Madame Secretary, of all the things that happened yesterday I was most struck by the welcome and anticipation from the State Department workers who want so much to have a champion and believe they do in you.

So, last I wrote about the challenge of informing local "influentials" about the State Department actions beyond daily briefings on war, pestilence and famine. I am always annoyed by people who only state the problem without at least taking a chance on offering an answer. When I saw a reference to the creation of America Houses in the Muslim world it sparked my thinking. So, here goes as wild as this might be and as impractical as it might seem how about creating World Houses here in the U S of A. World Houses could be part of libraries across the country where information and news about parts of the world, aid programs and women's initiatives, etc. etc. would be featured. Part of this idea comes from my passion for public libraries. Libraries are in every nook and cranny of the country. They are all too often these days underfunded and understaffed so a turn key package about what is going on - study guides for the tough issues and information about non-headline grabbing activities - could be embraced. Libraries could pick books to feature. You get the drift. The danger is that it would be seen as "promotional"; I rather think that it could and should be designed as part of the new government transparency effort. Much could be done on line. And, as a sidelight, when State Department folks happen to travel around the country they could appear a libraries.

As usual, I send ideas without much knowledge of whether they could possibly work or are appropriate. Nevertheless, I did not want to shirk my responsibility to add something to the discussion someone may be having.

Again, my congratulations. I am sorry I missed seeing you at your event this week but will see you for sure when you are honored in March at the Planned Parenthood Annual Meeting.

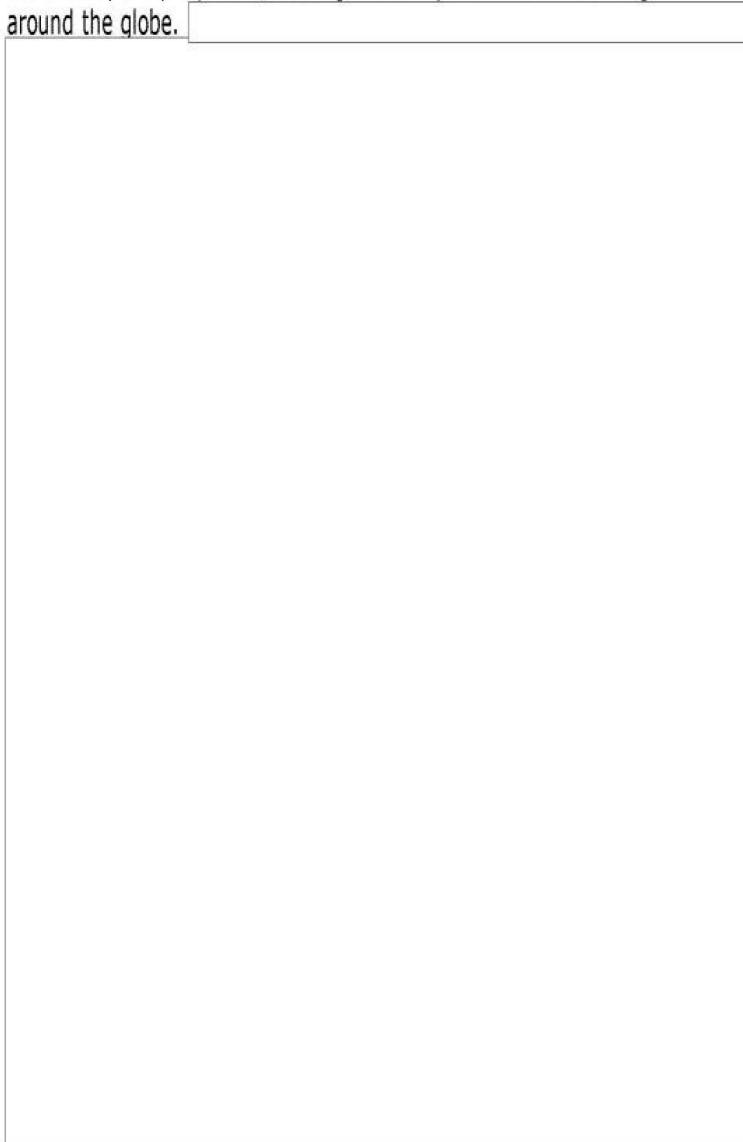

Hey all,

This is my last email from Eagle Base and G Co 2/9. Tomorrow we head back to Ramadi. We've got a number of options on the table and are t Ramadi before heading to Fallujah Saturday night. It has been a great trip with the Marines and incredibly special catching up with Gunny Fox. sometime in the spring together. He's got a [redacted] just after he comes home so it may be hard to pull off. I have to say, I'm exhausted after today. We started off early and ended late today. In the morning we headed out with one of Gunny Fox's sc through dusty farm roads along the banks of the Euphrates. A beautiful and cold morning. The Marines hung back as the police officers led the and work alongside Iraqi forces. Along the patrol we took the opportunity to speak to many of the Marines. They are tremendous young kids -- when things were going terribly in Iraq and yet they signed up to serve their country knowing full well they were headed into harms way. Man have served here in combat are grateful. It is astonishing, but the last two infantry battalions in this area saw little to no combat. Marines rece participating in combat operations. Only a handful of Marines have received one while serving in Al Anbar over the last year. It is certainly a di I am still puzzled as to why it has changed so drastically and during interviews throughout the rest of the day I pressed two sheiks and the2/9 brother of Abu Risha, the father of the Awakening movement. Sometime in 2006, Abu Risha approached a number of other tribal leaders. The "enough" of the insurgency. Brutal fighting resulted and Abu Risha was killed, but Al Qaeda was eventually pushed out of Al Anbar. Abu Risha! province. His brother told me about how brutal Al Qaeda was and that it took time for the tribes and the coalition to learn to trust each other. \ Awakening apparently began late one night. Photos of him with Obama, President Bush, and many Marine officers lined the walls. We then headed out to meet Sheik Heiss at his house. Two giant mansions, one made of marble that cost an estimated \$1.2m. We met in an i meetings. At least a hundred people could sit in the chairs lining the room. It was HUGE. We drank turkish coffee and tea and talked about the the upcoming provincial elections. Sheik Heiss was one of the first Sheiks to work with the coalition in 2004. He feels that the wrong people ar out depending on the results of the election. He also said, that violence, like that experienced in 2004-2007 will not return to the province. Th

but he is quick to say it was mistaken. Other family members, too many to count, were killed by Al Qaeda. He was even kidnapped and beaten during the Awakening. Sheik Heiss was also very proud to show me a photo of him with President Bush in the Oval Office.

Apparently his house was destroyed by AQI sometime in the last few years and I asked him how he could afford such a beautiful and expensive house. He said he had something to do with the different types of Sheiks in Iraq. There are Sheiks put in power by the Ottomans, Sheiks put in power by the British, Sheiks put in power by Saddam, and finally, the American Sheiks -- namely leaders, often lower leaders who remained in Iraq when more senior tribal leaders left because of it. The counterinsurgency manual states that money is a weapon. As far as I am concerned, better to shed treasure than blood in order to return to living their lives in peace.

Finally, we went back to Camp Ramadi for dinner and to interview the Battalion Commander. We spoke for an hour about the operations he had led as an infantry officer during the bloodiest months in Ramadi in 2005, but before you think he was engaged in combat he was braving ambushes and leading the governance and economic development of the province. Fascinating conversation about how and why someone trained to close with a combat zone is granted it is a combat zone.

Much more to write, but it is my last night with Gunny Fox and we want to catch up some more, more to follow....

Keep those emails coming and can't wait to see you all when I get home...

I think we're underway to help her and for her in essence to help us. This'll be long:

For starters, I asked [redacted] to confer before yesterday with Sgt At Arms pple about all of the key info KG's team would want immediately. We did a conference call yesterday with her CoS to do that download. They will get immediate swing space that's part of [redacted] office on the 5th floor of Dirksen. We have cleared out good computers no longer used to set up everyone she'll bring right away. And so on.

Our space has to be "abated" with lead paint removal and new carpet before they can move to ours. And we told them we need to help them keep rooms they'll want.

We have a whole bunch of other ways we can help on the administrative and logistical end.

The CoS is coming over on Monday to cover all this and staffing more.

I also prepared a list of our remaining staff and have given to the Leg Dir [redacted] And for the CoS, and have repeated the process of asking staff to indicate if they want to be considered for positions with KG.

So I think you can reiterate the hope she'll hire all she can. The staff most interested and in need are the NY staff, hdqtrs and regional offices. Few in DC see KG as first choice because most are looking for a step up, and our senior people are headed elsewhere.

Then there's the category of her strategy and the like. [redacted] Is of course a good one to help and is talking to the CoS and was on our conf call. Seems she has to figure out how to appeal to the other demographics of the cities and suburbs, so think about the political advisors to tap and the best of NY's power brokers and political forces.

I have also talked to staff about essentially volunteering to help. Examples are [redacted] on diving into approps. There a pile of other ways.

Many of your staff still believe or really do want to go to State. Some seem to be plugged in already to feel that's a pretty sure thing. But for their morale, the rest just hope to hear from someone or to be directed on how or whether they can even be considered. As I mentioned on the phone, I heard from [redacted] abt work he's doing to try to systematize applicants of importance to you, and I spent yesterday morning going over the grid of our staff, getting him updated memos and resumes, and sharing what staff I at least think have the most to offer and are super talented.

The staff by and large have a "healthy" dose of pessimism abt landing at State. But they see who has landed there including campaign staff and then [redacted], again hoping they get looked at.

SO for KG, to summarize, I'd underscore how much we want to help, I'd offer your own ideas about putting her plan together to position her to be strongest for 2010 and ward off a bruising primary, and I'd report we certainly have staff eager to be considered esp in NY.

If you want to talk specifics, I am always eager to talk!

Congrats on what appeared to be a splendid, notable, widely reported couple of State days.

It is with great enthusiasm that I am naming today a new Special Envoy for Climate Change.

As should be evident by now, the President and I believe that American leadership is essential to meeting the challenges of the 21st century, and chief among those is the complex, urgent, and global threat of climate change.

From rapidly rising temperatures to melting Arctic ice caps, from lower crop yields to dying forests, from unforgiving hurricanes to unrelenting droughts, we have no shortage of evidence that our world is facing a climate crisis. And let's be clear: A world in crisis goes well beyond the air we breathe, the food we eat, the water we drink. It is at once an environmental, economic, energy, and national security issue with grave implications for America's – and the world's – future.

A quick scan of the globe vividly conveys the human toll. Competition for scarcer resources like food and water will lead to migrations of populations, regional conflicts, and greater disparities between rich and poor. Reliance on foreign sources of oil and gas influences our way of life here at home and continues to compromise our national security.

So the urgency of the global climate crisis must not be underestimated. Nor should the science behind it or the facts on the ground be ignored or dismissed. The time for realism, and action, is now.

President Obama and I recognize that the solutions to this problem are both domestic and global – that all nations bear some responsibility, and all nations must work together to find a solution.

Under President Obama, America will take the lead in addressing this challenge, both by making commitments of our own and engaging other nations to do the same. On the domestic side, we are beginning immediately to enact measures that will lead to lower greenhouse emissions and to make new and significant investments in clean energy technology and a new green economy. Just this morning, the President announced major initiatives to improve the fuel efficiency of automobiles so that we can further reduce emissions of greenhouse gases that are largely responsible for climate change and the problems resulting from it. There is no doubt about the complexity and magnitude of the task ahead. But we cannot shrink from the challenge or overlook the chance it offers to propel us toward a better future. If we are smart and bold, we can turn the climate crisis into an economic opportunity that creates jobs, generates growth, enhances our competitive edge, and ensures greater prosperity in the 21st century.

This effort will require disciplined and sustained attention at the highest levels, as well as the vigilance and dedication of one senior official who can harness the broad array of stakeholders in our government as we work toward these ends.

1. The same sources that informed me during the campaign that Sarah Palin had been invited to the Israel rally that you were scheduled to address without telling you are now saying that the attack last week by Abe Foxman of ADL on the appointment of George Mitchell as Special Envoy to the Middle East was coordinated by Jewish institutional leaders and carefully scripted. Malcolm Hoenlein, vice chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations, is the chief organizer. Foxman was chosen as point man to shoot the first round, but he was hardly acting alone. Foxman's remark that Mitchell is neutral and therefore suspect simply lays down a marker. Mitchell is distrusted for his previous work and statements on the issue. That he is of Arab descent, which has deliberately gone unmentioned for now but may be used later, makes him politically vulnerable, whatever his qualifications, skill or stature. (Foxman: "Sen. Mitchell is fair. He's been meticulously even-handed. But the fact

is, American policy in the Middle East hasn't been 'even handed' — it has been supportive of Israel when it felt Israel needed critical U.S. support. So I'm concerned. I'm not sure the situation requires that kind of approach in the Middle East.")

2. The same sources tell me that every one of your conversations and communications with Bibi Netanyahu flows directly and instantly back to top Jewish leadership. You should, of course, assume that nothing involving him is private. Though Livni and Barak signed on to the Gaza adventure and thought they would receive political credit, only Bibi is gaining in the aftermath. The guiding assumption must be that he will likely become the next Israeli prime minister. (See report in today's NYT: "Gaza War Gives Bigger Lift to Israel's Right Than to Those in Power, By Isabel Kirschner, Jerusalem— With two weeks to go before the Israeli elections, the politicians who seem to have benefited the most from the military offensive against Hamas in Gaza are those who were not involved in planning or carrying out the war. That is not because Israelis have regrets or have become faint-hearted about the casualties and destruction in Gaza. To the contrary, there appears to have been a shift further to the right, reflecting a feeling among many voters that an even tougher approach may now be required. Recent polls indicate that Likud, Benjamin Netanyahu's right-wing opposition party, has retained and even increased its lead. The other party that appears to have gained the most ground is the nationalist Yisrael Beiteinu, led by Avigdor Lieberman.")

3. In June 1990, after Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir proposed stringent conditions for peace talks with the Palestinians intended to sabotage negotiations, Secretary of State James Baker, testifying before the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, recited the White House general telephone number and said, "call us when you are serious about peace." Baker's tough stance stunned the Israelis and eventually helped pressure Shamir into the process. Baker presented himself as an honest broker and neutral party (like Mitchell), but he never recovered his full ability to operate, though his actions led to the Madrid talks that began the modern peace process. He was savaged by Jewish organizations, in the Jewish press and among the phalanx of neoconservative media. (That President George H.W. Bush's chief of staff John Sununu was of Arab descent provided a leitmotif.) To this day, despite his extraordinary effectiveness, Baker is limited in how he might ever be used in the Middle East.

4. You are always in danger of being maneuvered into Baker's position. Mitchell is even more immediately in danger. Gen. Jones, widely distrusted by Jewish leadership, is wisely keeping a very low profile, but to the extent he emerges will be in danger and targeted as Baker redux (and Scowcroft's stalking horse).

5. Bibi and the Jewish leadership should be expected to use political means, including outsourcing personal attacks, to counter moves the administration seeks in any peace process or initiating any negotiations. As you know, Bibi is deeply connected to political networks in the US—media, Jewish groups, Republican leaders, and right-wing Christian right organizations. (In 1998, Bibi tried to undermine President Clinton's peace process by meeting in the US with and mobilizing nearly every influential conservative columnist, the leaders of the Southern Baptist Convention, Jerry Falwell, Fox News, etc.)

6. In order to protect yourself and your emissaries in the diplomatic effort from the inevitably intense fire of which the Foxman incident is only a portent, you need a political heat shield. That barrier must be a person. That person should not be a diplomat (though Mitchell is already targeted and will receive incoming). That person should be organically tied to the President, invested with his authority and have an explicitly political brief. That person should be the bad cop. The bad cop must be a

political appointee, Jewish, considered the true friend of Israel, and be understood as representing the president's will. The bad cop should already have sternly rebuked Foxman to send the message back not to play with fire. The bad cop

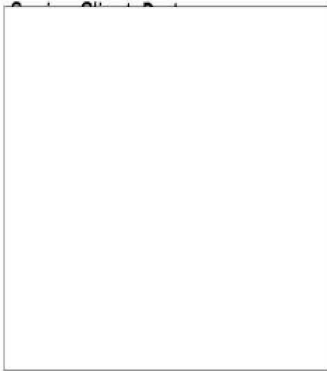

Family and friends,

I'm sorry that I haven't written in a few days. We've been busy traveling and in transit trying to make our way into Fallujah. We finally made it and are looking forward to seeing some of the city today.

I'm struggling to figure out the direction of the film, mainly because it is very hard to figure out what is going on here. On one hand, there is much to be hopeful about. At the surface, it appears most Iraqis have been able to return to their daily lives, they waive at Marines, casualties are way way down, and the presence of US and coalition forces has been drastically reduced. On the other hand, at what cost has this security arisen? Who are we leaving in power? Will security persist after we leave? Who will fill that vacuum? Unemployment is still high and targeted political violence still occurs. What lies beneath the surface in Iraq? I wonder how honest of a film can we make and is it arrogant to think that we can even attempt to figure any of this out?

In meetings and interviews with tribal leaders who participated in the Al Anbar awakening, I continue to ask them where the bodies are. They claim that there was vicious fighting between the tribes and Al Qaeda once the tribal leaders "woke up" and decided to switch allegiances. Perhaps there are questions we are not supposed to ask, but what did they do with the Al Qaeda dead? At the heart of the question I wonder whether they fought against Al Qaeda groups or if they were the ones following the Al Qaeda leadership, armed with money and ideology, down a treacherous path and when the Awakening occurred shot those leaders in the back of the head, about faced, and started following us down a different path. There is no doubt that it is not that simple, many Sheiks and tribesmen were killed in the fighting, but I desperately want to know what happened and am not satisfied by the answers we are getting. It has just got to be more complicated than the story of Abu Risha gathering the tribes to stand up to the brutality of Al Qaeda in Iraq. Did Al Qaeda's money supply get dried up? Did ours start flowing? Did the Marines win hearts and minds through innovative counterinsurgency tactics? Did the Iraqis decide to take matters into their own hands? Any ideas?

Onto our update...

Monday was rather uneventful except for one meeting in the morning with the director of the local radio station, the head of the Fallujah police, the local ePRT, and the Marine PTT. For laypersons among you, that is the State departments embedded Provincial Reconstruction Team and the Marine Police Transition Team. Fascinating study in the different approaches between state department personnel and the Marines. The purpose of the meeting was to help the police and the radio station director coordinate in the case of emergencies to get information out to the public. The Marine, being a Marine, was very direct and

comfortable with his Iraqi counterpart. It seemed the State Department official was less so, or at least took a decidedly different tact. It seems there is a growing popular consensus in the States that we need more foreign service off

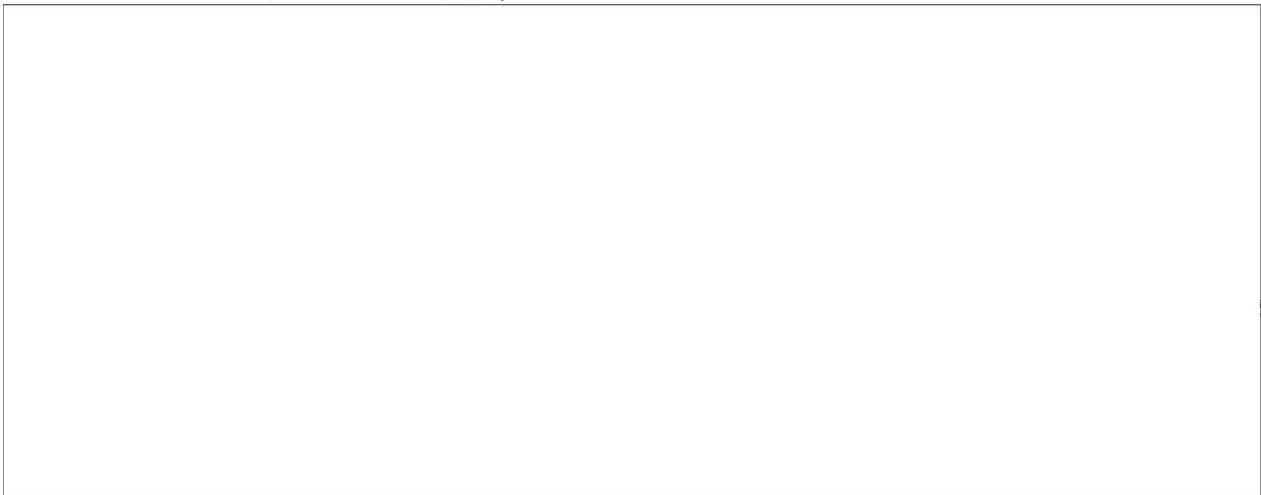

While Lantos proudly wore his Jewish identity in public life, his private life was a more complicated matter. Lantos married his childhood sweetheart and fellow Holocaust survivor, Annette Tillemann, who was a Jew by birth but a Mormon by choice. Their two daughters were both raised in the Mormon faith.

Lantos's wife worked side by side with him on Jewish causes, but the congressman's private engagement with Mormonism made many in the Jewish community uncomfortable, and Lantos generally declined to talk about his own private religious practice. When Lantos first came to office, Jewish institutional leaders did not quite know how to deal with him and his wife, most especially when Annette Lantos referred to the Jewish people with the possessive "we."

Still, Lantos left no question that in public he was a Jew. In his official biography, Lantos listed his religion as Jewish. His death this week was met by a profuse outpouring of praise from Jewish organizations and politicians spanning the partisan spectrum.

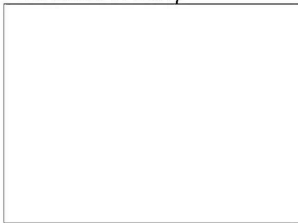

Obama to Speak at National Prayer Breakfast

President Barack Obama will speak at next Thursday's annual National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, according to event organizers and a White House aide. The breakfast has drawn the sitting U.S. president every year since the Eisenhower administration, according to an organizer who would speak about the event only on background. It's customary for the president to address the gathering. The event's planners are forbidden to talk publicly about the breakfast, which is expected to draw about 4,000 guests—including a smattering of heads of state—to the Capital Hilton's ballroom next week.

"There's excitement about Obama's because it's not the first breakfast he's attended," said one organizer. "He's not coming in cold."

In addition to the presidential address, the National Prayer Breakfast features scripture reading, prayers, and a keynote speaker, all selected by a bipartisan congressional committee. Recent keynoters include rock star Bono and Human Genome Project leader Francis Collins.

Organizers said this year's speaker is confirmed but declined to disclose the person's identity.

The White House press office declined to comment, but an Obama aide said the president "is confirmed to attend and it is tradition that the president will address the group."

Re: Specialty Media in the Age of Secretary Clinton

Specialty media played a major role in this year's presidential election during both the primary and general campaigns by providing information on key issues to niche audiences. The public hunger for news and information about the candidates and their positions ensured that the campaign got regular coverage from media sources as diverse as daytime talk shows like *The View* to Country Music Television to ethnic outlets like *La Opinion*, *India Abroad* and the Jewish Telegraphic Agency (JTA). The heightened interest from specialty media is unlikely to abate as the Obama administration takes over the reins of government and begins to address the multitude of challenges facing the nation at home and abroad.

As Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton should tap into this heightened media interest and the enormous well of goodwill she has developed with many of these specialty media outlets through her time in the Senate and especially from her presidential campaign. Unlike the elite, *Inside-the-Beltway* reporters who are constantly on the hunt for controversy and internal friction within the administration, specialty media outlets are more focused on substantive policy issues and want to find ways to connect these complex issues to a human face. Further, the thirst for access from these outlets puts the State Department in a position of strength in negotiating amount of coverage and topics to be discussed. Many will agree to do a written Q&A or restrict questioning to previously approved topics. These outlets can create vital support for official policy or pending legislation among key domestic constituency groups but also create momentum for policy abroad. As the media environment continues to become more and more globally interconnected, it will be critical for the leadership of the State Department to leverage all of these media opportunities to amplify and deliver messages that advance policymaking.

For the most part, specialty media outlets have been vastly underutilized by the leadership of the State Department, instead relying heavily on the Sunday shows and network and cable news to communicate the administration's foreign policy agenda. For example, of the over 550 media interviews Secretary Rice conducted during her tenure (does not include media availabilities or press conferences) only a handful of those can be considered to be with specialty media. In fact, she only did five interviews with outlets that reach the African-American community (2 with *Ebony*, 1 each with *Essence*, *American Urban Radio*, and *Tavis Smiley*) and even though many ethnic specialty media outlets have operations in the U.S., she rarely did interviews with them stateside and instead, would do brief interviews during a trip to that region. Most of the specialty media that Secretary Rice did was in the world of sports, demonstrating her devotion to sports like football and golf.

Unlike previous Secretaries of State, Hillary Clinton will come to the State Department with a national constituency who can be grassroots voices to their Members of Congress and the White House. She will have unparalleled star power and abilities to use her brand to turn good policy ideas into concrete programs. Specialty media can be an important tool

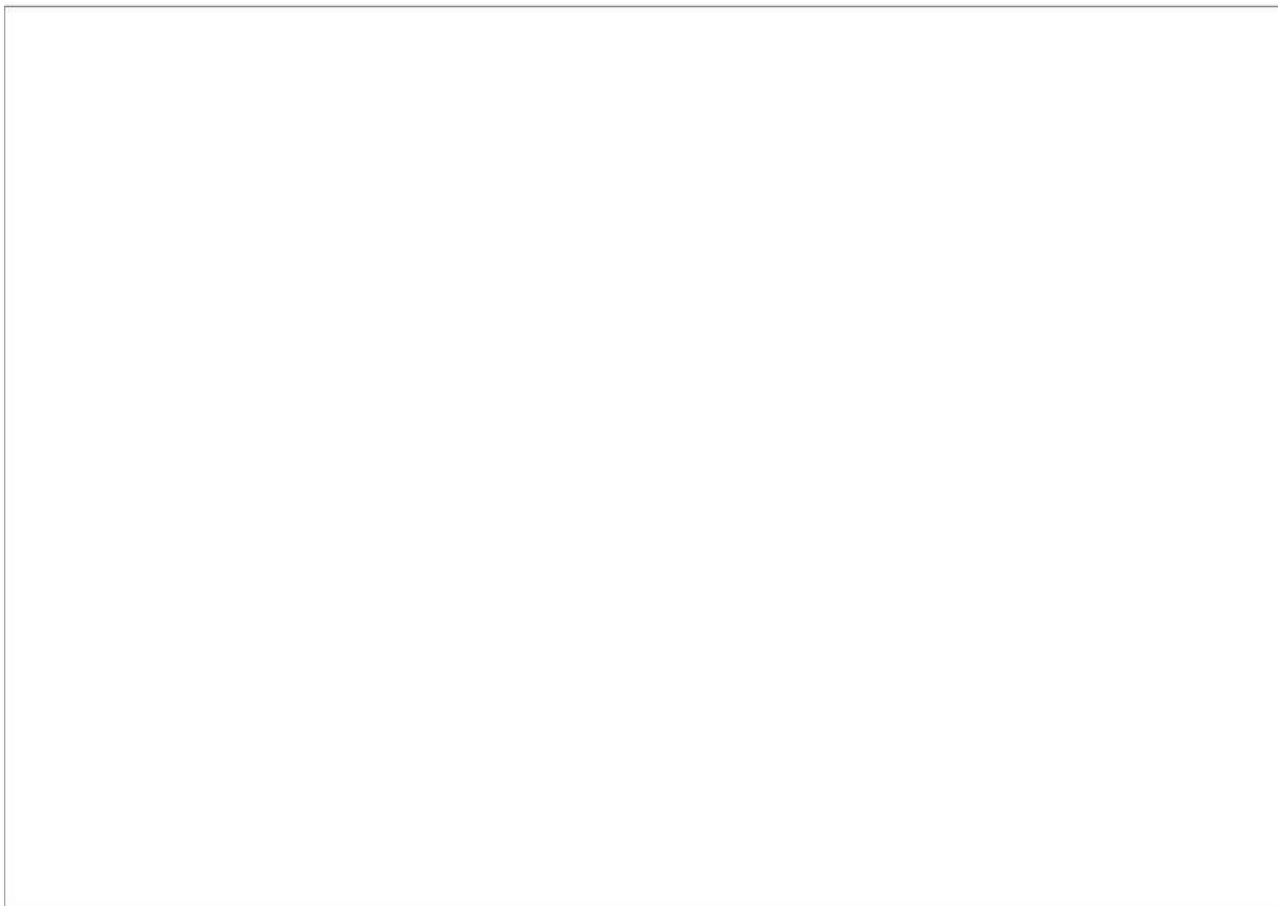

RE: Findings Concerning the State Department's Office of International Religious Freedom

I've had the opportunity to briefly study the basic structure of the Office of International Religious Freedom (IRF) and hear from several who have worked at IRF or have had close working relationships over the years. I knew very little about this office prior to the last few weeks, therefore, my findings should be taken on that fact. There is much deeper knowledge and understanding to garner. But, this should act as cursory or starting information.

I will put my finding in bullet form and keep them short.

Findings:

- It was interesting to me that all who have been associated with IRF at State are quick to volunteer that they are not associated with the Commission on International Religious Freedom (I believe both were created by the same 1998 Act). They want it known up front that the Commission is a Presidential commission entity and is not part of State. Some go farther by suggesting the commission accomplishes little or nothing and is solely a place to provide titles to certain people. At least on the staff level there is animosity and no working relationship.

- Apparently the staff of IRF has grown over the Bush years. All of those I talked to but one is either a Democrat or from the progressive faith community. And, all of these described the IRF staff as "not effective," "right wing partisan," "right wing ideologues," and "religious right adherents." They said the office is not helpful. One person told me that the Amb at Large over IRF (Hanford I believe) is a nephew or close relationship to outgoing NC Senator Dole. Regardless, the IRF office from top to bottom is described by Democrats and/or faith progressives as larger than once was, partisan, hostile and ineffective. The one Republican I talked to, a Pentecostal minister I've helped with passports, etc for mission purposes over the years praised the office for both its attentiveness to his needs and "yearly reports on religious status" around the globe. Apparently, the office releases a yearly report about the religious freedom/activity around the globe.
- Everyone I talked to discussed the total insular nature of IRF within State. Just through listening I think most of the insular nature is driven by other departments and probably a systemic reason be it on purpose or not. In other words, IRF does little or no coordinating with other bureaus within State. This creates two things: 1.) It's the total focus inward and outward for those interested in religious freedom - this issue doesn't relate much with the rest of State and 2.) there is no involvement of religious issues with the rest of State. It seems that the Bush Administration has allowed this. They have allowed IRF to operate largely in their own corner, possibly focused on a personal or partisan agenda of seeing to the needs and message of particular faith communities but not the whole faith community. And, the subsequent and tragic other result has been a lack of understanding and knowledge by the larger community at State of the impact, influence and nuances of how religious and faith traditions, customs and belief impact daily short term and long term decisions of political entities throughout the world.
- Its two pronged: serving the faith communities and informing diplomacy (micro and macro). MICRO: If the IRF is reaching out to, listening to, meeting with ALL the US sending/mission a

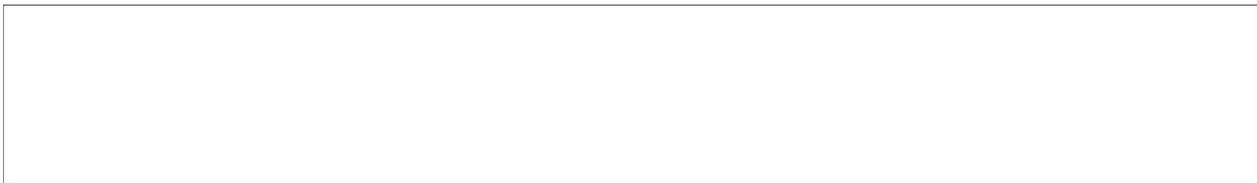

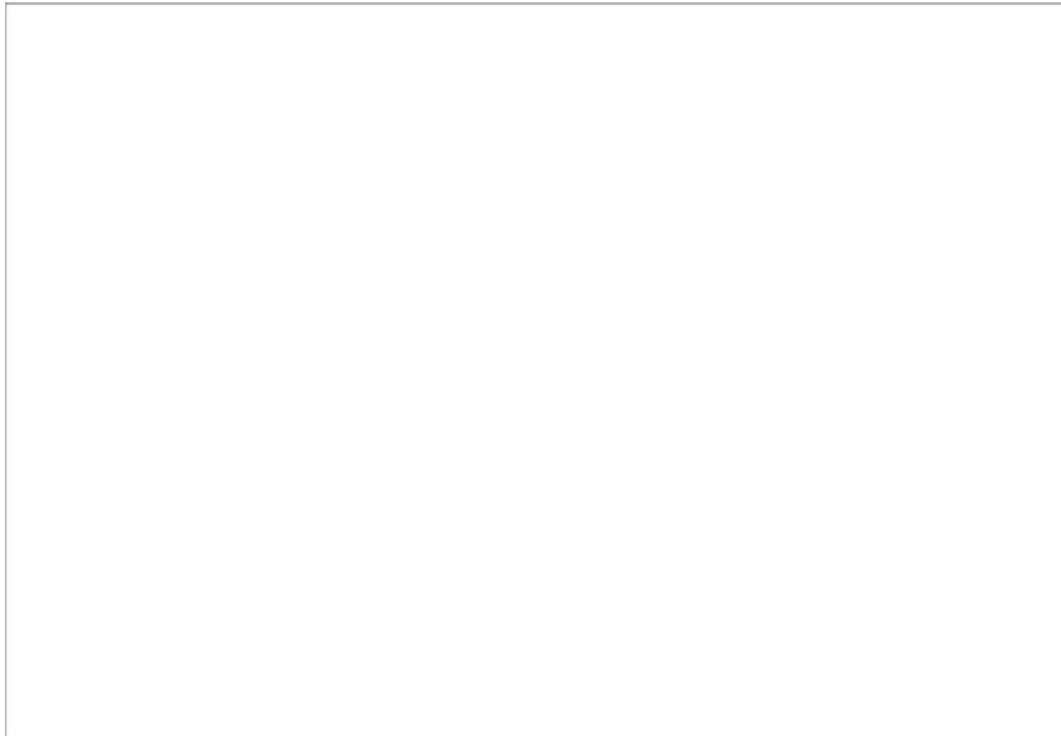

BEIJING (Reuters) - The AIDS virus became the top deadly infectious disease in China last year for the first time, killing 6,897 people in the first nine months of 2008, the official news agency Xinhua said on Tuesday.

The number of people infected with the HIV/AIDS virus doubled during that period, Xinhua said, citing a report posted on the Ministry of Health website.

Xinhua said there were a total of 264,302 HIV/AIDS cases by the end of September last year and 34,864 people have died of the disease so far.

United Nations figures estimate that 700,000 people in China were HIV positive by the end of 2007.

Xinhua said tuberculosis was the second biggest killer in the first nine months of last year, while rabies ranked third followed by hepatitis and infant tetanus.

The country reported a one-fifth rise in syphilis last year, with a total of 257,474 cases, while gonorrhea cases dropped by a tenth, China's health ministry said.

China on Sunday launched a national sex education campaign aimed at getting more people to seek treatment for sexually transmitted diseases and infertility.

Exelon Wins Big Advantage in Its Pursuit of NRG

By MATTHEW KARNITSCHNIG

Exelon Corp. said its \$6 billion tender offer for NRG Energy Inc. garnered more than 51% of the outstanding shares, a result that gives it powerful leverage in its hostile pursuit of NRG.

"The will of the shareholders is to enter into discussions with us that will end in the consummation of a transaction," said William Von Hoene Jr., Exelon's general counsel, in an interview.

NRG has already rejected the offer twice, saying the price "manifestly undervalues" NRG while also expressing doubts about whether Exelon could finance the transaction. But the result of the tender offer could force it to the negotiating table.

A spokeswoman for NRG said the company hadn't seen the results and declined to comment further.

Winning the tender gives Exelon the right to acquire NRG, but its offer is contingent on regulatory approval as well as the agreement of its own shareholders and other conditions. Exelon would prefer a friendly transaction because in a negotiated deal it would have access to NRG's books and the regulatory approval process would be less arduous.

If NRG continues to refuse talks, Mr. Von Hoene said Exelon would pursue a proxy contest to replace NRG's board with its own nominees at the next annual meeting. NRG has yet to set a date for the meeting but it has to be held by June. Exelon said it would extend its tender offer until June 26. "We are fully prepared in the event that they do not [negotiate], to solicit the proxies and attempt to change the composition of the board," he said.

The result of the tender suggests Exelon would win that fight, allowing it to push through the deal.

Exelon began the tender in November after NRG's first rejection. By the first deadline in early January, Exelon garnered commitments for about 45.6% of NRG's outstanding shares. Exelon then extended the offer until Feb. 25. The two companies' chief executives met in Washington in mid-January to discuss the offer but failed to agree on a framework for negotiations. Exelon first made the unsolicited bid in mid-October, offering to pay a fixed exchange ratio of 0.485 Exelon share for each share of NRG, which is based in Princeton, N.J. At the time, the bid represented a 37% premium. The value of the deal, which was originally \$6.2 billion, has fallen to \$5.8 billion as Exelon's stock has dropped, but the offer still represents a 22% premium to where NRG was trading before the bid.

The apparent willingness of many NRG shareholders to still accept the offer instead of holding out for a higher premium is likely a reflection of the broader market malaise. With market indices falling sharply, many investors are desperate to book a profit, even if means forgoing the possibility of a better deal. In the case of NRG, investors may also be eyeing the stocks of other independent power producers, many of which have fallen substantially since October. NRG's shares have held firm since then because of the Exelon offer.

Hostile offers are unusual in the power sector, where deals normally are amicable because they typically also require approval from state regulators. But Exelon's move shows that sagging stock values for companies may entice companies to go after each other.

Exelon has already applied for regulatory approval in most jurisdictions and believes it can complete the process by the end of the third quarter. It foresees few obstacles because there isn't much overlap between the two companies and neither is a public utility.

Exelon, which owns utilities in Chicago and Philadelphia in addition to a large fleet of nuclear generating plants, sees great value in NRG's portfolio of fossil-fuel and nuclear power plants and its proposal to build an additional nuclear station in Texas.

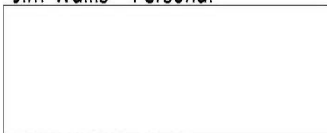

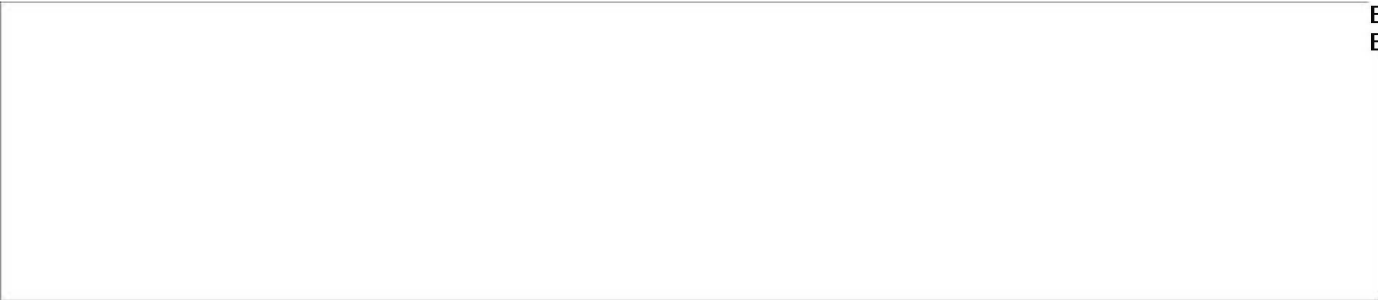

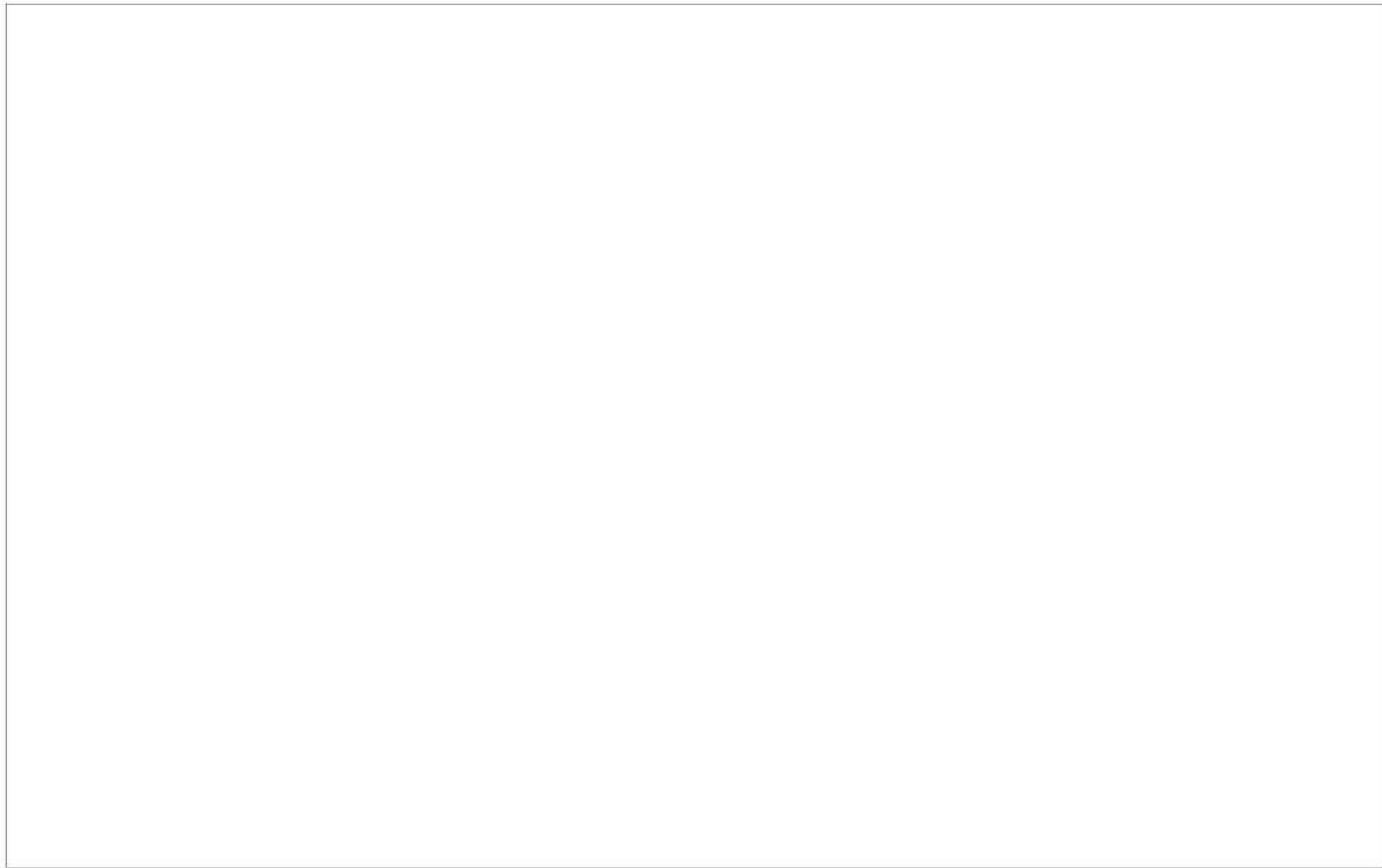
