The undersigned Officer is providing notice of the incident that happened with the First Family's Pet (Commander) on Thursday, November 10, 2022.

I began my tour of duty at 0230 hours this morning working in the Southeast region of the White House Complex. At approximately 0650 hours, I began to walk across the South roadway from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to my next post assignment at (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). I proceeded to walk past the Kennedy Garden where I noticed Commander and the First Lady. As I continued walking, I saw Commander exit the Kennedy Garden and sprint towards me. I immediately stopped and put my hands up. Commander then bit me on my left thigh and then ran back towards the First Lady. The First Lady (b) (6), (b) (7)(C); I replied "I believe so." Once I got to Post (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) I called Sergeant (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to notify him of the incident.

After I was relieved from my post, Sergeant (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and I went to the White House Medical Unit to get the injury examined by a professional. WHMU Doctor (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). I am currently experiencing bruising, tenderness, and pain in the bite area. Doctor (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) recommended (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C).

An OSHA 301 claim has also been completed and approved by my supervisor to document the workplace injury.
