Global BioEnergy Partnership.

What Lies Ahead

Both the United States and Brazil will work to deepen our cooperation on biofuels. Other areas of interest include joint sponsorship of private sector renewable energy efforts and development of proposed initiatives under the Energy and Climate Partnership of the Americas, to be rolled out for the April Ministerial in Washington. You have been invited to deliver a public keynote at the ministerial and to host a lunch for the region's energy ministers.

- Are there any particular articles or stories that stick out in your mind?
- Nick and Sheryl's new book, *Half the Sky*, focuses on three main issues: maternal mortality, sexual violence, and human trafficking – and they say the tools to best address the challenges include girls' education, family planning, microfinance, and "empowerment" in every sense. What are your strategies to empower women around the globe?


Suggested Initiatives:

- In the book, Nick and Sheryl call on the US government to pass a \$10 billion effort over five years to educate girls around the world and reduce the gender gap in education. This initiative would focus on Africa but would also support—and prod—Asian countries such as Afghanistan and Pakistan to do better. The aim would be not just to fund new schools, with donated by the American people written on the sides, but to experiment with finding the most cost-effective ways to support education. In some countries that may be providing school uniforms to girls from poor families, or deworming communities, or providing scholarships to the best-performing girls, or helping girls manage menstruation, or supporting school lunches, or extending Mexico's opportunities program to Africa. These approaches should be rigorously tried on a randomized basis, and assessed by outside evaluators, so that we can determine which are most cost-effective.
- What do you think of this plan?

SUBJECT: New York Times Interview with Mark Landler

New York Times reporter Mark Landler will interview you on August 3 for an extended Q&A piece slated to run in the New York Times magazine on August 23.

I met with Mark on July 13 for a pre-brief. We discussed the fact that next year is the 15th anniversary of the 1995 Fourth World Conference in Beijing, the significance of your leadership at that conference, and the way in which it moved issues such as microcredit, girls' education, and women's health onto the world's agenda. We talked about the Platform for Action that was adopted, and the progress that's been made since then in terms of the laws that have been enacted, particularly in the area of violence against women – but also about how few of those laws have been successfully implemented. I

emphasized that many of the issues discussed in 1995 remain serious and urgent challenges today, particularly the ongoing need to combat violence, and to provide access to education and healthcare. We talked about the studies showing the development and macroeconomic benefits of increasing women's economic participation; about maternal and child health and the President's Global Health Initiative; and about the current extent of global violence against women and measures to combat it, such as the IVAWA legislation you supported as a senator.

Topics that Mark may raise with you might include:

The history of your interest in, and involvement with, women's issues.

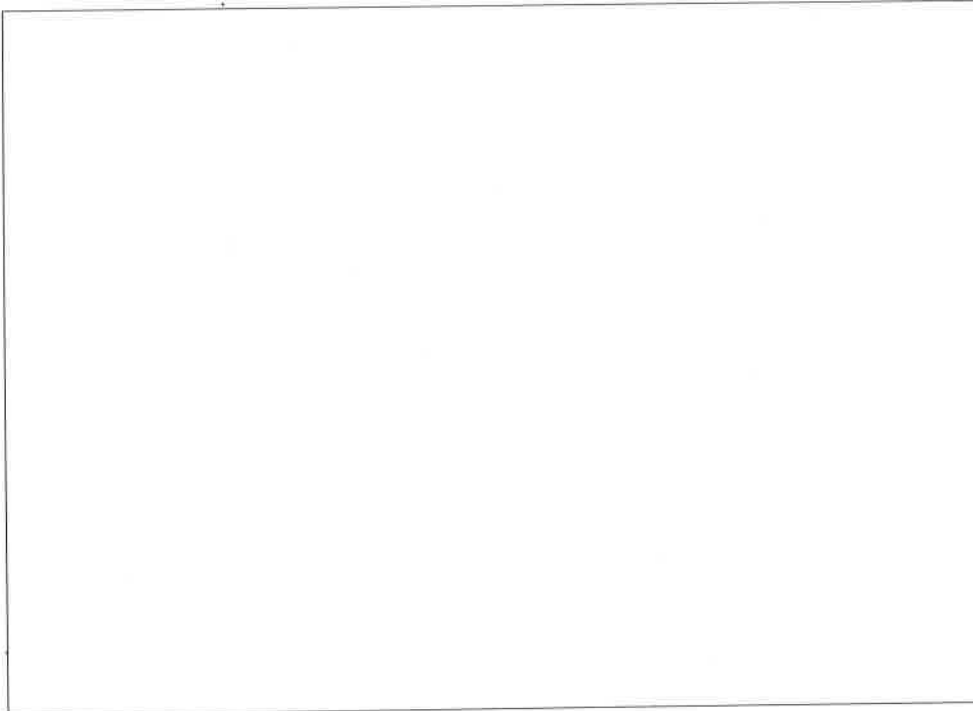
Mark commented on the "granularity" of your engagement with women's issues, based on his observations on trips in El Salvador and Asia, and on your extensive network of women leaders and activists and your in-depth knowledge of regional and country-specific challenges. We discussed the history of your remarks on these issues while First Lady, but he may ask you to recapitulate that evolution. He will probably ask you to characterize your overall approach or define what you consider to be "women's issues." In the pre-brief, I suggested to him that this outlook included identifying women not as victims, but as changemakers and key to the robustness of any civil society. We discussed the need to define women's issues not just in terms of topics solely of interest to women, but as questions that went to the heart of what kind of society we'd all like to live in.

Afghanistan elections.

In the pre-brief, we talked about the need for another type of "surge" in Afghanistan – one of Afghan civilians taking charge of the reconstruction of their society, with women working with men to jointly determine Afghanistan's future, and, particularly, to grow economic opportunity. Mark may ask how the different election outcome scenarios in Afghanistan might affect women's lives there, and how the United States plans to keep its commitment to women in the foreground of our assistance. You could reaffirm women's integral role in long-term stability and national prosperity and the need for women to be in decision-making roles. We have called for a campaign that is credible, secure and inclusive – where men and women candidates can campaign with no restrictions on their freedom of movement and can be assured of protection.



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**DRC trip.**

Although we did not talk about this topic in the pre-brief, Mark may ask about gender-based violence in DRC and what you hope to accomplish on this visit. Systematic statistics aren't available, but the reports from Panzi hospital and other care centers are that 1100 women are being brutally attacked each month. Rape is deliberately being used as a tool of conflict by both state military and rebel groups in the eastern DRC, precisely because targeting women effectively destroys their communities. In the atmosphere of impunity that is flourishing in DRC, rates of rape by civilians, in more stable areas of the country, are also increasing dramatically. Acting A/S Carter in AF, A/S Brimmer in IO, and I testified in May before joint Senate subcommittees on rape as a weapon of war in DRC and Sudan. You recently sent a letter to Senators Boxer, Shaheen, and Feingold that outlined the Department's coordinated plan for addressing rape prevention, protection, and treatment services, as well as plans to help strengthen DRC's judiciary and end the culture of impunity surrounding these crimes. You are also exploring steps you can take at the UN to address better implementation of key Security Council Resolutions 1325 (which addresses the impact on women of armed conflict) and 1820 (which acknowledges rape as a weapon of war to be a security issue, and advocates for the inclusion of women in peace negotiations), and working bilaterally through diplomatic channels. Your trip to Goma will give you an opportunity to see firsthand the effects of the conflict and to speak with service providers, peacekeepers, and the victims of the violence.

Iraq.

Mark and I did not discuss Iraq. However, like Afghanistan, it is a country in which women will be key to future progress and there is an urgent need to ensure that their potential is tapped by their leaders, especially as our military presence withdraws. The growing number of Iraqi widows are particularly vulnerable to both destitution and violence. The USG is supporting, through our PRT's, Quick Response Fund (QRF) program, international organizations, and implementing partners, funding for vocational and literacy training, micro-loans, and support for political participation. We have requested funds to support child/youth programs, economic empowerment, efforts to reduce gender-based violence and "honor" killings, women's shelters, and job training and placement in the FY 09 Supplemental. This request includes \$5 million for a new "Iraq War Widows Initiative" program which would complement existing programs to assist Iraq's widow and female-headed household population. Currently, for widows, we have a \$800,000 program with our partner the Free Iraq Foundation, which, over two years, will train 470 head-of-household widows in democracy, women's rights, entrepreneurship and career-building skills.

Worldwide violence against women.

Mark and I touched on the range of violence to which women are still subjected: not just the domestic violence that occurs in every country on earth, or rape used as a weapon of war, but also the continuing prevalence of "honor" killings (and the weak or nonexistent penalties for men who murder women under this pretext); trafficking, in which women are reduced to commodities; female genital mutilation, which both kills and maims; child marriage, which institutionalizes the rape of minors and deprives girls of their childhood and education; female infanticide and sex-selective abortion; dowry burnings, and more.

You responded, in February, to a letter from Representative DeLauro and a number of her colleagues, on the issue of child marriage in Saudi Arabia. The Congressmen and Congresswomen had written to express their dismay that a Saudi judge had upheld, on appeal, a refusal to grant an annulment of the marriage between an eight-year-old girl and a much-older man. You expressed your abhorrence of child marriage and pledged to continue to work within the bilateral relationship to help the Saudis criminalize the practice. In May, the marriage was annulled on further appeal, and the Shura Council, which advises the government, is evaluating the feasibility of setting the minimum age for marriage at 18. Yemen, similarly, raised its minimum age for marriage to 17

this year, after several courageous child brides – including a 12-year-old winner of the 2008 State Department International Women of Courage award – drew international attention to the practice.

Economic participation and the global economic downturn.

Mark and I briefly discussed how women's economic empowerment is the "low-hanging fruit" of development, in the words of Goldman Sachs chairman Lloyd Blankfein. An accumulation of empirical studies, from Goldman Sachs, the World Bank, McKinsey and others, have identified the ways in which increasing women's economic participation is "smart development": women – who reinvest 90 percent of their income in their families and communities – move economies ahead, lift communities out of poverty, and stimulate their countries' GDP growth.

Women, especially in the developing world, are being hit hard by the global economic downturn. Many economies in the emerging markets enjoyed a sustained boom because educated young women, in particular, moved from the informal economy (like farming and household work) to become engaged in export related industries like garments and small electronics. With the downturn in the export market, thousands of these women are now unemployed. Without corrective action, the repercussions of these job losses may adversely affect future economic growth and shortchange the development progress that has been made over the last few years. In the developing world, girls and women are in many places the first to lose access to education and to their basic needs of food and shelter when economic stresses tear into families. They are at greater risk of domestic violence and of being targeted by the sex work and trafficking industries. These "missing girls" at school have long-term implications for future economic health, potentially leading to a missing cohort of skilled female workers.

It is "smart economics" to invest in women's business and management development. It's why we are ensuring equal access for women in our food security initiative – to incorporate the perspectives of the 60 to 80 percent of smallhold farmers who are women – and why we need to help women take advantage of trade agreements, from Agoa to Pathways to Prosperity that you announced in El Salvador.

Nick Kristof's book.

We didn't talk about Nick's upcoming book, "Half the Sky," but the issue of the NYT magazine for which you are being interviewed is inspired by Nick's forthcoming release. He talks about the need for our world to confront

ongoing discrimination against women, and the need to overcome the inequality which is institutionalized in every country on earth, as well as for women's increased political and economic participation. His book covers the power of microenterprise, the sorry state of maternal mortality, violence against women – from chapters on trafficking to covering gang rape in Pakistan – the difference that girls' education makes, and the efforts of women in the Middle East to increase their rights and freedoms. This is what you have been working on around the globe since 1995 (and earlier, domestically). [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He also cites NGOs and individuals who are helping to mobilize the public, which is your role as well: to encourage U.S. citizens, whether students or businesspeople, to be more engaged. Everyone makes a difference – as you demonstrated through Vital Voices.

Nick also wrote a column in the July 30th New York Times on maternal mortality: highlighting the crisis, commenting on the U.S. government's lack of adequate attention to this issue, and calling on us to take action. Nick includes the striking statistic that one woman dies every minute from complications of pregnancy or childbirth somewhere in the world, and 20 times as many suffer childbirth injuries. As you know, progress toward Millennium Development Goal number five, addressing maternal mortality, has been woefully inadequate. Reductions in maternal mortality should be an important part of the Global Health Initiative, and our office is advocating for significant increases in funding for maternal health to address this in a serious and comprehensive way.

Future plans.

Mark may ask about your plans and goals for the integration of women's issues into foreign policy, and why an Ambassador was named for Global Women's Issues. [REDACTED]

**A New Gender Agenda

Hillary Rodham Clinton staked her claim as an advocate for global women's issues in 1995, when, as first lady, she gave an impassioned speech at a United Nations conference in Beijing. As secretary of state, she pushed to create a new position, ambassador at large for global women's issues, and recruited Melanne Verveer, her former chief of staff, to fill it. And she has drawn attention to women at nearly every stop in her travels, most recently on an 11-day visit to Africa, during which, among other things, she went to eastern Congo to speak out against mass rape. Hours before leaving on that trip, Clinton discussed women's issues and the Obama administration's foreign policy for 35 minutes in her elegant seventh-floor office at the State Department. What follows is a condensed and edited version of our conversation.

Q: In your confirmation hearing, you said you would put women's issues at the core of American foreign policy. But as you know, in much of the world, gender equality is not accepted as a universal human right. How do you overcome that deep-seated cultural resistance?

Clinton: You have to recognize how deep-seated it is, but also reach an understanding of how without providing more rights and responsibilities for women, many of the goals we claim to pursue in our foreign policy are either unachievable or much harder to achieve.

Democracy means nothing if half the people can't vote, or if their vote doesn't count, or if their literacy rate is so low that the exercise of their vote is in question. Which is why when I travel, I do events with women, I talk about women's rights, I meet with women activists, I raise women's concerns with the leaders I'm talking to.

I happen to believe that the transformation of women's roles is the last great impediment to universal progress — that we have made progress on many other aspects of human nature that used to be discriminatory bars to people's full participation. But in too many places and too many ways, the oppression of women stands as a stark reminder of how difficult it is to realize people's full human potential.

Q: I'm curious about what priorities you're setting. Will the Obama administration have a signature issue — sex trafficking or gender-based violence or maternal mortality or education for girls — in the way that H.I.V./AIDS came to symbolize the Bush-administration strategy?

Clinton: We are having as a signature issue the fact that women and girls are a core factor in our foreign policy. If you look at what has to be done, in some societies, it is a different problem than in others. In some of the societies where women are deprived of political and economic rights, they have access to education and health care. In other societies, they may have been given the vote, but girl babies are still being put out to die.

So it's not one specific program, so much as a policy. When it comes to our global health agenda, maternal health is now part of the Obama administration's outreach. We're very proud of the work this country has done, through PEPFAR, on H.I.V./AIDS [the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief was begun by George W. Bush in 2003]. We've moved from an understanding of how to deal with global AIDS to recognizing it's now a woman's disease, because women are the most vulnerable and often have no power to protect themselves. And it's increasingly younger women or even girls.

But women die every minute from poor maternal health care. You know, H.I.V./AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria — those are all, unfortunately, equal-opportunity killers. Maternal health is a woman's issue; it's a family issue; it's a child issue. And for the United States to say to countries that have very high maternal mortality rates, "We care about the future of your children, and in order to do that, we care about the present of your women," is a powerful statement.

Q: Do you have a point of view about what should come first: Do you empower women economically and then hope that they seize a political role for themselves? Or do you seek to give them more legal and political standing and hope that they can win a place in the economic sphere?

Clinton: That's a great question, because I think the historical record would show both routes have worked. Women were not particularly economically empowered when we finally included the right of women to vote in our Constitution. So women's rights were expanded in 1920, and that opened up a lot of doors to women to see themselves in different roles, including economic roles, outside the home.

India's been a democracy for 60 years, and remarkably extended the vote to everyone, every caste, to both men and women equally. So women have been given the right to vote, but without economic empowerment, they didn't have the influence that their votes should have brought, which is why the government of India has made such a big point of extending economic and political opportunity equally to women.

And when we visited SEWA, the Self-Employed Women's Association [in India], those women had the vote before they were born, but being economically empowered, being able to stand up for themselves inside their

families, on the streets of their villages, is giving them a sense of autonomy and authority that just their vote couldn't have.

Q: In your travels as secretary of state, you've focused heavily on the role of microlending. Is there a reason in these early days that you've tended to emphasize the economic over the political?

Clinton: It's interesting: it's partly because of where I've gone. It's also because I've worked on microcredit since 1983, going back to Arkansas and projects that I worked on with my husband there.

I am also struck by every international public-opinion poll I've ever seen, that the No. 1 thing most men and women want is a good job with a good income. It is at the core of the human aspiration to be able to support oneself, to give one's children a better future. Microenterprise is uniquely designed to empower women because — through the trial and error of its development, going back to Muhammad Yunus's invention of it in Bangladesh — women are much greater at investing in future goods than the men who have participated in microcredit have turned out to be. And they are also very reliable in paying back, because they are so eager to have that extra help and recognition that microcredit provides.

So, I don't make a distinction between economic empowerment and political, social empowerment; I think it's fair to say both need to go hand in hand.

Q: There are counterterrorism experts who have made the observation that countries that nurture terrorist groups tend to be the same societies that marginalize women. Do you see a link between your campaign on women's issues and our national security?

Clinton: I think it's an absolute link. Part of the reason I have pursued it as secretary of state is because I see it in our national security interest. If you look at where we are fighting terrorism, there is a connection to groups that are making a stand against modernity, and that is most evident in their treatment of women.

What does preventing little girls from going to school in Afghanistan by throwing acid on them have to do with waging a struggle against oppression externally? It's a projection of the insecurity and the disorientation that a lot of these terrorists and their sympathizers feel about a fast-changing world, where they turn on television sets and see programs with women behaving in ways they can't even imagine. The idea that young women in their own societies would pursue an independent future is deeply threatening to their cultural values.

Q: Many of the countries where the abuses against women are most prevalent are also countries that have a vital strategic importance to the

United States: Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, India. How can you aggressively advocate for women without jeopardizing those strategic relationships?

Clinton: Well, in a number of these strategic relationships, there's a commitment to advancing the roles and rights of women. In India, the changes that have been made are remarkable. There are still tens of millions of very poor women, but women have assumed more and more responsibility; they are seen in public positions and increasingly economic ones, where their stature is accepted by society.

When I meet with the Chinese leadership, as I just did in the Strategic and Economic Dialogue, they have women who are part of their leadership team, and women who are assuming greater and greater economic and political roles.

Obviously, there's work to be done in both India and China, because the infanticide rate of girl babies is still overwhelmingly high, and unfortunately with technology, parents are able to use sonograms to determine the sex of a baby, and to abort girl children simply because they'd rather have a boy. And those are deeply set attitudes. But at the governmental level, there is a great deal of openness and commitment that I am seeing.

In other societies where we have strategic security interests, it's a challenge to move the agenda forward in a way that includes women's issues. When we did our strategic review on Afghanistan, we said very clearly, We can't be all things to all people in Afghanistan. We have to focus on a few critical concerns. But one of them was the role of women, and women's participation in society.

Q: Let me ask you one question about India, where we've just concluded a Strategic Dialogue agreement. I didn't notice too much emphasis on sex trafficking on your trip, even though it's clear India remains the world capital of sex trafficking. Can you make that case strenuously with the Indians at the same moment that we're trying to do so many other things with them?

Clinton: Absolutely, and in fact, we do it every year with our annual report on trafficking in persons. It's a very high priority to me, and it is raised as part of the ongoing discussions that we have with many countries. In a democracy like India, there is a challenge of getting the word down to the local jurisdiction — the local police, the local judges, the local authorities. But I have no doubt about the seriousness with which their government takes this issue.

Q: Could some of the billions of dollars the United States has spent on military aid to Pakistan since 9/11 have been better spent on education and health care for girls and women?

Clinton: Yes. The answer is yes, and in my meetings with then-President Musharraf in '03, '05, '07, in this country as well, I raised it all the time.

I remember visiting a village about 45 minutes outside of Lahore, when I was in Pakistan as first lady, and we met with a group of mothers and grandmothers in the village. And they wanted very much to have a school at the secondary level for their daughters, the way their sons did. But the school for their sons was not in the village, so the sons had to travel. No one could even imagine the daughters traveling outside their village to continue their education.

And when I think about the extraordinarily accomplished Pakistanis in the professions, in medicine, in education, I think it is certainly the case that if Pakistan had invested more in the education of children so that poor families would not have sent their boys off to be educated by extremists, it might well have made a difference. And it still can, because that's part of our approach now.

Q: Because it's also a question of how we allocate our resources.

Clinton: That's right, and with the Kerry-Lugar/Berman bill[s] that provide aid for these kinds of purposes in Pakistan, we hope to try to make up for lost time. [These Senate and House bills are currently being finalized in Congress.]

Q: Gender-based violence is an enormous issue in much of Africa, and in places like Congo, rape, as you know, is an instrument of war. How can you, or anybody else, hope to combat that?

Clinton: President Obama and I and the United States will not tolerate this continuation of wanton, senseless, brutal violence perpetrated against girls and women. We don't know exactly what we can do, but we are going to be delivering some aid and some ideas about how to better organize the communities to deal with it. We're going to sound the alarm that this is not all just unexpected and irrational.

These militias, which perpetrate a lot of these rapes and other horrific assaults on girls and women, are paid well, or realize the spoils of guarding the mines. Those mines, which are one of the great natural resources of the Congo, produce a lot of the materials that go into our cellphones and other electronics. There are tens of millions of dollars that go into these militias that, in effect, get translated into a sense of impunity that is then exercised against the weakest members of society.

The ambassador for war crimes, Steve Rapp, has the distinction of being among the first international prosecutors to win a case on gender violence, and I specifically wanted him to take on this role, because I want to highlight this issue.

Q: I've been at more than a few women's events with you overseas where the men in the audience drift off to their BlackBerrys or into a snooze after a few minutes. How do you change the mind-set, not just overseas but at home and in this building, that tends to view women's issues as a pink ghetto?

Clinton: By making the arguments that I am making here — that so-called women's issues are stability issues, security issues, equity issues. The World Bank and many other analyses have proved over and over again that where women are mistreated, where they are denied equal rights, you will find instability that very often serves as an incubator of extremism.

A woman who is safe enough in her own life to invest in her children and see them go to school is not going to have as many children. The resource battles over water and land will be diminished. This is all connected. And it's an issue of how we take hard power and soft power, so called, and use it to advance not just American ends but, in advancing global progress, we are making the world safer for our own children.

Q: Last month in New Delhi, a young woman asked you an interesting question: How would you view the progress of women in both India and the United States? She pointed out that India elected a woman as prime minister within three decades of independence, while the U.S. had yet to elect a female president. Is there any lesson from your own presidential campaign that you can use to take to women elsewhere in the world?

Clinton: Well, you've heard me talk about this in a lot of settings, from Japan to South Korea to Indonesia to India to Latin America [laughs]. It is one of the most common questions I'm asked, along with the question about how I can now work for and with President Obama, since he and I ran so vigorously against each other. It is clearly on young women's minds. And I find that both exciting and gratifying.

My campaign for many millions of reasons gave a lot of heart to many young women. It is still the most common comment that people make to me: "your campaign gave me courage" or "your campaign made a difference in my daughter's life" or "I went back to school because of your campaign." So, it is unfinished business, and young women know it is unfinished business.

The vast majority of them will never run for political office in any country. But they may decide to seek an education that their family doesn't approve of, or move away for a job that is a little bit frightening to them, but which they feel they've got the skills to do. Or, you know, stand up and speak out against an injustice they see. And it is all of that ripple that is building and building — and is unstoppable.

I live for those moments where I see this woman stand up in SEWA — this poor, uneducated woman — and say, "I am the president of SEWA; 1.1 million women voted." I mean, what a great statement that was from her. So, I get a lot of joy out of doing this work. I think it is so critically important, but it is also incredibly moving to see these individual lives changed because of some event or speech that you have no idea why it made an impression on them.

Altogether, Ling reported from more than two dozen countries, including Afghanistan, Iraq, and Iran. Ling's hard work continues off-camera: she serves as a contributing editor for USA Weekend and recently co-authored a book entitled "Mother, Daughter, Sister, Bride: Rituals of Womanhood."

Dear Madame Secretary,

I'm writing respectfully to urge you to request that President Obama accord the Personal Rank of Ambassador for a six-month period to one of my colleagues, [redacted]. In past years the heads of the U.S. delegation have had ambassadorial rank, either as active Foreign Service Officers or as retired ambassadors. The tight time-schedule this year precludes submitting [redacted] name for Senate confirmation. As you know, in such situations there is the often-used mechanism of a Presidential letter to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, informing it of his action. The process begins, however, in the State Department with a letter from the Secretary of State to the President, requesting the personal rank of ambassador status. I am attaching [redacted] one-page McLarty Associates biosketch for your information.

The annual, two-week [redacted] conference is the largest human rights conference in Europe. Fifty-six countries will be participating. The 40-member U.S. Government Delegation, which [redacted] will be heading, includes Washington, DC-based

State Department officials, diplomats from the U.S. Permanent Mission to the OSCE in Vienna, members of the Congressional Helsinki Commission, and a few prominent Public Members. In addition, a unique feature of the Warsaw conference is that human rights NGOs are given speaking rights. As one might expect, American organizations will figure prominently here too, and one of [redacted] key responsibilities as Head of Delegation will be interfacing with them.

I am attaching the agenda of the conference. Given your strong emphasis on women's rights, please note that the entire day of October 1st is devoted to the issues of trafficking in human beings, equality of opportunity for women and men, implementation of the [redacted] Action Plan for the Promotion of Gender Equality, and prevention of violence against women.

I recommend [redacted] in the strongest terms, and I cannot imagine that the United States would be the only country at this important international human rights conference whose Delegation Head did not have ambassadorial rank. If you need any more information, I would be eager to provide it.

ABAC has conducted a poll on "Mrs. Hillary Clinton and the Secret Jail in Thailand". I think there are some interesting results that may be of your interest. The poll was conducted today among respondents aged 18 up from 1,082 households in 17 provinces nationwide.

77.9% of respondents were informed of Mrs. Clinton's visit to Thailand by watching news on TV / 28.5% did not learn of this news

56.3% thought the fact that Mrs. Clinton was in her orange dress is meaningful, thinking it is a combination of red and yellow—a reflection of prominence and prosperity involving her role.

66.6% believed Mrs. Clinton has shown goodwill towards Thailand / 33.4% refused to believe so.
