Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated February 27, 2017, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The processing of records responsive to your request is ongoing and has yielded an additional 193 documents. After reviewing these documents, we have determined that 22 may be released in full, 149 may be released with excisions, and 6 must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonable segregable from the exempt material has been released. For the documents withheld in full, we have cited FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. §§552 (b)(5) and (b)(6).

# The Freedom of Information Act (5 USC 552)



HONOLULU There is a sense of dj vu in the Obama administrations response to the attempted terrorist attack on Christmas Day. A by-now familiar pattern has been established for dealing with unexpected problems.

First, White House aides downplay the notion that something may have gone wrong on their part. While staying out of the spotlight, the president conveys his efforts to address the situation and his feelings about it through administration officials. After a few days, the White House concedes on the issue, and perhaps Obama even steps out to address it.

That same scenario unfolded over the summer when Obama said Sgt. James Crowley, a white Cambridge, Mass., police officer, acted stupidly when he arrested Henry Louis Gates Jr., a black Harvard professor, in his own home. It happened in March when the public was outraged over AIG dishing out hefty bonuses. More recently the public witnessed the dynamic after a security breach at President Barack Obamas first state dinner.

But the fact that the issue now is a terrorist incident - albeit an unsuccessful one - makes the stakes much higher, and the White Houses usual approach more questionable. That this test of his leadership comes while hes on vacation in tropical Hawaii further complicates things.

After delivering his first public remarks Monday about a Nigerian mans attempt to blow up a Northwest Airlines jetliner over Detroit, the president motorcaded over to the golf course at a nearby country club. Optics aside, it had taken Obama three days to issue a statement on the incident, and the administration was left struggling to get control of the message.

By the time Obama addressed the public with a brief televised statement, his critics had made such headway that the White House was left with this lede in the New York Times: President Obama emerged from Hawaiian seclusion on Monday to try to quell gathering criticism of his administrations handling of the thwarted Christmas Day bombing of an American airliner as a branch of Al Qaeda claimed responsibility.

Its the kind of story the White House might have avoided if Obama hadnt waited so long to forcefully react to the incident.

Critics on the right have predictably seized on his response as a sign of weak leadership. After Obama spoke Monday, Benjamin Friedman, a research fellow for defense and homeland security at the Cato Institute, said his remarks did not do a great job of calming the public.

He didnt try that hard, Friedman said. He just made that comment that we ought to be confident, but he didnt really go into much detail about why we ought to be confident.

But Obamas aides say that a measured approach is Obamas style. The president has said as much himself. When asked at a news conference in March why it took him days to respond to the AIG bonuses, Obama snapped: It took us a couple of days because I like to know what Im talking about before I speak alright?

Over the past few days that reticence created a vacuum his critics were only to happy to fill. As Obama let thing play out, Republicans slammed him for not addressing Americans about the situation and Congress called for hearings on the matter. The White House released updates on how he was monitoring the situation, as well as background guidance to reporters to help shape the narrative. Obamas chief spokesman, Robert Gibbs, was already scheduled to be on Sunday news shows, and National Security Council chief of staff Denis McDonough said it was Obamas idea to also dispatch his Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano to explain what was going on. But Napolitano and Gibbs seemed to both be carrying a message that the White House quickly backed off of Monday morning - that the system worked.

Gibbs said on CBSs Face the Nation that in many ways, this system has worked. Napolitano also said the system worked. But by Monday morning she was on NBCs Today show explaining that her words had been taken out of context and that she was referring to what happened after the incident occurred. Our system did not work in this instance, she explained clearly.

The comments of Gibbs and Napolitano whether planned or unplanned did not come off as being slips of the tongue, such as when Vice President Joe Biden advised Americans against traveling on airlines after the swine flu outbreak, and Gibbs later cleaned up the message by explaining what Biden meant to say.

The decision for Obama to leave the talking to his aides in the aftermath of the attempted terrorist attack was not standard operating procedure, McDonough said after Obamas statement Monday.

We thought it made sense for him to handle it in that way and then we thought today was a good opportunity for the president to go out there, McDonough said. We dont really have a standard operating procedure for when is best to go out.

The White House pushed back against criticism that the president was not properly engaged.

McDonough told reporters that Obama is getting at least half a dozen briefings a day a morning briefing with administration officials about the Northwest Airlines incident and five paper briefings, two from the National Counterterrorism Center and three from the Situation Room.

The president has been very engaged on this, has been leading our response effort, asking agencies to take a variety of steps including all the steps he outlined today, McDonough said. He recognizes that its very important that we communicate to the American people what we know and the steps that were taking.

Without naming names, the White House also put blame at the feet of the departed Bush administration even as Obamas speech-to-golf-course moment Monday conjured up memories of President George W. Bush on a golf course angrily decrying recent suicide bombings in Israel, and capping off his remarks with, "Thank you. Now watch this drive."

Obviously the procedures and the protocols employed in this instance are ones that weve inherited that had been built over the course of several years since 2003, McDonough said. His comments echoed Obama, who pointed out that the review he ordered of the governments terrorist watch-list procedures is of a system that our government has had in place for many years.

In general, I think that the presidents inclinations as a leader work fairly well for this issue no-drama Obama, Friedman said. In some ways Al Qaeda is trying to be relevant and trying to be politically relevant, and in some sense they achieved that. Hes denying them that relevance by acting like its not the number-one thing on his agenda. We credit them with more power and credibility than they have.

Obama heading to the golf course, Friedman said, signals that its not a crisis, and hes the president and he has a lot of things to do and this is just one of them.

There are times when the Obama White House has responded swiftly. When Somali Pirates captured and American captain, the president appeared engaged from the start. After the Air Force One flyover that brought back memories of 9/11 throughout Manhattan, the White House quickly apologized and Obamas aides informed reporters that he was furious when he learned about it.

But other times the administration seems to have a tin ear.

The White House refused to accept any responsibility for the security breach at last month's state dinner allowing the Secret Service to accept complete fault even after it became clear that Obamas social secretary Desiree Rogers had nixed a practice to have an East Wing staffer with Secret . Service verifying names off of a guest list. Only after mounting pressure did the White House quietly order an internal review and reinstate that procedure.

And for days, as controversy over Obamas acted stupidly remark about the Cambridge police officer continued to swirl, the White House downplayed its significance. Indeed on the Friday after he uttered it, Gibbs still defended Obamas remark and told reporters in his office that they had heard the last from the president on the issue. But a few hours later, Obama interrupted Gibbs during his daily briefing and stepped to his podium to apologize for his remarks and offer up the now famous beer summit.

Obama will continue to monitor the aftermath of the Northwest incident with close advisers and top aides. But Americans probably wont see more of Obama at a podium speaking about the issue again this week as he continues to balance his family vacation with his duties as commander-in-chief.

McDonough left reportrers with the impression that if the public sees Obama again in Hawaii hell likely be heading to the golf course or the beach. We havent really talked through when hell go out, but you guys Im sure youll see him, McDonough said half-jokingly.

Without naming names, the White House also put blame at the feet of the departed Bush administration even as Obamas speech-to-golf-course moment Monday conjured up memories of President George W. Bush on a golf course angrily decrying recent suicide bombings in Israel, and capping off his remarks with, "Thank you. Now watch this drive."

Obviously the procedures and the protocols employed in this instance are ones that weve inherited that had been built over the course of several years since 2003, McDonough said. His comments echoed Obama, who pointed out that the review he ordered of the governments terrorist watch-list procedures is of a system that our government has had in place for many years.

HONOLULU There is a sense of dj vu in the Obama administrations response to the attempted terrorist attack on Christmas Day. A by-now familiar pattern has been established for dealing with unexpected problems.

First, White House aides downplay the notion that something may have gone wrong on their part. While staying out of the spotlight, the president conveys his efforts to address the situation and his feelings about it through administration officials. After a few days, the White House concedes on the issue, and perhaps Obama even steps out to address it.

That same scenario unfolded over the summer when Obama said Sgt. James Crowley, a white Cambridge, Mass., police officer, acted stupidly when he arrested Henry Louis Gates Jr., a black Harvard professor, in his own home. It happened in March when the public was outraged over AIG dishing out hefty bonuses. More recently the public witnessed the dynamic after a security breach at President Barack Obamas first state dinner.

But the fact that the issue now is a terrorist incident - albeit an unsuccessful one - makes the stakes much higher, and the White Houses usual approach more questionable. That this test of his leadership comes while hes on vacation in tropical Hawaii further complicates things.

After delivering his first public remarks Monday about a Nigerian mans attempt to blow up a Northwest Airlines jetliner over Detroit, the president motorcaded over to the golf course at a nearby country club. Optics aside, it had taken Obama three days to issue a statement on the incident, and the administration was left struggling to get control of the message.

By the time Obama addressed the public with a brief televised statement, his critics had made such headway that the White House was left with this lede in the New York Times: President Obama emerged from Hawaiian seclusion on Monday to try to quell gathering criticism of his administrations handling of the thwarted Christmas Day bombing of an American airliner as a branch of Al Qaeda claimed responsibility.

Its the kind of story the White House might have avoided if Obama hadnt waited so long to forcefully react to the incident.

Critics on the right have predictably seized on his response as a sign of weak leadership. After Obama spoke Monday, Benjamin Friedman, a research fellow for defense and homeland security at the Cato Institute, said his remarks did not do a great job of calming the public.

He didnt try that hard, Friedman said. He just made that comment that we ought to be confident, but he didnt really go into much detail about why we ought to be confident.

But Obamas aides say that a measured approach is Obamas style. The president has said as much himself. When asked at a news conference in March why it took him days to respond to the AIG bonuses, Obama snapped: It took us a couple of days because I like to know what Im talking about before I speak alright?

Over the past few days that reticence created a vacuum his critics were only to happy to fill. As Obama let thing play out, Republicans slammed him for not addressing Americans about the situation and Congress called for hearings on the matter. The White House released updates on how he was monitoring the situation, as well as background guidance to reporters to help shape the narrative. Obamas chief spokesman, Robert Gibbs, was already scheduled to be on Sunday news shows, and National Security Council chief of staff Denis McDonough said it was Obamas idea to also dispatch his Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano to explain what was going on. But Napolitano and Gibbs seemed to both be carrying a message that the White House quickly backed off of Monday morning - that the system worked.

Gibbs said on CBSs Face the Nation that in many ways, this system has worked. Napolitano also said the system worked. But by Monday morning she was on NBCs Today show explaining that her words had been taken out of context and that she was referring to what happened after the incident occurred. Our system did not work in this instance, she explained clearly.

The comments of Gibbs and Napolitano whether planned or unplanned did not come off as being slips of the tongue, such as when Vice President Joe Biden advised Americans against traveling on airlines after the swine flu outbreak, and Gibbs later cleaned up the message by explaining what Biden meant to say.

The decision for Obama to leave the talking to his aides in the aftermath of the attempted terrorist attack was not standard operating procedure, McDonough said after Obamas statement Monday.

We thought it made sense for him to handle it in that way and then we thought today was a good opportunity for the president to go out there, McDonough said. We dont really have a standard operating procedure for when is best to go out.

SUBJECT: Furthering Biofuels Engagement with Brazil

Summary: I chaired the U.S.-Brazil Steering Committee meeting here on December 15 with interagency support from the Departments of Energy and Agriculture. Our external partners from the Organization of American States, Inter-American Development Bank, and the United Nations Foundation also participated. We discussed ways to assist third countries to develop and utilize biofuels, how to advance research with Brazil, and the development of global standards and codes to foster an international biofuels industry. Our coordinated biofuels effort has significant strategic value: it opens the door to a broader dialogue with Brazil on energy security, oil finds, and cooperation in sustainability, and is a good platform to point to as we seek to engage Brazil more broadly.

## Joint Efforts on Biofuels in Other Countries

**Dominican Republic:** We have helped the Dominican Republic pass biofuels legislation, draft implementing regulations, and identify investment projects. However, the Dominicans have not begun blending ethanol, due to a combination of high sugar prices, vested sugar interests, and lower oil prices. We will work with Brazil to make a political-level push with President Fernandez to demonstrate the benefits of introducing domestic biofuels to offset high oil import bills.

El Salvador: We have found the incoming Funes administration interested in submitting comprehensive energy legislation next year. El Salvador has now formally requested our continued engagement on biofuels.

Jamaica: The United States and Brazil have sent a joint mission to Jamaica and have agreed to a joint public diplomacy campaign there to support Jamaica as it begins blending ethanol into gasoline. We will provide technical support to the government as this program is implemented.

Guatemala: The country is already producing ethanol. We will harmonize the work of Brazilian and U.S. experts to assist Guatemala to establish a framework to consume biofuels at home and lower its fuel import bill.

Africa: In addition to discussing a strategy for biofuels cooperation with the countries in the Americas, we have discussed with Brazil a strategy for biofuels cooperation with select countries in Africa, notably Senegal and Guinea-Bissau. The United States asked Brazil to consider joint work in Angola, following up on our recent mission there, which identified domestic petroleum consumption as a drain on export revenues.

## Areas of Cooperation

**Feedstock:** The United States and Brazil have been successful in quantifying the sustainability of biofuels based upon feedstock. Our cooperative efforts have enabled technical exchanges on matters addressing lifecycle greenhouse gas emission reductions and energy yield.

**Information:** The United States and Brazil are leading international efforts to bolster confidence and understanding of biofuels globally. Both governments agreed to develop a joint fact sheet to combat negative campaigns against biofuels.

**Standards:** The United States, Brazil, and the European Union have harmonized many of our respective weights and measurements standards for biofuels. Harmonization is helping to set a uniform global standard and facilitate biofuels trade among the three markets.

Sustainability: A key and sensitive challenge the United States and Brazil face is the issue of biofuels sustainability. Together with Brazil we are trying to address sustainability in global forums, like the Global BioEnergy Partnership.

#### What Lies Ahead

Both the United States and Brazil will work to deepen our cooperation on biofuels. Other areas of interest include joint sponsorship of private sector renewable energy efforts and development of proposed initiatives under the Energy and Climate Partnership of the Americas, to be rolled out for the April Ministerial in Washington. SUBJECT: New York Times Interview with Mark Landler

New York Times reporter Mark Landler will interview you on August 3 for an extended Q&A piece slated to run in the New York Times magazine on August 23.

I met with Mark on July 13 for a pre-brief. We discussed the fact that next year is the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1995 Fourth World Conference in Beijing, the significance of your leadership at that conference, and the way in which it moved issues such as microcredit, girls' education, and women's health onto the world's agenda. We talked about the Platform for Action that was adopted, and the progress that's been made since then in terms of the laws that have been enacted, particularly in the area of violence against women – but also about how few of those laws have been successfully implemented. I

emphasized that many of the issues discussed in 1995 remain serious and urgent challenges today, particularly the ongoing need to combat violence, and to provide access to education and healthcare. We talked about the studies showing the development and macroeconomic benefits of increasing women's economic participation; about maternal and child health and the President's Global Health Initiative; and about the current extent of global violence against women and measures to combat it, such as the IVAWA legislation you supported as a senator.

Topics that Mark may raise with you might include:


The history of your interest in, and involvement with, women's issues. Mark commented on the "granularity" of your engagement with women's issues, based on his observations on trips in El Salvador and Asia, and on your extensive network of women leaders and activists and your in-depth knowledge of regional and country-specific challenges. We discussed the history of your remarks on these issues while First Lady, but he may ask you to recapitulate that evolution. He will probably ask you to characterize your overall approach or define what you consider to be "women's issues." In the pre-brief, I suggested to him that this outlook included identifying women not as victims, but as changemakers and key to the robustness of any civil society. We discussed the need to define women's issues not just in terms of topics solely of interest to women, but as questions that went to the heart of what kind of society we'd all like to live in.

Afghanistan elections.

In the pre-brief, we talked about the need for another type of "surge" in Afghanistan - one of Afghan civilians taking charge of the reconstruction of their society, with women working with men to jointly determine Afghanistan's future, and, particularly, to grow economic opportunity. Mark may ask how the different election outcome scenarios in Afghanistan might affect women's lives there, and how the United States plans to keep its commitment to women in the foreground of our assistance. You could reaffirm women's integral role in long-term stability and national prosperity and the need for women to be in decision-making roles. We have called for a campaign that is credible, secure and inclusive - where men and women candidates can campaign with no restrictions on their freedom of movement and can be assured of protection.

DRC trip.

Although we did not talk about this topic in the pre-brief, Mark may ask about gender-based violence in DRC and what you hope to accomplish on this visit. Systematic statistics aren't available, but the reports from Panzi hospital and other care centers are that 1100 women are being brutally attacked each month. Rape is deliberately being used as a tool of conflict by both state military and rebel groups in the eastern DRC, precisely because targeting women effectively destroys their communities. In the atmosphere of impunity that is flourishing in DRC, rates of rape by civilians, in more stable areas of the country, are also increasing dramatically. Acting A/S Carter in AF, A/S Brimmer in IO, and I testified in May before joint Senate subcommittees on rape as a weapon of war in DRC and Sudan. You recently sent a letter to Senators Boxer, Shaheen, and Feingold that outlined the Department's coordinated plan for addressing rape prevention, protection, and treatment services, as well as plans to help strengthen DRC's judiciary and end the culture of impunity surrounding these crimes. You are also exploring steps you can take at the UN to address better implementation of key Security Council Resolutions 1325 (which addresses the impact on women of armed conflict) and 1820 (which acknowledges rape as a weapon of war to be a security issue, and advocates for the inclusion of women in peace negotiations), and working bilaterally through diplomatic channels. Your trip to Goma will give you an opportunity to see firsthand the effects of the conflict and to speak with service providers, peacekeepers, and the victims of the violence.

Iraq.

Mark and I did not discuss Iraq. However, like Afghanistan, it is a country in which women will be key to future progress and there is an urgent need to ensure that their potential is tapped by their leaders, especially as our military presence withdraws. The growing number of Iraqi widows are particularly vulnerable to both destitution and violence. The USG is supporting, through our PRT's, Quick Response Fund (QRF) program, international organizations, and implementing partners, funding for vocational and literacy training, microloans, and support for political participation. We have requested funds to support child/youth programs, economic empowerment, efforts to reduce gender-based violence and "honor" killings, women's shelters, and job training and placement in the FY 09 Supplemental. This request includes \$5 million for a new "Iraq War Widows Initiative" program which would complement existing programs to assist Iraq's widow and female-headed household population. Currently, for widows, we have a \$800,000 program with our partner the Free Iraq Foundation, which, over two years, will train 470 head-ofhousehold widows in democracy, women's rights, entrepreneurship and careerbuilding skills.

Worldwide violence against women.

Mark and I touched on the range of violence to which women are still subjected: not just the domestic violence that occurs in every country on earth, or rape used as a weapon of war, but also the continuing prevalence of "honor" killings (and the weak or nonexistent penalties for men who murder women under this pretext); trafficking, in which women are reduced to commodities; female genital mutilation, which both kills and maims; child marriage, which institutionalizes the rape of minors and deprives girls of their childhood and education; female infanticide and sex-selective abortion; dowry burnings, and more.

You responded, in February, to a letter from Representative DeLauro and a number of her colleagues, on the issue of child marriage in Saudi Arabia. The Congressmen and Congresswomen had written to express their dismay that a Saudi judge had upheld, on appeal, a refusal to grant an annulment of the marriage between an eight-year-old girl and a much-older man. You expressed your abhorrence of child marriage and pledged to continue to work within the bilateral relationship to help the Saudis criminalize the practice. In May, the marriage was annulled on further appeal, and the Shura Council, which advises the government, is evaluating the feasibility of setting the minimum age for marriage at 18. Yemen, similarly, raised its minimum age for marriage to 17

this year, after several courageous child brides – including a 12-year-old winner of the 2008 State Department International Women of Courage award – drew international attention to the practice.

Economic participation and the global economic downturn.

Mark and I briefly discussed how women's economic empowerment is the "low-hanging fruit" of development, in the words of Goldman Sachs chairman Lloyd Blankfein. An accumulation of empirical studies, from Goldman Sachs, the World Bank, McKinsey and others, have identified the ways in which increasing women's economic participation is "smart development": women – who reinvest 90 percent of their income in their families and communities – move economies ahead, lift communities out of poverty, and stimulate their countries' GDP growth.

Women, especially in the developing world, are being hit hard by the global economic downturn. Many economies in the emerging markets enjoyed a sustained boom because educated young women, in particular, moved from the informal economy (like farming and household work) to become engaged in export related industries like garments and small electronics. With the downturn in the export market, thousands of these women are now unemployed. Without corrective action, the repercussions of these job losses may adversely affect future economic growth and shortchange the development progress that has been made over the last few years. In the developing world, girls and women are in many places the first to lose access to education and to their basic needs of food and shelter when economic stresses tear into families. They are at greater risk of domestic violence and of being targeted by the sex work and trafficking industries. These "missing girls" at school have long-term implications for future economic health, potentially leading to a missing cohort of skilled female workers.

It is "smart economics" to invest in women's business and management development. It's why we are ensuring equal access for women in our food security initiative – to incorporate the perspectives of the 60 to 80 percent of smallhold farmers who are women – and why we need to help women take advantage of trade agreements, from Agoa to Pathways to Prosperity that you announced in El Salvador.

Nick Kristof's book.

We didn't talk about Nick's upcoming book, "Half the Sky," but the issue of the NYT magazine for which you are being interviewed is inspired by Nick's forthcoming release. He talks about the need for our world to confront

ongoing discrimination against women, and the need to overcome the inequality which is institutionalized in every country on earth, as well as for women's increased political and economic participation. His book covers the power of microenterprise, the sorry state of maternal mortality, violence against women – from chapters on trafficking to covering gang rape in Pakistan – the difference that girls' education makes, and the efforts of women in the Middle East to increase their rights and freedoms. This is what you have been working on around the globe since 1995 (and earlier, domestically).
He also cites NGOs and individuals who are helping to mobilize the public, which is your role as well: to encourage U.S. citizens, whether students or businesspeople, to be more engaged. Everyone makes a difference – as you demonstrated through Vital Voices.
Nick also wrote a column in the July 30 <sup>th</sup> New York Times on maternal mortality: highlighting the crisis, commenting on the U.S. government's lack of adequate attention to this issue, and calling on us to take action. Nick includes the striking statistic that one woman dies every minute from complications of pregnancy or childbirth somewhere in the world, and 20 times as many suffer childbirth injuries. As you know, progress toward Millennium Development Goal number five, addressing maternal mortality, has been woefully inadequate. Reductions in maternal mortality should be an important part of the Global Health Initiative, and our office is advocating for significant increases in funding for maternal health to address this in a serious and comprehensive way.
Future plans.  Mark may ask about your plans and goals for the integration of women's issues into foreign policy, and why an Ambassador was named for Global Women's Issues.

A New Gender Agenda Interview by Mark Landler The New York Times Magazine August 23, 2009

Hillary Rodham Clinton staked her claim as an advocate for global women's issues in 1995, when, as first lady, she gave an impassioned speech at a United Nations conference in Beijing. As secretary of state, she pushed to create a new position, ambassador at large for global women's issues, and recruited Melanne Verveer, her former chief of staff, to fill it. And she has drawn attention to women at nearly every stop in her travels, most recently on an 11-day visit to Africa, during which, among other things, she went to eastern Congo to speak out against mass rape. Hours before leaving on that trip, Clinton discussed women's issues and the Obama administration's foreign policy for 35 minutes in her elegant seventh-floor office at the State Department. What follows is a condensed and edited version of our conversation.

Q: In your confirmation hearing, you said you would put women's issues at the core of American foreign policy. But as you know, in much of the world, gender equality is not accepted as a universal human right. How do you overcome that deep-seated cultural resistance?

Clinton: You have to recognize how deep-seated it is, but also reach an understanding of how without providing more rights and responsibilities for women, many of the goals we claim to pursue in our foreign policy are either unachievable or much harder to achieve.

Democracy means nothing if half the people can't vote, or if their vote doesn't count, or if their literacy rate is so low that the exercise of their vote is in question. Which is why when I travel, I do events with women, I talk about women's rights, I meet with women activists, I raise women's concerns with the leaders I'm talking to.

I happen to believe that the transformation of women's roles is the last great impediment to universal progress — that we have made progress on many other aspects of human nature that used to be discriminatory bars to people's full participation. But in too many places and too many ways, the oppression of women stands as a stark reminder of how difficult it is to realize people's full human potential.

Q: I'm curious about what priorities you're setting. Will the Obama administration have a signature issue — sex trafficking or gender-based violence or maternal mortality or education for girls — in the way that H.I.V./AIDS came to symbolize the Bush-administration strategy?

Clinton: We are having as a signature issue the fact that women and girls are a core factor in our foreign policy. If you look at what has to be done, in some societies, it is a different problem than in others. In some of the societies where women are deprived of political and economic rights, they have access to education and health care. In other societies, they may have been given the vote, but girl babies are still being put out to die.

So it's not one specific program, so much as a policy. When it comes to our global health agenda, maternal health is now part of the Obama administration's outreach. We're very proud of the work this country has done, through Pepfar, on H.I.V./AIDS [the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief was begun by George W. Bush in 2003]. We've moved from an understanding of how to deal with global AIDS to recognizing it's now a woman's disease, because women are the most vulnerable and often have no power to protect themselves. And it's increasingly younger women or even

But women die every minute from poor maternal health care. You know, H.I.V./AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria — those are all, unfortunately, equalopportunity killers. Maternal health is a woman's issue; it's a family issue; it's a child issue. And for the United States to say to countries that have very high maternal mortality rates, "We care about the future of your children, and in order to do that, we care about the present of your women," is a powerful statement.

Q: Do you have a point of view about what should come first: Do you empower women economically and then hope that they seize a political role for themselves? Or do you seek to give them more legal and political standing and hope that they can win a place in the economic sphere?

Clinton: That's a great question, because I think the historical record would show both routes have worked. Women were not particularly economically empowered when we finally included the right of women to vote in our Constitution. So women's rights were expanded in 1920, and that opened up a lot of doors to women to see themselves in different roles, including economic roles, outside the home.

India's been a democracy for 60 years, and remarkably extended the vote to everyone, every caste, to both men and women equally. So women have been given the right to vote, but without economic empowerment, they didn't have the influence that their votes should have brought, which is why the government of India has made such a big point of extending economic and political opportunity equally to women.

And when we visited SEWA, the Self-Employed Women's Association [in India], those women had the vote before they were born, but being economically empowered, being able to stand up for themselves inside their

families, on the streets of their villages, is giving them a sense of autonomy and authority that just their vote couldn't have.

Q: In your travels as secretary of state, you've focused heavily on the role of microlending. Is there a reason in these early days that you've tended to emphasize the economic over the political?

Clinton: It's interesting: it's partly because of where I've gone. It's also because I've worked on microcredit since 1983, going back to Arkansas and projects that I worked on with my husband there.

I am also struck by every international public-opinion poll I've ever seen, that the No. 1 thing most men and women want is a good job with a good income. It is at the core of the human aspiration to be able to support oneself, to give one's children a better future. Microenterprise is uniquely designed to empower women because — through the trial and error of its development, going back to Muhammad Yunus's invention of it in Bangladesh - women are much greater at investing in future goods than the men who have participated in microcredit have turned out to be. And they are also very reliable in paying back, because they are so eager to have that extra help and recognition that microcredit provides.

So, I don't make a distinction between economic empowerment and political, social empowerment; I think it's fair to say both need to go hand in hand.

Q: There are counterterrorism experts who have made the observation that countries that nurture terrorist groups tend to be the same societies that marginalize women. Do you see a link between your campaign on women's issues and our national security?

Clinton: I think it's an absolute link. Part of the reason I have pursued it as secretary of state is because I see it in our national security interest. If you look at where we are fighting terrorism, there is a connection to groups that are making a stand against modernity, and that is most evident in their treatment of women.

What does preventing little girls from going to school in Afghanistan by throwing acid on them have to do with waging a struggle against oppression externally? It's a projection of the insecurity and the disorientation that a lot of these terrorists and their sympathizers feel about a fast-changing world, where they turn on television sets and see programs with women behaving in ways they can't even imagine. The idea that young women in their own societies would pursue an independent future is deeply threatening to their cultural values.

Q: Many of the countries where the abuses against women are most prevalent are also countries that have a vital strategic importance to the

United States: Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, India. How can you aggressively advocate for women without jeopardizing those strategic relationships?

Clinton: Well, in a number of these strategic relationships, there's a commitment to advancing the roles and rights of women. In India, the changes that have been made are remarkable. There are still tens of millions of very poor women, but women have assumed more and more responsibility; they are seen in public positions and increasingly economic ones, where their stature is accepted by society.

When I meet with the Chinese leadership, as I just did in the Strategic and Economic Dialogue, they have women who are part of their leadership team, and women who are assuming greater and greater economic and political roles.

Obviously, there's work to be done in both India and China, because the infanticide rate of girl babies is still overwhelmingly high, and unfortunately with technology, parents are able to use sonograms to determine the sex of a baby, and to abort girl children simply because they'd rather have a boy. And those are deeply set attitudes. But at the governmental level, there is a great deal of openness and commitment that I am seeing.

In other societies where we have strategic security interests, it's a challenge to move the agenda forward in a way that includes women's issues. When we did our strategic review on Afghanistan, we said very clearly, We can't be all things to all people in Afghanistan. We have to focus on a few critical concerns. But one of them was the role of women, and women's participation in society.

Q: Let me ask you one question about India, where we've just concluded a Strategic Dialogue agreement. I didn't notice too much emphasis on sex trafficking on your trip, even though it's clear India remains the world capital of sex trafficking. Can you make that case strenuously with the Indians at the same moment that we're trying to do so many other things with them?

Clinton: Absolutely, and in fact, we do it every year with our annual report on trafficking in persons. It's a very high priority to me, and it is raised as part of the ongoing discussions that we have with many countries. In a democracy like India, there is a challenge of getting the word down to the local jurisdiction — the local police, the local judges, the local authorities. But I have no doubt about the seriousness with which their government takes this issue.

Q: Could some of the billions of dollars the United States has spent on military aid to Pakistan since 9/11 have been better spent on education and health care for girls and women?

Clinton: Yes. The answer is yes, and in my meetings with then-President Musharraf in '03, '05, '07, in this country as well, I raised it all the time.

I remember visiting a village about 45 minutes outside of Lahore, when I was in Pakistan as first lady, and we met with a group of mothers and grandmothers in the village. And they wanted very much to have a school at the secondary level for their daughters, the way their sons did. But the school for their sons was not in the village, so the sons had to travel. No one could even imagine the daughters traveling outside their village to continue their education.

And when I think about the extraordinarily accomplished Pakistanis in the professions, in medicine, in education, I think it is certainly the case that if Pakistan had invested more in the education of children so that poor families would not have sent their boys off to be educated by extremists, it might well have made a difference. And it still can, because that's part of our approach now.

O: Because it's also a question of how we allocate our resources.

Clinton: That's right, and with the Kerry-Lugar/Berman bill[s] that provide aid for these kinds of purposes in Pakistan, we hope to try to make up for lost time. [These Senate and House bills are currently being finalized in Congress.]

Q: Gender-based violence is an enormous issue in much of Africa, and in places like Congo, rape, as you know, is an instrument of war. How can you, or anybody else, hope to combat that?

Clinton: President Obama and I and the United States will not tolerate this continuation of wanton, senseless, brutal violence perpetrated against girls and women. We don't know exactly what we can do, but we are going to be delivering some aid and some ideas about how to better organize the communities to deal with it. We're going to sound the alarm that this is not all just unexpected and irrational.

These militias, which perpetrate a lot of these rapes and other horrific assaults on girls and women, are paid well, or realize the spoils of guarding the mines. Those mines, which are one of the great natural resources of the Congo, produce a lot of the materials that go into our cellphones and other electronics. There are tens of millions of dollars that go into these militias that, in effect, get translated into a sense of impunity that is then exercised against the weakest members of society.

The ambassador for war crimes, Steve Rapp, has the distinction of being among the first international prosecutors to win a case on gender violence, and I specifically wanted him to take on this role, because I want to highlight this issue.

Q: I've been at more than a few women's events with you overseas where the men in the audience drift off to their BlackBerrys or into a snooze after a few minutes. How do you change the mind-set, not just overseas but at home and in this building, that tends to view women's issues as a pink ghetto?

Clinton: By making the arguments that I am making here — that so-called women's issues are stability issues, security issues, equity issues. The World Bank and many other analyses have proved over and over again that where women are mistreated, where they are denied equal rights, you will find instability that very often serves as an incubator of extremism.

A woman who is safe enough in her own life to invest in her children and see them go to school is not going to have as many children. The resource battles over water and land will be diminished. This is all connected. And it's an issue of how we take hard power and soft power, so called, and use it to advance not just American ends but, in advancing global progress, we are making the world safer for our own children.

Q: Last month in New Delhi, a young woman asked you an interesting question: How would you view the progress of women in both India and the United States? She pointed out that India elected a woman as prime minister within three decades of independence, while the U.S. had yet to elect a female president. Is there any lesson from your own presidential campaign that you can use to take to women elsewhere in the world?

Clinton: Well, you've heard me talk about this in a lot of settings, from Japan to South Korea to Indonesia to India to Latin America [laughs]. It is one of the most common questions I'm asked, along with the question about how I can now work for and with President Obama, since he and I ran so vigorously against each other. It is clearly on young women's minds. And I find that both exciting and gratifying.

My campaign for many millions of reasons gave a lot of heart to many young women. It is still the most common comment that people make to me: "your campaign gave me courage" or "your campaign made a difference in my daughter's life" or "I went back to school because of your campaign." So, it is unfinished business, and young women know it is unfinished business.

The vast majority of them will never run for political office in any country. But they may decide to seek an education that their family doesn't approve of, or move away for a job that is a little bit frightening to them, but which they feel they've got the skills to do. Or, you know, stand up and speak out against an injustice they see. And it is all of that ripple that is building and building — and is unstoppable.

I live for those moments where I see this woman stand up in SEWA — this poor, uneducated woman — and say, "I am the president of SEWA; 1.1 million women voted." I mean, what a great statement that was from her. So, I get a lot of joy out of doing this work. I think it is so critically important, but it is also incredibly moving to see these individual lives . changed because of some event or speech that you have no idea why it made an impression on them.

Ling has been working in television for nearly two decades. At age 16, the Northern California native hosted "Scratch," a nationally syndicated teen magazine show.

Ling moved on to become one of the youngest reporters for Channel One News, a network seen in middle and high schools across the country. By the age of 25, Ling was a Channel One war correspondent, visiting violent hot spots around the globe. In the field, she hunted down cocaine processing labs, reported on refugee crises and shared tea with the Dalai Lama.

Altogether, Ling reported from more than two dozen countries, including Afghanistan, Iraq, and Iran. Ling's hard work continues off-camera: she serves as a contributing editor for USA Weekend and recently co-authored a book entitled "Mother, Daughter, Sister, Bride: Rituals of Womanhood."

ABAC has conducted a poll on "Mrs. Hillary Clinton and the Secret Jail in Thailand". I think there are some interesting results that may be of your interest. The poll was conducted today among respondents aged 18 up from 1,082 households in 17 provinces nationwide.

77.9% of respondents were informed of Mrs. Clinton's visit to Thailand by watching news on TV / 28.5% did not learn of this news

56.3% thought the fact that Mrs. Clinton was in her orange dress is meaningful, thinking it is a combination of red and yellow—a reflection of prominence and prosperity involving her role.





In Surte, senior African officials expressed deep appreciation for the role the United States is playing on Sudan, and noted that US influence has resulted in consensus on the above confidence-building approach. While previous agreements have gone unimplemented, all parties now agree that implementation will be carried out first, then senior-level meetings can be arranged to confirm full implementation. We will continue to press forward on this track.

On my last day in Libya, senior Libyan officials dispatched an aircraft to take me and the Ambassador back to Sirte for discussions with Libyan Leader al-Qadafi. The Leader welcomed the US role in Sudan and endorsed our joint approach. He asked that the United States and Libya work together to end the proxy war between Chad and Sudan, and to address the underlying causes of the conflict in Darfur. He stressed that the opportunity to bring peace to Chad and Sudan (and to Darfur) must be seized. I conveyed our appreciation for Libya's role to improve relations between Chad and Sudan, and pledged our support for joint efforts to end the Chadian-Sudanese proxy conflict. Leader al-Qadafi promised to continue his nation's close collaboration with the United States. As Chairman of the African Union, Leader al-Qadafi will represent the AU in Rome at the G8 summit and is eager to meet you and President Obama on the margins of the Summit.

In Rome, I met with the UN Food and Agriculture Organization's (FAO) emergency program and the UN World Food Program Executive Director FAO representatives expressed appreciation for US aid and warned of growing instability from drought, localized floods, and conflict in Southern Sudan. WFP confirmed that growing instability in Southern Sudan is negatively affecting rehabilitation operations, and warned that development efforts were being diverted to meet needs of newly displaced persons as a result of the conflicts—particularly in Southern Kordofan WFP operations in Darfur continue to meet 95-100 percent of the emergency food needs for internally displaced persons in Darfur. The UN is continuing to use local communities (although in a decreasing manner) to distribute food where international NGOs are not yet available. In addition to its focus on meeting emergency food needs for internally displaced in Darfur, WFP is also working with other partners to review how to support voluntary returns from camps to their places of origin or to other areas chosen by the Darfur people. WFP and other agencies are looking to coordinate activities to ensure physical security and human rights protection are guaranteed for all returnees, and that food and non-food needs will be met. 

PRESS BACKGROUND BRIEFING ON NORTH KOREA BY SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL

Via Conference Call

10:45 P.M. EDT

MR. McDONOUGH: Hey, everybody. Thank you very much for waiting for us, and apologies for making you wait. We do appreciate very much the opportunity to get on the phone here and just talk you through a little bit of what's transpired over the last couple days.

I do think it's worth noting that earlier tonight, between 8:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. eastern time, the President did call family members of both Euna Lee and Laura Ling to express his relief that their families will be reunited here shortly.

I'm going to turn it over to one of my colleagues -- senior administration official colleagues here to talk through several important data points as it relates to the last several days and then we'll open it up to your questions, mindful of the fact that it's late in the night here and everybody wants to get some rest. I'd just remind everybody that this call is on background and let me turn it over to my senior administration official colleague.

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Good evening and thanks for joining us.

I want to not just go back a couple of days, but go back a few months here to give some context to the events of today in Pyongyang. Today's events reflect an awful lot of work over a couple of months on behalf of two United States citizens who were detained in North Korea and also the very fine work of President Clinton and his team in North Korea today.

As I think most of you know, on March 17, 2009, North Korea border guards seized and detained two American journalists, Laura Ling and Euna Lee, while they were filming for former Vice President Al Gore's Current TV along the China-North Korean border. Since their being detained the President and Secretary of State directed that we in the administration take every appropriate step to look out for the safety of these Americans and expedite their release.

On June 8, 2009, Laura Ling and Euna Lee were convicted on charges brought by the North Koreans and were sentenced to 12 years of hard labor in a labor camp. As the State Department has briefed -- and the set-up here, as you know, we don't have relations, formal diplomatic relations with the North Koreans, so that we have in Pyongyang what's called a protective power, a protecting power, and it's the Swedish government.

The Swedish ambassador in Pyongyang, acting on our behalf, provided consular services and got mail and medicine to the two women. At our request Sweden also pressed very hard to ensure their safety and good treatment, and were very appreciative of that good work by the Swedes, especially Ambassador Mats Foyer in Pyongyang.

Through the Swedish ambassador and other channels, as I said, we repeatedly pressed the North Koreans to agree to the quickest posture release of the two journalists and the guarantee of their well-being in the meantime. During this time we in the State Department maintained very close contact with the families of the two journalists, talking to them daily, briefing them on efforts each week. And as you know, Secretary Clinton met with the families in person in May.

In response to our many requests, the North Korean authorities at a point during the spring began allowing Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee to call their families periodically, and family members, they shared their readouts of these calls with us. Often Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee reported what the North Korean officials were telling them.

In mid-July, during one such phone call, Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee shared what the North Koreans had told them -- that they would be willing to grant them amnesty and release the two Americans if an envoy in the person of President Clinton would agree to come to Pyongyang and seek their

This, as I said, was reported by family members to us, and to Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee's employer, former Vice President Al Gore. Both the families of former [Vice] President Gore asked us in the United States government to assist in seeing if President Clinton could go on a humanitarian mission, and if he did, whether such a trip would be successful in securing the release of Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee.

The National Security Advisor and our team here did quite a bit of due diligence on this issue through a variety of channels and a variety of means to seek a judgment -- to make a judgment as to whether or not if in fact President Clinton did go to Pyongyang, that he would be able to successfully secure the release of our two American journalists there. As I said, we did a lot of due diligence on this through a variety of channels, and worked this issue very hard.

During the weekend of the 24-25 of July, the National Security Advisor spoke with President Clinton about his willingness to take on this mission and as we indicated, Vice President Gore, on behalf of the families, had already been in touch with President Clinton about this.

So the families and Vice President Gore made their appeal to Bill Clinton to go to Pyongyang. We spoke to him over that weekend. President Clinton indicated that he would be willing to undertake this mission as a private, humanitarian mission if there were a reasonable chance of getting Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee released. We continued to do our due diligence on this issue. We considered the request carefully. We tested directly with the North Koreans repeatedly. We sought and received North Korea's agreement in fact that a visit by President Clinton would secure the release of Ms. Ling and Ms. Lee.

During the course of these discussions, it was insisted that the North Koreans acknowledge, as former President Clinton's visit was not any part of a negotiation, it was not in any way connected to the nuclear issue or other issues that we have a government-to-government basis with the DPRK, including their noncompliance with international obligations and behaviors that have been the subject of Security Council resolutions and statements and actions by our government and other governments in the international community.

The North Koreans confirmed to us directly that they accepted his visit in a private capacity that exclusively focused on the humanitarian purpose of releasing the two Americans. On this basis, President Clinton proceeded to make the logistical arrangements to go to North Korea to seek the -- secure their release.

In advance of departure, President Clinton did talk directly with the families and with Vice President Gore, where they repeated his request that he make this trip.

I should also point out that we in the administration, prior to President Clinton making the trip, consulted directly with allies to ensure that they understood what the trip was about and what it wasn't about. Consistent with the humanitarian nature of the trip, we offered President Clinton's good (inaudible) in pressing North Korea on humanitarian concerns of other

countries, including South Korean citizens and abducted Japanese citizens.

In advance of the departure, we also conferred with China and Russia and our other partners in the six-party talks to make sure, again, as I said, that they fully understood what the trip was and what it wasn't; that they fully understood specifically the unofficial, humanitarian character of the trip.

As you all know by now, President Clinton and his party have left North Korea. They're on their back to the United States. We've been in touch with them. We can report that the two journalists are enormously relieved and in seemingly very good health.

And with that, Denis, I'd be glad to answer any questions as to what we know about this and what we can tell folks about our efforts to date.

Yes, when you say that you tested the idea with the North Koreans repeatedly, do you mean there were direct talks between the U.S. and North Korea or was that also conducted through an intermediary?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: I don't want to get into the details of how this has gone. I can tell you, though, that after the two journalists in conversations with their family members indicated that North Korean officials had told them that if President Clinton visited as an envoy on a private mission that they would be released, that we, through a variety of means, tested that proposition and to our satisfaction were convinced that in fact the North Koreans would, in response to President Clinton visiting Pyongyang would release the journalists. I don't want to get into the details of exactly how we communicated, the back and forth.

I can tell you though that we became convinced through our contacts that in fact this would be the result, and it was based don that that we could advise President Clinton that his trip was likely to be successful.

Thank you very much. I just really wanted to take a step back and look at policy overall to North Korea. How is it possible to maintain that North Korea is deepening its isolation as a result of the nuclear program when you just had this very high-level, albeit. private, Visit by a former President of the United States? I know that you're insisting that these are two wholly separate tracks, but doesn't it at least complicate your message that North Korea is isolating itself still further?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: We, in undertaking this project -- and I will tell you and we can tell you after talking to our colleagues who were in Pyongyang over the last day, can tell you that we made clear in every communication we had with the North Koreans, and President Clinton made clear in all his conversations, that this was a purely private humanitarian mission aimed solely at the release of the two American journalists -- and that in fact was completely separate from issues between North Korea and the international community. It was made crystal clear, the separation here. That's point one.

Point two is that the United States and its international partners continue to pursue aggressively the goal of a verifiable denuclearized Korean Peninsula. The United States -- and as you've seen over recent weeks, having secured a new Security Council Resolution, 1874, fully intends and has to successfully implement that resolution. You've seen a number of instances -a couple of instances of that in recent weeks and we'll continue to implement that resolution vigorously.

I have to tell you, as Secretary Clinton said after her trip to the ASEAN meeting last week, that I don't know of a time when the Koreans have been more isolated. I don't know of a time when there's been such cooperation among the international community with respect to actual implementation -- not just adoption, but implementation of an important and tough U.N. resolution. And we will continue on that path.

So I -- you know, it's just the facts. It's in the performance. So it was both in the communications with North Korea about what this was and what this wasn't, and we had one goal in mind, which was in the U.S. interest, which was to seek to release of these two Americans. That's what it was, and we've been very clear about what it wasn't. It in no way indicates -and we've been -- that's why I also wanted to underscore the consultations that we had with allies before the mission to make sure we were absolutely clear here as to what it was and what it wasn't. And it wasn't in any way about our disagreements with the DPRK with respect to its conduct or with respect to our intention to vigorously enforce the resolution and to vigorously seek the denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula.

If I could follow up on that --

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Sure, of course, go ahead, sorry.

The other argument, of course, is that -- is there any possibility that at a time when North Korea has indicated it may be willing to get back to some kind of talks with the U.S., that this might create a certain positive momentum by cooling tensions? Is there any overlap in that sense?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Yes, we have indicated quite clearly, in coordination with our partners in the six-party talks, that the Koreans have two paths to consider here. They can consider the path of provocative behavior, continuing to pursue their nuclear program, and they will face deepening isolation. There's another path, which is they actually implement irreversibly the steps that they've agreed to implement to date, and that they can come back into talks. But the two paths are quite clear here, and we feel that those paths remain in front of them.

So, you know, to answer to your question directly, that's up to the North Koreans, as it has been. Provocative behavior, continued pursuit of the nuclear program, continued violation of U.N. Security Council resolutions will result in their facing the kind of unified international community isolation that they're facing at this moment. A path that says that they re-embrace the irreversible denuclearization of the North Korean Peninsula, and engage in a way that indicates the irreversible taking of the steps that they've agreed to take in 2005 and beyond would put it on a different path. That's our firm view going forward here, and it's up to them.

- Thank you. Q
- Hi, there. I won't use your name, but nice to talk to you. Can you tell us about the conversations between former President Clinton and Kim Jong-il? I mean, to what degree did they discuss the nuclear program? Who brought it up first? What can you tell us?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Margaret, I can't -- you know, we don't have a detailed readout on exactly what happened. I can give you a couple of things here, though.

Number one, of course the principle discussion was around seeking the release of the journalists. Point one.

Point two, I can give you a couple of details which we've learned in our conversation with the folks on the airplane before getting on the phone with you all; that President Clinton and his team did engage in an hour-and-fifteen-minute meeting with President Kim Jong-il this -- I guess yesterday afternoon, right, and then had a dinner which lasted a little over two hours. So the total amount of time that they were speaking -- or in meetings or in dinners with each other was about a little over three hours and 15 minutes. And I don't have a readout on the particulars of what was discussed at this point.

Was the nuclear issue at least discussed?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: I don't know the answer to that question, you know. President Clinton -- I'm sure he gave him -- I'm sure President Clinton gave President Kim his views on denuclearization, and his views are well known with respect to denuclearization.

And President Clinton, as you know, Margaret, has a history here of both being quite tough, where we went through some very serious episodes with the North Koreans, as you know when you covered in the 1990s, but also entered into agreements and with President Kim's father.

And President Clinton's view on denuclearization and on the question of whether or not pursuit of nuclear weapons will make the North Koreans safer or -- more safe or less safe are well known. But again I'd be speculating at this point, given the short conversations we've had with them to go beyond that.

But I can tell you this, though, one other thing that one of my colleagues just reminded me of here, is that in addition to discussing, Margaret, the U.S. journalists, he also discussed and we know pressed very hard -- and we heard this from our debrief, our short debrief from the plane -- he did press very hard on the positive things that could flow from the release of the South Korean detainees and entering into talks and to really -- seeking the release of Japanese

abductees. So I can tell you with confidence that both those issues were raised.

Good evening, gentlemen. Let me ask this. In this sequence of events did President Obama speak either directly to former President Clinton or Vice President Gore as this process moved along? And for a while there was this sort of public spat between the North Korean government and Secretary of State Clinton about her characterization of North Korea's isolation and it I guess is maybe consistent with North Korea's own behavior, but it just seems interesting that that kind of spat would be going on while it appears, based on your timeline, that these other very significant conversations were going on in back channels about the release of these two journalists. Can you address both of those issues?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: I can, Major. With respect to conversations that President Obama has had, former Vice President Gore has been directly, vigorously, and constantly involved in trying to seek the release of his colleagues at Current TV. And Vice President Gore has been, as I said, pretty tireless in this effort, and I think if you talk to the families of the two journalists they'll tell you that. And that includes being in touch quite frequently with members of the United States government -- and I do believe he did have at least one conversation with President Obama. Point one.

Point two on your question is that President Obama has not spoken to President Clinton about this mission or about this issue. President Clinton has had, as you would expect, conversations with members of the national security team and in preparation -- well, two things: One, in determining the bona fides of the offer -- that is, whether or not we could assure him that if he undertook this visit, as I said earlier, that in fact it would succeed, and we did tremendous amount of due diligence on that, and we did talk to him obviously about

And secondly, prior to his trip, he was -- as we would do with any other prominent American undertaking such a trip, we did sit down with him on two occasions, the last one being last Saturday at his residence in Washington --

#### Would these be face to face?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Yes, absolutely. There were telephone conversations, but there were at least two face-to-face briefings, Major. One on the issue, as I said, of the bona fides of the offer, but the second, as we would do with any prominent American or any American who undertook such a trip, we did last Saturday. He did sit down with members of the interagency team and experts on the Korean issue to receive a briefing on the issues and on the current circumstance in Korea. And that's, as I said, that last briefing took place at his residence in Washington, D.C., last Saturday.

Last Saturday?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Yes.

And on the spat?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Remind me of the spat?

Oh, the -- you'll remember, there was this kind of dialogue, official commentary from the North Koreans comparing the Secretary of State to a child or a young girl or a schoolgirl or something like that, and it just seems odd that that kind of highly undiplomatic language was going on at the same time it appears, based on your timeline, that very high-level and intense back-channel diplomacy was going on about the two journalists.

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Yes, both those things were going on at the same time. That's just a fact.

Anything unusual or striking about that in your mind?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: No, I just think, as I said earlier to the question from the Financial Times, that we are engaged in an effort, worked with the international community, with respect to the North Korean nuclear program and other issues. And those efforts are important and they continue. But we also had an effort underway to -- as we had from March of 2009 -- an effort underway to seek the release of American citizens, which we consider to be one of our obligations. And as you know, we take that really seriously here.

Q Very good, thank you.

MR. McDONOUGH: Why don't we take one more?

Q Hi. Can you just clear up whether there was an apology or sign of contrition from former President Clinton towards the North Koreans as the official media has reported? And how much of a sort of bounty do you expect to receive in terms of the kind of intelligence the former President was able to gather about the state of Kim Jong-il's health, possible succession moves, and what's going on inside North Korea?

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: With respect to the first question, the answer is no. With respect to the second, I'm not going to comment on that.

MR. McDONOUGH: All right, everybody. Sure appreciate you getting on the phone with us here and I'm sure we'll be in touch on this and other issues. But let me just reiterate here in closing that this is a briefing on background and we sure appreciate you're taking the time to be with us.

SENIOR ADMINISTRATION OFFICIAL: Thanks for your patience, everybody, and I apologize for being so late.

Here are some top level thoughts and questions. We should talk through it, I am happy to chat this weekend. I will keep feeding you stuff but wanted to get these off ASAP. See my comment boxes imbedded in the attached as well and then other notes below. Let's talk when you can

- 1. Do you want a list of cultural options? If so, where are you most likely to have some time? Do you want everything from shopping to church to half day gorilla safari? There is a safari park in the MIDDLE of Nairobi, I know she has done it but she could do a sunrise safari trip before her official stuff starts.
- 2. I don't know what your briefing books are like now but I have a whole bunch of briefing papers for many of the issues you are exploring and site briefs if you want them. Let me know so we can start pulling.
- I am working on some public-private partnership water sites will have those to you soon. Do you want to see some other health research like TB vaccines? You can do that in Cape Town...
- Where do you think your biggest holes are?

#### <u>Kenya</u>

- I think you should really try to visit Kibera Slum. Largest slum on continent and there is so much to see/learn. We could do any number of things highlighting Water, Sanitation, Health, Maternal-Newborn-Child Health etc - if you want specific options let me know which issue you are leaning toward. After the Kenyan elections there was a ton of violence there, a bunch of it burned etc. It is visually stunning
- I know the KARI research folks well. There are some extraordinary women researchers we should be sure to include/highlight. Its cool because its different women in research in AG is unique and people don't hear it/see it much. Note that the entire AGRA team (Gates and Rockefeller grant) are in DC on Monday and Tuesday if any of your policy people want to meet with them about this trip/ideas. We should do a tour of KARI's facility (crops in the field) as well as a sit down discussion with some leading crop scientists. Need to have enough time for this. Beautiful photos, uplifting site visit, women as partners etc.
- We can give you some good names for the civil society roundtable in Nairobi if you do one.
- I was with HRC the day of the bombings, I don't know if you remember the nightmare of trying to find a plane to go there and retrieve the bodies. As you know, we didn't go, Madeline went instead but there are some extraordinary people/survivors one woman I know who was pregnant, thankfully had the baby, loves the Clintons anyway we should make sure to get some of them there for the wreath laying or Embassy meet and greet.
- I know a number of women agribusiness entrepreneurs if you want to stop by their shops on the way to or from the AGOA forum (street stands where they sell seeds etc)

## 6. Pretoria

There are some extraordinary young successful women entrepreneurs we should include in your lunch. I will put together a list if you want. Richard Branson has done a lot of work with entrepreneurs there, he may have an exchange happening around that time, let me know and I will find out what their plans

Congo

In general you should spend AS MUCH time as possible in Goma. They will want you out by sun down

so get there early.

We should do the survivors discussion at HEAL Africa in Goma. It is the only hospital around performing fistula repair surgery. Women come there for the surgery as a result of rape and child birth. We can tour, talk with women and then have a talk there. Good spaces for this. They have income generating activities on site as well so that would tie in with your social/economic entrepreneurship

For the peace keepers meeting, you can go to their compound and meet with them. Its all close in

Goma no more than 25 minutes drive to anything

There are 3 massive refugee and IDP camps right in Goma. It is a little weird to go there and not see one, you will pass them on the road. There are about 100k people displaced (living in camps) right in Goma. UNHCR is doing a terrible job of caring for these people but other, local Congolese orgs are there as well and you could see them.

There is a therapeutic feeding center (1-5) year olds run by International Medical Corp in Goma. Incredible place, its run by Africans so you would get a good sense of African solutions to African

Note you can walk from Goma into Rwanda.....literally. President Kagame regularly takes meetings in Gisenyi on the border with Goma and you can take off from his military base. The stunning difference between Congo/Rwanda can literally be seen by walking across the border.

The "Desmond Tutu" of Congo is a priest named Malu Malu, you could meet with him/others in the peace process. Great example of regional governance/local solutions. You could see him in either west or east.

Let me know if you want other site ideas for Kinshasa.....

#### Nigeria

FYI in November 08 there was a Heads of State Summit re: Congo held in Nairboi, Obasanjo (fmr Pres Nigeria) was lead negotiator the HoS agreed to call for an immediate ceasefire, humanitarian corridors and urgent humanitarian assistance, strengthened MONUC mandate and additional forces, establishment of regional forces and a Great Lakes, AU and UN mechanism. Anyway he is back in Nigeria, you may want to see him since you have just been in Congo. Its another great example of Good regional governance.



The North Koreans have conducted two such tests before, including one over Japanese territory, and American officials are particularly concerned about Japan's reaction to another test. Such missiles could theoretically reach Alaska and Hawaii

The news comes as North Korea has been test-firing short-range missiles since Monday, when it conducted an underground nuclear test

North Korea last test-fired a long-range missile on April 5 That test did not achieve its goal of putting a satellite into orbit.

# Background

In order to create conditions for progress in the P5 plus 2 (Japan and South Korea) consultations scheduled at the Permanent Representative level in New York on Monday, we need to move both the Russians and the Chinese from a position of offering nothing concrete beyond the existing provisions of UNSC resolution 1718 to a position of willingness to negotiate substantively new elements that go beyond resolution 1718. Thus far, our USUN experts level and Permanent Representative level consultations have borne no fruit. Our embassies in Moscow and Beijing are delivering talking points to the Russian and Chinese governments, however, without high-level contact, the Chinese and Russian missions are unlikely to have the flexibility to negotiate elements of the resolution when discussions resume Monday morning in New York. Should we be unable to move the Chinese and the Russians with calls at your level, we are asking the President to be prepared to make calls to his counterparts as well.

As we discussed, the timing of this application comes at a unique time in the history of U.S.-Cuba relations. While occasionally, Cuban artists residing in third countries have been admitted into the country, no Cuban artist still residing in Cuba has been issued a visa since December 2003 when the Bush administration rejected notions of the Clinton administration's "people-to-people" policy and returned to the Reagan Proclamation in which all Cuban artists were considered agents or employees of the Cuban government or were members of the Communist Party, and therefore ineligible for entry into the U.S.

With the election of President Obama, there has been renewed hope for better relations with Cuba. Following up on his pre-election pledge for engagement with Cuba, President Obama has already partially reversed the Bush administration's policy, mainly by allowing unrestricted travel to Cuban American family members. Yesterday's announcement was the latest, most significant of these policy changes.

While no mention was made of a change regarding cultural exchanges with Cuba, it is expected that President Obama will return to the "people-to-people" policy that allowed so many Cuban artists to travel to the U.S. (and for U.S. artists to perform in Cuba). Such a reverse of policy is consistent with his "cultural diplomacy" platform: "opening America's doors to...artists provides the kind of two-way cultural understanding that can break down the barriers that feed hatred and fear...Barack Obama will streamline the visa process to return America to its rightful place as the world's top destination for artists....".

# Background for the Secretary's Call to Foreign Minister Wirajuda

- We believe that Indonesia can be an important voice on Burma.
- With over forty percent of Southeast Asia's population, Indonesia plays a key leadership role in ASEAN.
- Indonesia has been at the forefront of leading ASEAN to take a stronger stand on democracy and human rights. For example, Indonesia pressed for inclusion of language on those topics in the ASEAN Charter. Indonesia is also working to create a credible ASEAN Human Rights Body.
- President Yudhoyono (SBY) and FM Wirajuda have also sought to promote democracy throughout Asia, chiefly through the Indonesia-hosted Bali Democracy Forum, which met for the first time in December 2008.
- SBY has written to Senior General Than Shwe several times urging reform. To our knowledge, however, the Burmese have never replied.
- Yudhoyono believes that Indonesia's own transition from a military dominated authoritarian government to a democracy offers a useful model for Burma's own reform process. Indonesian leaders also think that their success with regional separatist conflicts, such as those in Aceh and Papua, will allow them to help the Burmese address similar problems.

Background for the Secretary's Call to Foreign Minister Wirajuda

We believe that Indonesia can be an important voice on Burma.

With over forty percent of Southeast Asia's population, Indonesia plays a key leadership role in ASEAN

Indonesia has been at the forefront of leading ASEAN to take a stronger stand on democracy and human rights. For example, Indonesia pressed for inclusion of language on those topics in the ASEAN Charter Indonesia is also working to create a credible ASEAN Human Rights Body.
