**MINUTE ORDER.** For the reasons discussed at the November 14, 2018 motions hearing, the Court grants in part and denies in part [111] News Media Coalition's motion to intervene to seek reconsideration. The Court grants News Media Coalition's motion to intervene but denies its motion for reconsideration of the Court's Order sealing the audiovisual deposition testimony. The Court also denies [153] Judicial Watch's motion to unseal the audiovisual recordings of all depositions. The Court finds that good cause remains to keep the audiovisual recordings under seal. Therefore, all audiovisual copies of depositions taken in this case shall remain under seal. The Court also denies [140] Judicial Watch's motion to compel Mr. Bentel's testimony and sustains Mr. Bentel's invocation of his 5th Amendment privilege. Finally, the Court grants in part and denies in part [141] Judicial Watch's motion to compel Former Secretary Clinton's answers to interrogatories. Secretary Clinton is therefore compelled to answer questions 1 and 24, as modified by the Court. Her objection is sustained as to question 14. Secretary Clinton shall provide her answers to modified questions 1 and 24 by no later than December 17, 2018. The parties are further ordered to file a joint status report updating the Court as to the status of the litigation and recommending next steps for further proceedings by no later than December 5, 2018.
