

ISSUE:

A reporter with Politico has asked us to comment on a story he is preparing that claims that in 2018, a gun belonging to Hunter Biden was "disposed' of by his then girlfriend, Hallie Biden. During the course of the investigation, by the Delaware State Police, someone claimed that two U.S Secret Service agents went to the gun store, where the gun had been purchased and asked to take possession of the paperwork Hunter had filled out to purchase a gun.

INTERNAL BACKGROUND:

This story was initially reported by The Blaze in October 2020. A FOIA request was completed at the time, that resulted in no records being found. The RAIC of the Wilmington Resident Office reported that all agents in his office denied any involvement. The Politico reporter refused to provide any details on the source of the information or that he was in possession of any official document, where we were identified. The statement has been drafted to address any implication that anyone from the service was involved in this incident.
