This is the third interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), dated December 29, 2015. This letter hereby describes the agency's efforts to date.

DHS's Production

For this month's production DHS reviewed 491 responsive pages. Of the 491 pages, 101 pages are released in full, 249 pages are released in part pursuant to FOIA exemption 5 and 6, and 141 pages are withheld in full pursuant to FOIA exemption 5 and 6. The enclosed documents are bates stamped DHS-172-00405 to DHS-172-00895.


From the bottom of my heart, for all you have done and will continue to do, thank you.

>1. The rush to close Guantanamo over the past several months is >inspired party by President Obama¹s concerns about his legacy, and >partly by political calculations, as presidential elections approach.

This comports with neither the current reality nor the facts when I was speaking on behalf of the the Dept of Defense on matters related to detainee policy. Not once, since I started speaking for the detainee policy to now, has anyone ever mentioned the words "legacy," "political calculations," and / or "Guantanamo" in the same sentence. The president has sought to close the detention facility at Guantanamo Bay because is serves as an inspiration point for those looking to do harm to the United States and because it doesn't represent who we are as Americans. The president and those who work to accomplish his policies have been consistently clear on this: responsibly and securely closing the detention facility at Guantanamo Bay is a national security imperative

>2. Nearly every part of the Administration has been involved in or >dealt with the closing of the prison

While I'm not qualified to address this, what I do know is that it seems like a functional impossibility for anyone to assert something this sweeping.

- >3. We spoke about this before; just Confirming a few details about the >case of seventeen Uighur detainees:
- a. In April 2009, Rahm Emanuel called a principals committee
 meeting, including Cabinet-level secretaries and directors concerned
 with National Security, in the White House Situation room.
- b. At this meeting, everyone agreed that two of the Uighur
 detainees should be brought to northern Virginia

- c. After this meeting, White House officials met with
 Representative Frank Wolf, but Rep Wolf only learned about the transfer
 of Uighur detainees to Virginia at the last minute when the information
 was leaked to him.
- > d. After Rep Wolf and Harry Reid voiced their opposition to the >transfer, Emanuel abandoned the idea of the transfer, and Pres Obama >did not force the issue.

>4. Pres Obama chose to set aside Guantanamo in favor of competing>priorities, such as the Affordable Care Act

The president and his administration are capable of completing multiple tasks at one time. Other than through wild speculation, I'm unclear how this can be reasonably asserted.

>5. In August 2010, a principals committee meeting was scheduled and>some Pentagon staffers had indicated that the Secretary of Defense>Robert Gates would argue the military should resume trying detainees.

>6. In 2010, the Senate added a provision in a defense authorization >bill that required the Secretary of Defense to issue a certification to >Congress that personally ensured detainees would not re-engage in >terrorist activities. When these provisions were revealed, White House >was shocked.

Such a provision was inserted into the NDAA in 2010. However, I was serving in Afghanistan during this time and I cannot speak to what anyone in the WH might have thought at any given time.

>7. Pres Obama didn¹t veto this spending bill because the legislation >also contained provisions that would repeal the military¹s ³Don¹t Ask, >Don¹t Tell² policy

The Don't Ask, Don't Tell Repeal Act (H.R. 2965 & S 4023) was a stand-alone piece of legislation that passed the House on Dec. 15, 2010 and the Senate on Dec. 18, 2010. It was signed by the president on Dec. 22, 2010. It had originally been attached as a rider to the NDAA but never made it to the president's desk.

>8. When Hillary Clinton departed as Sec of State, she sent a memo to >Pres Obama urging him to appoint a White House official responsible for >Guantanamo.

I have no knowledge of this.

>9. In 2014, when Chuck Hagel became Sec of Defense, the White House put

>pressure on him to sign off on detainee transfers. Pres Obama told him >that he wanted it done now. Hagel responded by saying that the >president would be disappointed in him if he just arbitrarily signed >off based on a political promise. I can't speak to private conversations between the SECDEF and the President. >10. The White House had expected Ashton Carter to quickly approve >transfers when he became Sec of Defense I don't know what expectations the WH (again, with this sweeping term – "the White House" – who in the WH?) has for any cabinet secretary. >11. Several weeks after a principals committee meeting in July 2015, >Pres Obama met with Sec carter and told him he expected Carter to carry >out the closure policy While I cannot speak to any conversation the president may or may not have had with any cabinet secretary, the president and those who work to accomplish his policies have been consistently clear on this: responsibly and securely closing the detention facility at Guantanamo Bay is a national security imperative. >12. Q4: Question for you Mr. Secretary. This is concerning TSA lines. [laughter from the crowd.] You guys have suggested that travelers show up two and three hours before to get through those lines and in some cases it's going even longer in some cases the wait time to go through the security lines is longer than the flights itself. Surely this can't be a permanent solution, what do you suggest going forward?

Secretary Johnson: It's not a permanent solution, no one should have to wait three hours to get to the gate. And we have expedited the hiring of 768 new TSOs, we want to get them onboard this summer. We have reversed the trend that we have seen in recent years where we were downsizing the TSA workforce. We began that process last fall of reversing that trend so this year, with Congress' help, we have avoided the elimination of some 1600 positions in TSA. We want to reverse that trend and start building that workforce back. So we have expedited the hiring of 768 with the reprogramming from Congress, we have added authorization to pay the existing workforce overtime, we are bringing on additional K-9 teams, we are giving federal security directors increased discretion about how they use their workforces at the airports to deploy them to the security checkpoints, we are doubling down on our investments in technology and expediting that as well. The airlines have to be a partner with us on this to reduce wait times. There is in fact increased travel volume. Last summer, I gave the new TSA administrator the mandate to refocus on aviation security because of the global threat environment we are seeing and he's done that. But in addition to that we are seeing this increased travel volume so the airlines have to partner with us and there are ways that they can do that. One for example is to reduce the size and number of carry-on luggage that people bring on flights. Inspecting carry-on luggage has a lot to do with the wait time. That is a time consuming process to inspect the carry-on luggage as well as the person. Some airlines have offered to help us at the security checkpoint with non-security tasks which I think is a good thing, and asked airlines to consider possibly eliminating the checked baggage fee to encourage people to check their luggage rather than put it in the carry-on. So there are a number of ways in which the airlines can help us, are helping us

and I've had this conversation with the CEOs of the airlines this week and will continue that dialogue. We got a reprogramming request through Congress, we are evaluating whether more is necessary with OMB, and we're going to keep at this for the summer because I agree no one should have to wait three hours for a flight or for that matter even two hours. This is by the way something we're seeing in certain airports but not all airports. Chicago O'Hare right now is not good. I had a conversation with Mayor Emmanuel and Senator Durbin today about that and we've got a team on the ground at O'Hare today to address the problem at O'Hare and figure out a solution for that and we're doing that in several big city airports but this has become a top priority for me and the TSA Administrator.

That yellow highlighted portion caused some waves – the good kind (including pissing off A4A, who have consistently thrown us under the bus) – but then the Egypt Air crash happened and it's all things security, now.

FC2 Background

The Florida Center for Cybersecurity (FC²) was created in 2014 by the Florida Legislature as an educational and research center within the University of South Florida with the purpose of:

- Positioning Florida as the national leader in cybersecurity and its related workforce through education, research and community engagement
- Assisting in the creation of jobs in the state's cybersecurity industry and enhance the existing cybersecurity workforce
- Acting as a cooperative facilitator of state business and higher education communities to share cybersecurity education, knowledge, resources and training
- Seek out partnerships with major military and civil agencies installations to assist, when possible, in homeland security defense initiatives
- Attract cybersecurity companies to the state with an emphasis on defense, finance, health care, transportation, energy and utility sectors

Purpose

The purpose of the Board of Advisors (BOA) is to assist FC^2 in establishing its strategic direction. Specifically, the BOA is charged with assisting FC^2 to position itself as the preeminent national leader for cybersecurity education, outreach, training, and research.

Responsibilities

The BOA will report to the Provost and will serve as a valued resource to FC^2 by providing advice on best practices for optimizing the resources of FC^2 ; identifying collaborative research opportunities; interfacing with potential funding sources; and representing FC^2 and the vital importance of cybersecurity education and research to the broader community. - Advising FC² in establishing challenging educational and training curriculum to bolster the State of Florida's cybersecurity workforce
- Advising FC² in establishing and cultivating relationships with both the public and private sector to foster the growth and development of cybersecurity research
- Advising to develop best practices that encourage the efficient exchange of cybersecurity information and resources between the public and private sector
- Promoting awareness of FC² throughout the technology and intelligence community to bring focus and attention to FC² as a leader in cybersecurity education and research

Real ID is about to get real for states: Our view

14 years after 9/11 hijackers had no trouble getting driver's licenses, time to crack down.

The 9/11 hijackers had no trouble getting one crucial tool that helped them carry out their murderous plot — the driver's licenses and state IDs that allowed them to easily board four jetliners.

The 19 terrorists had been issued 16 state driver's licenses and 14 state ID cards, including one obtained with paperwork bought from an undocumented immigrant in a convenience store parking lot in Virginia for \$100.

By now, you'd think the nation would have filled this dangerous security gap.

But 14 years after the attack, more than half the states have failed to comply with the 2005 Real ID law that was supposed to make driver's licenses more tamper-proof and tougher to obtain fraudulently. Not only could such changes help prevent attacks, more secure licenses could stop underage drinkers from using fake ID and criminals from obtaining licenses for identity theft schemes.

The federal government has been more than patient with the laggard states. But the Homeland Security Department is expected to announce that it will bring down the hammer on all non-compliant states in early 2018. At that point, if your state doesn't follow the rules, you won't be able to use your driver's license or state ID card to get on a plane. You'll need an alternative ID, such as a passport or a U.S. military ID.

Technically, the government can't force states to comply with Real ID issuing driver's licenses is purely a state matter. But federal authority at airports and government buildings gives the feds significant leverage, and it's about time they used it.

The strongest argument for Real ID is pretty simple: Driver's licenses are already accepted as the nation's most credible and commonly used form of ID. As long as that's the case, they need to be trustworthy. Without improvements, they simply aren't. It is just too easy to fool state motor vehicle offices. In 2003, for example, fewer than half the states bothered to verify Social Security numbers, even while accepting them as proof of identity. Today, under the influence of Real ID, every state verifies with a federal database, and security is better for it. The insistence by some states that they can't comply due to lack of time or money looks ridiculous when you realize that more than 20 have managed to adopt the standards, including 13 that did so by 2012. And many have success stories to tell. For instance, when Indiana checked

its 6 million drivers against a Social Security database, it found 19,000 licenses that didn't match and invalidated them. When it went beyond the law's requirements to use "facial recognition" technology to make photos secure, it caught one man who had 149 licenses under different names but with the same photo.

Since 2010, New York has used facial recognition to find and <u>arrest 800 people</u> for having multiple licenses.

The most valid concern raised by opponents is a fear that privacy will be compromised when information on licenses is in a form that's easily shared. In reality, driver's license information currently remains with each individual state. The Real ID law doesn't authorize a national database. Nor is one in the works.

The good news is that while 27 states haven't fully complied with the Real ID requirements, the vast majority of them have moved a good distance in the right direction. <u>Just five</u> Illinois, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico and Washington — have failed to pass enabling measures or gone so far as to pass laws prohibiting the adoption of Real ID standards.

A security system is only as good as its weakest link. To make this work, all states need to comply. But 14 years after 9/11, it seems compliance will come only when the feds finally show they're serious about cracking down

AT CONGRESSIONAL HISPANIC CAUCUS INSTITUTE GALA

THE PRESIDENT: Buenas noches! Well, it is good to be here. Thank you, Secretary Castro, not just for the introduction but for the great work he is doing on behalf of the American people every single day. (Applause.) Thank you to your chair, Linda Sanchez, for her outstanding leadership in the Congress. (Applause.) Thank you to all of you for having me here tonight. (Applause.)

AUDIENCE MEMBER: Thank you!

THE PRESIDENT: Thank you! (Applause.) I'd like to begin my remarks with a story.

AUDIENCE MEMBER: I love you!

THE PRESIDENT: I love you, too! (Laughter.) But, look, I'm going to tell you this story here. So on an evening about 75 years ago, in the Boyle Heights neighborhood of Los Angeles - (applause) -- a young man proposed to the woman of his dreams.

Any of us who've done that -- and I have -- know at that moment he was feeling pretty nervous. And fortunately for him, she said yes. And because apparently he was making the kind of money I was making when I proposed -- (laughter) -- to celebrate, they went to a hot dog stand. Things were simpler back then. (Applause.) But things took a wrong turn. Authorities suddenly pulled up, lined them up, patted them down, demanded to see their IDs -- just because they were Mexican American. And when the young man handed over his wallet, the officer pulled the cards out of it and just dropped them on the sidewalk and then he said, "Now you pick them up."

"I remember getting on my knees and picking them up," that young man said decades later. And we can imagine his fear and his humiliation. What had been a beautiful day had suddenly become an example of occurrences that were happening far too often. And imagine how easy it would have been for him at that moment to turn to despair, and to allow the anger and the resentment to feed a cynicism, and for him to decide that America could never change.

But that young man was named Ed Roybal. (Applause.) And Ed Roybal never lost faith in himself, or in his country. And less than 25 years after he was brought to his knees on the streets of Los Angeles, Ed stood under the Capitol Dome to represent those very same streets in the Congress of the United States of America. (Applause.) He dedicated his life to the idea that America can change, that our union can become more perfect. And today, his legacy lives on not only in the legislation he passed and the improvements he made in his district, but also in his daughter, Lucille, who is here tonight. (Applause.) And he helped start the Congressional

Hispanic Caucus because he knew that we are stronger together than we could ever be alone.

And that's the same reason I ran for this office eight years ago -- not because I believed in what I could do, but because I believed in what we could do together. (Applause.) The financial crisis hadn't even hit yet, and we came to understand it was going to make our job a lot harder. But thanks to the members of the Hispanic Caucus, thanks to people like Nancy Pelosi, who is standing here tonight -- (applause) -- thanks to the determination and fundamental optimism of the American people, we have made progress.

When I took office, the unemployment rate was on its way to 10 percent. Today, it's 5.1 percent. (Applause.) The unemployment rate among Latinos hit 13 percent, and we've brought that down to 6.4 percent. (Applause.) When I took office, we were losing about 800,000 jobs a month. Today, our businesses have created jobs for a record 67 months in a row — more than 13 million new jobs overall. (Applause.)

When I took office, more than 15 percent of Americans, including one in three Hispanics, lacked health insurance. Today, we've covered another 17 million Americans, including 4 million Latinos and only 9.2 percent of Americans are uninsured. (Applause.) For the first time on record, more than 90 percent of Americans have health insurance. For the first time ever, insurance companies can't discriminate against anybody with a preexisting condition. (Applause.)

When I took office, we were still too often stuck in a Cold War mentality that began before many of us were even born. And today, for the sake of our people, and our entire hemisphere, we have reestablished relations with Cuba, we have turned the page on the failed policies of the past. We have strengthened our relationship with Latin America. We've put forward a plan to invest \$1 billion in our shared security and prosperity in Central America. (Applause.)

When I took office, hardworking young people -- Americans in every way but on paper -- lived in constant fear of deportation. Today, more than 680,000 DREAMers live and study and work freely and openly in the country they've always called home. (Applause.) We've got smarter enforcement priorities, because it makes no sense to focus on separating families when we can be going after felons instead. We're taking new steps to reach out to folks who are eligible to become citizens, and

attract immigrant entrepreneurs, and educate STEM students. We're going to help more husbands and wives of American citizens get their green cards without separating them from their families. (Applause.) And the deferred action policies I announced last year will help millions of mothers and fathers remain in the United States of America with their families — and although it is taking us longer than we hoped, I know we're on the right side of the law and we are going to keep fighting to prove it. (Applause.)

We haven't won every battle. We've still got a lot more work to do. But when the cynics told us we couldn't change our country for the better, they were wrong. There are more job openings today than at any time in our history. The high school dropout rate is near the lowest on record, and Latino students are making some of the fastest gains. (Applause.) More Americans are graduating from college. The deficits are down by two-thirds. The amount of foreign oil we buy is down. Teen pregnancy is down. (Applause.)

All of which makes you wonder: Why are some of the folks who are running for my office so down on America? (Laughter and applause.)

AUDIENCE MEMBER: What about you?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, no, I'm definitely not doing that. (Applause.) But by most measures, we are better off now than we were seven years ago. (Applause.) And that we know. Of course, none of it comes up in their debates. I mean, they have invented this new reality where everything was terrific back in 2008 -- (laughter) -- when the unemployment and uninsured rates were rising and DREAMers lived in fear of deportation and we were engaged in two wars, and bin Laden was still at large. That was the golden era, apparently, the good old days. (Laughter.) And then I came along and messed it all up. (Laughter and applause.)

And now when you listen to them, you still don't know what they're for except turning back the clock on the work that we've done together. Repealing Obamacare. Gutting Wall Street Reform. Allowing power plants to pollute the air our children breathe. And there is nowhere where they want to go further backwards than on immigration.

It wasn't that long ago that my predecessor, George W. Bush, a Republican -- a conservative Republican from Texas, with whom I disagreed with on a whole lot of things, made immigration

reform one of his core priorities. "We cannot build a unified country," he said, "by inciting people to anger, or playing on anyone's fears, or exploiting the issue of immigration for political gain." (Applause.) That's what he said.

Think how much better our economy would be if the rest of his party got the message. (Laughter.) Think about how much better off our country would be if Republican politicians hadn't spent years precisely trying to scare voters with tales of immigrants flooding across our borders and taking our jobs, and destroying America as we know it -- even though we know that when you look at what's happening at the borders, it's the lowest rates of immigration that we've seen since the 1970s. A clear majority of Americans, including a lot of Republican voters, support reform. That's one of the reasons we got a bipartisan bill through the Senate in 2013. But now some of the very same Republican politicians who championed reform in the past -- some of whom sponsored these efforts -- suddenly they want nothing to do with it.

AUDIENCE: Hmmm --

THE PRESIDENT: Hmm. (Laughter.) In these circumstances, I always say, don't boo -- vote. (Applause.)

They can't hear the boos but they can hear your vote. (Applause.) But the point is, that's not leadership -- turning against what's right the moment the politics of your base gets tough. Leadership is not fanning the flames of intolerance, and then acting all surprised when a fire breaks out. Saying clearly inflammatory things and then saying, well, that's not what I meant -- until you do it again, and again, and again. So we've got to decide whether or not we, as Americans, are willing to stand up against this kind of bigotry that the same cruel impulse that Ed Roybal spent a lifetime fighting against.

The anti-immigrant sentiment that has infected our politics is not new, but it is wrong. It was directed at Irish folk. It was directed against Italians. There have been generations of immigrants that have been subject to this same kind of attitude — with some of the same stereotypes. It wasn't right then; it's not right now. (Applause.) And unless you were one of the first Americans, unless you're Navajo or Cherokee — (applause) — somebody somewhere came from someplace else. (Applause.)

I believe we need an immigration system that is fair and orderly and lawful. I believe that people who come here

illegally should have to pay a fine, and pay their fair share of taxes, and get registered, and get right with the law and go to the back of the line before they earn citizenship. But when I hear folks talking as if somehow those kids are different from my kids, as if they're less worthy in the eyes of God, that somehow their families are less worthy of our respect and consideration and care, as if somehow back in the day everybody had their papers in order when they came here, but now suddenly nobody has their papers in order -- (applause) -- I believe we're better than that.

If you want to be taken seriously as a leader, you can't just be against everything. You have to be for something. You can't just feed on fear. You should be feeding hope. You should be for fixing our immigration system. You should be for allowing DREAMers and their parents, who have been here for years, to live without fear in the country they love. You should tell the truth, which is that illegal border crossings are lower than they've been in decades, and that economists agree that immigration does not hurt our economy, it grows our economy, creating jobs, raising wages for Americans. (Applause.) You don't hear those facts very often, but those are facts.

And you've got to recognize that America's greatness does not come from building walls. Our greatness comes from building opportunity. Our greatness comes from building an economy that works for everybody. Our greatness comes from a dream that says in this country, if you work hard, you can build a better life for your family. No matter where you come from. No matter what you look like. No matter what your last name is. That's what makes America great. (Applause.)

So I'm going to spend every day that I have left in this office fighting to restore that dream, so that everyone who works hard can get ahead. And, yes, that includes immigration reform. (Applause.) But that's not all that we've got to do. We've got to keep creating good jobs. We've got to make sure every family feels our country's recovery in their own lives — and that includes the families in Puerto Rico. (Applause.) We've got to make two years of college as free and universal as high school is today. (Applause.) We've got to stop spending billions of taxpayer dollars keeping non-violent drug offenders behind bars and give them a chance to get right and back on the right track. We've got to make sure that every child gets a world-class education from the earliest age, that every person

who's still uninsured gets covered, that every school and every street is safe from the madness of gun violence. (Applause.)

And this change will not be easy because change never is. Change is never easy. It takes longer than one year. It takes longer than one term. It takes longer than the tenure of one President. But what we together have shown and proven is that when we stick together and put our shoulders to the wheel of history, not only is change possible — change is inevitable. America can change. And if we keep dreaming of something better and organizing for something better, if we keep voting for something better, together we're going to build on the progress we've made. We're going to create a brighter future for our children. Si, se puede. (Applause.) Juntos podemos! (Applause.)

Thank you, CHCI. Que Dios los bendiga. God bless America. (Applause.)



Sir,

So, from what I'm reading about and by Ryan, I think that this write up from April 27, 2013, when the White House Correspondents' Association presented Lizza with the Aldo Beckman Memorial Award for journalistic excellence for his 2012 coverage of Barack Obama's presidency and re-election campaign, sums it up fairly well. The judges wrote: "The judges enthusiastically choose Ryan Lizza of The New Yorker for his remarkable efforts to provide an independent perspective on President Obama's presidency and re-election. Deep reporting, both through documents and personal interviews, moves these stories beyond the cacophony of a campaign year. Mr. Lizza, in addition to being an excellent reporter, is a thoughtful, cogent writer. He has a keen ability to take his readers inside decisions and weave a compelling narrative, something he has done for more than a decade covering the White House."

He's done at least four profiles on President Obama, from what I can find. Additionally, he's also done a profile on the president's economic team, on Gov. Christie, on Sen. Paul, on Sen. Schumer, on Sen. Warren, on Sheila Bair (FDIC), and on Paul Ryan. An interesting bit about this one: Mitt Romney is alleged to have read Lizza's piece on Paul Ryan and chose him as his running mate because of it. Additionally, he's written profiles on Hillary Clinton, Vice President Biden, Sen. McCain, Jim Webb, Eric Cantor, Michele Bachmann, Darrell Issa, Peter Orszag, Larry Summers, Rahm Emmanuel and Gov. Hickenlooper.

I'm still reading through the profiles, but what I can tell you is that his profile reportage is a mix of on-the-record quotes, background statements from (likely) the profilee himself and other sources, quotes from allies and those who are critical of the profilee, and public statements from all parties. And, it's all straight reporting. You seem to get what you get with Ryan. He neither pulls punches nor takes forays into snark. The early bits of his pieces are slightly *slightly* reminiscent of a Maddow wind-up or the set-up for an article by Chad Pergram. That is, he finds a hook that doesn't seem immediately relevant but then broadens into very interesting reading.


A bit of follow-up from what he said about the unfortunate cover-art on the New Yorker when he did that profile piece on then candidate Obama in '08. The campaign was allegedly so angry about the cover art -- mistakenly attributing it to disallowed him from getting on the campaign plane, citing "lack of space." What he also didn't mention last night was that, that article was nominated for a National Magazine Award.

He's revered by his peers and appears to be equally loved and disliked by all sides and various times, politically. In other words - he covers things down the middle and appears to be without editorial affect. As you know, this angers those looking for something to make themselves politically angry.

My gut on [b)(6) is that we do this - but we do it next year - perhaps launching toward the end of the year. And, we do it in such a way that tees up (or puts a bow on, after) the speech you would like to give on guns.





Hi, all! So, my PEP story is done and has a good shot at Monday's front page. I will let you know as soon as I know it's running. And, fyi, I will be on vacation next week but am reachable if it's urgent. Tnx. On the story: First, THANK YOU profusely for all of the help. I REALLY appreciate it, and it definitely made the story better and more balanced. That said, I'm sure you all knew, and I was clear from the start, that this wasn't going to be an everything-is-wonderful story. The issue is too divisive, and there are too many raw feelings out there from Secure Communities, and too much skepticism about PEP, to make a story like that possible, at least an honest one. And, I could have written what I would call the easy story, kind of like the one the LA Times did a few weeks ago, something hard-hitting that emphasized all the negative views of PEP from immigration advocates, the legal concerns raised by the ACLU (which thinks the new detainer forms are still unconstitutional), and the fact that despite all the outreach, very few localities have said publicly that they are participating and some very key ones told me they are still on the fence. But as I dug into it deeper, the reporting told me that that wouldn't really be fair: that it's way too early to judge PEP a failure; that immigration advocates will blast most everything you do (as we've discussed!); and that DHS and Secretary Johnson in particular deserve some credit just for undertaking such a difficult venture and for admitting that a major program had failed, and replacing it. How often does the government do that? So while to be sure, all the negatives are in the story and it will be clear to readers that the Secretary has taken on a very tough task, we decided that the emphasis should be on the outreach itself and on how key localities (at least the ones who would talk to me) are just still wrestling with this difficult issue, even as they have nothing but praise for Secretary Johnson. And that is true – every quote in the story that references him directly is uniformly positive because that's what people told me, including the Mayor of Philadelphia, who as you know very significantly scaled back cooperation with ICE just last year and was cheered by immigrant advocates. He raved about the Secretary's outreach efforts, which is in the story (the lede at this point, actually) even as he said he still has concerns about PEP and hasn't decided to participate. So did Cook County. And there is a quote from Marshall Fitz (thanks, Marsha!) pointing out exactly what I wanted to get in: that how often does a major government agency just scrap a program and start over, and clearly the Secretary was listening. So, while you won't love this story and probably won't like it as much as some of my recent ones, I think it's fair and honest, at least s much as it could be, given that getting people to talk at this sensitive stage was difficult. Sorry to go on...but I think you all know by now, despite our rocky beginning, that I take fairness and depth and thorough reporting VERY seriously, and I know how big of a deal PEP is to the Secretary and the whole department, and I hope I was able to do it justice. Thanks.

Other reports of breaches in security have been brought up by the House of Representative's Homeland Security Committee. Chairman of the House Homeland Security Committee, John Katko (R-NY) told The Hill about workers with "unspecified ties to terrorism" that were permitted to conduct work in secure areas. Katko stated, "All of these findings individually are concerning, and in the aggregate, well, they just shake the public's confidence and only further demonstrate the need for steady leadership at TSA to work through the many issues that plague this agency."

Neffenger recently retired from the U.S. Coast Guard, and has served as 29th Vice Commandment, and Coast Guard's Deputy Commandment for Operations. His most notable position was Deputy National Incident Commander during the 2010 BP oil spill. Neffenger was officially sworn in on July 4.

Neffenger was quickly approved for the TSA chief position by the Senate after the failings became public in effort to quell concerns among passengers about the safety of flying.

Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson said prior to swearing-in in Neffenger that he is challenging the new TSA chief "to be an energetic leader and to not hesitate to think out of the box, rethink old assumptions, encourage your people, your subordinates, to raise ideas and points of view and make hard choices when you have to."

Johnson said he is confident that Neffenger is up to the job.

"Pete Neffenger is one of the brightest and most capable military officers I've ever met," he said. "I know he will be a strong and effective leader of TSA. I salute him for stepping away from a distinguished and successful career in the Coast Guard, retiring to civilian life and taking on this other very demanding job serving his country."

Neffenger said Monday that he accepts the challenge from Johnson.

"We will make the necessary changes, we will reassess old assumptions, and we will make tough choices, ones that our mission demands," he said.

The TSA has faced intense scrutiny since the Homeland Security Department's inspector general documented in May a series of undercover stings in which agents tried to pass through security with prohibited items.

They made it through in nearly all the tests 67 of 70 including one instance in which a TSA screener failed to find a fake bomb, even after the undercover agent set off a magnetometer. The screener reportedly let the agent through with the fake bomb taped to his back, having missed it during a pat-down.

The TSA's acting administrator, Melvin Carraway, was removed from office after the findings became public.

Retired U.S. Coast Guard officer Peter Neffenger will have his hands full as the new head of the Transportation Security Administration.

Neffenger will have to make sure there's not a repeat of the security lapses found by the agency's inspector general. Undercover agents repeatedly managed to sneak face explosives or banned weapons through airport checkpoints, the investigation found.

Those "results were completely unsatisfactory," said Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson before swearing in Neffenger as TSA administrator Monday. Johnson said the TSA has embarked on a 10-point plan to address these security lapses, including "back to basics training" for every TSA officer, the reintroduction of handheld metal detectors as security checkpoints and a review of its expedited screening programs for selected travelers.

"We are a security organization, and every member of our team must be always laser-focused on this mission," Neffenger said.

The threats facing the nation's transportation system are "more decentralized, diffuse and complex than ever before," he said, and "we must continually innovate to defeat them."

Neffenger, who was confirmed by the Senate on June 22, spent 34 years at the Coast Guard, serving as its deputy commandant for operations before rising to vice commandant.

"I look forward to applying my years of leadership experience, law enforcement background and security skills to protecting our nation's transportation systems," he said.

But while security lapses are TSA's most pressing concerns, the agency also must deal with its poor public image due to other issues. For example, what happened to Don Zimmer's jersey, which was given to his widow by the Yankees to honor the team's late bench coach? When she landed in Florida last week, it was missing from her luggage.

Then there was a TSA tweet showing a photo of \$75,000 in cash found in a bag at Richmond International Airport. This prompted lots of responses from folks who thought the photo invaded the passenger's privacy. This passenger, however, has bigger problems: Local police seized the money and are investigating why the passenger was carrying so much cash.

Peter Neffenger was sworn in Monday as the new head of the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) amid the agency's reevaluation of airport security following revelations of undercover agents bringing banned items through checkpoints.

Neffenger, the former vice commandant of the US Coast Guard, becomes the sixth administrator in TSA's history. He told a packed room at TSA headquarters in Arlington, Virginia that he will be "guided by risk-based strategies" and a "multi-layered approach" to aviation security. He emphasized that aviation remains a target and that "the threat is more decentralized and diffuse than ever before."

Department of Homeland Security (DHS) secretary Jeh Johnson, who swore in Neffenger, said the DHS inspector general (IG) had conducted 70 "fairly discreet" tests at airport checkpoints in which undercover agents attempted to bring banned items past screeners. Johnson noted that IG agents have "the benefit of insider's knowledge" and don't pass through all layers of security. Nevertheless, he said, "the results were completely unsatisfactory" and Johnson has ordered "back to basics training" for all TSA officers. "TSA is now implementing this in a phased and layered manner" and it will be completed by the end of September, Johnson said.

Among a wide range of TSA practices under review, Johnson said the process of "managed inclusion," in which some passengers who are not members of the Pre-Check expedited screening program are sent to Pre-Check lanes, is being reevaluated, in part because some Pre-Check lines are becoming too long.

"We're looking at this right now and we want to arrive at a thoughtful balance," Johnson said during a press conference following Neffenger's swearing in ceremony. "I do believe this is an issue that must be studied. As we've progressed with TSA Pre-Check, which is a terrific program, we've seen longer and longer 'short' lines."

Johnson said his guidance to Neffenger is "to be an energetic leader and not hesitate to think outside of the box," adding, "We must continually and comprehensively evaluate and reevaluate what is best for aviation security."

Neffenger said he aims to "build a culture of adaptation ... that is able to rapidly deploy new concepts," adding, "We will make the necessary changes, we will reassess old assumptions and we will make the hard choices."

"I am deeply honored to continue serving our country, particularly alongside the dedicated men and women of TSA," he continued. "I look forward to applying my years of leadership experience, law enforcement background and security skills to protecting our nation's transportation systems."

The TSA has faced intense scrutiny since the Homeland Security Department's inspector general documented in May a series of undercover stings in which agents tried to pass through security with prohibited items.

They made it through in nearly all the tests — 67 of 70 — including one instance in which a TSA screener failed to find a fake bomb, even after the undercover agent set off a magnetometer. The screener reportedly let the agent through with the fake bomb taped to his back, having missed it during a pat-down.

The TSA's acting administrator, Melvin Carraway, was removed from office after the findings became public.

Democrats sought to defuse criticism of the TSA's failed bomb tests by accusing the Republican-led Senate of dragging its feet on approving Neffenger.

Neffenger recently retired from the US Coast Guard, where he held many operational, staff and leadership positions during his 34-year career. Before joining TSA, he served as the 29th Vice Commandant, a position held since May 2014.



A serious mission, but DHS chief is low-key in campus talk

When the Secret Service makes an appearance, it's usually not a laid-back affair. But when U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security Jeh Johnson spoke on campus last night at an event hosted by the Berkeley Forum, instead of standing behind a podium and orating like many public officials are wont to do, he walked down to the floor to talk directly to students.

"I love college campuses," he began, coffee mug in hand. "The energy, the youth, the dreams, the aspirations."

Johnson has two kids in college and says his son gets a kick out of his dad's visits. "Does anyone know what happens when a lot of uniformed police officers show up in front of a freshman dorm without notice?" the secretary asked the crowd. "You hear a lot of doors slam and a lot of toilets flush."

The appearance at International House by the nation's top security official was far more relaxed.

Joking aside, Johnson jumped into discussing the key points of his talk, called "Threats to the Homeland."

First on the list? Terrorism.

"Counterterrorism has to be the cornerstone of our mission," said the secretary. He said the global terrorist threat has evolved from terrorist-directed attacks to terrorist-inspired homegrown threats. "That type is harder to detect because the actor can act with almost no notice," he said. "Unfortunately, that's the new reality that we're in."

How is the government working to counter violent extremism? It's a whole-government approach, said Johnson, and it requires the public's help. "If you see something, say something," he encouraged the audience. Also, he said it's important to work together to help change the messages young people — especially those who might be inclined to turn toward violence — receive.

Next on the list? Immigration — a subject that students and community members had been protesting outside the building, calling into question the government's deportation policies.

Before the talk began, Johnson approached the demonstrators in attempt to discuss their concerns, but they were unwilling to speak with him. "Every time I encounter protesters, I try to talk to them," said Johnson. "I admire and respect the strongly held point of view outside. I wanted to talk to them, but didn't get a chance."

He went on to explain that deportation numbers, which reached a high of 400,000 in 2012, will have dropped some 100,000 by the end of the fiscal year. "This is pursuant of the new policy the president and I want to go toward, which is fewer deportations, fewer families being broken apart, fewer deportations of people who have been in this country for years and have committed no crimes, and focusing on the convicted criminals... Let's focus on going after the threats to public safety."

There are some 11 million undocumented people in this country, he said, and more than half have been here more than 10 years. "They are becoming integrated members of society. We want to provide an earned path to citizenship, which only Congress can provide, in comprehensive immigration reform."

During the student question portion of the talk, an audience member interrupted the secretary, and after a few minutes was escorted out, along with two other demonstrators. Johnson continued to answer audience questions through outside protest noise, which eventually died down.

One student asked, "In response to the refugee crisis in Europe and the Middle East, Germany has promised entrance to 800,000 refugees and Venezuela 20,000, and only a couple of days ago, Obama promised 10,000 refugees entrance. And I wonder, why is there a hesitancy and what can you do to speed up the process?"

Johnson answered, "In addition to accepting 10,000 Syrian refugees, the U.S. government already provides billions of dollars to humanitarian assistance — something like \$4 billion. We're the single biggest donor to that effort overseas. We want to do more. We will do more. And we want to do it as quickly as possible. But like everything in government, you've got to do it with the resources that you have."

The secretary ended his talk with an inspirational message to students, encouraging them to pursue a career in public service. "The basic instinct in all of us is to serve and help people," he said. "Those of you who are thinking about a career in public service. don't lose that dream."







Sir, please find attached Chapter 18 ("The Red Scare Hits Home") of Charles S. Johnson: Leadership Beyond the Veil in the Age of Jim Crow.

The quote from your remarks is at the bottom of page 239/top 240. The text says the connection to the CA equivalent of HUAC was due to his affiliation with the National Sharecroppers Fund, which HUAC had called a Communist front. I'll try to hunt down more info from the footnote -- as well as follow-up the reference in the text that he testified before HUAC in 1949.

The same page has a single paragraph on a professor (Lomanitz) charged with contempt over Communist allegations -- which led to his being offered work only without a contract.

The longer story regards Professor Lee Lorch (main story pp. 240-245, with analysis the rest of the chapter). The summary is:

- *Johnson hired Lorch, a white math professor who was an outspoken Civil Rights advocate.
- *In 1954, after Brown v. Board, Lorch tried to enroll his daughter in an all-black school, but the school board denied the request. The NAACP said they were going to sue school the board.
- *At this point, Lorch was called before HUAC -- one assumes that's not a coincidence -- and afterward cited for contempt of Congress.
- *Johnson and the board ultimately made the decision to dismiss him, which appears -- at least from Johnson's perspective -- to have had to do with protecting Fisk University, as well as protecting black higher education more broadly since Fisk was such a prominent institution.

If I recall correctly off the top of my head, there was not that much around this quote in particular (I thought the CA bit strange too). However, there was a good deal about an issue with one of his professors where he was put in the impossible situation of deciding whether to support the prof's freedom of speech in full -- or protect Fisk's financial situation.

I accessed the book (as well as another about him) through a university ebook program. I believe it will let me PDF up to a certain number of pages -- so I'll try to grab the whole chapter on the Red Scare for you this evening.

There's also this quote from a letter he sent, I believe to a friend in response to his having to testify before a Senator in Memphis regarding two former Fisk professors alleged to be communists:

"I was impressed by the abnormal hysteria over communism and the inability to distinguish between communism and basic human aims which were condemned because they were akin to statements of Soviet policy. It required a strong character to stay clear of this hysteria."
