- 2. Registration for the 2020 #EdEquityVA Virtual Summit is now open on a first come first served basis. Governor Ralph R. Northam, Virginia Secretary of Education, Atif Qarni and Superintendent of Public Instruction, Dr. James Lane typically kicks off the summit that brings together educators and leaders from across the state to explore the implications of institutional racism in public education and raise state discourse and action around courageous teaching and leading, equity, and the principles of anti-racism. Day one, August 5 is for Teachers, Principals, Instructional leaders, and Equity Coordinators and the second day, August 6 is for Superintendent Teams, Administrators, School Board Members, and Division Level Equity Leads. Both days will include a keynote address by Dr. Bettina Love, author of We Want to Do More Than Survive: Abolitionist Teaching and the Pursuit of Educational Freedom. In alignment with the mutually agreed upon professional learning plan referenced in the LCPS Action Plan to Combat Systemic Racism all sessions provided will focus on building an educator workforce that is positioned for anti-racism and cultural proficiency.
